Regarding: Election Precinct Boundaries Proposed Plan for 2022

Following redistricting at both the State and County level, Travis County Voter Registration undertook the task of realigning precinct boundaries. During this process, staff reviewed precinct sizes and dramatically reduced precincts that were near or exceeded the maximum size of 5,000 voters.

During the process of realigning precincts, staff looked at the following as the boundary dividers:

- 1. Highways and Toll Roads
- 2. Expressways, Arterials, FM Roads
- 3. Neighborhood Collectors
- 4. Waterways—river, lake, creeks, watersheds
- 5. Railroads
- 6. Parcels—property lines
- 7. Parks, green belts

Our goal was to bring neighborhoods back together when possible. Legislative boundaries didn't allow us to be 100% successful, however, we were able to make modifications to legacy precinct boundaries that had split neighborhoods. We were able to reunite neighborhoods or communities of interest in many cases.

A notice was mailed to both County Chairs, all election judges, and precinct chairs for both parties. In the case of the political party County Chairs, we hand delivered the notice and a copy of the backup. Additionally, the week prior to Thanksgiving, both County Chairs and key staff received email correspondence with our map link for them to share with precinct chairs for input. We consequently did receive communication back and were able in most cases to accommodate requests and/or suggestions. In some cases, we were unable to make the modifications due to legislative boundaries that do not allow us to cross over precinct lines.

With new precincts created, the Division also looked at the precinct numbering system or the lack of one. With this opportunity, a system was developed in precinct numbering. This system creates communities of interest within the system. Stakeholders who will benefit with this new system are:

- 1. Elections Division—in planning and directing resources regionally
- 2. Precinct Chairs—organizing in their region
- 3. General Public—organized manner in which to identify where their precinct is located
- 4. Elected Officials and candidates—better planning in identifying precincts as they maneuver meetings in the county.

The numbering system follows this rule—the County Courthouse is ground zero. From that point the first precinct in each Commissioner precinct is the '00' precinct. The Courthouse precinct is 300. The numbers fan out across the County in groupings of tens and are geographical. In the majority of number sequences, numbers remain unassigned to allow for future growth and adding new precincts.

We recommend in 10 years, that the County consider moving to the 4 digit numbering system just as the other urban counties (Harris, Bexar, Dallas and Tarrant) did nearly 20 years ago. As growth continues, precinct numbers could become scarce in any one Commissioner precinct.

As of today, we have 247 precincts. As you see below, we have over a quarter of precincts at or above the maximum of 5,000 voters in a precinct.

This leaves room for growth in all precincts and therefore, few precincts will need to be split over the next 10 years.


Of the precincts over 4,500 voters in the proposed plan, this is the breakdown by Commissioner Precinct:

Solutions have been outlined if the precincts exceed the 5,000 maximum within the next 10 years. A review will occur each January of the odd numbered years—2023, 2025, 2027, 2029, and 2031 in conjunction with redistricting. We also recommend for the Voter Registration Division to contact the Texas Legislative Council to ensure that situations like the one below don't occur.

This precinct was created when the House line was set with the top line boundary and the Congressional line was set with the 'V' line boundary. Had we had the time to talk with them, we might have prevented this situation.

Again, the breakdown by Commissioner Precinct is as follows for the grouping above:

- Commissioner Pct. 1—3 precincts
- Commissioner Pct. 2—7 precincts
- Commissioner Pct. 3—6 precinct
- Commissioner Pct. 4—5 precincts

In both groupings, an attempt at identifying solutions were made that do <u>not</u> require adding more precincts. At this time, only 7 precincts might require splitting and creating more precincts in the future if no modifications realigning with another smaller precinct can be accomplished.

We have created Overview cards for each Commissioner Precinct that shows the numbering sequence with a description of the location. It also lists the unassigned precinct numbers.


Precincts unassigned by Commissioner Precinct:
