Posting Language

Authorize negotiation and execution of a multi-term contract with ThyssenKrupp Airport Systems Inc., to provide maintenance, inspections, emergency repairs, parts and training for passenger boarding bridges, for up to five years for a total contract amount not to exceed \$3,001,000.

(Note: Sole source contracts are exempt from the City Code Chapter 2-9C Minority Owned and Women Owned Business Enterprise Procurement Program; therefore, no subcontracting goals were established).

Additional Backup Information:

The contract will provide original equipment manufacturer resources for preventative maintenance, emergency repair services, and associated repair parts for passenger boarding bridges located at the Austin-Bergstrom International Airport. Services under the contract will include annual passenger boarding bridge operation inspections, unscheduled service calls, and on-site training for airport technicians. Parts will be purchased and stocked by the Aviation Department for routine and emergency repairs as well as preventative maintenance.

ThyssenKrupp Airport Systems Inc. is the original equipment manufacturer for many of the airport's passenger boarding bridge components and the repair parts and services for these components are only available from the manufacturer. Authorization amounts for this contract are based on departmental estimates including an

anticipated increase due to the airport expansion.
