Authorize negotiation and execution of an agreement with Family Eldercare, Inc. to provide direct financial assistance and direct relief services to Austin/Travis County residents impacted by COVID-19 in an amount not to exceed \$277,241 for the term May 26, 2020 through September 30, 2020.

Funding in the amount of \$277,241 is included in the Fiscal Year 2019-2020 General Fund Emergency Reserve Fund for Relief in a State of Emergency Fund to support COVID-19 emergency relief.

Prior Council Action:

April 9, 2020 - Council approved Resolution No. 20200409-081 to appropriate an amount not to exceed \$15,000,000 for the Relief in a State of Emergency Fund to support COVID-19 emergency relief, with an 11-0 vote on the virtual dais.

This action will authorize the negotiation and execution of an agreement with Family Eldercare, Inc. to provide direct financial assistance and direct relief services to Austin/Travis County residents impacted by COVID-19. The term for this agreement is May 26, 2020 through September 30, 2020 in an amount not to exceed \$277,241, for a total agreement amount of \$277,241, with no extension options.

On April 9, 2020, City Council approved an ordinance amending the Fiscal Year 2019-2020 General Fund Emergency Reserve Fund (Ordinance No. 20190910-001) to appropriate an amount not to exceed \$15,000,000 for the Relief in a State of Emergency (RISE) Fund to support COVID-19 emergency relief. On the same day, City Council approved Resolution No. 20200409-081, which authorized the City Manager to negotiate and execute new emergency contracts funded from the RISE Fund to offer immediate support services and direct financial assistance to residents impacted by the COVID-19 pandemic and economic crisis.

Family Eldercare, Inc. will provide direct financial assistance and direct relief services to serve people of color, the LGBTQI+ community, seniors, and historically marginalized individuals. They will provide the following direct financial assistance and direct relief services: food access, case management and behavioral health services, access to essential hygiene services/materials, mortgage or rental assistance, assistance with utility bills, and dependent caregiver services.
