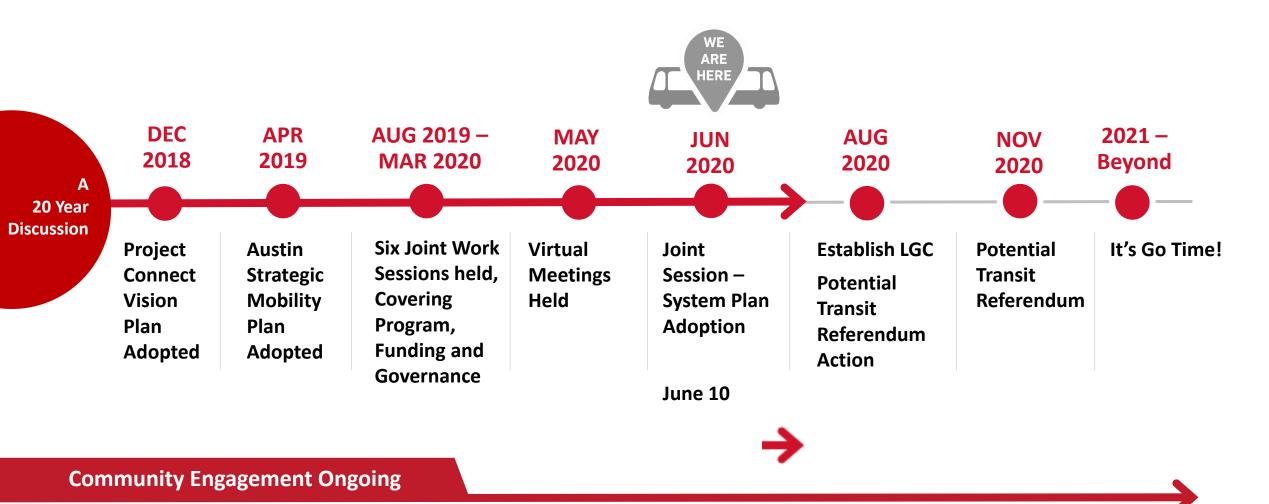

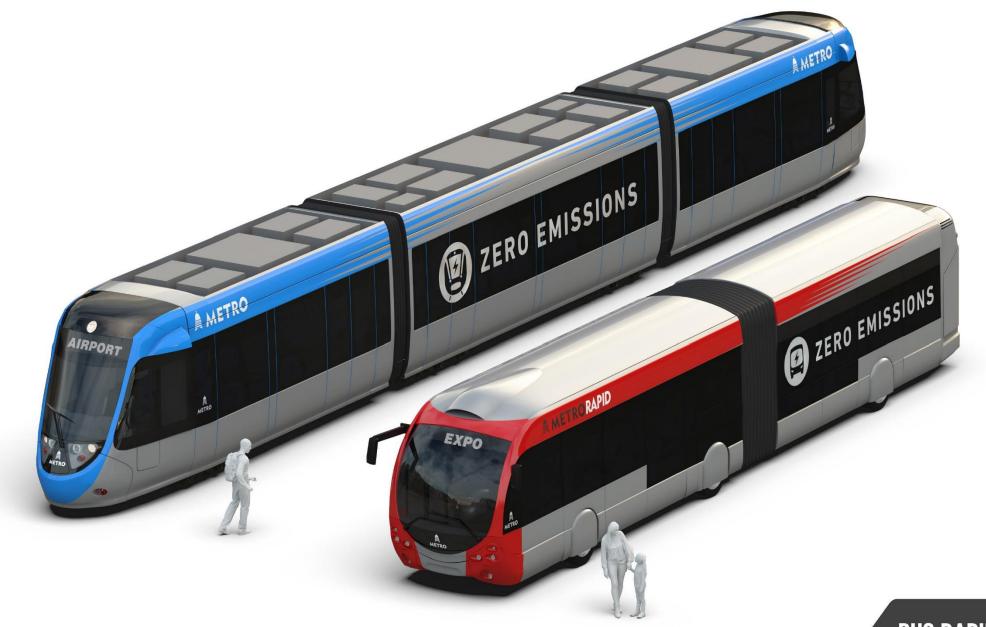

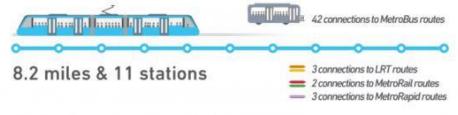

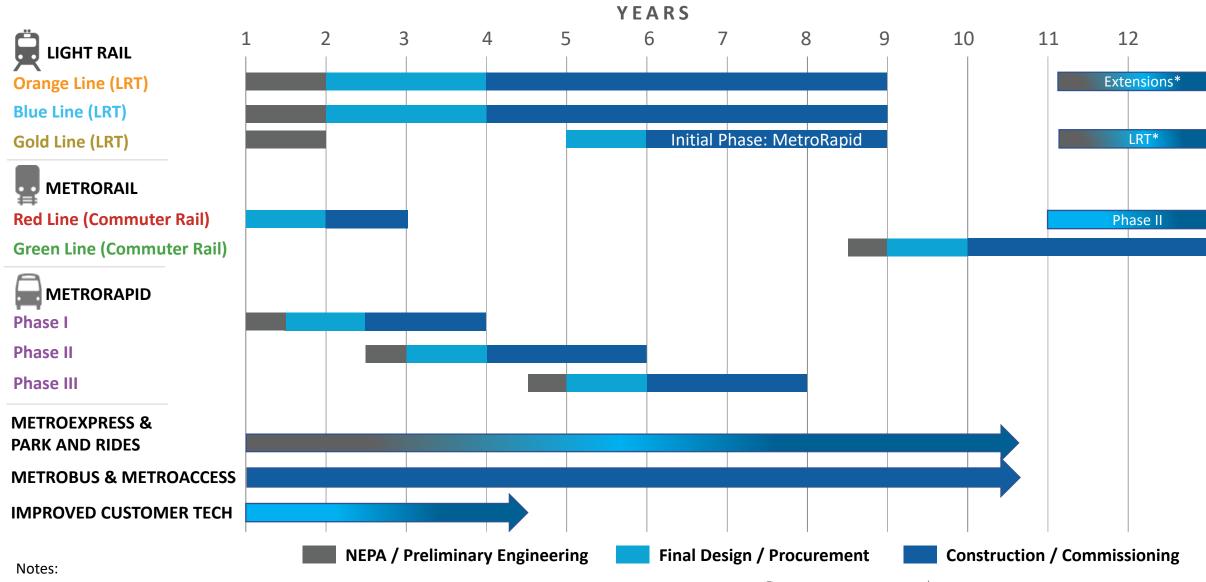


METRORAPID OVERVIEW





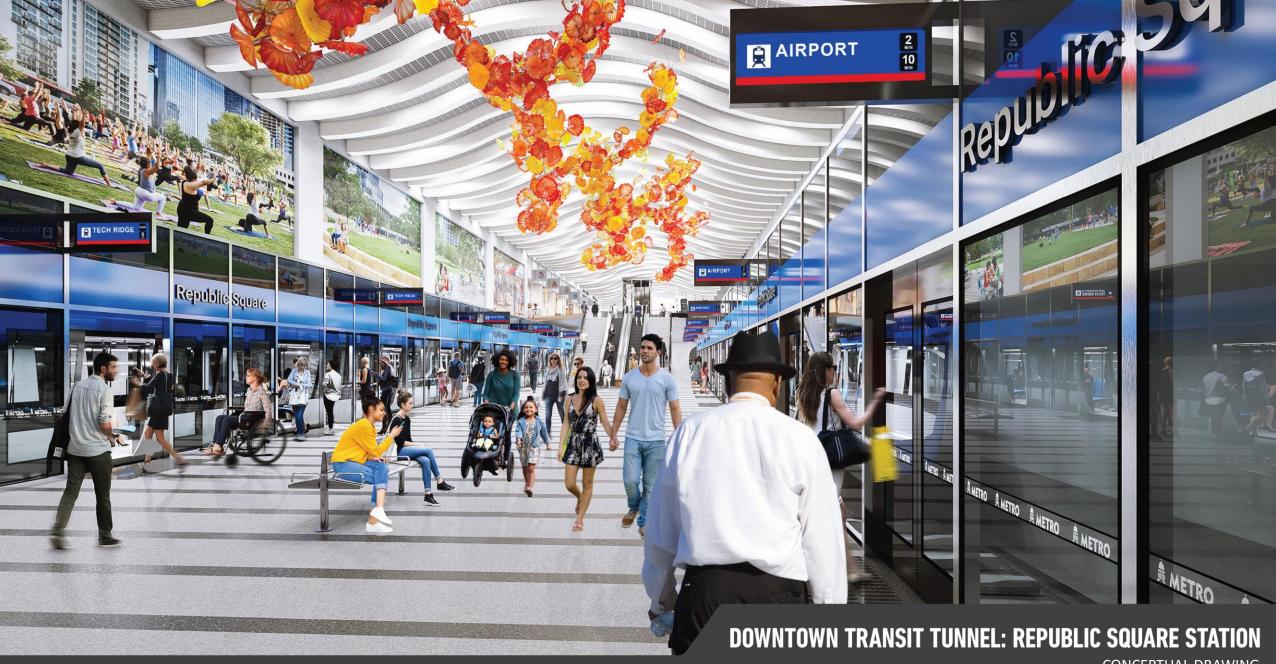

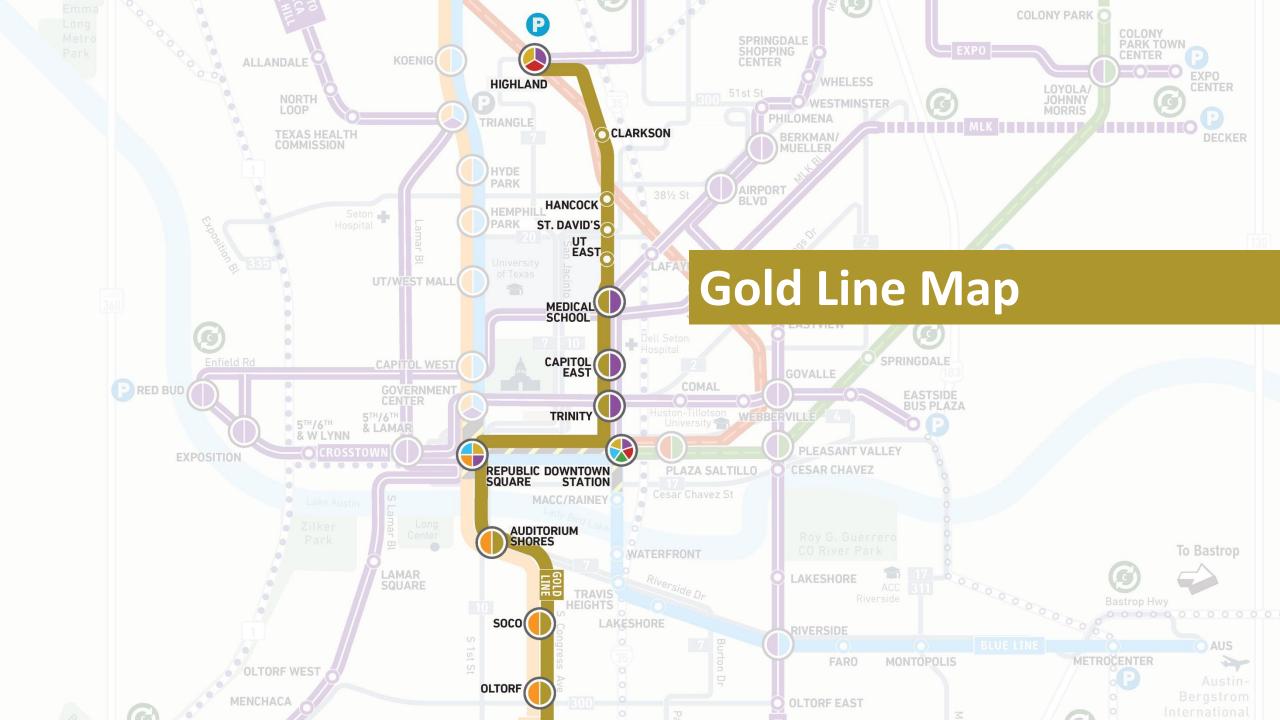


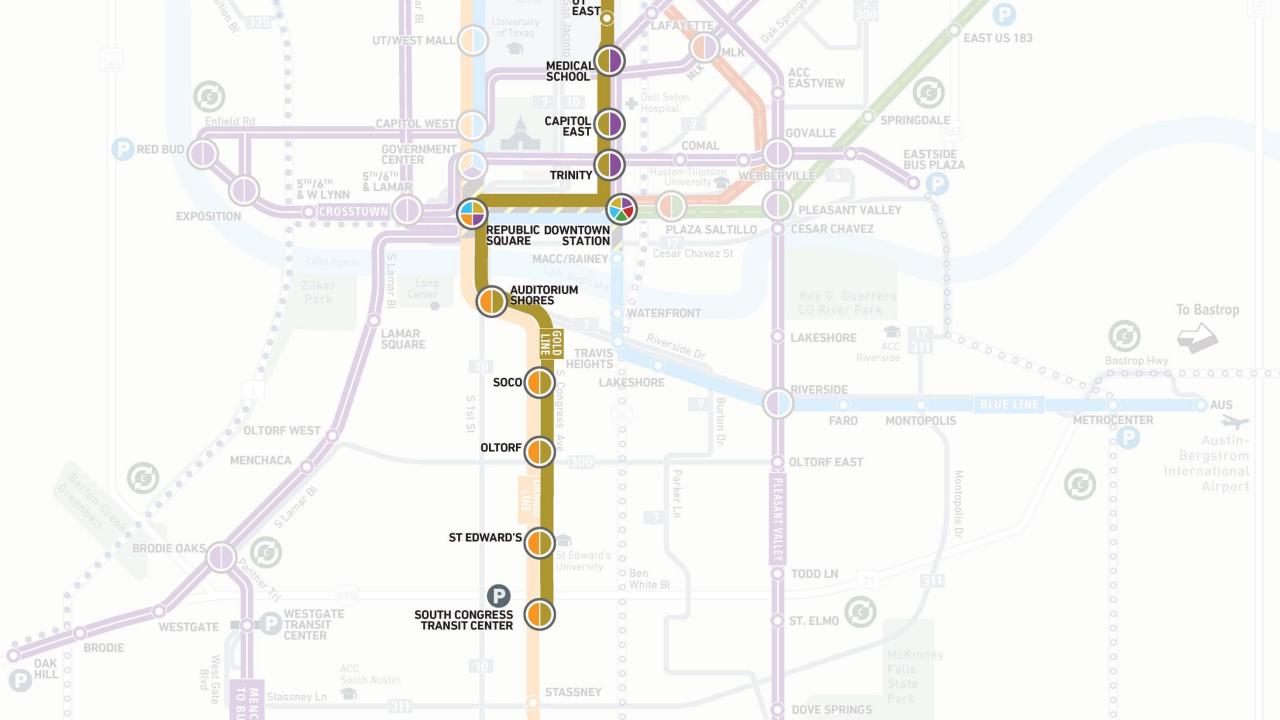






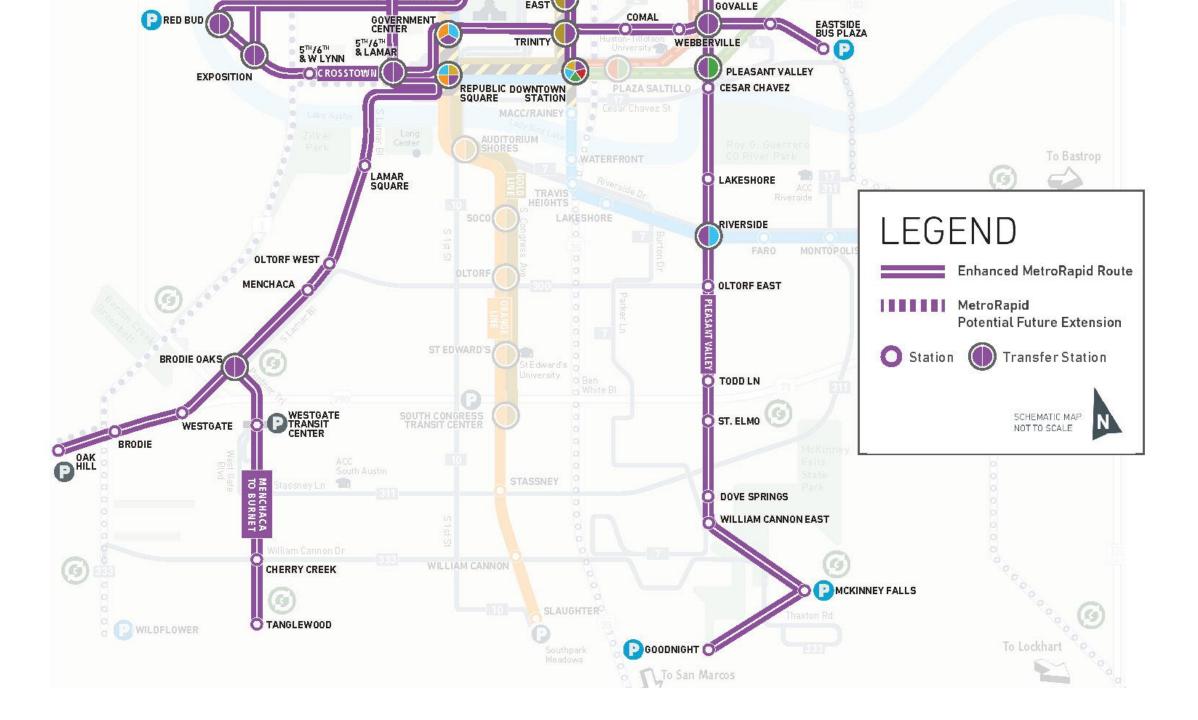






PROPOSED METRORAPID LINES
