Posting Language

Authorize negotiation and execution of an agreement with Workers Defense Project to provide direct financial assistance and legal assistance to support high-risk workers impacted by COVID-19 in an amount not to exceed \$3,300,000 for a five month term to end by December 30, 2020.

Lead Department:

Austin Public Health.

Fiscal Note:

Funding in the amount of \$3,300,000 is included in the COVID-19 Spending Framework (Resolution No. 20200604-040) as part of the Economic Support for Financial and Other Direct Support.

Prior Council Action:

June 4, 2020 - Council approved Resolution No. 20200604-040 adopting the COVID-19 proposed spending framework for the use of all available federal and local funding that maximizes the benefit of federal COVID-19 relief funding and local funding, with an 11-0 vote on the virtual dais.

May 21, 2020 - Council approved Resolution No. 20200521-038 directing the City Manager to establish a unified city strategy for high-risk workers, with an 11-0 vote on the virtual dais.

Additional Backup Information:

This will authorize Austin Public Health to start an agreement with Workers Defense Project to provide direct financial assistance and legal assistance to Austin/Travis County residents who are high-risk workers impacted by COVID-19 in an amount not to exceed \$3,300,000, for a five month term to end by December 30, 2020.

High-risk workers are those who are most likely to be hospitalized if they are infected with COVID-19 or have members of their household who face such risks. This agreement will focus on individuals, and their families, who jobs are in a field that is highly susceptible to COVID-19 contact and thus are considered high risk.
