








Figure 1: Projected COVID-19 hospital admissions (left) and COVID-19 ICU patient census (right) in the Austin-Round Rock MSA through February 28, 2022, assuming that the Delta variant continues to spread. *Top row:* The projections assume the current thresholds in Austin's staged-alert system, i.e., a 7-day moving average of 5, 15, 30, and 50 daily COVID-19 admissions trigger changes in the green-blue, blue-yellow, yellow-orange, and orange-red stages, respectively. The red points represent historical data, the black horizontal line represents ICU capacity (200 beds), the light curves indicate stochastic simulations (300 per graph), and solid lines illustrate a representative projection. Note the projected spikes in admissions and ICU census in November and December. These occur shortly after transitions from blue (stage 2) to green (stage 1). The colors in the right-hand plot show the proportion of sample paths that are in each stage at each point in time, including those in green (stage 1) during November. *Bottom row:* The plots are identical to those in the top row except that the threshold for moving from blue to green is reduced from five to zero. None of the 300 projections under this policy resulted in November-December spikes.




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








Total Cases by Age Group and Sex
















Travis County Residents Who Have Not Received Second Dose





TXDSHS Vaccine Data for Travis County by Race and Ethnicity



Booster and Pediatric Emergency Use Authorization Status

Centers for Disease Control and Prevention Recommendations

- Pfizer-BioNTech or Moderna COVID-19 booster vaccines are recommended for the following groups 6 months or more after their initial series:
 •65 years and older
 •Age 18+ who live in long-term care settings
 •Age 18+ who have underlying medical conditions
 •Age 18+ who work or live in high-risk settings
- J&J COVID-19 Vaccine booster shot is recommended at 2 months after first dose for all populations that received an initial dose.
- CDC's recommendations now allow for mix and match dosing for booster shots.
- FDA is meeting today (10/26) to consider clinical trial data submitted by Pfizer for use of vaccines for children ages 5-11 years

PLANNING AHEAD: PEDIACTRIC VACCINE STRATEGY

Proactive planning for the COVID-19 vaccine for 5-11:

Direct Operations

- •APH will be a pediatric COVID-19 provider
- •11/8 distribute vaccine through four established locations
- •11/15 continue four static sites and add school pop up clinics in areas that have limited access points.
- •CHW team coordinating with schools in zip codes identified and promotion of clinics

Provider support

- Technical support to broader provider community.
- Provider survey to assess capacity and identify needs and gaps
- Parent survey to assess vaccine location and provider preferences and identify hesitancy
- Provider meeting Nov. 5th to address TA needs, safety concerns, and connect the provider network
- TA on vaccine management and reimbursement


