ANALYSIS / ADDITIONAL INFORMATION: This item will appropriate an amount not to exceed \$49,400,000 from the United States (U.S). Federal Government American Rescue Plan Act (ARP). At the May 6, 2021 meeting, Council accepted \$97,900,000 in ARP funds and appropriated a total of \$44,800,000; \$44,300,000 for the Public Health Response to COVID-19 (Austin Public Health and Homeland Security and Emergency Management) and \$500,000 in Economic Recovery Resources for Community Navigators (Economic Development). Since acceptance, the federal government informed the City the amount available for Austin is \$94,200,000 in fiscal year 2021, \$3,700,000 less than previously expected. The same amount in ARP funding is anticipated for fiscal year 2022.

For this amendment, funding not to exceed \$49,400,000 will be appropriated in accordance with Resolution No. 20210325-111 which directed the City Manager to use both federal American Rescue Plan Act funds, additional federal funding received by the City of Austin, and City funds in substantially the categories and allotments reflected in Exhibit A: the American Rescue Plan Act Spending Framework.
