Posting Language

Authorize negotiation and execution of a cooperative contract with Precision Task Group, Inc. to provide licenses, maintenance, and support services for a workflow management software platform, for a term of five years in an amount not to exceed \$8,000,000.

The contract will continue to provide licenses, maintenance, and support services for the ServiceNow software platform for the City. The contract will expand the ServiceNow solution citywide in future years. The solution will continue providing information technology (IT) service management workflow for handling incidents, service requests, problems, and changes. The solution will also add a configuration management database which is a data repository for IT asset management and contains information about IT assets, systems, platforms, software, and other IT related data. The solution will also manage governance, risk, and compliance via the integrated risk management functionality for the Information Security Office.

The State of Texas Department of Information Resources cooperative establishes competitively bid contracts that can be utilized by the State and other government agencies through a cooperative agreement. Cooperative agreements save taxpayer dollars by leveraging the State's volume-buying power to drive down

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costs on hundreds of contracts through a streamlined cooperative purchasing program.
