Posting Language

Authorize the ratification of an agreement with Central Texas Food Bank to provide direct relief food access to Austin/Travis County residents impacted by COVID-19 in an amount not to exceed \$2,000,000 for the term May 11, 2020 through September 30, 2020.

Fiscal Note

Funding in the amount of \$2,000,000 is included in the Fiscal Year 2019-2020 General Fund Emergency Reserve Fund for Relief in a State of Emergency Fund to support COVID-19 emergency relief.

Prior Council Action:

April 9, 2020 - Council approved Resolution No. 20200409-081 to appropriate an amount not to exceed \$15,000,000 for the Relief in a State of Emergency Fund to support COVID-19 emergency relief, with an 11-0 vote on the virtual dais.

Additional Backup Information:

This action will authorize the ratification of an agreement with Central Texas Food Bank to provide direct relief food access to Austin/Travis County residents impacted by COVID-19. The term for this agreement is May 11, 2020 through September 30, 2020 in an amount not to exceed \$2,000,000, for a total contract amount of \$2,000,000, with no extension options.

On April 9, 2020, City Council approved an ordinance amending the Fiscal Year 2019-2020 General Fund Emergency Reserve Fund (Ordinance No. 20190910-001) to appropriate an amount not to exceed \$15,000,000 for the Relief in a State of Emergency (RISE) Fund to support COVID-19 emergency relief. On the same day, City Council approved Resolution No. 20200409-081, which authorized the City Manager to negotiate and execute new emergency contracts funded from the RISE Fund to offer immediate support services and direct financial assistance to residents impacted by the COVID-19 pandemic and economic crisis.

Central Texas Food Bank will distribute food to relieve hunger for low-income and food insecure people living in Travis County and the Austin through distribution of groceries to low-income households through partner agencies.
