



66 In the Mexican American culture, some of the siblings will stay and live close to the parents. That was pretty much the way it was for our culture, and that's what happened here on our street. My dad, four of his brothers, and two of his older nephews, when they moved into the city, they all bought houses

next to each other right on East Fifth between [what is now] Robert Martinez Street and Pedernales Street. So us kids, all of us grew up together. We didn't have to go looking for other kids because there were so many of us. s. The original owners who built this house back in 1938 were the Fisher fami-

dens. The street was called DonAnn. In 1986, the City honored our family by naming the street; we picked Calle Limón which means Limón Street. It was my brother that said, 'let's leave it Calle Limón.'


