



CORRIDOR MOBILITY IMPROVEMENTS

2018 Council Adoption of Corridor Construction Program

- Corridor-Wide Improvements on All Corridors
- Enhance Multimodal Improvements on Prioritized Segments
- Initiate Design on Additional Enhanced Multimodal Segments



ANTICIPATED OUTCOMES

50 Miles of Roadway
10-15% Mode Shift

INCREASED SAFETY

- Separation of travel modes
- Intersection safety improvements and Pedestrian Hybrid Beacons
- Medians to reduce turning movement conflicts
- 13 of the Top Crash Intersections improved

PROVIDE CONNECTIVITY AND TRAVEL OPTIONS

- 75 miles of sidewalks or shared-use paths
- 46 miles of existing High/Very High sidewalks repaired (Sidewalk Master Plan)
- 18 miles of absent High/Very High sidewalk gaps filled (Sidewalk Master Plan)
- 100 bike route connections (Bicycle Master Plan)
- Coordinated transit improvements

REDUCED VEHICULAR DELAY

- Approximately 25% average reduction in delay time
- 50 new turn lanes added at intersections; New signal technology
- 120 signal improvements





PHASE 1 » COMPLETE

NUECES STREET

- East side, just north of 25th St. to 26th St.
- East side, between 24th St. and 25th St.
- East side, select portions between 26th St. and 28th St.
- West side, between 27th St. and 28th St.

24TH STREET

- North side, between Guadalupe St. and Nueces St.
- South side, just west of Guadalupe St.



- New pedestrian crosswalk and signal added at San Antonio St.

25TH STREET

- South side, between San Antonio St. and Guadalupe St.

26TH STREET

- South side, between Nueces St. and San Antonio St.

27TH STREET

- South side, between Nueces St. and alley

- West side, between 21st St. and 29th St.




