APPROVE AN ORDINANCE AMENDING ORDINANCE NO. 20210729-119 TO EXTEND THE APPLICABILITY PERIOD AND EXPIRATION DATE IN ORDINANCE NO. 20200326-090, WHICH RELATES TO REQUIRING NOTICES OF PROPOSED EVICTION; AMENDING ORDINANCE NO. 20200326-090 TO MODIFY THE MINIMUM TIME PERIOD TO RESPOND TO A NOTICE OF PROPOSED EVICTION AND TO AMEND THE STATEMENT REQUIRED IN A NOTICE OF PROPOSED EVICTION; AND DECLARING AN EMERGENCY.

BE IT ORDAINED BY THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF AUSTIN: PART 1. FINDINGS.

- (1) On March 26, 2020, the City Council adopted Ordinance No. 20200326-090 ("Original Ordinance"), which requires a landlord to provide a notice of proposed eviction prior to a notice to vacate because of the COVID-19 pandemic.
- (2) On May 7, 2020, the City Council adopted Ordinance No. 20200507-056, which amended Part 2 (*Definitions*), Part 3 (*Applicability*), and Subsection (C) of Part 4 (*Requirements*) of the Original Ordinance.
- Ordinance No. 20200507-056 amended the Original Ordinance's applicability period to include August 24, 2020; and the expiration date to the 61st day after August 24, 2020.
- (4) Ordinance No. 20200729-115 amended the Original Ordinance's applicability period to include September 30, 2020; and the expiration date to the 61st day after September 30, 2020.
- (5) Ordinance No. 20200917-106 amended the Original Ordinance's applicability to include December 31, 2020; and the expiration date to the 61st day after December 31, 2020.
- (6) Ordinance No. 20201210-054 amended the Original Ordinance's applicability to include March 5, 2021; and the expiration date to the 61st day after March 5, 2021.
- (7) Ordinance No. 20210304-099 amended the Original Ordinance's applicability to include May 17, 2021; and the expiration date to the 61st day after May 17, 2021.
