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- (1) serve process issued by a municipal court under this chapter, including a Class C warrant, subpoena, or summons;
  - (2) transport a person with a Class C warrant between city and county courts, or booking and detention facilities;
  - (3) accept a person arrested for a Class C offense by a city police officer and process the person through a city court or detention facility;
  - (4) provide building and courtroom security for a municipal court under this chapter; and
  - (5) perform other duties as assigned by the municipal court clerk.
- (B) A city marshal or deputy city marshal may enforce all applicable laws or regulations in the course and scope of the performance of the duties described in Subsection (A).
- (C) Subsection (B) does not limit a city marshal's or deputy city marshal's law enforcement authority in the marshal's capacity as a peace officer.

**PART 2.** Sections 2-6-1 through 2-6-14 of the City Code are repealed.

**PART 3.** Sections 2-6-21, 2-6-22, 2-6-23, and 2-6-24 of the City Code are renumbered as Sections 2-6-1, 2-6-2, 2-6-3, and 2-6-4, respectively. Chapter 2-6, Article 3 (*Office of Emergency Management*) is renumbered as Article 1 (*Office of Emergency Management*).

**PART 4.** Chapter 2-6 (*Public Safety and Emergency Management Department*) is renamed Chapter 2-6 (*Emergency Management Department*).

**PART 5.** This ordinance takes effect on \_\_\_\_\_, 2021.
