 - ii. Support Farms & Farmers Felipe Camacho provided an update. Working to onboard a new food policy board member. Working Group is planning to meet soon.

COVID-19 Food System Response Karen Magid provided an update. 1) Emergency Response Needs, 2) Two FTEs and funding for the Equity Toolkit and Food System Planning efforts, 3) Creation of a Food System Department and establishment of funding stream. Casar and Garza have \$400k in current budget amendments earmarked for mobile solution Vive Bien/Live Well but does not address longer term solutions or root issues.
 - iv. Healthy Food Access to All Communities Andrea Abel provided update. Comment from Garza's office was that these were not community led proposals. Suggestions to remove the word "planning" from Regional Food System efforts. Appetite for funding
