








































Population Growth Since 10-1



Austin Population Growth, 1870 to 2020



Austin is the 11th largest city in the country and growing.





Austin's share of regional growth flattens.






Drivers of Growth

- Migration from other states and other parts of Texas drove nearly 3/4 of the growth in the Austin metro area between 2019 and 2020.
- Increased share due to increase in newcomers paired with decrease in international migrants and natural increase.





Austin metro area experiences small increase in births but also deaths.






Domestic migration driving growth in all parts of the metro.



Where are Austinites from?


- Share of Austin residents born in Texas has dropped from 55% to 49% in last decade.
- Share of Austin residents from other countries has remained stable at 18%.
- Biggest increase seen among Austin residents from other U.S. states, growing from 26% to 31% in last decade.

Place of Birth of Austin Residents, 2019






Numeric Population Change, 2010 to 2019






Percent Change, 2010 to 2019






Percent Black, 2019






Percent Hispanic, 2019






Percent Asian, 2019





Percent Non-Hispanic White, 2019





2020 Census: Looking Ahead

- Apportionment file released in April.
 - Texas gained 2 congressional seats, 1 less than projected.
 - 38 Congressional seats
 - 40 Electoral College votes





2020 Census: Looking Ahead

- Redistricting file to be released mid-August to late September.
 - Aug 16 release on Census Bureau FTP site
 - Sep 30 release on data.census.gov
 - Data file to include block-level total population, voting age, race/ethnicity, housing occupancy status, and group quarters by type





2020 Census: Looking Ahead

- Data quality metrics
 - Post-Enumeration survey
 - Evaluate count, especially of historically undercounted communities
 - Explore count of college age populations living off-campus
- Demographic & Housing Characteristics file
 - Household type, relation to householder, age detail, etc.
 - Released next year

Data Privacy & Legal Battles
