PARD Goals for Hancock Golf Course/Surrounding Park Space:

- 1) Increase the fiscal responsibility of City funds
- 2) Financial solvency at Hancock Golf Course
- 3) Maintain golf's historic significance at this location
- 4) Maintain Shared use of Space

Challenges:

- Limited General Fund Resources
- 9-hole Golf Course
 - Minimal Staffing Levels (Pay Station)
 - Limited Pro Shop Services
 - Course Conditions
- Aging Maintenance Equipment

Five Year Financial Trend


Revenue Expenses

General Fund Outlook

- General Fund Fiscal Year 2021 (FY21) Estimates
 - Revenue estimated to end year
 \$8.3 million below FY21 Budget
 - $\circ~$ Future Revenue tax caps at 3.5%
 - "Departmental revenues much weaker than budgeted due to extended duration of shutdown in comparison with assumptions made last summer."
- Enterprise Golf Fund
 - \$1.0M Annual Transfer will be reduced to \$500,000 in Fiscal Year 2022


- PARD worked with Austin Energy's Data Analytics and Business Intelligence Division

 - QR Code 721 responses received






March 2021 Community Survey Results



Most Common Words in Text Response (Email Survey)




Most Frequently Used Words from Email Survey
