History of the Department

2002

 Property abatement cases covered under Health and Human Services Structural and Land Use under Development Services

2006

 Code Department implemented the first formal uniform for code staff

2004

 Code staff added to DSD staff to include zoning inspections under the Development Services Department

2009

 Austin Code Compliance became an independent department

2005

 Code Department moved under the Solid Waste Services Department and included sanitarians and code inspectors

2014

 Austin Code rebranded and incorporated the current uniform and logo

Challenges and Concerns

Pros

- Safety
- Uniformity in appearance
- Easy identification as a City employee representing an authorized agency
- Recognition as a public official while performing duties
- Assist in identification during special events
- Clothing is exposed to elements which can cause crosscontamination

Cons

- Mistaken identity for law enforcement
- Fear in some communities
- Budgetary impact for department
- Can be uncomfortable during specific weather conditions
