

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




#### COVID-19 AUSTIN MSA CURRENT HOSPITALIZATIONS, ICU ADMISSIONS, AND VENTILATOR USE






#### City of Austin - Travis County COVID-19 Hospitalization by Age Group (Austin MSA)






#### City of Austin - Travis County COVID-19 Count of Weekly Hospitalizations by Age Group (Austin MSA)






### City of Austin - Travis County COVID-19 Hospitalization by Race & Ethnicity (Austin MSA)

#### City of Austin - Travis County COVID-19 Count of Weekly Hospitalizations by Race/Ethnicity (Austin MSA)




#### Percent Positive by Test Collection Week and Year - Last 12 Weeks







## **Stage 3 Recommendations**

• Wear a mask, social distance, and practice good hygiene

Avoid gatherings with social groups greater than 10 people

• Avoid non-essential dining, shopping, and travel if you are high-risk

Businesses voluntarily operate at a reduced capacity of 50-75%

### Guideline Modifications

Reanalysis of trigger point for transition down to Stage 2 based upon decreases in hospital length of stay


Emerging scientific publications indicate that primary transmission is airborne

Masking>>Duration of Exposure>Physical Distancing



## Vaccine for Childcare, Education, and Senior Population Update

#### **APH TOTAL**

• Total of **273,199** first/second doses administered through APH (4/26)

#### Childcare/School Staff

• ~13,035 school and child-care staff have been vaccinated with at least one dose (as of 4/26)

#### **Senior Population**

- Doses through APH (60 years and older as of 4/26):
  - First dose ~60K
  - Second dose: ~43K

#### DSHS total

~104,394 Travis County residents 65 years or older have been vaccinated with at least one dose

APH continues to use data to drive community-centered intervention.

#### **& Population-Based Focus**

Using data to identify populations most severely impacted by COVID-19.

Through the APH dashboards, we understand that the following populations have been most impacted:

- Black
- Hispanic/Latinx
- Seniors
- Essential Workers

These communities are where we focus our equity efforts.

#### Bace-Based Focus

Using data to identify areas most severely impacted by COVID-19, including those with limited testing and vaccination resources.

#### **Community-Based Testing Sites**

COVID-19 testing locations were set up for people in neighborhoods that have experienced the highest number of cases of COVID-19 in Austin. This place-based focus for testing allows us to meet people where they are to reduce the barrier to accessing services. APH sites include:
