Additional Backup Information:

The contract will provide continuation of a workforce development program for the Austin-area manufacturing sector. The Austin Regional Manufacturers Association (ARMA) uses their knowledge and experience of the manufacturing industry in the Austin area to develop a comprehensive understanding of the needs and interests of area manufacturing employers. ARMA utilizes existing professional relationships and established trust with area manufacturing employers to bolster the success and expediency of workforce development in Austin.

The contract includes the development, implementation, and execution of several deliverables related to the manufacturing sector's needs, including: an internship program, community organization outreach, securing

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commitments from manufacturing businesses, securing partnership statements from area schools, and working collaboratively with Workforce Solutions Capital Area to align with the Austin Area Master Community Workforce Plan and associated Employer Hub Initiative. The current contract with ARMA is scheduled to expire on September 30, 2021.

These workforce development services will build upon the findings of the 2017 Manufacturing Employers Study conducted by the Ray Marshall center for the Study of Human Resources, a research unit of the University of Texas at Austin's LBJ School of Public Affairs. If the City is unable to secure a contract, industry development may be impacted, for a sector that provides job opportunities for those with barriers to entry, and for those that are suffering the adverse employment effects of the COVID-19 pandemic.
