

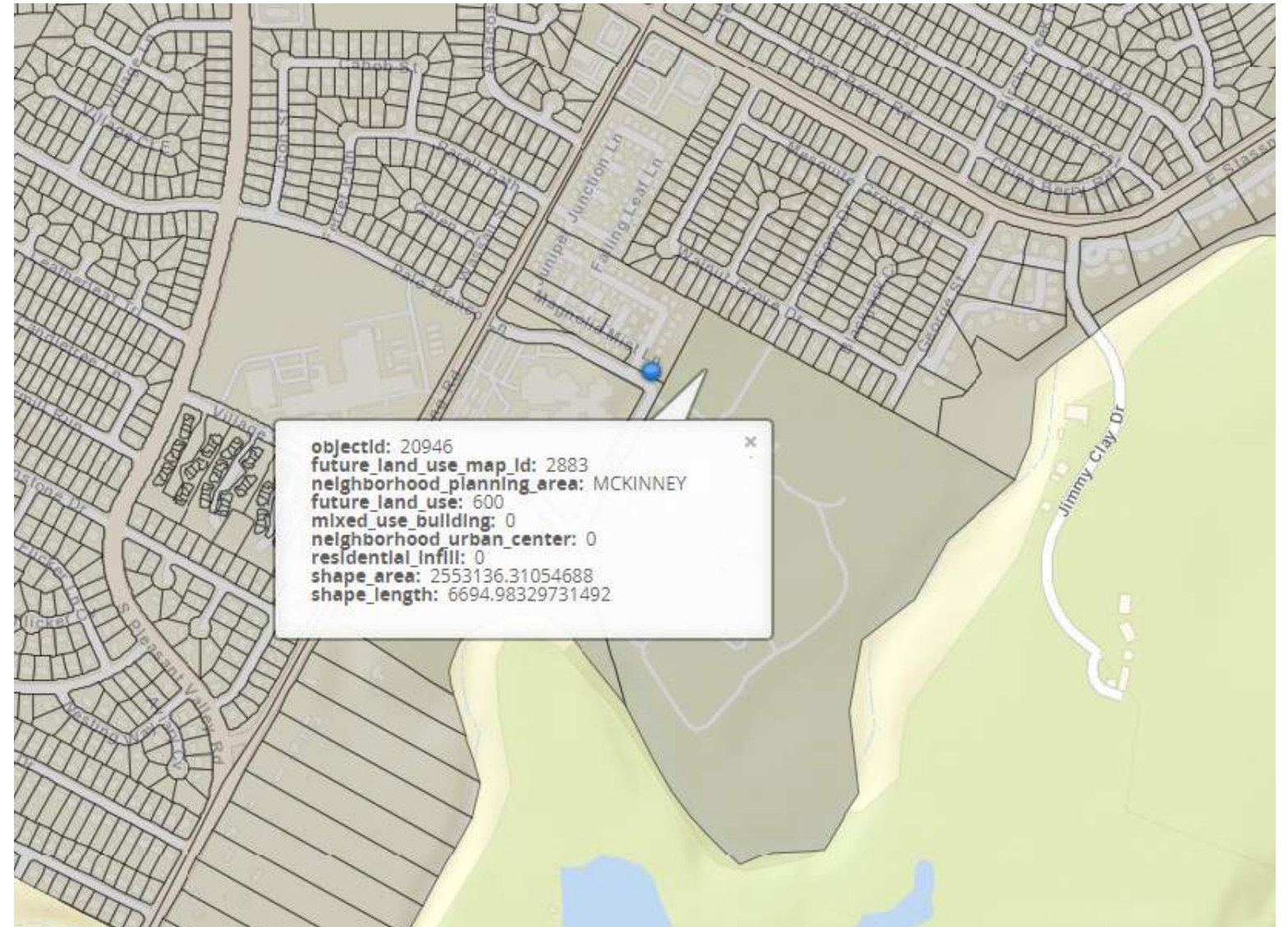

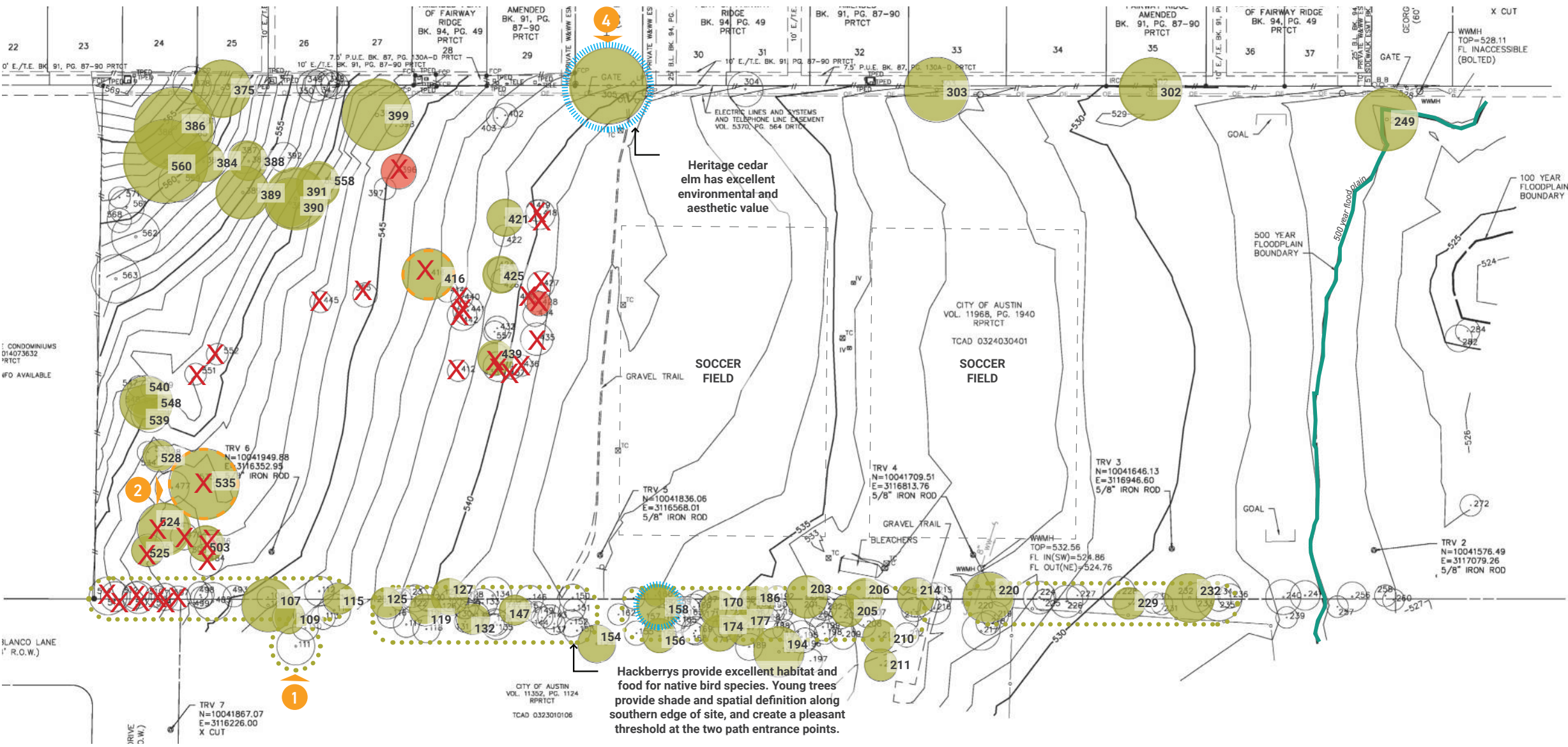

TREE CONSERVATION



Key

- Protected Tree
- Heritage Tree
- Tree observed to be in poor health
- Surveyed tree
- Invasive
- Tree to be removed

Key Findings:

- A small subset of trees are large enough and appear healthy enough to prioritize in the design; most trees will not require mitigation.
- Hackberrys around the southern and western edges provide spatial definition and value for wildlife; recommended to preserve these trees where possible.
- Some larger multistem Hackberrys and Mesquites are in poor health.

TREE OBSERVATIONS

1 Cedar Elm 111 near southwest corner has an upright growth pattern and can be seen from the south entrance.

2 Tree 535 is a large multi-trunked Honey Mesquite that appears to be in poor health.

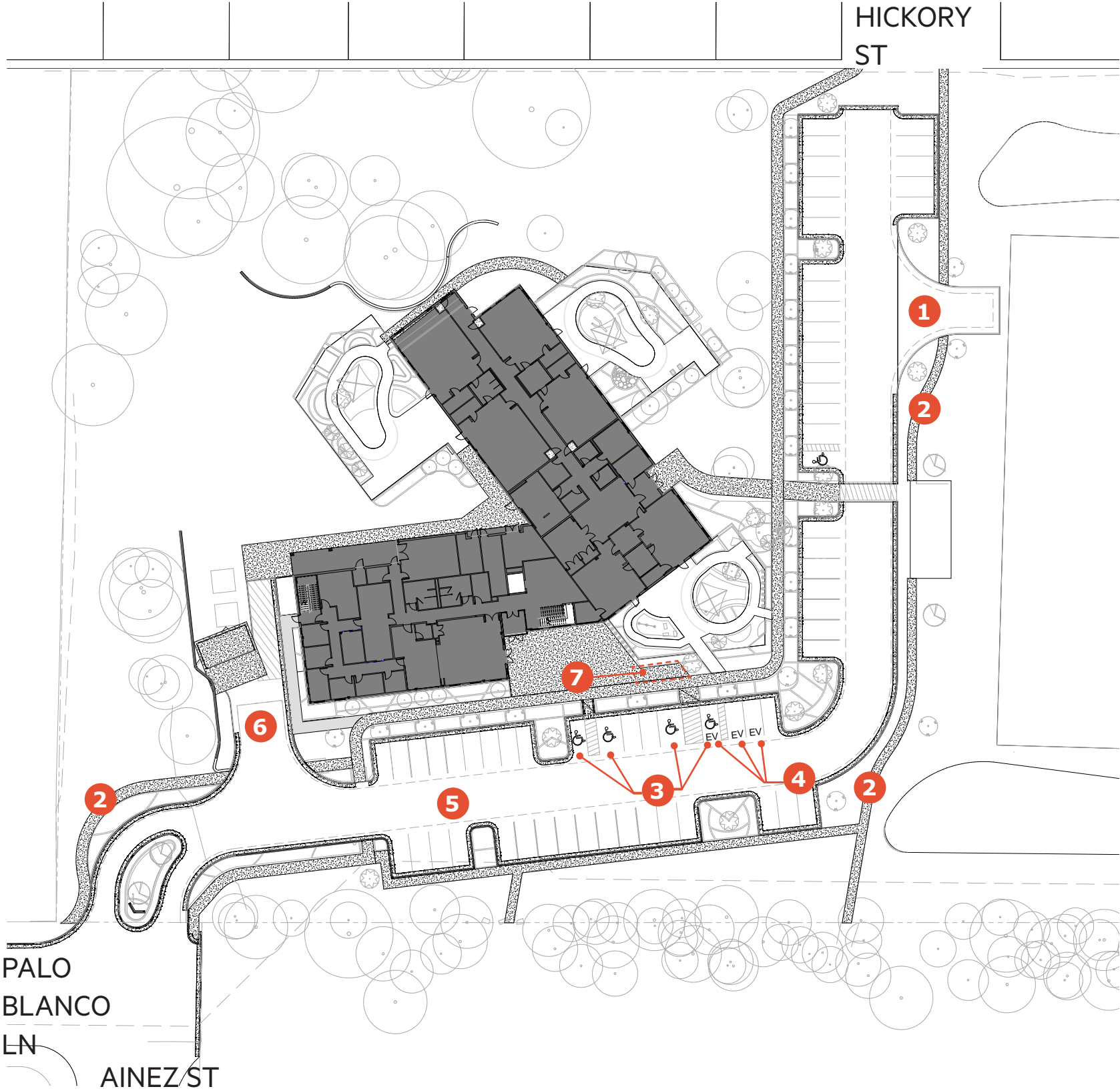
3 Scrub and early succession species such as Hackberry, Mesquite and Juniper dominate the eastern side of the site. Most growth is relatively small, with a dense understory. Hackberry is the most common tree species onsite.

4 A large Cedar Elm sits at the property line at the end of Hickory Street. This tree is likely in conflict with the proposed fire lane.

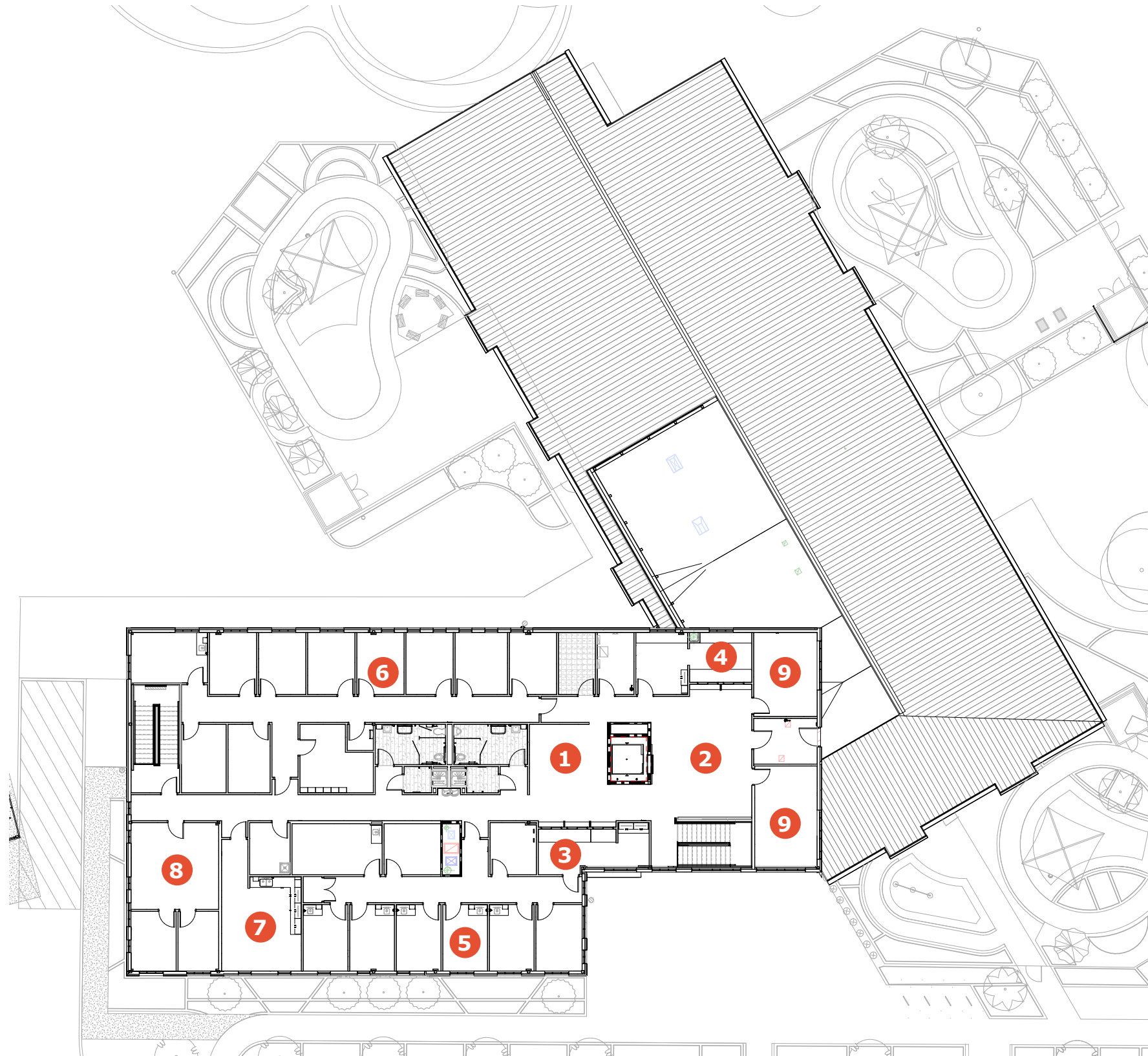

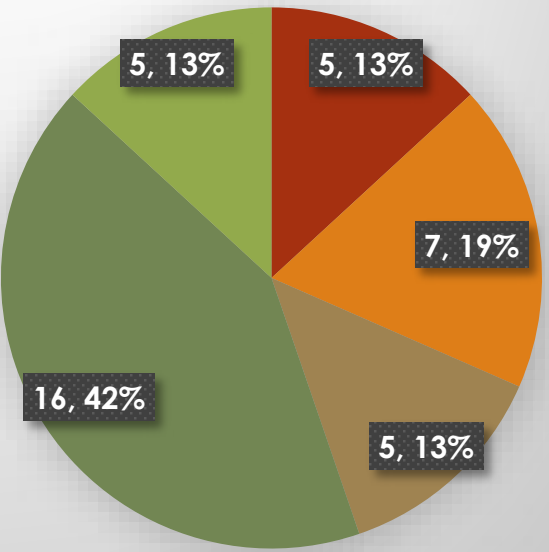

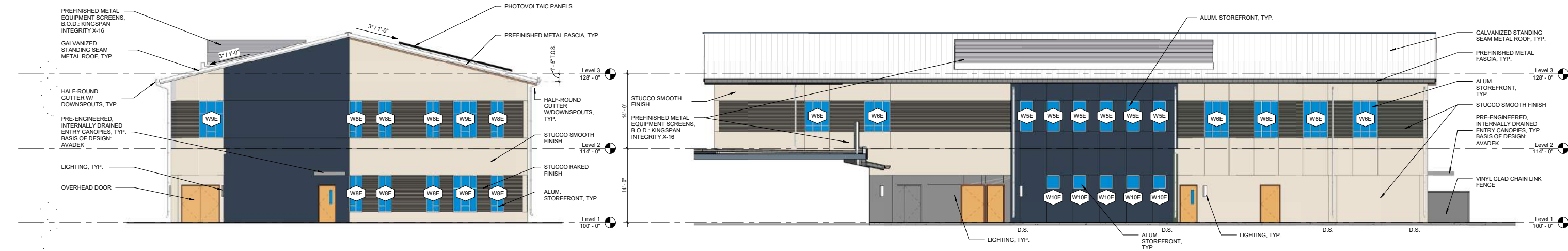
