Hello ICRC Members,

I live downtown without a car in an extremely efficient home (never had a utility bill over \$100) and rely on transit. As a result I have a very low carbon footprint as do most of my neighbors to the northwest of me in Austin City Lofts, to the north of me in 5th and West, East of me in 360, southeast of me in Northshore and southwest of me in Seaholm. What's odd to me is the new map cuts my building out of the downtown district going from District 9 to District 10 while all of my friends in all of those other communities in all directions from me stay in District 9.

My building, the Independent, sits on land found in the original Edwin Waller plan from 1839 and to put the tallest building in Austin in a district that is so low density and auto-centric makes zero sense to me.

Please do not fracture downtown. We're the most walkable and oldest neighborhood in the city; please allow us to remain in the most urban district.
