SO IF YOU DON'T HAVE ONE YET, COME ON, GUYS.

WE ARE LIVE ON ATX PRIESTS IN THE BACK HERE.

WE JUST A FEW MORE COME ON IN.

GOOD MORNING WHEN I WAS THE MORNING, THE MORNING.

THANK YOU FOR JOINING ME TODAY.

MY NAME IS VANESSA FUENTES, AUSTIN CITY, COUNCILMAN FOR DISTRICT TWO.

IT IS AN HONOR TO STAND HERE WITH YOU ALL, SEEING SO MANY FAMILIAR FACES.

I TRULY FEEL LIKE, YOU KNOW, SOMEONE'S GOING TO FAMILIA AND IT'S SO GOOD TO START THE MORNING OFF WITH EACH OTHER, TO CELEBRATE AND MARK THE MANY CONTRIBUTIONS OF OUR HISPANIC COMMUNITY FROM SEPTEMBER 15TH TO OCTOBER 15TH, WE CELEBRATE HISPANIC HERITAGE MONTH, BUT WE KNOW THAT THE IMPACTS OF HISPANICS ARE FELT ON A DAILY BASIS.

THIS IS ESPECIALLY TRUE.

AS WE CONTINUE TO WORK OUR WAY THROUGH THE DEVASTATING PANDEMIC FROM ESSENTIAL WORKERS TO COMMUNITY ADVOCATES, OUR HENTAI HAS STEPPED UP WHILE SO MANY OTHERS HAVE STEPPED BACK SERVING ON THE FRONT LINES DURING COVID IS A TESTAMENT TO THE GENERATION OF HISPANICS WHO HAVE UPHELD MUCH OF OUR EVERYDAY LIFE.

THIS IS SOMETHING THAT WE SAW DURING THE WINTER FREEZE.

WHEN WE, WHEN OUR COMMUNITY WAS IN NEED, IT WAS THE LATINO COMMUNITY WHO STEPPED UP, WHO ORGANIZED A DONATION TO WERE MAKING LATE NIGHT CALLS, STANDING UP POPUP DISTRIBUTION WITH LITTLE LEAD TIME.

UH, WE WERE MAKING SURE THAT OUR NEIGHBORS GOT WATER, THAT WE GOT FOOD AND, AND, AND GOT DIAPERS FOR OUR CHILDREN.

SO, BUT THIS IS A CELEBRATORY DAY AND I CAN'T HELP, BUT JUST TAKE PRIDE IN NORTH DAKOTA, PRIDE IN OUR CULTURE AND EVERYTHING THAT WE HAVE, UH, IN CELEBRATION AND RECOGNITION OF EACH OTHER.

UH, WE STILL HAVE SYSTEMIC CHALLENGES THAT NEED TO BE ADDRESSED, BUT OUR HISTORY IS ONE OF RESILIENCE.

AND TODAY SERVES AS A REMINDER OF THE WORK THAT LIES AHEAD OF US.

SO AS DOLORES HUERTA, ONCE SAID, EVERY MOMENT IS AN ORGANIZING OPPORTUNITY.

EVERY PERSON IS A POTENTIAL ACTIVIST.

EVERY MINUTE IS A CHANCE TO CHANGE THE WORLD.

SO TODAY I'M PRESENTING A PROCLAMATION, BE IT KNOWN THAT WHEREAS THE HISPANIC HERITAGE MONTH IS CELEBRATED FROM SEPTEMBER 15TH TO OCTOBER 15TH, TO MARK THE MANY CONTRIBUTIONS OF HISPANIC COMMUNITY.

WHEREAS GENERATIONS OF HISPANICS IN AUSTIN HAVE, AND CONTINUE TO SHAPE AND UPHOLD EVERY ASPECT OF LIFE, INCLUDING THE HARD-FOUGHT ACHIEVEMENTS, SERVING ON THE FRONT LINES DURING THE COVID-19 PANDEMIC.

WHEREAS HISPANIC HERITAGE MONTH ALSO SERVES AS A REMINDER TO THE HISPANIC COMMUNITY THAT WE CONTINUE TO FACE VARIOUS SYSTEMIC CHALLENGES, WHICH REQUIRE LOCAL LEADERS TO ADDRESS THROUGH COMMITTED AND DEDICATED WORK, WHEREAS IN RECOGNITION OF THE CRITICAL CONTRIBUTION AND IN CELEBRATION OF THE HISPANIC HISTORY AND OUR TRADITIONS.

NOW, THEREFORE I, VANESSA WENT THIS AUSTIN CITY COUNCIL WOMAN, ALONG WITH MY COLLEAGUES, COUNCIL MEMBERS, ALTAR RENTERIA, COUNTERPART CASSADA AND MAYOR PRO TEM, NATASHA FROM MADISON AND, UH, THE REST OF THE CITY COUNCIL ON BEHALF OF STEVE ADLER, THE MAYOR OF BOSTON DO HEREBY PROCLAIM SEPTEMBER 15TH THROUGH OCTOBER 15TH, 2021 AS HISPANIC HERITAGE MONTH.

YES EXCEPT IN THIS PROCLAMATION, WE HAVE BALSA TANYA, WHO IS AN INCREDIBLE LEADER IN OUR COMMUNITY WHO HAS STEPPED UP AND SERVED OUR COMMUNITY DURING THIS GREAT TIME OF NEFD.

HE IS ACCEPTING THIS PROCLAMATION ON BEHALF OF THE AUSTIN LATINO COALITION, AND WE'LL BE OFFERING A FEW REMARKS.

PROUD, LATINO, YOU NAME IT.

UH, AND I'M PROUD TO BE A MEMBER OF THE AUSTIN LATINO COALITION, UH, WITH US TODAY, I DO WANT TO ACKNOWLEDGE

MEMBERS OF THE AUSTIN LATINO COALITION, THE DEL VALLEY COMMUNITY COALITION, UH, ABRA, THE U S HISPANIC CONTRACTORS ASSOCIATION, THE LATINO HEALTHCARE FORUM, LULAC LARISA ROUND TABLE BILL.

THEN CHINGONA PASS LOS VALDEZ.

LATINITAS ACADEMIC HISPANIC VOTERS COUNT IN AUSTIN, TEXAS THE GREATER AUSTIN HISPANIC CHAMBER OF COMMERCE, HISPANIC WOMEN'S NETWORK NETWORK OF TEXAS AUSTIN CHAPTER.

THE YOUNG HISPANIC PROFESSIONALS ASSOCIATION OF BOSTON, THE ABA YOU BOUGHT THE ACTION FUND GLENN MI MADRE, SOMOS, AUSTIN, HISPANIC IMPACT BOND, THE GREATER AUSTIN HISPANIC CHAMBER OF COMMERCE FOUNDATION, THE AUSTIN LATINO X LEADERSHIP LAB AND LA POLITICA.

AND I'M SURE THAT THERE ARE OTHERS THAT I HAVE MISSED, BUT I'M PROUD THAT ALL OF YOU ARE HERE.

AS THE COUNCIL WOMAN SAID, UH, EACH YEAR AMERICANS OBSERVE NATIONAL HISPANIC HERITAGE MONTH, OCTOBER, SEPTEMBER 15TH, TO OCTOBER 15TH, BY CELEBRATING OUR RICH CULTURAL HISTORIES, OUR CONTRIBUTIONS OF AMERICAN CITIZENS WHOSE ANCESTORS COME FROM MEXICO, FROM SPAIN, FROM THE CARIBBEAN, FROM CENTRAL AND SOUTH AMERICA.

YOU NAME IT.

WE COME FROM THERE, SIMPLY PUT, WE'RE NOT A MONOLITH.

LATINOS COME IN MANY SHADES.

AND OUR DIVERSITY SIMPLY ADDS TO THE BIBLE ANCY ABOUT EVEN HERE IN AUSTIN, TEXAS.

THIS OBSERVATION ACTUALLY STARTED BACK IN 1968 IF HISPANIC HERITAGE WEEK UNDER PRESIDENT LBJ.

AND THEN IT WAS EXPANDED BY PRESIDENT REAGAN IN 1988 TO COVER A 30 DAY PERIOD STARTING ON SEPTEMBER 15TH AND ENDING OCTOBER 15TH.

THE DAY OF SEPTEMBER 15TH IS SIGNIFICANT BECAUSE IT IS THE ANNIVERSARY OF THE INDEPENDENCE OF LATIN AMERICAN COUNTRIES LIKE COSTA RICA, EL SALVADOR, GUATEMALA, HONDURAS NICARAGUA, AND IN ADDITION, AND MAKE ONE IN SHEILA, WE CELEBRATE THE INDEPENDENCE STATE ON THE SSAS AND THE SEA AUTO RESPECTABLY.

ALSO THE OTHER LARISSA NOT COLUMBUS DAY, WHICH IS OCTOBER 12TH FALLS WITHIN THIS 30 DAY PERIOD, AMERICA AND AUSTIN GOT ITS FIRST LOOK AT THE 2020 CENSUS DATA WITHIN THE LAST COUPLE OF MONTHS.

AND WE HAVE SHOWN A PICTURE OF A NATION AND A CITY THAT IS GROWING MORE AND MORE DIVERSE LATINOS ACCOUNTED FOR MORE THAN HALF OF THE U.S. POPULATION GROWTH.

HALF OF THE POPULATION GROWTH IN TEXAS AND 20% OF THE GROWTH IN AUSTIN, TEXAS, HISPANIC WORKERS ARE THE ENGINE OF THE AMERICAN ECONOMY.

WE HAVE THE HIGHEST EMPLOYMENT RATE AMONG AMERICAN MEN AGED 16 TO 60.

OVER THE LAST 10 YEARS, WE HAVE INCREASED OUR CONTRIBUTION TO THE NATIONAL WORKFORCE BY 36%.

AND WE ARE JOB CREATORS.

WE'RE RESPONSIBLE FOR EIGHT OUT OF THE 10 NEW BUSINESSES IN THE UNITED STATES.

THANKS TO THE LATINAS, LATINOS THAT ARE SOME THAT ARE IN THIS ROOM TODAY.

THANK YOU LATINAS MORE OVER SOME 19 MILLION OF US QUALIFY AS ESSENTIAL WORKERS DURING THE PANDEMIC AND HISPANICS ARE NOT JUST BUSY PRODUCING.

WE'RE BUSY CONSUMING TO DRIVING THE MAJORITY OF GROWTH IN INDUSTRIES FROM CARS TO VIDEO GAMES.

OUR POPULATION HAS A PURCHASING POWER NOW OF 2.3 TRILLION, NOT BILLION TRILLION WITH A T THAT'S AN AMOUNT GREATER THAN THE GDP OF BRAZIL, CANADA, AND RUSSIA.

BUT WHILE WE ARE INCREASINGLY DRIVING BOATING AND BUYER PATTERNS IN AMERICA, WE ARE STILL CRIMINALLY UNDERREPRESENTED IN POSITIONS OF POWER IN THE PUBLIC AND PRIVATE SECTOR, ACROSS THE ENTIRETY OF BOARDS OF DIRECTORS OF FORTUNE 500 COMPANIES.

LATINOS ONLY HOLD A GRAND TOTAL OF 3% OF THOSE SEATS ARE LACK OF REPRESENTATION AND POLITICAL OPPOSITES ALSO DISCONCERTING WHEN COMPARED WITH OUR IMPACTS IN ELECTIONS OF, OF ALL 535 SENATORS AND MEMBERS OF THE HOUSE OF REPRESENTATIVES, ONLY 8% ARE LATINO.

WIDEN THE LENS.

THE PICTURE IS EVEN MORE GRIM.

LATINOS ONLY REPRESENT ABOUT 1% OF LOCAL AND FEDERAL OFFICES ACROSS AMERICA.

YET WE'RE RAPIDLY GROWING AS A SHARE OF THE ELECTORATE.

IN FACT, EVERY 30 SECONDS, LATINO TURNS 18 AND BECOMES AN ELIGIBLE VOTER.

AND HERE IN AUSTIN, TEXAS, WE REPRESENT 32 AND A HALF PERCENT OF THE TOTAL POPULATION, WHICH MEANS WE ARE 313,000 STRONG.

AND IN TRAVIS COUNTY WE REPRESENT 34%.

THAT MEANS WE ARE 429,000 STRONG, APPROXIMATELY 220 LATINOS.

220,000 LATINOS ARE CONSIDERED CITIZEN AND VOTING ELIGIBLE VOTERS.

AND ABOUT 1100, 1000 1100 ARE ACTUALLY REGISTERED VOTERS AS A COUNTRY.

AND OUR CITY GETS INCREASINGLY MORE DIVERSE AND AS MUCH NEEDED CONVERSATIONS
ABOUT RACE CONTINUES, LATINOS TO NEED TO BE PART OF AMERICA AND OUR CITY'S CONVERSATION
ON RACE EQUITY, DIVERSITY AND INCLUSION AMERICA, AND AUSTIN'S FUTURE IT'S LATINO IS LATINO
AND IT STARTS AND IT'S TIME TO START TREATING US.

LIKE WE MATTER THE STORIES ABOUT LATINO HISTORY EXPERIENCE AND HOW WE HAVE POSITIVELY, POSITIVELY INFLUENCED AUSTIN IS INSPIRING.

THE VERY FIRST CENSUS WAS TAKEN IN AUSTIN 146 YEARS AGO AND GET THROUGH THE FIRST TWO NAMES ON THAT CENSUS, WHERE IT WAS A COUPLE OF NAMES, JOSE AND LIZZIE LOPEZ.

AND IN

18 75, 297, MEXICAN AMERICANS LIVE ALONG THE SHORES WHERE THE SEAHOLM POWER PLANT USED TO BE.

I WOULD BE REMISS IF I DID NOT TAKE INTO THIS OPPORTUNITY TO ALSO TALK ABOUT THE COVID PANDEMIC AS COUNCILWOMAN OH, WENT AS ALLUDED TO THE UNFORTUNATE REALITY OF HOW OUR LATINO COMMUNITIES HAVE BEEN DECIMATED ACROSS THE COUNTRY.

AND HERE IN AUSTIN, AS OF THIS WEEK, WE'VE LOST 1,095 AUSTIN, TRAVIS COUNTY RESIDENTS, LATINOS UNFORTUNATELY REPRESENT 50% OF THOSE DEATHS.

THAT MEANS THAT WE'VE LOST 548 LATINOS FROM THE AUSTIN TRAVIS COUNTY COMMUNITY.

IF WE TRULY WANT TO HONOR THE LIVES AND LEGACIES OF LATINOS, THEN WE MUST SEIZE THIS OPPORTUNITY NOW TO GET VACCINATED, TO PROTECT, TO PROTECT OUR FUTURE, OUR FAMILY MEMBERS AND FUTURE GENERATIONS OF THE LATINO COMMUNITY.

I'M EXTREMELY PROUD TO BE, UH, WORKING IN PARTNERSHIP WITH THE AUSTIN'S LATINO COALITION MEMBERS, MANY OF WHOM WHO ARE HERE TODAY, OVER THE COURSE OF THE MAJORITY OF THIS PANDEMIC AND FOR OVER 76 WEEKS.

NOW, WE HAVE PROVIDED CULTURALLY RELEVANT, BILINGUAL PUBLIC INFORMATION, INFORMATION, RESOURCES, SUPPORT, INCLUDING COVID TESTING, FOOD, WATER, FINANCIAL SUPPORT, FLU SHOTS, AND VACCINATIONS TO OVER 73,000 FAMILIARS HERE IN AUSTIN AND COUNTING.

FINALLY, I WANT TO THANK COUNCILWOMAN VANESSA , WHO HAS BEEN WITH US SINCE DAY ONE.

WE VALUE AND APPRECIATE HER LEADERSHIP, HER ADVOCACY, HER VOICE, HER REPRESENTATION ON THE COUNCIL DIAS, BECAUSE WE KNOW THAT YOUR SUCCESS IS OUR SUCCESS, NOT JUST FOR

LATINOS, BUT FOR ALL AUSTINITES WE ADMIRE YOUR PERSISTENCE, YOUR TENACITY, AND EXTREME, EXTREME, PROUD OF YOUR MOTTO.

GOOD ASK.

YES.

I WANT TO HAVE JILL SAY A FEW WORDS AS WELL.

OKAY.

YOU ALSO, DO YOU WANT TO MEET US? I AM THE CEO OF THE LATINO HEALTHCARE FORUM, BUT I'M ALSO A VERY PROUD MEMBER OF THE AUSTIN LATINO COALITION.

AND IT'S JUST REALLY, REALLY WONDERFUL.

IT JUST FULFILLS MY HEART TO SEE ALL OF YOU HERE TODAY.

I AM NOT GOING TO GO OVER SOME OF THE THINGS THAT COUNCIL, WOMAN APPRENTICE I'VE ALREADY MENTIONED AND, AND PAUL, BUT, UH, WE ARE A FAMILY SOMEONE'S GOING TO FAMILIAR.

AND SOMETIMES WOMEN, I GET ALONG A HUNDRED PERCENT, BUT YOU KNOW, WE ARE HERE AND WE WILL CONTINUE BEING TOGETHER.

I MEAN, I WORK CLOSELY WITH PAUL AND Y'ALL HAVE NO IDEA OTHER WORK.

HE DOES THIS MAN NEVER SLEEPS.

I MEAN, I TALKED TO HIM AT 12 O'CLOCK AT NIGHT AND HE'S UP AT FOUR OR FIVE IN THE MORNING.

AND YOU KNOW, WHAT DRIVES HIM? WHAT DRIVES HIM IS THE FACT THAT WE NEED TO CONTINUE ADDRESSING THE CHALLENGES THAT WE HAVE.

AND THANK YOU, VANESSA, FOR, UH, YOU KNOW, FOR THIS.

AND I'M JUST SO HAPPY TO BE HERE WITH YOU.

THANK YOU.

I FELT, I FELT TOO TO THINK WHEN THE PANDEMIC STARTED, OF COURSE, THE FIRST ONE WHO STEPPED UP WAS COUNCIL MEMBER AND HIS OFFICE, THE VERY FIRST MEETING, HE KNEW WE WERE GOING TO BE COMPLAINING, BUT HE WAS THERE AND OFFERED US RESOURCES AND SUPPORT.

HE WAS THERE.

UH, AND I'M PROUD TO PRESENT THIS PROCLAMATION TODAY TO, UH, WHERE WE AT HAVE SO MANY FOLKS THAT HAVE BEEN WORKING REALLY HARD ON THE FRONT LINES, TRYING TO MAKE SURE WE TAKE CARE OF OUR COMMUNITY.

AND SO BE IT KNOWN THAT WE'RE AS THE AUSTIN CODE DEPARTMENT PROVIDES FOR THE SAFETY, HEALTH, AND WELFARE OF RESIDENTS, LIVING IN COMMUNITIES THROUGHOUT THE CITY OF AUSTIN, THROUGH EDUCATION, COLLABORATION, AND ENFORCEMENT OF BUILDING ZONING, HOUSING, PROPERTY MAINTENANCE, AND OTHER CODES AND ORDINANCES.

AND WHEREAS OUR STAFF AT AUSTIN CODE ARE DEDICATED WELL-TRAINED AND HIGHLY RESPONSIBLE INDIVIDUALS COMMITTED TO PROMOTING THE CITY'S OUTCOMES OF BEING SAFE IN OUR HOME AND OUR WORK AND IN OUR COMMUNITY.

AND WHEREAS OUR CODE OFFICERS RESPOND AND PROVIDE ENFORCEMENT INVESTIGATING MORE THAN 38,000 CITYWIDE CODE CASES PER YEAR, AND PERFORMING OVER 75,000 INSPECTIONS.

SO I'M PROPOSING AN ALTERNATIVE TO THE CURRENT SITUATION, A PRAGMATIC WAY TO FUND RENEWABLE GAS RESEARCH AND EQUITY FOR THE POOR IN A TIME OF INCREASING GAS, UTILITY COSTS AND CLIMATE EMERGENCIES, REPURPOSE EXISTING MISSPENT MONEY, TEXAS GAS SERVICE HAS A QUESTIONABLE CONSERVATION PROGRAM.

CURRENTLY AS MUCH AS \$1.9 MILLION IS BEING WASTED ON ENERGY EFFICIENCY PROGRAMS THAT DO NOT SAVE MUCH ENERGY.

FOR EXAMPLE, THE GAS COMPANIES REBATES FOR GLASS GAS CLOTHES DRYERS WILL PAY AS MUCH AS \$325

TO SAY \$1 AND 32 CENTS A YEAR ON FUEL.

THE PAYBACK CAN BE AS LONG AS 246 YEARS, LET'S TAKE THE MONEY FROM THIS AND OTHER SIMILARLY WORTHLESS PROGRAMS AND SPEND IT ON RESEARCH FOR RENEWABLE ENERGY AND ASSISTANCE TO THE POOR.

WE COULD CREATE SOMETHING SIMILAR TO AUSTIN.

ENERGY'S CUSTOMER BENEFIT, CHARGE THIS REPURPOSING STRETCH.

I'M GOING TO READ MY LAST SENTENCE COUNCIL.

THE CONSERVATION ADJUSTMENT CLAUSE WILL BE UP FOR YOUR REVIEW IN NOVEMBER, AND I URGE YOU TO SERIOUSLY CONSIDER THIS ALTERNATIVE.

I THINK THE NEXT SPEAKER WAS KRISTA GILHAUSEN AND THEN ON-DECK AFTER KRISTIN IS MARY CASTLE.

I'M SORRY, YOUR NAME IS NOT KRISTEN.

IT IS KRISTA.

THANK YOU.

HI, GOOD MORNING.

MY NAME IS KRISTA GILHAUSEN AND I'M A GRADUATE STUDENT STUDYING PUBLIC AFFAIRS COMMUNITY REGIONAL PLANNING AT UT I'M HERE TO TESTIFY IN SUPPORT OF THE CLIMATE EQUITY PLAN.

UM, A COUPLE OF HIGHLIGHTS FROM THE MOST RECENT IPC REPORT.

WE ARE NOT ON TRACK TO LIMIT WARMING TO A 1.5 OR EVEN TWO DEGREES CELSIUS.

IF IN THIS CENTURY, THERE IS NO DOUBT THAT HUMAN MADE GHG EMISSIONS HAVE DRIVEN UNPRECEDENTED, UNPRECEDENTED WARMING.

SINCE THE INDUSTRIAL REVOLUTION, WARMING WILL NOT SLOW DOWN UNLESS WE DRASTICALLY REDUCE THESE NET GHG EMISSIONS.

HOWEVER, EVEN WITH DRASTIC REDUCTIONS, WE WILL STILL ALL FEEL THE EFFECTS OF CLIMATE CHANGE AND AT LEAST THE COMING DECADES AND IN OUR REGION, SPECIFICALLY DROUGHT AND FIRE WEATHER ALREADY INCREASING AND ARE EXPECTED TO CONTINUE INCREASING WITH CONTINUED WARMING.

WE WILL ALSO SEE INCREASED EXTREME PARTICIPATION IN RIVER FLOODING, WHICH HAS HISTORICALLY BEEN A CHALLENGE FOR AUSTIN.

UM, THE STRENGTH OF THE CLIMATE EQUITY PLAN COMES IF IT'S DIVERSITY OF SOLUTIONS WHILE, UM, FRAUGHT WITH SOME POLITICAL CHALLENGES, UM, I WOULD URGE THE CITY OF BOSTON TO STILL MOVE TOWARDS REWRITING ITS LAND DEVELOPMENT CODE.

INCREASING HOUSING SUPPLY FOR THE PROVISION OF DENSITY WILL POSITIVELY IMPACT THE CLIMATE.

YOU KNOW, HOUSING TYPES LIKE DUPLEXES, ACCESSORY, DWELLING, UNITS, AND TOWNHOMES CAN ACCOMPLISH THIS GOAL.

ADDITIONALLY, TRANSPORTATION POLICIES LIKE PROJECT CONNECT CAN IMPROVE WALKABILITY AND BIKEABILITY AND IMPROVE CLIMATE'S AUSTIN'S CLIMATE BURDEN.

UM, THESE POLICIES INCREASE AUSTIN'S IS OUR ABILITY AS A CITY IN TERMS OF ECONOMIC DEVELOPMENT, LIVABILITY, TOURISM, AND OTHER AMENITIES.

AND THEN ADDITIONALLY, AUSTIN SHOULD MOVE BEYOND THE CLIMATE EQUITY PLAN TO CREATE A COMPREHENSIVE FOOD SYSTEM PLAN.

BUT THIS PLAN DOES GO IN A GOOD DIRECTION WITH SOME POLICIES LIKE GOOD FOOD PURCHASING, INCENTIVIZING PLANT-BASED FOODS AND POLICIES DEDICATED TO LOWERING FOOD WASTE.

UM, WHAT'S MOST WHAT'S MOST WORTH MENTIONING AND IMPORTANT TO ME IS THE PLANT'S EMPHASIS ON EQUITY WHILE IT'S A LOT OF BOULDER PUBLIC ENGAGEMENT THAT WENT INTO INFORMING THIS PLAY ON THE POLICIES THEMSELVES ARE WHAT WILL IMPACT UNDERREPRESENTED COMMUNITIES.

THE MOST MARGINALIZED GROUPS ARE THE ONES WHO ARE MOST EFFECTED BY THE LACK OF ACTION ON CLIMATE.

AND THAT'S TRUE FOR PAST AS WELL AND DUE TO STRUCTURAL RACISM AND AUSTIN'S PHYSICAL INFRASTRUCTURE EAST AUSTIN NEIGHBORS HAVE INJURED, ENVIRONMENTAL RACISM, FOOD DESERTS, AND A LACK OF COMMUNITY SERVICES AND ACCESSIBLE PROXIMITY.

WE DON'T HAVE TO IMAGINE WHAT, OH, LET ME FINISH MY LAST SENTENCE.

UM, TAKING ACTION ON AUSTIN'S EQUITY PLAN IS A STEP IN THE RIGHT DIRECTION AND MAKING IMMENSE.

THANK YOU.

THANK YOU VERY MUCH.

NEXT STEP.

I BELIEVE IT WAS MARY CASTLE.

AND THEN AFTER MARY CASTLE, WE HAVE RICHARD SUBTLE.

I DON'T SEE MR. SUTTLES RAFTER, MS. CASTLE.

WE HAVE HEATHER SIN.

YOU HAVE TWO MINUTES MORNING MAYOR ADLER AND MEMBERS OF THE COUNCIL AND MAYOR PRO TEM, UH, UM, HARPER, MADISON, THANK YOU FOR THIS TIME TO SPEAK.

MY NAME IS MARY ELIZABETH CASTLE AND I'M THE SENIOR POLICY ADVISOR AT TEXAS VALUES.

I AM ALSO AN AUSTIN RESIDENT IN DISTRICT SIX, AND I'M HERE TO SPEAK IN OPPOSITION OF THE RESOLUTION AND AGENDA ITEM ONE 11 EVERY TIME THE STATE LEGISLATURE PASSES PRO-LIFE LEGISLATION, THE CITY COUNCIL TRIES TO KNOWINGLY GO AGAINST THAT NEWLY PASSED LAW.

AND THIS RESOLUTION, EVEN AT MIDST, BY TALKING ABOUT YOUR ACTIONS, WHEN THE 2011 BUDGET CUTS OCCURRED, THE ACTIONS YOU TOOK IN THE 84TH SESSION WHEN AFTER HB TWO WAS PASSED AND NOT TO MENTION THE INFAMOUS FUNDING FOR ABORTION SERVICES, YOU APPROVED AFTER SB 22 HAS PASSED.

AND THE 2019 LEGISLATURE, I ASKED THE BOARD TO NOT PASS THIS RESOLUTION FOR THE FOLLOWING REASONS.

FIRST, IT WILL LEAD DOWN A PATH TO ONCE AGAIN, VIOLATE SB 22 FROM THE 2019 TEXAS LEGISLATIVE SESSION WITH CREATING LEGAL FUNDS TO HELP ASSIST

UM, IT IS ALWAYS ABOUT POLITICAL POSTURING WITH THE CITY COUNCIL OPPOSING ANY PRO-LIFE LEGISLATION.

AND IT'S NOT ABOUT SOME OF THE ISSUES THAT WE FACE IN AUSTIN, SUCH AS HOMELESS WOMEN ON THE STREET, FINDING HOUSING, HELPING YOUNG WOMEN AND MOTHERS FIND A CALLING OR PROFESSION, OR EVEN KEEPING THE AUSTIN CITY STREETS SAFE ENOUGH FOR GIRLS AND WOMEN TO WALK DOWN ON THE DAILY BASIS.

AND YOU MAY THINK THAT SBA DISPROPORTIONATELY AFFECTS CERTAIN PEOPLE, BUT THINK ABOUT THE LIVES YOU'RE AFFECTING AS WELL WITH THAT, I WILL SPEAK IN OPPOSITION OF AGENDA ITEM ONE 11.

AND AFTER HEATHER, WE HAVE EMILY LEBLANC AND THEN GABINO FERNANDEZ.

HELLO COUNCIL AND MS. FROM MY EAST SIDE NEIGHBORHOOD.

UH, I DIDN'T HAVE A FEW EXTRA SECONDS.

I DIDN'T THINK I'D HAVE.

SO I WOULD JUST LIKE TO SAY THAT STATISTICALLY, I KNOW AT LEAST ONE OF YOU UP HERE HAS BEEN MOLESTED OR IN DECENTLY ASSAULTED OR RAPED.

UM, WITHOUT STATISTICS, I KNOW EVERY SINGLE ONE OF, YOU KNOW, MORE THAN ONE PERSON WHO HAS, SO HOPEFULLY YOU CAN KEEP THEM IN MIND.

UH, WHEN I SAY MY NAME'S HEATHER SIN, I'M HERE TO GIVE A VOICE TO THOUSANDS OF DISABLED WOMEN.

WHO'VE BEEN VICTIMS AND SOME SURVIVORS OF SEXUAL ASSAULT AND VIOLENCE HERE.

UH, WITH ALL RESPECT, I THINK YOU CAN DO BETTER WITH 158 WITH THIS APPOINTMENT.

I THINK WE DESERVE BETTER.

UM, WE, THIS VERY BROKEN POLICE DEPARTMENT HAS FAILED AND EVEN HARMED SO MANY OF US.

WE HAVE A GOLDEN OPPORTUNITY HERE TO CREATE SOMETHING NEW, TO CREATE SOMETHING GREAT TO EFFECT PROFOUND CHANGE.

BUT THE ONLY OPTION WE'RE BEING GIVEN IS A 20 YEAR PRODUCT OF THAT BROKENNESS AND A PROMISE THAT HE'S DIFFERENT AND HE'S BETTER.

WHAT WE ARE DROWNING IN PROMISES AND PROMISE OF EVIDENCE, PROTOCOL, SURVIVOR PROTOCOL, VICTIM SERVICES, HAVING A SEAT AT THE TABLE, EVEN A CALL BACK FROM A COP, NONE ARE MANIFEST.

SO WHAT IF HE ISN'T BETTER? THAT'S THE SCARY PART.

I DON'T HAVE ANY RECOURSE.

YOU DON'T HAVE ANY RECOURSE.

YOU CAN'T FIRE HIM.

SO I'M HERE AS ONE OF THOUSANDS TO SAY THAT I HOPE YOU CAN DISSENT OR AT LEAST DELAY THIS UNTIL YOU FIND SOMEONE BETTER FOR US UNTIL YOU FIND SOMEONE BETTER FOR ME, WHO CAN HELP ME BECAUSE IN SEVEN YEARS I HAVEN'T GOTTEN ANY HELP.

SO I NEED TO MAKE ANOTHER CORRECTION FOR THE RECORD.

UM, SO ON CORRECTIONS OR CHANGES AND CORRECTIONS ITEM NUMBER 22, IT SAYS THE WORD RENTERS HAS BEEN STRICKEN, BUT AS STATED FOR ITEM 22, THE WORD RENTERS IS DELETED AND THE NEW WORD IS TENANTS.

SO TENANTS HAS BEEN ADDED IN IT'S PLACE.

GOOD MORNING.

I'VE COME BEFORE THIS COUNCIL, SEVERAL TIMES OVER THE LAST DECADE TO ASK YOUR SUPPORT, ASK YOUR SUPPORT FOR SURVIVORS OF SEXUAL ASSAULT AND DOMESTIC VIOLENCE.

I'VE TOLD YOU ABOUT THOUSANDS OF SURVIVORS I'VE WORKED WITH AS A COUNSELOR, AS AN ADVOCATE, NONE OF WHOM HAVE FOUND JUSTICE HAVE STOOD BESIDE SURVIVORS, AS THEY'VE TOLD YOU THEIR STORIES.

WHAT I HAVEN'T EVER TOLD YOU IS THAT I TOO AM A SURVIVOR OF SEXUAL ASSAULTS, JUST DOING THE MATH I'D SUSPECT.

SOME OF YOU ARE TOO.

AND I CAN TELL YOU FROM MY PERSONAL EXPERIENCE THAT WHEN A SURVIVOR TELLS YOU HER STORY, SHE DOES, SHE OPENS A PAINFUL WOUND AT A PERSONAL COST TO HERSELF, OUT OF SELFLESS AND GENEROUS HOPE, NOT FOR HER OWN, BUT FOR SOMEONE ELSE'S FUTURE, HOW YOU RESPOND MATTERS, MAKING GOOD ON YOUR PROMISES MATTERS.

YOU'VE LISTENED AND TIME AND TIME AGAIN, YOU'VE, YOU'VE VOTED TO SUPPORT SURVIVORS.

AND STILL WHAT WE HEAR FROM THE DEPARTMENT IS THAT THE UNIT DOES NOT HAVE WHAT IT'S, WHAT IT NEEDS.

AND SURVIVORS ARE FINDING, NOT JUST

JUSTICE.

TURNOVER IS HIGH.

MORALE IS LOW AND TRAINING IS INADEQUATE.

IN FACT, SURVIVORS ARE BEING TOLD BY PATROL OFFICERS THAT THEY CANNOT INVESTIGATE THEIR ASSAULTS BECAUSE THEY'VE BEEN DEFUNDED.

THE CULTURE HAS NOT CHANGED BECAUSE FRANKLY IT HASN'T HAD TO, THE STATUS QUO HAS BEEN REWARDED TIME AND TIME AGAIN.

AND THE DECISION BEFORE YOU TODAY IS REALLY WHETHER OR NOT YOU'RE OKAY WITH THAT.

AND ULTIMATELY HOW MANY WOMEN WILL BE RAPED, BEATEN, OR DIE.

AS A RESULT, THE SHINING LIGHT IN A BROKEN SYSTEM HAS BEEN VICTIM SERVICES.

THEY'RE NATIONALLY RECOGNIZED, AND THEY'RE ONE OF THE BEST THEY REPRESENT CRIME VICTIMS, NOT JUST OF SEXUAL ASSAULT AND DOMESTIC VIOLENCE, BUT ALL CRIME VICTIMS. AND THEY'VE BEEN THE VOICE OF CHANGE WITHIN THE DEPARTMENT AT GREAT COST TO THEMSELVES.

EXECUTIVE, YOU VOTED TO ELEVATE THE VOICE OF EXECUTIVE TO EXECUTIVE LEADERSHIP AS THE COMMUNITY AND EXPERTS ASKED YOU TO DO.

AND YET APD LEADERSHIP CHOSE TO IGNORE THAT DIRECTIVE.

DO VICTIMS DESERVE A VOICE IN A SYSTEM MEANT TO SERVE AND PROTECT THEM IF WE'RE NOT ACTUALLY COMMITTED TO IMPROVING THE SYSTEM FOR VICTIMS AND SURVIVORS? MY ONLY REMAINING ASK IS THAT WE'D BE HONEST ABOUT THAT.

LET US MAKE INFORMED DECISIONS ABOUT WHETHER OR NOT TO REPORT CRIMES, KNOWING WE WON'T HAVE A VOICE ON THE SYSTEM IF WE DO.

THANK YOU.

THANK YOU FOR TIME.

I HAVE, UH, I'D LIKE TO SPEAK COUNCILMEMBER ELSA.

THANK YOU, MS. LEBLANC, UM, FOR SHARING YOUR EXPERIENCE, I KNOW THAT IS DIFFICULT.

UM, AND THANK YOU FOR SHOWING UP AGAIN AND AGAIN, TO KEEP US, UM, ACCOUNTABLE.

UM, EVEN YESTERDAY'S NEW YORK TIMES ON THE OPINION PAGE, THERE WAS AN ARTICLE THAT REALLY CALLED OUT THE NEED.

UM, ONCE AGAIN, FOR LOCAL STATE AND FEDERAL CHANGES TO ADDRESS OUR SEXUAL ASSAULT RESPONSE SYSTEM, UM, AUSTIN WAS CALLED OUT AS ONE OF THE CITIES THAT HAS BEEN SUED BY SURVIVORS FOR NOT STANDING UP TO, TO OUR VALUES.

UM, THAT'S NOT OKAY.

AND WE'VE BEEN WORKING ON THIS FOR A LONG TIME.

UM, AND I AGREE WITH YOU THAT THE DECISION BEFORE US TODAY IS A REALLY IMPORTANT ONE AND WILL SET THE TONE, UM, FOR, UM, HOW WE MOVE FORWARD WITH THE STUFF THAT WE SET IN MOTION WITH RESPECT TO SEXUAL ASSAULT RESPONSE.

I'D LIKE TO ASK YOU, IF YOU COULD GIVE US SOME EXAMPLES OF CHALLENGES, SEXUAL ASSAULT, SURVIVORS, AND ADVOCATES ARE CURRENTLY EXPERIENCING AND HOW THEY CAN BE REMEDIED.

SURE.

THE, THE EXAMPLES THAT I'VE HEARD RECENTLY ARE, UM, AS I STATED BEFORE, SURVIVORS BEING TOLD, UM, BY PATROL OFFICERS THAT THEIR CRIMES WILL NOT BE INVESTIGATED BECAUSE THE POLICE DEPARTMENT HAS BEEN DEFUNDED THAT LEAVES VICTIMS WITH NO RECOURSE, NO PROTECTION.

UM, IT MEANS THE PROSECUTOR'S OFFICE CANNOT PROSECUTE THOSE CRIMES BECAUSE THEY'RE NOT BEING INVESTIGATED.

UM, AND WHO ARE WE SUPPOSED TO CALL IF NOT OUR POLICE DEPARTMENT? UM, I'VE HEARD FROM SURVIVORS, UM, HAVING DIFFICULTY FEELING AS THOUGH THERE ARE ROADBLOCKS PUT IN THE PLACE, UM, TO KEEP THEM FROM PROCEEDING IN THE CRIMINAL JUSTICE SYSTEM.

I THINK IT'S BECOME HARDER FOR VICTIM SERVICES TO DO THEIR JOB.

UM, NEW LEGISLATION PASSED TO ALLOW SAFE ADVOCATES TO BE PRESENT WHEN DETECTIVES INTERVIEW VICTIMS. UM, I WOULD BE REALLY INTERESTED TO HEAR FROM SAFE, HOW THAT IS GOING, BUT IT'S MY UNDERSTANDING VICTIM SERVICES HAS BEEN CUT OUT OF THAT EXPLANATION TO VICTIMS. THE VICTIMS WILL HAVE TO A DETECTIVE THAT THEY WANT TO ASSERT THEIR RIGHT TO HAVE AN ADVOCATE PRESENT WITH THEM.

UM, VICTIMS. AREN'T GOING TO DO THAT.

THERE'S TOO BIG OF A POWER DIFFERENTIAL WITH THE DETECTIVE, AND THAT MAKES IT HARDER FOR SEXUAL ASSAULT SURVIVORS TO REPORT AND TO PROCEED THROUGH THE SYSTEM.

UM, WE KNOW FOR EXAMPLE, THAT THE AUSTIN POLICE DEPARTMENT HAS A POLICY TO REPORT ANY SURVIVOR OR PERPETRATOR OF DOMESTIC VIOLENCE WHO HAS CHILDREN TO CPS, AND THAT CAUSES SOME OF THE GREATEST DISPROPORTIONALITY, UM, FOR FAMILIES OF COLOR IN TRAVIS COUNTY THAN WE SEE ANYWHERE ELSE IN TEXAS.

UM, THEY HAVE BEEN ADVISED BY COMMUNITY EXPERTS BY JUDGES TO CHANGE THAT POLICY, UM, TO ONLY REPORT IF THERE HAS BEEN A SUSPECTED CHILD ABUSE OR NEGLECT.

UM, AND THAT POLICY HAS NOT CHANGED.

MY UNDERSTANDING IS THAT IT'S SITTING WITH THE EXECUTIVE STAFF WHERE AGAIN, VICTIM SERVICES DOES NOT HAVE A VOICE TO SPEAK TO HOW THAT POLICY AFFECTS VICTIMS. SO, UM, THOSE ARE ALL IMPORTANT EXAMPLES OF WHY IT WOULD BE, YOU KNOW, IMPORTANT TO HAVE A SURVIVORS VOICE AT THE TABLE.

UM, AND WHERE IT'S NOT THERE CURRENTLY.

CAN YOU TALK ABOUT WHAT YOU MEAN? LIKE WHAT IT WOULD LOOK LIKE TO HAVE A SURVIVOR'S VOICE AT THE TABLE? SURE.

I THINK IT WOULD LOOK LIKE THE, THE MANAGER OF VICTIM SERVICES REPORTING DIRECTLY TO THE CHIEF, JUST LIKE, UM, AND TO BE IN THE ROOM WITH OTHER IMPORTANT DEPARTMENTS, LIKE THE HEAD OF FORENSICS, LIKE THE HEAD OF EMPLOYEE WELLNESS, UM, LIKE THE HEAD OF HR AND LIKE THE ASSISTANT CHIEFS SO THAT AS THEY CONSIDER POLICY CHANGES, TRAINING CHANGES, WHAT THE ACADEMY IS GOING TO LOOK LIKE MOVING FORWARD.

UM, ANY PROCEDURE OR PROTOCOL THAT THEY'RE PUTTING IN PLACE.

THERE'S SOMEONE

SO, AND HOW WOULD THEY BE AT THAT TABLE BEING ELEVATED? AND THE MANAGER NEEDS TO REPORT DIRECTLY TO THE CHIEF AND SHE NEEDS TO BE PRESENT IN ALL OF THOSE MEETINGS.

THANK YOU.

AND, UM, DO YOU HAVE KNOWLEDGE OF WHETHER THE CURRENT SWORN LEADERSHIP OVER SEX CRIMES AND VICTIMS SERVICES HAVE EXPERIENCED INVESTIGATING AND DEALING WITH SEXUAL ASSAULT PRIOR TO COMING TO THAT UNIT? IT IS MY UNDERSTANDING THAT NO ONE IN THAT CHAIN OF COMMAND HAS ANY PREVIOUS EXPERIENCE IN SEXUAL ASSAULT.

UM, WHAT COMMITMENTS DOES A CHIEF NEED TO GIVE IN ORDER TO DEMONSTRATE THAT HE WILL ACTUALLY PRIORITIZE SEXUAL ASSAULT, SURVIVORS AND RESPONSE? UM, YOU KNOW, COMMITMENTS ARE TOUGH BECAUSE AS THE PREVIOUS SPEAKER SAID, WE'RE KIND OF DROWNING IN COMMITMENTS AND PROMISES RIGHT NOW.

BUT, BUT WHAT I WOULD LOVE TO SEE IS IMMEDIATELY VICTIM SERVICES ELEVATED TO REPORT TO THE CHIEF AND TO BE PRESENT IN THOSE EXECUTIVE MEETINGS.

AS YOU ALL DIRECTED LAST YEAR, I WOULD LOVE FOR THERE TO BE AN IMMEDIATE, VERY PUBLIC, UM, DIRECTION TO PATROL OFFICERS, TO STOP TELLING THAT THEY CAN INVESTIGATE THESE CRIMES.

UM, I WOULD LOVE FOR THERE TO BE A VERY PUBLIC REQUEST FOR VICTIMS TO COME FORWARD AND REPORT TO YOU ALL.

UM, IF THAT'S HAPPENING SO THAT WE CAN ADDRESS IT SO THAT THE CHAIN OF COMMAND CAN ADDRESS IT, I WOULD LIKE FOR THEM TO BE HELD ACCOUNTABLE TO ADDRESS IT.

UM, I WOULD LIKE TO SEE THE SWORN OFFICERS COLLABORATE WITH COMMUNITY PARTNERS, INCLUDING THE DISTRICT ATTORNEY'S OFFICE AND SAFE AND OTHER COMMUNITY ADVOCATES THROUGH MEANINGFUL COLLABORATION AND PARTICIPATION IN, UM, COMMITTEES LIKE THE SEXUAL ASSAULT RESPONSE AND RESOURCE TEAM.

UM, AND TO HAVE REALLY HARD CONVERSATIONS ABOUT THIS, EVEN WHEN IT'S REALLY HARD, UM, AND TO PARTICIPATE, NOT JUST TO SHOW UP.

THANK YOU.

AND IF I, IF I MIGHT INDULGE IN ONE LAST QUESTION, I KNOW YOU HAVE TO BE OFF SOON YOURSELF.

UM, CAN YOU SPEAK TO THE CURRENT ENVIRONMENT AT SART? I KNOW THAT APD PREVIOUSLY LEFT START AND THEY'RE BACK.

HOW IS THAT WORKING FROM MY EXPERIENCE? UM, I LOVE THAT THERE ARE SWORN OFFICERS BACK IN THE ROOM, BUT THEY DON'T PARTICIPATE.

UM, WE HAVE NOT HEARD FROM THEM WHEN THERE'S DATA SHARING.

WE HAVE NOT HEARD FROM THEM IN COMMITTEE PARTICIPATION.

UM, THEY MOSTLY DON'T SPEAK.

UM, WE WERE EXCITED TO HEAR FROM THE, UM, THE SAKI TEAM, WHICH IS ONE OF THE GRANTS OF APD ABOUT THE VICTIM NOTIFICATION PROTOCOL.

AND AS SOON AS IT STARTED TO BE PRESENTED, IT GOT PULLED BACK ON.

THE SWORN OFFICER SAID IT WASN'T READY.

UM, THERE WAS ONE SWORN OFFICER WHO I BELIEVE WAS FROM CHILD ABUSE, WHO, UM, HAS LOTS OF EXPERIENCE IN SEXUAL ASSAULT INVESTIGATIONS.

HE DID SPEAK, UM, AT THE MEETINGS HE CAME TO IN FACT, WAS, WAS GOING TO BE ELECTED INTO THE LEADERSHIP OF THE SART AND WAS PULLED FROM THE START WITH NO EXPLANATION.

UM, SO, SO FAR THAT'S HOW IT'S GOING.

I'M REALLY GLAD THEY'RE THERE.

I HOPE THAT WE GET TO A PLACE WHERE THEY PARTICIPATE, BUT WE'RE NOT THERE YET.

THANK YOU.

AND THE ACRONYM MEANS SEXUAL ASSAULT RESOURCE AND RESPONSE TEAM.

YES.

THANK YOU, MR. BLANCA.

APPRECIATE SURE.

COUNCIL MEMBER KELLY, AND THEN COUNCIL MEMBER KITCHEN.

THANK YOU.

UM, IT'S MY UNDERSTANDING.

I, I DO WANT TO ASK YOU SOMETHING REAL QUICK, BUT IT'S MY UNDERSTANDING CITY MANAGER THAT YOU AND ASSISTANT CITY MANAGERS WERE GIVEN A COPY OF A MEMO FROM THE SART TEAM ON SEPTEMBER 21ST.

I WAS WONDERING IF YOU MIGHT BE ABLE TO SEND THAT TO COUNCIL PLEASE, SO THAT WE HAVE COPIES.

UM, WE'LL DO THANK YOU ALSO.

UM, AND THANK YOU SO MUCH FOR YOUR, YOUR SPRAY THERE, TALKING WITH US.

I THINK YOU HIGHLIGHTED SOME VERY IMPORTANT THINGS THAT EVEN I WASN'T AWARE OF WITH THE SEXUAL ASSAULT TEAM.

ONE OF THE SUGGESTIONS FROM THAT MEMO THAT I JUST ASKED TO BE SENT TO COUNSEL MENTIONED THAT OF OUR CHIEF CANDIDATES TO DID NOT RESPOND TO THE TEAM AND GIVE ANSWERS. BUT THAT ONE DID.

AND THEY STRESS THAT IF CHOSEN, THEY WOULD TO ELEVATE VICTIM SERVICES LEADERSHIP TO THE APD EXECUTIVE TEAM AND CREATE ADDITIONAL DIRECT REPORT ROLES, INCLUDING CIVILIAN OVERSIGHT, THAT TO GET AN ACCURATE PICTURE OF LOCAL RESPONSIBLE SYSTEM.

AND NON-SYSTEM IN ORDER TO CRAFT DELIBERATE VICTIM CENTERED PROTOCOLS BY WORKING IN CLOSE PARTNERSHIP WITH STAKEHOLDERS, THAT SOUNDS ACCURATE IN WHAT YOU JUST SAID AS WELL.

I JUST WANT TO CONFIRM THAT THAT'S THE PROPER WAY TO GO ABOUT DOING THINGS WITH VICTIM SERVICES IN MY OPINION, YES.

OKAY.

WE. AS LACQUERS HAVE ALWAYS MET WITH THE CHIEFS HAVE ALWAYS HAD AN OPEN DOOR.

I'VE SURVEYED THEM MANNY, UH, IN REGARDS TO ISSUES.

WHEN WE BRING ISSUES TO THEIR, TO, TO THEIR ATTENTION, THEY'RE ALWAYS AVAILABLE AND DISCUSS AND BRING US TO THE TABLE TO DISCUSS HOW TO MITIGATE THE SHORTCOMINGS.

IF ANY, IN WHATEVER PROGRAMS WE ARE ISSUES THAT WE HAVE CONCERNS, UH, VIA THE BIAS IN THIS ELECTION TO ME IS THAT I'M A FORMER CITY EMPLOYEE.

AND I THINK THAT THE SELECTION OF, OF CHECK ON WILSON, A HIGH MORALE ISSUE, UH, ENVIRONMENT WITHIN OUR, THE WORKFORCE, SO THAT ALL THOSE EMPLOYEES THAT ARE WORKING BOOTS ON THE GROUND HAVE HOPE AND EXPECTATIONS AND OPPORTUNITIES THAT THEY WILL FORESEEABLY SEE IN THE FUTURE.

AND WITH THAT, I JUST WANT TO ECHO AND AMPLIFY OUR SUPPORT FOR CHIEF SHAQUAN AND CONGRATULATE YOU CITY MANAGER AND THE SPECIAL ELECTION.

WE'RE NOT GOING TO GET THERE.

IF WE DON'T RADICALLY CHANGE THE WAY WE DO THINGS AROUND SITE PLAN, PERMITTING PROCESS, WE NEED TO PRIORITIZE HOUSING FOR THOSE WHO NEED IT MOST FOR OUR UNHOUSED NEIGHBORS.

SO STRONGLY URGE YOU TO SUPPORT THAT.

NOW, AS FAR AS ITEM 1 58 GOES, I DO NOT BELIEVE THAT COUNCIL SHOULD APPROVE CHECON WITHOUT A SOLID EXIT STRATEGY.

WE WERE ENTERING A RELATIONSHIP WITH NO EXIT STRATEGY.

UM, SO THE COUNCIL SHOULD NOT APPROVE CHECON WITHOUT A CLEAR PLAN FROM THE MANAGER ON HOW TO HANDLE THE ISSUE OF NOT BEING ABLE TO F HOT TO FIRE AN INTERNAL HIRE OR ELSE.

WE NEED A REAL COMMITMENT ON THAT.

IN THAT REGARD,

UM, IN PARTICULAR, IN MY, IN MY WORLD, WE INTERACT WITH LAW ENFORCEMENT AT ELOISE HOUSE, WHICH IS WHERE WE DO FORENSIC NURSING EXAMS FOR SEXUAL ASSAULT SURVIVORS IMMEDIATELY AFTER AN EXAM.

AND AS OF SEPTEMBER ONE, UM, A NEW LAW PUT IN PLACE MADE IT POSSIBLE FOR US TO HAVE, UM, AN ADVOCATE IN LAW ENFORCEMENT INVESTIGATION INTERVIEWS AS WELL.

UM, SO IT'S VERY IMPORTANT TO US THAT THE PUBLIC SAFETY SYSTEM FUNCTIONS WELL FOR OUR SURVIVORS, UM, APD IS REALLY CRITICAL

UM, AND SO WE'RE EXCITED TO BE MOVING TOGETHER TOWARD A BETTER FUTURE.

UM, WE JUST WANT TO MAKE SURE THAT SEXUAL ASSAULT SURVIVORS ARE PRIORITIZED IN THAT, IN THIS MOMENT.

UM, AND WE ALSO WANT TO REITERATE THE, THE PLEA FOR, UM, VICTIM SERVICES TO BE ELEVATED, UM, TO REPORT TO THE CHIEF AND TO BE PART OF EXECUTIVE LEADERSHIP CONVERSATIONS.

UM, TOP OF MIND, EXAMPLE FOR ME, BECAUSE WE JUST HAD A LAW GO INTO PLACE, UM, IS THAT WE'RE TRYING TO COORDINATE THESE, UM, LAW ENFORCEMENT INVESTIGATIONAL INTERVIEWS WITH SURVIVORS, UM, AND HAD VICTIM SERVICES PART OF COORDINATING AND PLANNING THE POLICIES AND PROTOCOLS FOR THIS.

THANK YOU, MS. GONZALEZ, AND ALSO THANK YOU FOR YOUR SERVICE AND YOUR TITLE COMMITMENT, CA COLLEAGUES, COUNCIL MEMBER POOL, AND THEN COUNCIL MEMBER ALTAR, AND THEN COUNCIL MEMBER KITCHEN.

UM, MY COMMENT IS ON A DIFFERENT ITEM THAN WHAT MS. GONZALEZ IS TALKING ABOUT SWELL DIFFERENT.

REMEMBER ALTERING THE OTHER TWO HANDS.

YEAH.

AND THEN I'LL COME BACK.

THANK YOU.

UM, MS. GONZALEZ FOR, FOR ALL YOUR WORK AND FOR COMING DOWN TO SPEAK WITH US TODAY.

UM, SO YOU MENTIONED THE LAW ENFORCEMENT INTERVIEW CHANGED THAT RECENTLY WENT INTO EFFECT AND TOWARDS THE END OF YOUR REMARKS, YOU STARTED TO ELABORATE.

CAN YOU SPEAK A LITTLE BIT MORE TO HOW THAT IS GOING? UM, AND, AND WHAT WOULD MAKE IT BETTER, UM, BECAUSE WE HAVE AN OPPORTUNITY WITH A NEW CHIEF FOR THERE TO BE CHANGE.

UM, BUT I THINK WE NEED TO BE SPECIFIC SINCE THIS HAS BEEN SO HARD FOR APD TO MAKE THESE CHANGES ABOUT WHAT NEEDS TO HAPPEN.

YES.

UM, SO IN BRIEF, THE LAW SAYS THAT AN ADVOCATE LIKE A SAFE ADVOCATE, UM, SHOULD BE OFFERED TO A SURVIVOR AT A LAW ENFORCEMENT INVESTIGATION INTERVIEW, UM, AN INVESTIGATIVE INTERVIEW.

UM, AND, UH, WE'VE HAD QUITE A FEW W WE HAD SOME GOOD MEETINGS TO PUT THAT INTO PLACE.

I THINK ABD IS VERY EXCITED TO HAVE OUR SUPPORT IN THAT MOMENT, BUT A COORDINATION AND COMMUNICATION HAS JUST BEEN DISASTROUS TO BE HONEST.

UM, SO WE'VE HAD, UM, SURVIVORS CALLING THE HOTLINE TO SCHEDULE THEIR LAW ENFORCEMENT INTERVIEWS BECAUSE THE, UM, THE OFFICER TOLD THEM THAT THAT'S HOW THEY, HOW THEY NEED TO MOVE FORWARD.

WE'VE HAD, UM, DETECTIVE DETECTIVES ASK OUR STAFF TO SCHEDULE THE LAW ENFORCEMENT INTERVIEWS.

UM, I CAN'T IMAGINE THAT THAT'S PRODUCTIVE FOR INVESTIGATION.

I'M, I'M SURE THAT THEY'RE LOOKING FOR SOMETHING BETTER.

UM, WE'VE HAD VERY LITTLE COMMUNICATION FROM THE TOP ABOUT, UM, THE MOU THAT NEEDS TO BE PUT INTO PLACE TO MAKE THIS HAPPEN.

UM, WE'VE HAD CALLS TO OUR ADVOCATES, UM, WE'RE, WE'RE 24 7 ON CALL, SO WE'RE ALWAYS AVAILABLE.

UM, BUT WE'VE HAD CALLS FOR OUR ADVOCATES TO REPORT TO THE SCENE, UM, TO SUPPORT SURVIVORS, WHICH, UM, CERTAINLY VICTIM SERVICES IS MORE EQUIPPED TO DO THAN WE ARE, UM, AND WOULD PROBABLY DO A BETTER JOB OF SUPPORTING THE OFFICERS ON SCENE AS WELL.

UM, SO THOSE ARE A FEW OF THE THINGS THAT HAVE JUST KIND OF ROLLED OUT, UM, OVER THE LAST COUPLE OF WEEKS.

AS OF YESTERDAY, WHEN I CHECKED, WE HAD DONE, UM, FIVE ACCOMPANIMENTS OF W WE'D DONE ADVOCACY FOR FIVE PEOPLE DURING LAW ENFORCEMENT INTERVIEWS DURING THE MONTH OF SEPTEMBER.

UM, ORDINARY FOR US IS TO SEE SOMETHING LIKE ONE OR TWO.

UM, SO THERE'S DEFINITELY A MOVE ON THE PART OF THE DEPARTMENT TO TRY AND MAKE THIS HAPPEN.

UM, BUT, UM, YEAH, I, IN MY PERSONAL OPINION, IT WOULD BE MUCH MORE EFFECTIVE TO HAVE THE VICTIM SERVICES PERSONNEL ON SCENE, UM, COORDINATE THAT INTERVIEW WITH US AND THE SURVIVOR RATHER THAN HAVING THE, UH, DETECTIVE BE THE ONE WHO, UM, OFFERS AN ADVOCATE TO THE SURVIVOR.

THE SURVIVORS MAY BE LESS INCLINED TO ACCEPT THE OFFER OF AN ADVOCATE, UM, FROM A DETECTIVE RATHER THAN A VICTIM SERVICES COUNSELOR.

UM, ARE YOU AWARE OF REPORTS THAT, UM, THE DA HAS EMAILED APD LEADERSHIP TO SUGGEST THAT, UM, WITH CASE NUMBERS, FAMILY VIOLENCE OR SEXUAL ASSAULT SURVIVORS WHO HAVE BEEN TOLD BY APD THAT THEY WILL NOT, UM, BE INVESTIGATING THEIR CASES?

YES, WE, WE ARE AWARE THAT SURVIVORS ARE REPORTING THAT, UM, AND, UM, SURVIVORS ARE ALSO, UM, HEARING COMMUNITY MESSAGING FROM, FROM THE NEWS THAT, UM, THE POLICE DEPARTMENT IS UNABLE TO INVESTIGATE SOME CRIMES THAT ARE DETERMINED TO BE LESS, LESS IMPORTANT OR LESS VIOLENT, LESS CRITICAL BECAUSE THEY ARE, UM, THEY, THEY'RE NOT RECEIVING FUNDING, RIGHT.

AND, YOU KNOW, WHAT WE'RE HEARING FROM THE FOLKS WHO ARE COMING TO SPEAK, AND THE QUESTIONS THAT WE'RE TRYING TO RAISE WITH THE CHIEF IS HOW DO WE MAKE SURE THAT APD HAS A BETTER VICTIM CENTERED APPROACH, UM, IN THEIR ACTIVITIES.

AND I WILL JUST INVITE YOU IF THERE ARE OTHER THINGS THAT YOU THINK WE NEED TO BE KNOWING AND ASKING TO MAKE SURE ARE HAPPENING.

UM, AS A FORMER RAPE CRISIS COUNSELOR, UH, THROUGH WHAT WAS THE PREDECESSOR TO SAFE, UM, UNDERSTAND WHAT YOU'RE TALKING ABOUT WITH REGARD TO, UH, RESPONDING TO, TO VICTIMS. I HAVE A VERY QUICK QUESTION.

AND THEN THIS IS PROBABLY, I'M SURE IT'S A LONGER CONVERSATION, SO I DON'T WANT TO USE UP TOO MUCH TIME, BUT, BUT BECAUSE YOU MENTIONED IT, WHAT DO YOU THINK IS THE IDEAL RELATIONSHIP BETWEEN, UM, BETWEEN THE FOLKS THAT, UH, PROVIDE, UH, SERVICES AND ASSISTANCE IN, IN COUNSELING AND SUPPORT THROUGH SAFE AND THE VICTIM SERVICES COUNSELORS AT APD? UM, WE'RE NOT UNDER ANY OBLIGATION TO SHARE CONFIDENTIAL OR PRIVILEGED INFORMATION WITH LAW ENFORCEMENT OR ANYONE ELSE.

UM, AND SO THAT PUTS US IN A POSITION WHERE, UM, SURVIVORS SHARE MORE WITH US OFTEN THAT OFTEN THAT INFORMATION WILL BECOME BENEFICIAL TO, UM, THE INVESTIGATION.

RIGHT.

UM, FOR EXAMPLE, THE INFORMATION THAT THEY SHARE DURING A FORENSIC EXAM, UM, WILL BECOME PART OF THE ACCOUNT THAT WE HOPE ULTIMATELY GOES THROUGH INVESTIGATION AND, UM, PROSECUTION.

UM, BUT YEAH, THE SURVIVORS SURVIVORS FEEL SAFE WITH US BECAUSE WE HAVE CONFIDENTIALITY AND PRIVILEGE.

AND SO WE'RE SORT OF UNIQUELY ABLE TO, UM, TO FIELD THOSE CONCERNS.

OKAY.

THANK YOU VERY MUCH.

YEAH.

THANK YOU.

THANK YOU.

IT'S GONZALEZ, UM, COUNCIL MEMBER OUT, AND THEN I BELIEVE COUNCIL MEMBER POOH HAD SOMETHING PERTAINING ANOTHER ITEM.

UM, SO THANK YOU AND TO EVERYBODY ELSE FOR RAISING THIS UP.

AND I DO INTEND FOR THAT TO BE A CONVERSATION WE HAVE HERE PUBLICLY WITH THE INTERIM CHIEF FRANKLIN.

IT IS NOT MY EXPERIENCE THAT, UM, APD HAS BEEN UNABLE TO SUPPORT INVESTIGATIONS FOR OUR SURVIVORS.

IT IS MY EXPERIENCE THAT SURVIVORS HAVE BEEN TOLD OR HEARD THAT.

YES.

AND I SEE MAYOR ADLER THAT YOU POPPED UP.

SOME HISPANICS WHO HAVE BEEN KILLED IN THIS CITY, NOTHING.

IT, SOME COULD HAVE BEEN AVOIDED.

AS YOU'RE TELLING ME THAT FOLKS WHO DON'T LOOK LIKE THESE PEOPLE WERE PRIMARILY WHITE PEOPLE, CITY COUNCIL, LET'S BE CLEAR.

YOU HAVE MADE THE DECISION HERE, NOT REGARDS TO THE FOLKS WHO REALLY EXPERIENCE AND KNOW POLICE SO THAT IT SEEMS TO ME, IT'S VERY PROBLEMATICALLY.

WE'RE LOOKING AT WHO KNOW THE CENTURY OF TRYING TO MAKE THE CITY RIGHT AND FAIR IN GELS.

SO YOUR DECISIONS ARE CERTAINLY BUILDING THE WILL OF THE PEOPLE WHO EXPRESS POLICING, WHO KNOW POLICING, WHO PART OF THE SOLUTION, I THINK IS A BAD ACTORS INTO RESPECT TO WHETHER THE PEOPLE AND NOT NOMINATE, NOT SELECT THE CON AT THE NEXT POLICE CHIEF IN AUSTIN, TEXAS IS UNFAIR PROCESS AND WE'LL POST IT.

THANK YOU VERY MUCH.

BOB HENDRIX, MAYOR ADLER MEMBERS OF CITY COUNCIL.

I'M BOB HENDRICKS, CHAIR OF THE EXECUTIVE COMMITTEE OF THE AUSTIN SIERRA CLUB.

THE CURRENT CLIMATE EMERGENCY CONTINUES TO WORSEN WITH DISRUPTION OF THE POLAR VORTEX LEADING TO WINTER STORM URI INTENSE HURRICANES.

SINCE SHE HAS IDA UNPRECEDENTED HEAT WAVES IN THE NORTHWEST WILDFIRES OUT OF CONTROL, WIDESPREAD FLOODING, LARGE AREAS OF TROUT, AND SO MUCH MORE CLIMATE CHANGE CREATES WIDESPREAD SUFFERING, NOT ONLY IN THIS COUNTRY, BUT AROUND THE WORLD.

THIS YEAR, A CLUB THAT STRONGLY URGES YOU TO VOTE FOR THE AUSTIN CLIMATE EQUITY PLAN.

WE COMMEND THE PROCESS WHICH PRIORITIZED FRONTLINE COMMUNITIES AND THEIR CONCERNS AND CRAFTING THE PLAN.

WE ARE PROUD THAT THE PLAN IS CENTERED IN EQUITY AND DESIGN FOR REAL ACTION TO ACHIEVE THE AMBITIOUS GOALS OF NET.

AND SHE WROTE DIRECT CARBON EMISSIONS BY 2040 FOR ALL OF AUSTIN.

THIS PLAN IS NOT PERFECT, BUT IT KEEPS AUSTIN IN THE FOREFRONT OF CITIES WILLING TO DO THEIR PART, TO FIGHT OUR CLIMATE EMERGENCY.

I AM ANXIOUS TO SHARE THIS PLAN WITH OTHER ACTIVISTS AROUND THE COUNTRY, AS A MODEL FOR BOTH CONTENT AND PROCESS IN CRAFTING A CLIMATE PLAN.

HOWEVER, WE MUST KEEP IN MIND THAT PASSING THIS PLAN IS ONLY THE FIRST STEP I URGE YOU NOT ONLY TO PASS THIS PLAN TO ENSURE THAT CITY STAFF IMPLEMENTS IT, GIVING THEM THE PERSONNEL AND RESOURCES TO DO SO

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ONLY BY PEOPLE IN GOVERNMENTS ALL OVER THE WORLD, TAKING ACTION TO STOP CLIMATE CHANGE.

CAN WE ENSURE THAT OUR CHILDREN AND GRANDCHILDREN WILL HAVE A LIVABLE PLANET IN THE FUTURE? THANK YOU, JANICE BOOKOUT.

THANK YOU.

UH, FIRST I WANT TO RECOGNIZE MY SUPPORT FOR THE CLIMATE EQUITY PLAN AND THANKS TO THE OFFICE OF SUSTAINABILITY THEY'RE OPERATIONALIZING OF THEIR ANTI-RACIST TRAINING AND IN PARTICULAR, THE LEADERSHIP OF PAULINE RENDEN.

SO THANK YOU THAT SAID I'M HERE TO SPEAK ON THE ITEMS RELATED TO SPENDING ON PROGRAMS DESIGNED TO SERVE PEOPLE EXPERIENCING HOMELESSNESS.

I WANT TO MAKE SURE YOU'RE AWARE OF A GROUP OF CONSULTANTS THAT ARE EXPERT AND EXPERTS IN THE LIVED EXPERIENCE OF HOMELESSNESS.

THEY'RE DEVELOPING A JOINT STATEMENT OF PRIORITIES AND A SET OF GUIDELINES FOR EVALUATING PROGRAMS THAT SERVE THEM.

THE GROUP IS CALLED THE UNHOUSED NEIGHBORHOOD COUNCIL.

THEY'RE AVAILABLE TO MEET WITH YOU AND BE, UM, AND WILL BE SUPPORTED AND COMPENSATED FOR THEIR TIME.

UH, THANK YOU, CRT, OUR SCENARIO, URBAN LEAGUE, TEXAS APPLESEED, AND AJC FOR YOUR SUPPORT SORT OF EFFORT.

UM, THE MEMBERS OF THE COUNCIL, DON'T PRETEND TO REPRESENT ALL FOLKS IN THEIR SITUATION, BUT THEY CAN PROVIDE UNIQUE INSIGHTS.

I CAN'T SPEAK FOR ANY MEMBER OF THE COUNCIL AND ENCOURAGE YOU TO SPEAK TO THEM DIRECTLY.

AND INSTEAD I'LL QUOTE FROM ONE OF OUR COUNCIL MEMBERS, WHITLEY, UM, DIGA GATTO WHO PREPARED SOMETHING FOR ME TO INCLUDE.

SHE ASKS THAT YOU TEMPORARY AND TEMPORARILY HALT ALL PROCEEDINGS THAT IMPACT THE OVERALL QUALITY OF LIFE, UM, OR PHYSICALLY DISPLACED PEOPLE IN THE UNHOUSED COMMUNITY.

AND SHE WRITES, AND I QUOTE UNTIL YOU'VE WALKED EVEN JUST ONE DAY IN MY SHOES, YOU'RE NOT ALLOWED TO DECIDE WHAT MY BEST INTERESTS COULD POSSIBLY BE AND MAKING DECISIONS ON FUNDING AND POLICY THAT WILL DIRECTLY IMPACT THE LIVES THAT QUALITY OF LIFE TO THOUSANDS IS FRANKLY, UNJUST AND INHUMANE WITHOUT CONSIDERATION FROM ITS OWN COMMUNITY MEMBERS.

## SHE CONTINUES.

WE HAVE ALREADY BEEN FORCED TO SUFFER TRAUMAS, LOSS, ADDITIONAL SUFFERING, AND MARGINALIZATION OF OUR PEOPLE AND INCREASES IN HATE CRIMES DUE TO DECISIONS MADE FOR, AND ONLY DIRECTLY IMPACTING US BY THE COUNCIL BY THIS COUNCIL.

I URGE YOU TO RECOGNIZE MOVING FORWARD ON SUCH IMPACTFUL DECISIONS FROM MY COMMUNITY UNTIL WE CAN FIRST SPEAK ON OUR OWN BEHALF FOR YOUR CONSIDERATION AS WELL.

YOU'VE ALREADY MADE MY COMMUNITY SIGNIFICANTLY LESS VISIBLE WITH THE DEATH TOLL, RISING AND NEARLY NO ONE COMING TO ACTUALLY HELP.

THIS IS NOW A CONCERN FOR HUMAN RIGHTS, AND I SINCERELY FEAR THE TRAJECTORY THE LONGER THIS TRAJECTORY, THE LONGER WE ARE UNHEARD.

AND THOSE ARE WORDS OF, UM, AGAIN, WHITLEY, UH, JADA, UM, WHO PREPARED THAT STATEMENT THAT I THANK YOU SO MUCH.

IF YOU'D LIKE TO SPEAK TO THE COUNCIL, UH, YOU CAN CONTACT ME AND WE'LL SET THAT UP.

THANK YOU SO MUCH, SUSANA.

ALMANZA HELLO? YES.

GO AHEAD.

OKAY.

YES.

THIS IS THE SINAI I'M MONICA, AND I'M SPEAKING ON THE CLIMATE EQUITY PLAN.

UH, I HAD THE PRIVILEGE AND THE HONOR TO BE ON THE STEERING COMMITTEE.

AND I WANT TO SAY THAT THIS CLIMATE PLAN IS A VERY HISTORICAL, UH, CLIMATE PLAN BECAUSE IT'S CENTERED EQUITY AT THE VERY FOREFRONT.

AND I WANT TO, UH, THINK, UM, ZACH BRANDNER BECAUSE HE HAS SOME FANTASTIC STAFF, PEOPLE OF COLOR, CELINE AND DAWN AND BBDO METAL WHO LED, UM, A LOT OF THE DISCUSSIONS ON THE CLIMATE CHANGE.

BUT ANOTHER THING THAT MAKES THIS A CLIMATE PLAN, HISTORIC BASED RESIZE, HAVING EQUITY AT THE FOREFRONT IS THE LAND ACKNOWLEDGEMENT, ACKNOWLEDGING AND RESPECTING THE HISTORY OF THE LAND AND JUST PEOPLE REINFORCING THIS KINSHIP RATHER THAN ERASING IT FOR THE CONIZATION.

IF LAND ACKNOWLEDGEMENT ALSO AIMS TO RAISE AWARENESS AND DISSEMINATE KNOWLEDGE ABOUT INDIGENOUS HISTORY THAT ARE SO OFTEN FORGOTTEN IN SILENCE.

AND FOR THE FIRST TIME WE HAD ALMOST A MAJORITY OF PEOPLE OF COLOR SITTING AT THE TABLE.

SO THAT'S WHY I SAY THAT THIS CLIMATE PLAN IS VERY A HISTORICAL ONE BECAUSE WE CANNOT STOP CLIMATE CHANGE WITHOUT ADDRESSING EQUITY AND CREEP.

AND WE CANNOT TALK ABOUT CLIMATE CHANGE SOLUTIONS WITHOUT TALKING ABOUT RACIAL AND ENVIRONMENTAL JUSTICE AND CENTERING COMMUNITIES OF COLOR AND OUR RESPONSES.

AND SO I'M VERY GLAD THAT, UH, THE STEERING COMMITTEE CREATED THE EQUITY, THE EQUITY TOOLS, WHICH WE LOOK FORWARD FOR ALL THE DEPARTMENT USING AND IDENTIFYING OPPORTUNITIES FOR ENGAGEMENT, INCENTIVES, TARGETING COMMUNITY COMMUNICATIONS, UH, ACTIVITIES AS A PORT ANTI-DISPLACEMENT AND FOCUSING ON JUST TRANSITION IN OUR ECONOMY, TRAINING AND JOBS FOR PEOPLE OF COLOR AND PRIOR TALKING HEALTH BENEFITS, ESPECIALLY FOR LOW INCOME AND COMMUNITIES OF, BECAUSE WE ALL KNOW WHO HAD BEEN IMPACTED, UH, BY

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THE TIME, UM, IN, IN THAT IS LOW INCOME AND COMMUNITIES COLORS, WHICH ALREADY EXPERIENCED MULTIPLE ENVIRONMENTAL BURDENS AND ALSO DISPROPORTIONATELY AFFECTED BY CLIMATE CHANGE.

SO LOW-INCOME COMMUNITIES OF COLOR ARE LESS ABLE AND OTHERS, OTHERS ADAPT TO CLIMATE CHANGE.

UH, SO WE SAID I SUPPORT, BUT IT SUPPORTS THE CLIMATE EQUITY PLAN.

THANK YOU, DAVID FOSTER.

THANK YOU.

MAYOR.

PUT TIM HARPER, MADISON MAYOR, HEATHER COUNCIL MEMBERS.

MY NAME IS DAVID POSTURE, AND I'M HERE TO SPEAK ON BEHALF OF CLEAN WATER ACTION IN SUPPORT OF ITEM ONE 17 ON, ON YOUR AGENDA TODAY, UH, THIS ITEM REPRESENTS AN IMPORTANT MILESTONE AND IMPLEMENTING THE RECLAIMED AND DISTRIBUTED WATER FEATURES OF AUSTIN'S APPROVED 100 YEAR WATER SUPPLY PLAN KNOWN AS WATER FORWARD.

UH, ITEM ONE 17 WILL FREE THESE FEATURES FROM THE STALLED REWRITE OF THE LAND DEVELOPMENT CODE, WHICH REMAINS MIRED IN A LEGAL BATTLE WHOSE POINTS OF CONTENTION HAVE NOTHING TO DO WITH WATER FORWARD.

UH, THE RECLAIMED AND DISTRIBUTED WATER FEATURES ARE AMONG THE MOST VISIONARY AND FARSIGHTED FEATURES OF THE WATER PORT PLAN.

THEY WILL REQUIRE ALL LARGE NEW DEVELOPMENTS OF 250,000 SQUARE FEET OR MORE TO BE DUAL PLUMBED SO THAT THEY CAN TAKE ADVANTAGE EITHER OF THE CITY'S RECLAIMED WATER SYSTEM.

THAT IS WATER.

THAT'S A WASTEWATER THAT'S TREATED TO NON-POTABLE STANDARDS PIPE BACK OUT INTO THE CITY OR PARTS OF THE CITY AND THE PURPLE PIPES OR, UM, CAPTURE WATER THAT IS PRODUCED ONSITE, SUCH AS AC CONDENSATE, RAINWATER TREATED GRAY AND BLACK WATER, AND USE THESE WATER STREAMS INSIDE THE DEVELOPMENT TO MEET NON-POTABLE NEEDS LIKE TOILET FLUSHING IRRIGATION.

UH, THERE ISN'T UP THERE AS AN INCREASED UPFRONT COST, UH, AND, AND BY, BY HAVING TO BUILD TWO SYSTEMS, THE PIPELINE FOR POTABLE AND ONE FOR NON-POTABLE, BUT THIS COST, WELL, I BELIEVE, UH, BE MORE THAN OFFSET BY DECREASING THE AMOUNT OF POTABLE WATER THE PEOPLE LIVING IN OR USING THESE BUILDINGS WILL HAVE TO PRODUCE.

I THINK THAT'S CRITICAL TO UNDERSTAND THIS WILL ACTUALLY HELP OUR AFFORDABILITY CHALLENGES, NOT, NOT HURT THEM.

NOT ONLY WILL IT SAVE PEOPLE MONEY WHO ARE USING OUR LIVING INSIDE THESE BUILDINGS, THE ENTIRE COMMUNITY WILL BENEFIT BECAUSE THIS WILL REDUCE THE OVERALL AMOUNT OF WATER

THAT ARE, WHY DON'T YOU TELL THAT HE NEEDS TO PROCURE TREATS POTABLE STANDARDS AND DISTRIBUTE.

I SHOULD ADD A CAPTURING STORMWATER AND USING IT ONSITE 10 RAIN WATER HAS THE ADDED BENEFIT OF MITIGATING LOCALIZED FLOODING AND REDUCE IT, REDUCING POLLUTED WATERWAY, UH, RATHER RUNOFF.

WE JUST INCLUDED RUNOFF INTO OUR LOCAL WATERWAYS.

THE ONLY QUIBBLE I HAVE IS THAT, UH, THE RECLAIMED WATER PIECE, UH, THE, UH, WHAT WON'T GO INTO EFFECT UNTIL DECEMBER 20, 23, ALONG WITH THE REST OF IT, BUT AS ORIGINALLY WRITTEN AND AS POSTED REALLY NO MORE THAN ABOUT A MONTH AGO, THIS WOULD HAVE GONE INTO EFFECT DECEMBER, DECEMBER, 2021.

SO I, YOU TO SUPPORT PLAN.

THANK YOU VERY MUCH.

MA'AM YES.

MA'AM COUNCIL MEMBER TEVA.

YEAH.

I HAVE A QUESTION FOR MR. FOSTER.

ARE YOU STILL ON THE LINE, MR. FOSTER? ARE WE ABLE TO GET THAT SPEAKER BACK? YES.

MR. FOSTER, UM, I THINK YOU WERE GETTING TO THIS JUST AS YOUR TIME EXPIRED.

UH, SO IT WAS ALSO MY UNDERSTANDING THAT THESE PIECES HAVING BEEN SO VERY, VERY LONG IN PROCESS, UH, WE'RE GOING TO GO INTO EFFECT SOON BECAUSE WE NEED THEM SOON.

AND SO, AS YOU WERE JUST WRAPPING UP YOUR COMMENTS, I BELIEVE YOU WERE SAYING THAT AS ORIGINALLY POSTED, THEY WERE TO GO INTO EFFECT IN 2021.

THE REVISED BACKUP HAS, OR NOT THE REVISED BACKUP, THE BACKUP FOR TODAY'S HAS SOME CONTEMPLATED TO TAKE EFFECT IN 2023.

AND I WONDERED IF YOU COULD SPEAK TO THE TIMEFRAME AND WHETHER YOU BELIEVE IT'S NECESSARY TO DELAY THIS IMPLEMENTATION FOR TWO YEARS AND GENERALLY WHAT THE IMPACT IS OR WOULD BE OF ACTING ON THE TIMEFRAME THAT WE HAD ORIGINALLY CONCEPTUALIZED.

WELL, NOT EVEN ORIGINALLY, I MEAN, IT'S, WE'RE ALREADY YEARS DELAYED.

UM, BUT IF YOU COULD SPEAK TO THE TIME, TIME ELEMENT, PLEASE.

YEAH.

SO THANK YOU.

THANK YOU FOR THE QUESTION.

UH, ORIGINALLY ACTUALLY THAT IS AUSTIN WATER UTILITY A FEW YEARS AGO WAS CONTEMPLATING NOT HAVING THESE GO INTO EFFECT UNTIL THE 23RD, BUT THANKS TO THE GOOD WORK BY MEMBERS OF THE TASK FORCE AND OTHERS, INCLUDING I THINK CLEAN WATER ACTION.

WE WERE ABLE TO MOVE THAT UP.

UH, DECEMBER, 2023 WAS THE ORIGINAL IDEA THAT IS, UH, RECENTLY WHEN WATER FLOORED WAS APPROVED FOR THE, UM, ONSITE WATER PIECES.

AND, AND THAT'S OKAY, WE CAN, I CAN LIVE WITH THAT, BUT IT'S THE RECLAIM PORTION RIGHT NOW UNDER CODE A NEW DEVELOPMENT OF 250,000 SQUARE FEET OR MORE, THAT IS BEEN 250 LINEAR FEET OF ONE OF THE CITY'S RECLAIMED WATER LINES TODAY NOW, UH, HAS TO BE TO UPLAND AND HOOK UP TO THAT LINE.

UH, THIS WOULD, UM, EXTEND THAT TO 500 LINEAR FEET.

SO MORE NEW DEVELOPMENTS WITHIN 500 LINEAR FEET OF,

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OF, UH, ONE OF THE LINES WOULD HAVE TO BE DUAL PUMP.

SO THAT PART OF IT WAS SUPPOSED TO GO INTO EFFECT THIS DECEMBER, DECEMBER, 2021, FOR REASONS I DON'T COMPLETELY UNDERSTAND WHAT YOU'RE, WHAT YOU'RE LOOKING AT TODAY, POSTPONES OUT TILL DECEMBER, 2023.

SO, UM, 2023 I THINK IS OKAY FOR THE ONSITE PIECES OF IT.

BUT IF THERE IS THE WILL OF THE COUNCIL, I WOULD, I WOULD, I WOULD RATHER DO THE RECLAIM PIECE THIS YEAR AS ORIGINALLY INTENDED.

AND SO I HOPE THAT ANSWERS YOUR QUESTION.

SO IT DOES.

THANK YOU.

BUT I BELIEVE THERE MAY BE ANOTHER QUESTION ON THE DIOCESE.

I BELIEVE IT WAS COUNCILMEMBER KITCHEN.

UM, YES.

AND THANK YOU, COUNCIL MEMBER TOBO FOR THAT QUESTION AND THANK YOU.

UM, MR. FOSTER, SO IT'S, WELL, WE CAN GET INTO THE DETAILS, BUT I THINK IT'S JUST ONE, ONE PORTION OF THE PROPOSED, UM, UM, ORDINANCE THAT WE NEEDED TO CHANGE.

AND DIDN'T WANT TO LET THIS MOMENT GO BY WITHOUT SAYING THANK YOU.

WELL, I APPRECIATE THAT.

MY PLAN IS TO RETIRE BY THE END OF THE YEAR.

THAT WON'T NECESSARILY MEAN YOU WILL HAVE SEEN THE LAST OF ME.

YOU JUST DON'T HEAR FROM ME.

IT'S CLEAN WATER ACTION GUY.

GOOD.

I KNOW THAT HAPPENS SOMETIMES WHERE PEOPLE EITHER RETIRE OR TRY TO RETIRE AND WE STILL SEE THEM AND WE LOVE IT.

RIGHT.

THANK YOU FOR YOUR WORK.

THANK YOU, COLLEAGUES CLERK.

UM, THE STORIES ARE REALLY HEARTBREAKING OF WHAT WE'RE HEARING, UM, FROM WOMEN AND FAMILIES ACROSS THE STATE.

UM, AND IT'S OUR OBLIGATION AS A COUNCIL, UM, TO STEP UP AND SPEAK OUT, UM, AND DO THE STEPS THAT WE CAN TAKE, UM, FOR AN ISSUE THAT'S OFTEN OUT OF OUR PURVIEW.

UM, BUT THAT REALLY MATTERS FOR THE HEALTHCARE AND INDUCTIVE NEEDS, UM, OF PEOPLE IN OUR COMMUNITY WHO CAN BECOME PREGNANT.

THANK YOU, MAYOR ADLER.

UH, AS WE RENEW THESE, I MAKE THE SAME REQUEST AND THE CITY MANAGER THAT I MADE ON THE OTHER RENEWALS THAT HAVE COME UP IN THE LAST SEVERAL WEEKS, THAT TO THE DEGREE THAT WE CAN IN THESE EXTENSIONS, UH, WE SHOULD START, UH, BETTER IDENTIFYING THE INFORMATION AND DATA, UH, THAT WE WANT AND EXPECT TO BE PRODUCED AS PART OF THESE CONTRACTS.

EACH SPEAKER WILL HAVE THREE MINUTES.

OUR FIRST SPEAKER IS EMILY K. HILL.

COME ON DOWN AFTER EMILY WE'LL HAVE ETHAN SMITH.

AM I ALLOWED TO BRING MY MASS DOWN YOUR COMFORT LEVEL? UM, GOOD AFTERNOON, EVERYONE.

MY NAME'S EMILY AND I'M HERE TODAY TO DISCUSS THE NEW ABORTION LAW AND SPECIFICALLY HOW IT IMPACTS VICTIMS OF SEXUAL ASSAULT.

I KNOW THAT WE THINK THE LAW IS GOING TO PROTECT RAPE VICTIMS, BUT THE TRUTH IS IT DOESN'T.

UM, I HAVE PERSONAL EXPERIENCE WITH IT.

THE FIRST TIME I WAS ASSAULTED, I WAS 12 YEARS OLD BY A FAMILY MEMBER BEING DISABLED AND BEING A CHILD.

I HAD NO IDEA WHAT TO LOOK FOR FOR THE SCIENCE OF IF I HAD GOTTEN PREGNANT AND DUE TO THE FACT THAT I DIDN'T HAVE A FAMILY NETWORK, THERE WOULD HAVE BEEN NO ONE THERE TO PROTECT ME AND HELP ME LOOK FOR THE SIGNS OF BEING PREGNANT.

THE SECOND TIME I WAS ASSAULTED WAS IN COLLEGE AND MY OWN HOME BY A CLOSE FRIEND OF MINE.

AND I WAS SO ASHAMED AND SO GONE MENTALLY, I WOULD HAVE NOT KNOWN THE SIGNS TO LOOK FOR, FOR BEING PREGNANT.

I FILLED UP THIS LAW'S REALLY BLACK AND WHITE THAT WE SHOULDN'T HOLD RAPE VICTIMS TO THE SAME STANDARDS AS CONSENTING ADULTS.

THEY, MANY OF THEM ARE HANDICAPPED OR CHILDREN OR JUST WOMEN TRYING TO GET ON WITH THEIR LIVES AND FORCING THEM TO HAVE THEIR RAPIST BABIES SAYING THAT SIX WEEKS IS ENOUGH, IS NOT EVEN CLOSE.

I, I THINK THAT THERE NEEDS TO BE SOME EXCEPTION TO THIS LAW TO PROTECT RAPE VICTIMS, ESPECIALLY CHILDREN, ESPECIALLY HANDICAPPED, UM, AND ESPECIALLY WOMEN WHO MAY NOT HAVE THE MEANS TO HAVE A CHILD AND MAY JUST WANT TO TAKE THEIR OWN LIFE BECAUSE THE LAW'S NOT GOING TO PROTECT THEM.

GENERALLY, THE LAW DOES NOT PROTECT RAPE VICTIMS, ESPECIALLY IF THEY'RE NOT GOING TO COME FORWARD.

AND IT TOOK ME 10 YEARS TO HEAL FROM WHAT HAD HAPPENED.

AND IN THAT TIME, SIX WEEKS WAS NOWHERE ENOUGH FOR ME TO MENTALLY UNDERSTAND RAPE.

UM, I KNOW THAT IN TEXAS, WE'RE A GOD-FEARING STATE AND I BELIEVE THAT GOD WOULD NOT WANT A 12 YEAR OLD TO HAVE THE RIPEST BABY, A HANDICAP PERSON OR A WOMAN TO, UM, BE FORCED TO ENDURE THAT.

AND LET ME GET MY HANDS ON THAT APPRAISAL AND I WILL BE ABLE TO GET YOU AN ANSWER MOMENTARILY.

GREAT.

I ACTUALLY, I CAN'T REMEMBER.

I, I DO, EXCUSE ME, I'M SORRY.

I DO HAVE, UH, ACCESS TO THE APPRAISAL.

UM, AND THERE IS A, UM, DID YOU WANT IT SPECIFICALLY A BREAKDOWN OF HOW THE VALUE WAS ACCOUNTED FOR BY THE APPRAISER? WELL, AS I UNDERSTAND THE RIBS AND THE PERMANENT, UH, YES.

THANK YOU.

SHALL I ASK MY OTHER QUESTIONS OR WOULD YOU LIKE ME TO GO AHEAD AND ASK MY OTHER QUESTIONS? AND THEN WE CAN COME BACK TO THIS ITEM AND AS THEY'RE GETTING, GETTING ANSWERS.

SO IT'S MY UNDERSTANDING THAT THIS WORK IS NECESSARY BECAUSE OF, UH, BECAUSE OF THE INTEREST IN PROVIDING WASTEWATER SERVICE TO THE FUTURE EAST PARK SUBDIVISION.

AND I GUESS I'M WONDERING TO WHAT EXTENT ARE ANY OF THOSE COSTS BEING BORNE BY THE DEVELOPER OF THAT SUBDIVISION? I DO, I BELIEVE A COUNCIL MEMBER THAT, UM, AUSTIN WATER DEPARTMENT, UH, REPRESENTATIVE FROM THAT DEPARTMENT COULD PROBABLY ANSWER THAT MORE ACCURATELY.

AND I DO UNDERSTAND THAT THEY ARE AVAILABLE TO, UM, MAYBE RESPOND TO THAT QUESTION.

I KNOW THEY ARE CONNECTED TO THIS LEADING, YOU KNOW, I THINK I DO SEE ACTUALLY IN LOOKING AT THE INFORMATION AGAIN, I THINK 40,722 IS FOR THE PERMANENT.

AND THEN THE TEMPORARY IS 1,467.

UM, HOW LONG WILL THE TEMPORARY CONSTRUCTION STAGING AREA? HOW LONG WILL THE TEMPORARY CONSTRUCTION, HOW LONG WILL CONSTRUCTION HAPPEN? CAUSE THAT THAT AMOUNT OF 1467 SEEMS PRETTY LOW.

MY UNDERSTANDING THAT THE ESTIMATED CONSTRUCTION DURATION IS ROUGHLY ABOUT 11 MONTHS.

SO I GUESS THEN MY FOLLOWUP QUESTION WOULD BE HOW THAT COMPARES TO OTHER MITIGATION, UM, FEES IN PARKLAND.

AGAIN, THAT SEEMS JUST A LITTLE LOW FOR 18 FOR 11 MONTHS OF DISRUPTION ON THAT PART OF THE PARK.

AND SO SORRY, MR. MENDEZ.

NO, I WAS JUST GOING TO RESPOND THAT I, I KNOW THAT THE THIRD PARTY APPRAISER THAT WAS HIRED BY, UM, OFFICE OF REAL ESTATE, UM, CONDUCTED THIS ANALYSIS AND APPRAISAL.

UM, SO IT'S ESSENTIALLY A GROUND LEASE AND THAT'S TYPICALLY WHERE YOU SEE IT.

IS THERE SOMEBODY ON FROM AUSTIN WATER WHO CAN EXPLAIN WHY THE CITY IS WHETHER THE DEVELOPER IS BEARING THE COSTS ASSOCIATED WITH THESE UTILITY LINES FROM THE BACKUP? IT LOOKS LIKE THE MITIGATION MONIES, UH, A 42,000 AND CHANGES COMING FROM THE WATER DEPARTMENT RATHER THAN THE DEVELOPER.

GOOD AFTERNOON COUNCIL MEMBERS.

THIS IS BUSINESS STRATEGY MANAGER WITH AUSTIN WATER.

I CAN PROVIDE THE CLARIFICATION FOR THE FIELD.

UM, AUSTIN, IT'S JUST A LEGAL PROCEDURE, UH, CONFORMED BY BOTH CITY LEGAL AND OFFICE OF REAL ESTATE THAT AUSTIN MOTTO PAYS.

THE ACTUAL COST IS BORN BY THE DEVELOPER.

UH, PART CAN CLARIFY ON, UH, THE LEGAL ASPECTS OF WHY PART CANNOT ACCEPT FINANCIAL TRANSACTIONS DIRECTLY FROM THE DEVELOPER.

YOU BET ANY OTHER QUESTIONS, COLLEAGUES, WE'LL MOVE ON TO ITEM NUMBER.

WE NEED TO VOTE ON MY PRAYER TIME.

THANK YOU ALL IN FAVOR OF ITEM, NUMBER THREE, IT'S UNANIMOUS AND I BELIEVE IT'S 10 YESES ONE.

NO, THANK YOU.

NO, I'M NOT A NO, NO, IT WAS, IT WAS COUNCIL MEMBER COW AND WE TASTE NOW WE'LL MOVE ON TO ITEM NUMBER FOUR.

UM, ITEM NUMBER ONE, 18 IS A PUBLIC HEARING.

UH, THE ITEM IS TO CONDUCT A PUBLIC HEARING AND CONSIDERED AN ORDINANCE FOR THE FULL PURPOSE ANNEXATION OF APPROXIMATELY 25 ACRES LOCATED IN TRAVIS COUNTY AT 1 1, 2 1 3 NORTH FM SIX 20 ROAD, AND TO RATIFY A WRITTEN AGREEMENT WITH THE PROPERTY OWNER FOR THE PROVISION OF SERVICES, THE SERVICE AGREEMENT HAS BEEN SIGNED BY THE PROPERTY OWNER AND THE CITY, AND A COPY IS INCLUDED IN THE BACKUP.

UM, I'M AVAILABLE FOR ANY QUESTIONS, BUT FIRST I WOULD LIKE TO EDIT OVER TO CITY MANAGER, KRONK, WHO I BELIEVE WILL, UM, WALK US THROUGH, UM, TO ADDRESS THE ISSUES REGARDING THE STAFF RECOMMENDATION ON THIS CASE.

THANK YOU, JERRY AND MAYOR AND COUNCIL MEMBERS, AS YOU KNOW, THIS HAS BEEN A COMPLEX AND CHALLENGING DISCUSSION AND STAFF HAS REALLY WORKED HARD TO ADDRESS AS MANY OF YOUR QUESTIONS AS POSSIBLE.

WE SENT OUT MEMOS FROM THE DEPARTMENTS ON JUNE 8TH AND ALSO ON SEPTEMBER 27TH.

AND AGAIN, THIS MORNING, UH, THERE ARE SEVERAL COUNCIL POLICIES THAT HAVE A BEARING ON COUNCIL'S FINAL DETERMINATION REGARDING THIS ITEM AND TAKING ALL OF THOSE INTO CONSIDERATION.

THE PERSPECTIVES BROUGHT FORWARD FOR THIS, UH, FROM THESE RESPECTIVE DEPARTMENTS IN TOTALITY, I'M RECOMMENDING, UH, FROM MY OFFICE THAT THE COUNCIL CONSIDER APPROVING THIS FULL PURPOSE ANNEXATION OF THE SUBJECT PROPERTY, FOR THE REASONS SUMMARIZE IN A POWERPOINT THAT I'M GOING TO ASK A CTM TO BRING FORWARD.

NOW, ESSENTIALLY THE ANNEXATION ADDRESSES MANY ISSUES AND IT IS CONSISTENT WITH OUR IMAGINE AUSTIN COMPREHENSIVE PLAN.

IT'S ALSO CONSISTENT WITH A RESOLUTION.

UH, PREVIOUSLY YOU CAN GO TO THE NEXT SLIDE THAT WAS PREVIOUSLY ADOPTED IN 2020 TO NEGOTIATE AND EXECUTE AN ANNEXATION AND DEVELOPMENT AGREEMENT ON THIS PROPERTY.

THE FULL PURPOSE ANNEXATION DOES A NUMBER OF THINGS AND ALSO REQUIRES OUR BUILDINGS TO OBTAIN A BUILDING PERMITS AND ADHERE TO TECHNICAL CODES.

IT ADDS A PROPERTIES TO OUR TAX BASE.

IT BRINGS THE ENTIRE, UH, 34 ACRES UNDER OUR STANDARD AND REVIEW JURISDICTION.

AND IF ANNEX, THE WHOLE SITE WOULD BE SERVED BY JUST ONE PUBLIC SAFETY PROVIDER INSTEAD OF A SPLIT BETWEEN THE CITY AND COUNTY AND ESD.

IT ALSO ALLOWS FOR THE ADMINISTRATIVE APPROVAL OF THE STR NEXT SLIDE.

TWENTY-FIVE PERCENT OF THIS TRACK IS ALREADY IN THE FULL PURPOSE CITY LIMITS, WHICH AUSTIN WATER IS LEGALLY REQUIRED TO SERVE.

IT'S SURROUNDED AND IMPACTED BY EXISTING UTILITY SERVICES AND EXISTING DEVELOPMENT.

UH, IT'S ALREADY HAS ACCESS TO WATER INFRASTRUCTURE AND THE PROVISION OF WASTEWATER SERVICES THROUGH THE STR IS AN ORDERLY DEVELOPMENT OF THE INFRASTRUCTURE TO THE TRACK.

THIS DEVELOPMENT WILL HAVE HIGH QUALITY INFRASTRUCTURE AND ENVIRONMENTAL PROTECTIONS.

UH, AS YOU KNOW, UH, ALL AUSTIN WATER CRITERIA MANUALS WILL APPLY ENVIRONMENTAL CRITERIA MANUAL APPLY, AND THE INFRASTRUCTURE WILL NOT BE ALLOWED TO CROSS ENVIRONMENTAL TO CROSS ENVIRONMENTALLY SENSITIVE FEATURES.

I'D ALSO ASK ASSISTANT DIRECTOR, KEVIN CHRITTON, DIDN'T BE MOVED OVER, UH, FOR OTHER POSSIBLE QUESTIONS, BUT, UH, BUT, UH, AS A, AS THE MANAGER, UH, I'M SORRY, WHO ASKED THE QUESTION? OH, COUNCIL MEMBER AS THE MANAGER, UM, GREG DIRECTOR OF BOSTON WATER, AS THE MANAGER INDICATED ARE ALL OF OUR DESIGN CRITERIA WILL APPLY TO THE PUBLIC INFRASTRUCTURE ASSOCIATE ASSOCIATED WITH THIS PROJECT.

SO WE HAVE VERY HIGH STANDARDS IN TERMS OF, UH, INFRASTRUCTURE REQUIREMENTS, UH, BUILDING STANDARDS.

CAN YOU SPEAK TO, I KNOW IN THE MEMO OUTLINE CONCERNS AROUND LEAKY, PERHAPS THE POTENTIAL OF LEAKY PIPES.

CERTAINLY.

SO, UH, OUR, OUR INFRASTRUCTURE STANDARDS, UH, WE, WE, UH, ACTIVELY MANAGE THE RISK OF, OF WASTEWATER OVERFLOWS BY ANY STANDARD THAT YOU MEASURE A UTILITY.

WE HAVE VERY HIGH STANDARDS FOR MANAGING WASTEWATER OVERFLOWS, BOTH IN TERMS OF NUMBER VOLUME AND FREQUENCY.

WE'RE A CONSIDERED A BEST PRACTICE LEADER.

IN THAT REGARD, WE HOST ANNUALLY A CONFERENCE, A NATIONAL CONFERENCE HERE IN AUSTIN ON A, ON SANITARY SEWER OVERFLOWS.

WE'VE BEEN RECOGNIZED BY EPA NUMEROUS TIMES FOR MANAGING SANITARY SEWER OVERFLOW RISK.

UH, OUR PUBLIC INFRASTRUCTURE IS BUILT TO STANDARDS THAT ARE CERTAINLY MODERN STANDARDS, UH, LIFT STATIONS THAT WE OWN IN THIS CASE, THIS FLOWS WOULD GO THROUGH OUR VALENTI LIFT STATION.

IT WOULD HAVE BACKUP POWER.

IT WOULD HAVE A SCADA SYSTEMS. IT WOULD HAVE, UM, UH, UH, ACTIVE MONITORING ON A REGULAR BASIS BY AUSTIN WATER STAFF.

WE WOULD VISIT THAT SITE, UH, REGULARLY, UH, UH, PIPING SYSTEMS, A FORCE MAIN IN THIS AREA, UH, THAT TAKES FLOWS FROM THE PUMP STATION WOULD BE OF MODERN STANDARDS AND, UH, HIGHLY RESISTANT TO LEAKS AND BREAKS.

AND THEN A GRAVITY SEWER SYSTEM ALSO SHOWS STATED, SHOULD THE COUNCIL APPROVE THIS, UH, THIS, UH, UH, ANNEXATION WOULD ALSO BE BUILT TO MODERN STANDARDS.

THANK YOU, COUNCIL MEMBER KITCHEN.

UM, THANK YOU.

I'D LIKE TO FOLLOW UP ON THOSE QUESTIONS A BIT.

THANK YOU.

UM, CAN YOU HELP TO HELP US OR HELP AND HELP THE PUBLIC UNDERSTAND? YOU KNOW, THERE'S BEEN RECENT CONCERNS RAISED ABOUT OUR RESOURCES AND ABILITY TO INSPECT, UH, THE WASTEWATER PIPES.

NOW, OF COURSE, THOSE ARE OLDER PIPES THAT CONCERNS HAVE BEEN RAISED ABOUT, BUT, UH, FOR, FOR FOLKS FROM IN THE PUBLIC WHO ARE JUST, YOU KNOW, HEARING THE POTENTIAL CONCERNS ABOUT LEAKAGE IN THE FUTURE, CAN YOU SPEAK TO HOW THIS IS DIFFERENT AND NOT THE SAME AS THE KINDS OF CONCERNS THAT WE'VE SEEN ABOUT, UM, OLDER PIPES CORRODING IN CAUSING LEAKAGE IN OUR, UM, NOT BEING SET UP TO INSPECT THOSE ON A REGULAR BASIS.

CERTAINLY COUNCIL MEMBER BELIEVE YOU'RE REFERRING TO A RECENT NEWS PIECE ON STORMWATER INFRASTRUCTURE, AND REALLY JORGE MIRALIS WOULD HAVE TO ADDRESS STORM WATER INFRASTRUCTURE.

I'M SPEAKING ON WASTEWATER INFRASTRUCTURE.

ALL OF OUR WASTEWATER INFRASTRUCTURE IS INSPECTED ON A REGULAR BASIS.

WE HAVE KNOWN CONDITION RATINGS ON ALL OF OUR INFRASTRUCTURE.

WE HAVE NO WASTEWATER INFRASTRUCTURE THAT WE DON'T KNOW THE CONDITION OF.

WE TARGET POOR CONDITIONING INFRASTRUCTURE WITH CAPITAL IMPROVEMENT PROJECTS.

UH, THIS AREA IS OVER THE AQUIFER AND WE WOULD X THAT HAS A HIGHER STANDARD OF INSPECTION AND SERVICES THAT WE DO, UH, OVER THE AQUIFER.

SO, UH, WE FEEL VERY CONFIDENT ABOUT, UH, NOT ONLY THE EXISTING CONDITION OF INFRASTRUCTURE, BUT HOW WE WOULD MAINTAIN THAT GOING FORWARD.

IN THE PUBLIC'S MIND ABOUT WHAT THAT DISTINCTION IS.

SO HOW OFTEN DO YOU INSPECT, UH, FOR, UH, GRAVITY WASTEWATER LINES THAT WE TRY TO MAINTAIN A SEVEN YEAR CYCLE OF TELEVISING RUNNING ON A TV CAMERA THROUGH A GRAVITY LINE OVER THE AQUIFER? I BELIEVE IT'S A FIVE-YEAR STANDARD THAT WE HAVE.

OUR LIFT STATIONS ARE MONITORED 24 7 THROUGH SCADA.

WE HAVE A CONTROL CENTER THAT IS CONSTANTLY MANNED, AND WE MONITOR LIFT STATIONS TO ENSURE THEY'RE OPERATING PROPERLY.

THE WET WELLS ARE FILLING AND DRAINING PROPERLY THAT THERE'S POWER TO THE STATION.

IF THE SCADA SYSTEM, MATTER OF FACT, IT'S A DUAL PURPOSE GATE ASSIST NURSE TO BACKUP SYSTEMS. IF THE SCALE INDICATES A PROBLEM, WE DISPATCH CREWS DIRECTLY.

WE HAVE AN ENTIRE DIVISION OF AUSTIN WATER THAT DOES NOTHING BUT MANAGE A LIFT STATIONS AND PUMP STATIONS.

AND TORSED MAINS.

UH, WE'RE VERY EXPERIENCED IN THIS ARENA.

WE HAVE A WELL OVER 160 PUMPING FACILITIES ACROSS OUR SYSTEM.

THANK YOU COLLEAGUES.

ANY OTHER QUESTIONS? IT DOESN'T APPEAR SO SORRY, WHICH CASE LET'S GO AHEAD AND VOTE ON THE ITEM COUNCIL MEMBER ALTERED.

UH, THE ITEM BEFORE YOU TODAY RIGHT NOW IS A FLOODPLAIN BARON ADDRESS IS 1514 WEST KENNEWICK LANG AND IT IS IN THE SHOAL CREEK WATERSHED.

NEXT SLIDE PLEASE.

SO THE PICTURE THERE BEFORE YOU SHOWS, CAN NICK LANE RUNNING EAST WEST IN THE MIDDLE OF THE, UP THE PICTURE THAT'S BURNET ROAD RUNNING NORTH SOUTH ON THE LEFT SIDE.

AND JUST OFF THE RIGHT SIDE OF THE PICTURE IS LAMAR RUNNING NORTH, SOUTH AS WELL.

YOU CAN SEE THE PROPERTY HIGHLIGHTED THERE.

IT IS THROTTLED BY THE FLOOD.

AND WE'LL SEE THAT ON THE ZOOM IN WHICH IS THE NEXT SLIDE, PLEASE THERE'S THE PROPERTY OUTLINED IN RED.

AND YOU CAN SEE THAT IT IS ENTIRELY SURROUNDED BY BOTH THE 25 YEAR FLOOD, PLAIN, WHICH IS THE DARK BLUE AND THE 100 YEAR FLOOD POINT IN WHICH IS THE LIGHT BLUE.

THE EXISTING DEVELOPMENT ON THIS PROPERTY IS A RESIDENTIAL BUILDING OF AN ABANDONED COMMERCIAL USE.

AND THERE'S A PICTURE OF WHAT THE PROPERTY LOOKS LIKE TODAY.

THE CURRENT BUILDING ON THE PROPERTY WAS BUILT IN 1952, UM, AND THE PROPERTY WAS NOT LOCATED WITHIN THE FLOOD POINT AT THAT TIME BECAUSE WE DIDN'T HAVE FLOODPLAIN MAPS AT THAT TIME.

SO AT THE PROPOSED DEVELOPMENT, UM, THE APPLICANT SUBMITTED IT TO THE CITY PRIOR TO OUR FLOODPLAIN REGULATION UPDATES IN, IN NOVEMBER, 2019.

THEREFORE, AS I GO THROUGH THE REST OF THE PRESENTATION AND I TALK ABOUT 100 YEAR FLOOD PLAINS AND TWENTY-FIVE AND 500 YEAR FLOOD PLAINS, THE 100 DAY OF PIPELINE IS THE OLD 100 YEAR FLOOD PLAIN.

AND SO I'LL TRY TO POINT OUT SOME OF THE DIFFERENCES BETWEEN THE OLD 100 YEAR FLOOD PLAIN AND THE CURRENT 500 YEAR FLOOD, PLAIN, WHICH AS WE ALL KNOW IS THE CURRENT 100 YEAR FLOOD PLAN.

SO I KNOW THAT'S CONFUSING.

SO THE PROPOSED DEVELOPMENT IS A THREE-STORY OFFICE BUILDING WITH FIRST FLOOR BEING PRIMARILY PARKING AND THEN FLOORS TWO AND THREE BEING OFFICE SPACE.

NEXT SLIDE, PLEASE.

THE DEVELOPER IS SIGNIFICANTLY MINIMIZING FLOOD RISKS ON A PROPERTY, BUT DOING TWO THINGS.

THE BUILDING ITSELF IS A MINIMAL OF 2.4 FEET ABOVE THE 100 YEAR FLOOD, PLAIN, THE OLD 100 YEAR, 2.1 FEET ABOVE THE NEW 100 YEAR OR 500 YEAR FLOOD PLAN.

**NEXT SLIDE PLEASE.** 

THE PARKING AREA IS A AND I, I WAS, I GOT A CLARIFICATION ON THIS WITH THE, UH, DESIGN ENGINEER TO THIS MORNING.

UH, THE PARKING IS NOT TWO FEET ABOVE THE A HUNDRED YEAR FLOOD PLAIN, BUT IT IS ELEVATED ABOVE THE FLOOD PLAIN.

IT'S NOT REQUIRED TO BE MORE THAN THE TWO FEET, BUT SO THE PARKING IS DEFINITELY LOCATED.

LOCATED IS ELEVATED ABOVE THE FLOODPLAIN.

ELEVATION.

NEXT SLIDE PLEASE.

HOWEVER, FROM THE MAPS THAT WE LOOKED AT PREVIOUSLY, UH, SORRY, LET ME SKIP THAT.

UH, THE, THE PROJECT AS DESIGNED DOES NOT CAUSE ADVERSE FLOODING TO ANY OTHER PROPERTIES THAT SURROUND IT.

**NEXT SLIDE PLEASE.** 

BUT AS THE, AS THE PICTURES THAT WE LOOKED AT PREVIOUSLY INDICATE THERE SINCE THE PROPERTY IS COMPLETELY SURROUNDED BY A FLOOD PLAIN, THAT THE PROPER, THE PROJECT IS NOT, UH, DOES NOT SATISFY THE SAFE ACCESS REQUIREMENT, WHICH IS, UM, YOU HAVE TO BID A WALK FROM THE BUILDING TO THE RIGHT OF WAY, ALL AT AN ELEVATION.

AND THAT'S A ONE FOOT ABOVE THE 100 YEAR FLOOD, PLAIN.

**NEXT SLIDE PLEASE.** 

SO THE PARENT'S REQUEST INCLUDES THREE THINGS.

THE FIRST SPIRIT'S QUEST IS A BARRIER TO THE SAFE ACCESS REGULATION.

THE SECOND FERROUS REQUEST IS THEY IS PROHIBITING EXPANDING, CHANGING ENLARGING, OR ALTERING THE USE OF A, OF A NON-CONFORMING PROPERTY, SUCH THAT IT INCREASES THE NON-CONFORMITY.

AND IN THIS CASE WHERE THEY ARE INCREASING THE BUILDING AREA ON THE SITE, WE CONSIDER THAT INCREASING THEIR NON-CONFORMITY.

IT SITS THE PROPERTY DOESN'T MEET THIS SAFE ACCESS RULE

IN THE THIRD, UH, VRX REQUEST IS TO, IS TO, UH, PROPOSE THE BUILDING BEING IN THE 25 AND 100 YEAR FLOOD POINT ITSELF.

**NEXT SLIDE PLEASE.** 

SO JUST TO SUMMARIZE THE FINDINGS, THE FRONT OF THIS APPLICATION AND THIS REQUEST, UH, AS I STATED BEFORE, THE DEVELOPMENT DOES NOT CAUSE ADVERSE FLOODING ON ANY OTHER PROPERTIES.

HOWEVER, IT DOES NOT MEET THE SAFE ACCESS REGULATION.

THE PROPOSED BUILDING IS MORE THAN TWO FEET ABOVE THE 500 YEAR FLOOD PLAIN, AND THE PARKING AREA IS ELEVATED ABOVE THE OLD 100 YEAR FLOOD.

PLAIN.

THERE IS AN ADDITIONAL OCCUPANCY THAT'S BEING PROPOSED IN A OF PIPELINE THAT'S BECAUSE THE BUILDING IS LARGER THAN THE ONES THAT THAT'S THERE TODAY.

AND ACCORDING TO THE BUILDING CODE, A HARDSHIP ADDITION FOR THIS PROPERTY DOES EXIST SINCE THE PROPERTY IS COMPLETELY SURROUNDED BY THE FLOOD PLAIN, AND THEY CANNOT MEET THE STATE FACTSET'S REGULATION.

STAFF IS RECOMMENDING APPROVAL OF THIS VARIOUS REQUEST.

AND I WANT TO POINT OUT TWO THINGS, TWO REASONS WHY WE ARE MAKING THAT REQUEST OR THAT THAT RECOMMENDATION.

THE FIRST IS THE FLOOD RISK ON THIS TO THIS PROPERTY IS RELATIVELY LOW IN CON IN RELATION TO OTHER PORTS THEY'LL OF SHOAL CREEK AND CERTAINLY OTHER PORTIONS ACROSS THE CITY.

THE 100 YEAR FLOOD, PLAIN DEPTH IS APPROXIMATELY ONE FOOT WITHIN CANUCK LANE.

AND THE OTHER THING THAT'S KEY IS THAT THE VELOCITY OF THOSE IS RELATIVELY LOW, ALMOST ZERO.

THIS IS WHAT WE CALL IN A BACKWATER AREA WHERE WATER JUST BACKS UP TO THIS LOW POINT.

IT IS NOT AN ACTIVELY FLOWING AREA OF THE FLOODPLAIN.

THE SECOND REASON THAT WE'RE PROVIDING THIS RECOMMENDATION IS THAT THE DEVELOPER IS MAKING SOME SIGNIFICANT, SIGNIFICANT DESIGN CONSIDERATIONS TO MINIMIZE FLOOD RISK ON THEIR PROPERTY.

THEY'RE ELEVATING THE ENTIRE PARKING AREA AND THEY'RE PUTTING 90% OF THE BUILDING AREA ON THE SECOND FLOOR AND THIRD FLOOR, WHICH IS MORE THAN 14 FEET ABOVE THE 100 YEAR FLOOD PLAN.

SO THEY'RE DOING SOME SIGNIFICANT DESIGN ITEMS THAT REDUCE FLOOD RISK ON THEIR PROPERTY.

SO THERE ARE TWO CONDITIONS IN THE DRAFT ORDINANCE THAT'S IN YOUR PACKET.

AND, UH, BOTH OF THESE CONDITIONS HAVE TO BE SATISFIED BY THE APPLICANT PRIOR TO RECEIVING THEIR CERTIFICATE OF OCCUPANCY.

AND THOSE TWO CONDITIONS ARE DEDICATING A DRAINAGE EASEMENT TO THE FORKS OUT OF THE FLOODPLAIN AND PROVIDING AN ELEVATION CERTIFICATE, WHICH IS THE WAY TO ENSURE THAT THE BUILDING WAS BUILT THE WAY IT WAS DESIGNED.

I WILL TELL YOU ONE OF THE REASONS THAT, UH, THERE MAY BE A LITTLE BIT MORE ON PDC IS BECAUSE WE ADDED IN SOME, SOME, SOME BUFFER FOR ADVERSE WEATHER AND SOME OTHER THINGS THAT MAY HAPPEN.

AND I KNOW IT MAY TAKE YOU A LITTLE BIT OF TIME AFTER TODAY, AND I THINK WE SHOULD GO AHEAD AND CERTAINLY APPROVE, UM, THE CONTRACT FOR THE SERVICES ALREADY RENDERED.

I DON'T KNOW WHETHER WE HAVE ANY FLEXIBILITY IN TERMS OF OUR NEXT CONTRACT.

UM, PROBABLY NOT BECAUSE YOU NEED SOMEBODY IN THERE IN PLACE RIGHT AWAY.

I THINK THOUGH, AS AN ONGOING MANAGEMENT STRATEGY, I REALLY QUESTION, WE REALLY NEED THAT INFORMATION TO KNOW WHETHER THIS IS THE RIGHT MODEL.

AND SO WHEN WE APPROVE THIS YEAR'S FISCAL, WHEN WE APPROVED THIS YEAR'S BUDGET WAS WHERE THE FEES SET IN SUCH A WAY AS TO ACCOMMODATE THIS, THIS, UM, COSTS.

SO THE DSD BUDGET, UH, SHOULD HAVE THE RENTAL, UH, ASSOCIATED WITH THE BUILDING, WHICH THEN FACTORS INTO THE FEES.

WE TAKE MANY THINGS INTO CONSIDERATION, INCLUDING THE EXISTING FUND BALANCE.

AND SO I CAN TELL YOU WITHOUT A DOUBT THAT THE BUDGET THAT IS APPROVED FOR DSD HAS ALL THIS INTO CONSIDERATION ANNUALLY AS PER COUNCIL DIRECTION.

WE LOOK AT THIS AND SO NEXT YEAR WE'LL TAKE A LOOK AT IT AS WELL AS WELL.

I BELIEVE YOU PULLED THIS ONE ALSO, I THINK ON SOME OF OUR KITCHEN, BUT I WANTED TO JUST MOVE APPROVAL FIRST SO THAT WE HAVE A MOTION ON THE TABLE.

ABSOLUTELY.

I MOVE APPROVAL ON ONE 10 PLEASE.

UM, APPROVAL OF ITEM NUMBER ONE, 10 HAS BEEN MADE BY COUNCIL MEMBER ALTAR.

IS THERE A SECOND, SECOND OF, I CAN'T REMEMBER KITCHEN, UM, ANY DISCUSSION COUNCIL MEMBER KITCHEN? UH. YES.

I, UH, HAD POSTED ON THE MESSAGE BOARD AND, UH, PASSED OUT TO EVERYONE, SOME POTENTIAL AMENDMENTS.

UM, I WANNA THANK, UM, COUNCIL MEMBER ALTAR FOR HER LEADERSHIP AND, AND BRINGING FORWARD THIS RESOLUTION.

I THINK IT'S REALLY AN IMPORTANT RESOLUTION BECAUSE IT'S IMPORTANT AT THE TIME THAT WE ADOPT PLANS.

WE ALSO THINK ABOUT IMPLEMENTATION, SO I SUPPORT IT AND I HAD SOME CLARIFYING LANGUAGE.

I AM GOING TO NOT PROCEED WITH THE FIRST PARAGRAPH THAT I HAD PROPOSED.

UH, BUT INSTEAD I WANT TO ASK SOME QUESTIONS RELATED TO THAT.

AND THEN I DO HAVE, UM, SOME LANGUAGE TO PROPOSE FOR, UM, THIS, THIS SECOND AND THIRD PARAGRAPH I HAD, UM, PROPOSED FOR THE LAST BIT RESOLVED.

SO I'LL GET TO THAT IN A MINUTE.

SO THE FIRST, UM, ON THE YELLOW SHEET, I PASSED OUT THIS MORNING.

I HAD SUGGESTED SOME LANGUAGE THAT RELATED TO CREATING A WORK GROUP, UH, FOR COUNCIL MEMBERS.

UM, UNDERSTANDING NOW THAT PERHAPS THAT'S NOT THE ROUTE THAT PEOPLE WOULD PREFER TO MOVE IN, UH, WHICH IS FINE.

MY THINKING WAS TO, UH, TO BE A BIT MORE SPECIFIC IN TERMS OF HOW WE AS A COUNCIL, UM, SPEAK TO HOW WE ARE GOING TO CONTINUE OUR EFFORTS AROUND CLIMATE EQUITY AND HOW WE ARE GOING TO AS A COUNCIL, UH, RECEIVE, UH, FEEDBACK ON IMPLEMENTATION, DISCUSS IT AND PROVIDE ANY GUIDANCE.

SO THOUGHT IS, UM, AND I'LL ASK, UH, COUNCIL MEMBER ALTER IF SHE WANTS TO SPEAK TO THIS, BUT I WANT TO MAKE SURE I'M UNDERSTANDING WHAT WAS INTENDED, UH, WITH THE RESOLUTION AS WRITTEN.

SO THE RESOLUTION AS WRITTEN HAS A SECTION ON PAGE SEVEN THAT TALKS ABOUT, UM, CITY IS DIRECTED TO PROVIDE AT LEAST QUARTERLY UPDATES ON IMPLEMENTATION TO THE CITY COUNCIL DURING REGULAR WORK SESSIONS.

I WAS INITIALLY REACTING TO THAT WHEN I, UH, PROPOSED A WORK GROUP, BECAUSE I WAS THINKING THAT PERHAPS THAT WAS NOT, UM, DEFINITIVE ENOUGH.

I WAS THINKING THAT PERHAPS QUARTERLY MIGHT NOT BE OFTEN ENOUGH.

I WAS ALSO THINKING THAT A LOT OF

TIMES OUR WORK SESSIONS DON'T GIVE US, UH, THE TIME TO PAY FULL ATTENTION TO WHAT, UH, TO SPECIFIC ISSUES, UH, THAT WE CAN SOMETIMES DO THROUGH A WORK GROUP OR A COMMITTEE.

BUT I AM CERTAINLY OPEN AND I WANT TO UNDERSTAND AND HEAR THE INTENTION OF COUNCIL MEMBER ALTAR AND THE OTHER.

CO-SPONSORS, I'M CERTAINLY OPEN TO DOING IT THIS WAY, IF THE PREFERENCES TO PROCEED THAT WAY.

AND, UM, IT MAY BE THAT WE DON'T NEED A WORK GROUP, OR WE DON'T NEED A COMMITTEE AND THAT WE CAN HANDLE FEEDBACK.

I CERTAINLY KNOW THAT ALL OF US WOULD LIKE TO BE ABLE TO PARTICIPATE.

SO WE DON'T WANT TO SET UP A MECHANISM THAT MAKES IT DIFFICULT FOR EVERYONE TO PARTICIPATE.

SO I'M OKAY WITH PROCEEDING WITH THE LANGUAGE AS WRITTEN, UM, AS LONG AS WE KEEP OPEN THE, KEEP A NOTE, KEEP OPEN, KEEP AN OPEN MIND ABOUT HOW THIS PROCEEDS, AND IF WE'RE FINDING IT'S NOT WORKING THROUGH UPDATES IN A WORK SESSION THAT WE ALLOW OURSELVES THE OPPORTUNITY TO TALK ABOUT WHETHER WE WANT TO CREATE A MORE STRUCTURED, UH, INPUT INPUT PROCESS THROUGH A WORK GROUP OR SOMETHING.

SO THAT'S, I'M SAYING A LOT HERE.

I APPRECIATE, UM, YOUR SUPPORT ON THIS ITEM.

UM, I THINK WE WERE, WE, THIS IS THE PIECE OF THE RESOLUTION THAT WE WENT BACK AND FORTH ON MULTIPLE TIMES.

UM, SO IT DOESN'T SURPRISE ME THAT THIS WOULD COME UP AND BE SOMETHING THAT WE NEED TO HAVE A CONVERSATION ON.

UM, WE CURRENTLY HAVE NINE CO-SPONSORS OF THIS, UM, AND WE HAVE A PROBLEM THAT NEEDS TO BE ELEVATED TO THE WHOLE COUNCIL ON A REGULAR BASIS.

AND WE HAVE, UH, IDA, WE HAVE A ISSUE THAT WE NEED THE CITY MANAGER TO BE PAYING ATTENTION TO, AND WE NEED TO HAVE STAFF AND DEPARTMENTS FROM ALL OVER, UM, THE CITY, UH, PAYING ATTENTION AS WELL AS THE, AS THE COMMUNITY.

UM, WE DIDN'T REALLY FEEL LIKE THAT WAS EFFICIENT FOR THE STAGE WE WERE AT, UM, FOR THE NEXT STEPS, NOTHING IN THIS PRECLUDES.

UM, SEVERAL OF US TAKING IT UPON OURSELVES TO WORK TOGETHER.

UM, IF WE CREATE A WORK GROUP, WE WILL END UP BACK AT THE SAME PLACE WHERE IT ENDS UP BEING A COMMITTEE BECAUSE WE HAVE SIX OF US AND IT'S A COMMITTEE OF THE WHOLE, UM, I HAD A LOT OF TROUBLE FIGURING OUT WHO COULD BE WHO I WAS GOING TO INVITE TO CO-SPONSOR.

SO WE HAVE THE AUSTIN WATER COMMITTEE, WHICH COUNCIL UMBRELLAS CHAIRS, AND LAWSON ENERGY, UM, THAT COUNCIL MEMBER POOL IS TEARING AND THEN MOBILITY THAT, WELL, YOU'RE NOT, OH, SHE'S DOING, I'M SORRY, YOU'RE DOING WATER AND WATER ABILITY.

SO WE SLEPT BOTH OF THOSE COMMITTEES, BOTH OF THOSE COMMITTEES.

UM, AND YOU KNOW, AND THEN I DO AUDIT I'M CHAIRING AUDIT AND FINANCE, AND WE HAVE THE HEALTH AND HUMAN SERVICES.

SO WE HAVE A LOT OF COMMITTEES THAT ARE DOING, AND SOME OF THEM ARE REALLY TAKING UP, UM, THESE ISSUES.

SO THE PERIOD WOULD STOP AFTER RESPONSIBILITIES.

PARDON? OKAY.

ALL RIGHT.

UM, SO, SO MAYOR PRO TEM, THEN MY LAST, UH, SUGGESTED LANGUAGE AS AT THE END OF THAT LAST PARAGRAPH AND IT'S, UM, SAME KIND OF THING, UH, RELATED TO A LITTLE BIT, UH, MORE CLARITY AROUND THE LANGUAGE.

THE CITY COUNCIL RECOGNIZES AND APPRECIATES THE ROLE OF THE JOINT SUSTAINABILITY COMMITTEE AND ADVANCING THE CITY'S CLIMATE GOALS.

AND THEN I'M PROPOSING TO ADD AND RECOGNIZES THE BENEFIT OF A RACIAL DIVERSITY IN THIS WORK

AND COMMITS TO APPOINTING NEW MEMBERS THAT WILL IMPROVE RACIAL DIVERSITY ON THE COMMITTEE CITY MANAGERS DIRECTOR RETURNED BY NOVEMBER 1ST, 2020 21 WITH A DRAFT ORDINANCE TO UPDATE THE BYLAWS OF THE JOINT SUSTAINABILITY COMMITTEE.

THE, THE IDEA THERE WAS JUST TO RECOGNIZE SOMETHING THAT'S ALREADY, UM, I I'M SURE THE, UM, COUNCIL MEMBER ALTER IN THE CO-SPONSORS ARE ALREADY INTENDING.

AND THAT WOULD BE THAT THE JOINT SUSTAINABILITY COMMITTEE THAT THE NEW MEMBERS, UH, HELP IMPROVE RACIAL DIVERSITY, BUT ALSO THAT IT'S DONE TIMELY.

AND THAT'S WHY I PUT IN THE NOVEMBER 1ST THERE.

SO I SEE THE CITY MANAGER STEPPED OFF.

SO MY QUESTION TO HIM IS WHETHER THIS, THIS WORKS, AND MY QUESTION TO COUNCIL MEMBER ALTER IS WHETHER THIS IS ALIGNED WITH Y'ALL'S THINKING.

SO, UM, YOU MAY HAVE A DIFFERENT COMMENT, BUT, UM, LET ME JUST, I'M ALL FOR IT.

IT BEING RACIALLY, THE GROUP TO BE RACIAL DIVERSE.

I THINK THAT SENTIMENT IS FINE.

I THINK THAT WAS THE INTENTION.

UM, WE WROTE IT THIS WAY BECAUSE NORMALLY IF YOU HAVE AN EXISTING COMMISSION AND THEY'RE DOING BYLAW CHANGES, IT COMES FROM THE COMMISSION.

THEN IT GOES TO AUDIT AND FINANCE, AND THEN IT COMES TO COUNCIL UM, AND I'M NOT SURE THAT WHAT THE TASK FORCE WANTED WAS FOR STAFF TO DETERMINE THAT MAKEUP AS MUCH AS THEY WANT.

THEY HAVE A VERY CLEAR IDEA OF, OF HOW THEY THINK, UM, THAT, UM, THOSE EXTRA, UM, MEMBERS WHERE THEY SHOULD COME FROM.

AND SINCE THAT IS ALREADY A JOINT BODY OF A LOT OF COMMISSIONS, I THINK THEM COMING FORWARD AND SAYING, THIS IS THE GROUP OF THE PEOPLE THAT WE NEED TO ADD TO OUR GROUP TO BE SUCCESSFUL.

UM, THAT WAS WHAT WE WERE TRYING TO ALLOW THEM TO DO AND FOLLOW NORMAL PROCEDURES, UM, RATHER THAN IMPOSING ON THE JOINT SUSTAINABILITY COMMITTEE, SOMETHING FROM STAFF, WHICH THEN COUNCIL WOULD EDIT BASED ON WHAT THE COMMITTEE WANTS, ET CETERA.

UM, SO, SO PERHAPS, UM, WE COULD ADD AND RECOGNIZES THE BENEFIT OF A RACIAL OF RACIAL DIVERSITY WITHOUT THE, A IN THERE, IN THIS WORK.

SO DELETING THAT LAST SENTENCE CERTAINLY AS APPROPRIATE.

SO SHOULD WE JUST DO THAT? AND SO ALL IT WILL HAVE IS IT ENDS CURRENTLY IN ADVANCING THE CITY'S CLIMATE GOALS.

AND THEN WE WOULD JUST ADD AND RECOGNIZES THE BENEFIT OF A RACIAL DIVERSITY IN THIS WORK AND COMMITS TO APPOINTING NEW MEMBERS THAT WILL IMPROVE RACIAL DIVERSITY ON THE COMMITTEE PERIOD, AND JUST END IT THERE IS THAT, DOES THAT WORK QUITE CHILL? YEAH.

SO STRIKING THE CITY MANAGERS DIRECTED TO RETURN, UM, I THINK THAT ALIGNS WITH THE INTENTION THAT THEY HAD.

I WOULD TAKE OUT THE A, BEFORE A RE BEFORE RACIAL DIVERSITY. OH, TYPO. YES. YEAH. SO, AND RECOGNIZES THE BENEFIT OF RACIAL DIVERSITY IN THIS WORK AND COMMITS TO APPOINTING NEW MEMBERS THAT WILL IMPROVE RACIAL DIVERSITY ON THE COMMITTEE. UM, THAT'D BE FINE WITH ME AS LONG AS WE UNDERSTAND THAT. WHAT WE'RE, WHAT WE'RE SAYING IS TO THE JOINT SUSTAINABILITY COMMITTEE. OKAY. YOU WANT TO ADD MORE MEMBERS, YOU NEED TO UPDATE YOUR BYLAWS AND GO THROUGH THE PROCESS, AND WE WANT YOU TO COME UP WITH THE INITIAL PROPOSAL, UM, UM, FOR THAT. AND THEN IF WE'RE THE ONES APPOINTING THEM, OR IF IT'S A DIFFERENT PROCESS THEN, BECAUSE WE HAVE LOTS OF COMMISSIONS THAT HAVE DIFFERENT, DIFFERENT APPROACHES, YOU KNOW, WHATEVER THE PROCESS IS, UM, THAN NOT, THEN I WOULD BE COMFORTABLE WITH THAT. YEAH. OKAY. OKAY. PRESENT. SO, SO THAT ONE'S CONSIDERED FRIENDLY AS WELL, CHANGES. YES. UM, UH, [04:25:01] MAYOR ADLER AND BY FRIENDLY AMENDMENT, WE MADE NO ONE ON THE DYESS HAS ANY OBJECTIONS TO IT BECAUSE I DON'T, BUT IT TAKES ALL OF US NOT TO HAVE AN OBJECTION TO AN AMENDMENT FOR IT TO GO.

I UNDERSTAND.

ARE THERE ANY OBJECTIONS TO STRIKE IN THAT LAST LINE, THE CITY MANAGER'S DIRECTED, UM, TO RETURN BY YADA YADA YADA SEEING NONE HEARING NONE.

UM, WE ARE CONSIDERING THAT ONE, A FRIENDLY AMENDMENT, AND I DIDN'T DO THE SAME FOR THE LAST ONE WHERE WE WERE STRIKING, WHERE WE STOPPED AT RESPONSIBILITIES, PERIOD, STRIKING AS DIRECTED IN THE SECOND, BE IT RESOLVED.

UM, ARE THERE ANY OBJECTIONS TO THAT HERE, NANCY? AND NONE, THE, BOTH OF THOSE ARE CONSIDERED FRIENDLY AND THEN YOU STRUCK THE FIRST ONE, SO, RIGHT.

OKAY.

SO THE NEW MOTION WOULD BE SO, SO WE, NOW WHAT YOU HAVE ON THE TABLE IS JUST THE ORIGINAL MOTION WITH THESE TWO FRIENDLY AMENDMENTS.

AND WHICH CASE IT HAS BEEN MOTIONED AND SECONDED, UM, COUNCIL MEMBER ALTAR.

UM, I JUST WANT TO SPEAK FOR IT TO THE, TO THE, UM, ITEM FOR, FOR ANOTHER MOMENT.

I'VE SAID A LOT AND INVITE MY COLLEAGUES AT FIVE 30, WHERE HAVE A CELEBRATION OF THE ADOPTION OF THE PLAN OUT IN THE OUTSIDE.

UM, TOGETHER, THAT'S HOW WE CAN BE.

THAT'S HOW WE CAN INNOVATE.

THAT'S HOW WE CAN BE THE EXAMPLE THAT WE NEED TO BE FOR OUR BUSINESSES, UM, AND OUR NONPROFITS AND THE ORGANIZATIONS AND THE PEOPLE IN OUR COMMUNITY.

UM, SO, YOU KNOW, I, I JUST WANT TO UNDERSCORE THE IMPORTANCE OF THAT SORT OF DELEGATION AND THAT CALL TO ACTION.

UM, WE DIDN'T GET INTO LOTS OF WEEDS ABOUT ALL OF THE SPECIFICS, UM, THAT IS THE MANAGER'S, UM, ROLE.

UM, BUT, BUT THE POLICY DIRECTION I HOPE IS CLEAR.

UM, AND, AND THE GOALS, UM, ARE THERE AS LAID OUT IN THE PLAN THAT THE WHOLE COMMUNITY HAS COME TOGETHER TO PUT TOGETHER.

SO I, WE JUST DIDN'T WANT TO BE AMBIGUOUS ABOUT THAT.

THAT'S TRYING TO TAKE THOSE STEPS RIGHT NOW THAT COULD BE REALLY TRANSFORMATIONAL AND AVOID THOSE THINGS THAT ARE, THAT ARE COMING IN OUR FUTURE MEMBER FOR THIS JUST QUICKLY.

I JUST WANTED TO THANK COUNSELOR ALTAR FOR YOUR LEADERSHIP AND BRINGING FORWARD THIS ITEM, THIS IMPLEMENTATION FRAMEWORK, AND, YOU KNOW, THIS ISSUE HITS CLOSE TO HOME FOR MY DISTRICT.

UM, AS WE APPROACH HALLOWEEN, WE'LL BE APPROACHING, UM, A SAD, UM, MILESTONE MEMORY FOR OUR COMMUNITY, WITH THE DEVASTATING FLOODS, THE DEVASTATING HALLOWEEN FLOODS THAT HAPPENED.

UM, AND, AND SO KNOWING THAT,

UM, I'D LIKE TO MOVE PASSAGE AND WITH MY EMOTION SHEET, CAN I DO IT THAT WAY? UM, I SHOULD KNOW THAT I WOULD LIKE TO MOVE PASSAGE WITH, UH, OR ITEM NUMBER ONE 17 WITH THE AMENDMENTS THAT ARE INCLUDED ON THE MODE WITH THE AMENDMENTS THAT ARE INCLUDED ON THE MOTION SHEET AND Y'ALL'S BACKUP.

AND ONCE I GET A SECOND, I CAN SPEAK TO IT.

YOU HAVE A SECOND AND COUNCIL MEMBER TOBO OKAY.

UM, SO, UM, THIS IS, UH, EXCITING TO MOVE FORWARD WITH THIS ITEM ON WATER FORWARD.

UH, YOU KNOW, WE PASSED A RESOLUTION A WHILE BACK, UH, TO, TO MOVE THESE ITEMS FORWARD.

AS A REMINDER, THESE WERE A WATERFORD RECOMMENDATIONS THAT WE ALL HAD PASSED AS PART OF THE LDC.

AND BECAUSE WE DIDN'T FINISH THE LDC, THESE WERE LEFT,

IT RESPONDS TO THE TESTIMONY WE HAD EARLIER TO MAKE IT CLEAR THAT WE ARE, UM, THAT THESE ITEMS ARE TAKING EFFECT DECEMBER 1ST, 2021.

UM, EXCEPT FOR PART FOUR, WHICH HAS ALWAYS BEEN, UH, RECOMMENDED TO TAKE EFFECT ON DECEMBER 1ST, 2023, THE AMENDMENT ALSO ACKNOWLEDGES A CONCERN THAT HAD BEEN RAISED TO US BY STAFF, UH, THAT, UM, THE, UH, LARGE DEVELOPMENT WITH A MULTI-FAMILY COMPONENT, UH, SHOULD WE PUSH PACK TO DECEMBER 1ST, 2023? SO THIS AMENDMENT DOES THAT.

IT SAYS FOR A LARGE DEVELOPMENT WITH A MULTIFAMILY COMPONENT THAT IS MORE THAN 250 FEET FROM, AND WITHIN 500 FEET OF A RECLAIM WATER LINE WOULD NOT HAVE TO CONNECT UNTIL DECEMBER 1ST, 2023.

SO WHAT THIS DOES IS IT MOVES EVERYTHING FORWARD.

ACCORDING TO THE, UM, ORIGINAL RECOMMENDATIONS IS ACKNOWLEDGES THE CONCERN THAT STAFF HAD RAISED, UH, RELATED TO AFFORDABILITY AS IT RELATES JUST TO THE MULTIFAMILY COMPONENT.

SO IT ACKNOWLEDGES THAT AND PROVIDES FOR, UH, TWO YEARS ADDITIONAL TIME FOR THOSE LARGE DEVELOPMENT MULTI-FAMILY WITHIN TWO 50 AND 500 FEET.

SO THAT'S, THAT'S WHAT IT DOES.

AND I THINK THIS IS ALIGNED, UM, WITH THE RECOMMENDATIONS FROM STAFF, AS WELL AS WHAT WE HEARD EARLIER FROM DAVID FOSTER ABOUT THE IMPORTANCE OF MOVING FORWARD WITH THIS AND MOVING FORWARD WITH AS MUCH OF IT AS WE CAN RIGHT NOW, UM, ON THAT, UM, THE DUAL PIPING AND THE CONNECTING TO THE, UM, UH, TO THE, UM, ADDITIONAL PIPING.

SO, UM, I KNOW COUNCIL MEMBER TOBO HAD ASKED ABOUT THAT, AND I DON'T KNOW IF SHE WANTS TO SAY ANYTHING ELSE ABOUT IT.

COUNCIL MEMBER TEBOW.

I DO HAVE SOME COMMENTS TO MAKE, BUT PROBABLY NOT AT THIS STAGE, EXCEPT THAT I SUPPORT THE AMENDMENT.

I THINK IT'S, UM, REALLY CRITICAL THAT WE MOVE FORWARD WITH THESE STRATEGIES AS SOON AS POSSIBLE AS SOMEONE IN, IN THE EARLIER PRESS CONFERENCE SAID, I MEAN, WE HAVE, WE HAVE

PLANS ON THE SHELF HERE, THE CITY OF AUSTIN, AND NEED TO GET NEED TO PUT THOSE PLANS INTO ACTION.

YOU KNOW, THE, THE WATER FORWARD WORK STARTED YEARS AGO.

UM, THE FIRST BEGINNINGS OF, OF THE WATER, WHAT BECAME THE WATER FORWARD PLAN STARTED IN 2014.

AND, YOU KNOW, THAT WAS RIGHT AFTER OR RIGHT DURING, UM, ONE OF THE WORST DROUGHTS ON RECORD IN THE, IN CENTRAL TEXAS, BETWEEN 2008 AND 2016, OUR CENTRAL TEXAS EXPERIENCED A DROUGHT SO SEVERE THAT THE STORAGE LEVELS OF THE HIGHLAND LAKES, WHICH IS OUR PRIMARY WATER SOURCE, OUR PRIMARY SOURCE OF DRINKING WATER, WHEREAS LOW AS 37%.

AND SO IT'S JUST VERY CRITICAL THAT WE MOVE THESE STRATEGIES FORWARD.

THEY ARE, YOU KNOW, WE'VE HEARD DIFFERENT CONCERNS THROUGH THE YEARS ABOUT THE COST OF THAT AT THE UPFRONT COSTS OF THAT INFRASTRUCTURE.

BUT I CAN TELL YOU AS SOMEONE WHO SAT ON THIS DYESS DURING THE PERIOD OF TIME WHERE WE WERE LOOKING FOR, AND CONSIDERING THE POSSIBILITY OF ENTERING INTO AGREEMENTS TO BRING IN WATER FROM OTHER COMMUNITIES INTO THIS ONE, SO THAT WE COULD ASSURE OUR RESIDENTS, THAT WE WOULD HAVE AN ADEQUATE WATER SUPPLY, THAT THOSE, YOU KNOW, THE ALTERNATIVES ARE EXTREMELY COSTLY TOO.

SO, UM, THAT'S ALL I HAVE TO SAY FOR RIGHT NOW, THE COUNCIL MEMBER ALTER AND THEN COUNCIL MEMBER ELLIS.

UM, THE OTHER COMPONENT OF WHAT COUNCIL'S LOOKING AT IN THIS PARTICULAR ITEM REQUIRES A WATER USE PINCHED MARKING IN THE LAND USE REVIEW PROCESS.

SO THE, SO BUILT INTO THE PROCEDURE THAT WE'RE PUTTING FORWARD, THEY WOULD BE INFORMED OF THAT AND HAVE SOMEONE TALKING THROUGH THE BENEFITS AND BE AWARE THAT THE LINE WAS WITHIN THAT NUMBER OF FEET FOR THEM.

OKAY, GREAT.

THANK YOU, COUNCIL MEMBER ELLIS.

THANK YOU.

I DO REALLY APPRECIATE, UM, THE, THE DIRECTION THAT THIS IS HEADING.

I HAD TWO QUESTIONS THAT WE HAD ASKED OF STAFF.

I THINK IT MAY HAVE BEEN MR. CROW THAT ANSWERED THEM, BUT I'M GLAD TO SEE MR. CRITTENDON ON HERE TOO.

I JUST WANTED TO ASK THEM PUBLICLY SO I COULD MAKE SURE I HAVE THE CORRECT UNDERSTANDING WITH REGARD TO THE WORDING.

THE DIRECTOR SHALL GRANT A VARIANCE.

I UNDERSTAND THIS WOULD BE ADMINISTRATIVE, RIGHT? SO THIS WOULD BASICALLY BE THEY AUTOMATICALLY QUALIFY OR THEY CAN FILL OUT A SIMPLE FORM AND IT JUST GETS BLESSED BY STAFF.

IS THAT THE, UH, YOUR INTERPRETATION COUNCIL MEMBER? YEAH, THIS IS ROSS AND THAT IS ABSOLUTELY CORRECT.

AND THERE'S NO DISCRETION FOR DIRECTOR.

IT WOULD JUST FILL OUT THE FORM AND GET THEIR VARIANTS AND WOULD MEET THAT REQUIREMENT.

WAS THAT THE INTENT WHEN YOU WROTE IT? THEY WERE JUST FOR THE, YES.

THAT IS THE INTENT.

YOU KNOW, I, I APPRECIATE WHAT COUNCIL MEMBER ALTAR BROUGHT UP.

I THINK THAT, UH, IF I'M UNDERSTANDING CORRECTLY, THEY HAVE TO FILL OUT A FORM AND THEN THEY ARE GRANTED THE VARIANCE.

IF THEY CHOOSE TO CONNECT, THEY CAN STILL CHOOSE TO CONNECT.

SO BASED ON WHAT COUNCIL MEMBER ALTER'S QUESTION WAS.

YES, TOTALLY AGREE WITH THAT.

I THINK THAT'S, THAT'S GOOD NEWS AND HELPFUL.

UM, AND JUST WITH THE LANGUAGE MULTI-FAMILY COMPONENT, I WANTED TO MAKE SURE THIS INCLUDED MIXED USE DEVELOPMENTS AND APARTMENT COMPLEXES.

YES, IT DOES.

IT WOULD INCLUDE ANYTHING WITH A MULTIFAMILY COMPONENT.

OKAY, GOOD.

THOSE WERE MY TWO QUESTIONS.

SO THIS HAS BEEN A REALLY INTERESTING NUMBER OF CONVERSATIONS I'VE BEEN HAVING OVER THE MONTHS ABOUT HOW TO SIMULTANEOUSLY SIMULTANEOUSLY ACHIEVE AFFORDABILITY ON THE FRONT END AND THE BACK END, SO THAT WE CAN HAVE RESILIENCE IN OUR COMMUNITY AND ALSO HAVE A ROBUST AMOUNT OF HOUSING SUPPLY.

UM, AND ALSO BECAUSE THE AFFORDABILITY IMPACT STATEMENT IS NOT QUITE READY FOR THIS YET.

I THINK THIS IS A GREAT TEST PERIOD TO GET THINGS GOING AND REALLY APPRECIATE THAT FOCUS ON, UM, THE MULTIFAMILY ASPECT OF IT.

SO THANK YOU, MAYOR ADLER.

UM, I JUST WANT TO MAKE CLEAR SOUNDS, I THINK EVERYONE'S WANTS WATER FORWARD TO, TO, TO MOVE FORWARD.

UH, STAFF HAD, UH, RAISED A RESERVATION THAT WANTED MORE TIME, UH, WITH THIS AMENDMENT.

DOES THIS MAKE THIS NOW WORKABLE FOR THE, UH, FOR THE STAFF AGAIN, KEVIN CRITTENDON OLSON, WATER MERRICK.

YES.

THAT, FROM OUR PERSPECTIVE, I THINK WE CAN CERTAINLY WORK WITH WHAT WE HAVE HERE AT THE SEASONING AND CAN EASILY WORK IT INTO KIND OF OUR CURRENT PROCESSES AND WORKFLOW.

THAT'S GOOD.

I REMEMBER REALLY WELL AS A COUNCIL MEMBER, TOVA POINTED OUT THAT DROUGHT WE WERE IN AND THAT THE, THE BILLION DOLLAR, UH, SOLUTIONS THAT WERE BEING SHOPPED TO US, UH, ONE OF THE FIRST THINGS, THE NEW TEN ONE COUNCIL DID WAS MAKE IT RAIN AND FILL THE RESERVOIRS.

THANK YOU, MAYOR PRO TEM AND COUNCIL AND COMMUNITY.

UH, AS YOU KNOW, AFTER A MONTH LONG PROCESS WITH EXTENSIVE COMMUNITY CONSULTATION TO IDENTIFY THE BEST CANDIDATE FOR THE JOB, I'M PROUD TO BRING FORWARD JOSEPH CHACONE AS MY APPOINTMENT FOR THE NEXT AUSTIN POLICE CHIEF, AS MANY OF YOU KNOW, CHIEF CHACONE HAS SERVED WITH THE AUSTIN POLICE DEPARTMENT FOR MORE THAN TWO DECADES, INCLUDING THE PAST SIX MONTHS SERVING AS INTERIM CHEAP PRIOR TO HIS INTERIM APPOINTMENT.

CHIEF MCKOWN SERVED AS ASSISTANT CHIEF FOR ALMOST FIVE YEARS, OVERSEEING PATROL, SPECIAL OPERATIONS, SPECIALIZED PATROL, INVESTIGATIONS, INTELLIGENCE, PROFESSIONAL STANDARDS, AND TRAINING AND RECRUITING.

I'D LIKE TO TAKE A MOMENT TO DESCRIBE THE PROCESS AND HOW WE GOT HERE IN MARCH.

THE CITY RELEASED A SURVEY, ASKING THE PUBLIC TO IDENTIFY THE SKILLS AND CHARACTERISTICS, BACKGROUND, AND EXPERIENCE AND TOP PRIORITIES.

THEY BELIEVE THAT WERE MOST IMPORTANT FOR THE NEXT CHIEF OF POLICE RESPONSES TO THE SURVEY HELPED ESTABLISH THE SELECTION CRITERIA FOR THIS POSITION.

IN APRIL, WE SOLICITED ADDITIONAL FEEDBACK FROM COMMUNITY GROUPS, INCLUDING FIVE ONLINE COMMUNITY INPUT MEETINGS AND CONSTITUENT CALLS FROM THE CITY'S THREE 11 SERVICE.

THE PROCESS INCLUDED A SERIES OF INTERVIEWS FEATURING PANELISTS DRAWN FROM CITY STAFF AND STAKEHOLDERS FOLLOWED BY TWO PUBLIC FORUMS AND AUGUST OFFERING COMMUNITY MEMBERS OPPORTUNITIES TO MEET AND QUESTIONS AND GIVE QUESTIONS TO THE FINAL CANDIDATES FOR THE POSITION.

OUR RECRUITMENT PROCESS WAS DRIVEN BY FEEDBACK FROM OUR COMMUNITY MEMBERS AND INVOLVED COMMUNITY MEMBERS.

I WANT TO GIVE A HEARTFELT THANK YOU TO EVERYONE THAT HELPED US REACH THIS IMPORTANT DECISION, NOT ONLY FOR OUR COMMUNITY, BUT FOR OUR WORKFORCE AS WELL.

WITH THAT, I'D LIKE TO OFFER CHIEF CHACONE AN OPPORTUNITY TO ADDRESS THE COUNCIL.

BEFORE WE OPEN UP FOR QUESTIONS, CHIEF, THANK YOU, CITY MANAGER, KRONK, UH, MAYOR, MAYOR PRO TEM COUNCIL MEMBERS.

UM, YOU KNOW, I'M REALLY JUST INCREDIBLY GRATEFUL TO BE STANDING HERE RIGHT NOW, UH, AND TALKING ABOUT THIS TO HAVE THIS OPPORTUNITY TO LEAD AN AMAZING ORGANIZATION OF, UH, MEN AND WOMEN WHO CARE SO DEEPLY ABOUT PUBLIC SAFETY AND ABOUT THIS COMMUNITY, UH, AS I DO.

UH, AND WE HAVE RESTARTED OUR ACADEMY AND HAVE TWO MORE ACADEMIES IN THE NEXT FISCAL YEAR.

HAVING TAKEN THAT CLASS.

I UNDERSTAND THE VALUE THAT IT HAS ON POLICING IN GENERAL, IN THE COMMUNITY AND HELPING MISSPELL SOME OF THE MYTHS ABOUT WHAT IT IS YOU ALL DO.

COULD YOU, UM, EXPLAIN TO THE PUBLIC WHY THE PROGRAM IS UNDER YOUR REVIEW, WHAT YOUR VISION IS FOR THE PROGRAM MOVING FORWARD AND WHAT THE TIMELINE IS ON STARTING THAT CLASS AGAIN, CERTAINLY, UM, YOU KNOW, I SHARE YOUR SENTIMENT ABOUT THE CITIZENS POLICE ACADEMY.

IT'S A GREAT WAY FOR OUR COMMUNITY TO TRULY UNDERSTAND POLICE WORK.

UH, WE'VE RUN MANY CLASSES GOING BACK MANY YEARS, UH, WHAT WE HAVE DONE, OBVIOUSLY, UH, COVID, UH, PUT A STOP TO THAT, UM, EARLY LAST YEAR AND WE ARE EXAMINING THE PROGRAM TO MAKE SURE THAT WE'RE DELIVERING IT IN A CONSISTENT WAY, A SIMILAR TO WHAT WE'RE DOING IN OUR POLICE ACADEMY, UH, APPLYING THAT DIVERSITY EQUITY, INCLUSION LENS OVER THE TRAINING CURRICULUM, UH, THAT, THAT WE ARE ESSENTIALLY TRAINING TO OUR, UM, TO THE COMMUNITY.

CAN YOU EXPLAIN TO ME WHY IT'S TAKING AS LONG AS IT IS TO BE REVIEWED? YOU KNOW, I THINK, UH, RIGHT NOW COUNCIL MEMBER, WE'RE, WE'RE BALANCING IT WITH, UH, MANY OF THE OTHER THINGS THAT WE'RE DOING, UH, AS A DEPARTMENT, IT OBVIOUSLY TAKES STAFF TO PUT THE CPA ON.

UM, I THINK THAT THIS ALSO FALLS IN LINE WITH, UH, THE DESIRES OF OUR COMMUNITY, THAT THEY'VE VOICED THROUGH THE RE-IMAGINING PUBLIC SAFETY EFFORT AND, UH, HAVING, UH, EITHER, UH, YOU KNOW, OFFICERS NOT RESPOND TO THOSE CALLS THAT DON'T, THEY DON'T NEED TO RESPOND TO, OR IN SOME CASES, SUCH AS A BURGLARY CALL THAT MAY REQUIRE THE COLLECTION OF EVIDENCE.

IT'S ALSO ABOUT RESPECTING OUR COMMUNITY'S TIME.

UH, IF WE CONTINUE TO STACK TYPE OF CALLS IN OUR, IN OUR QUEUE, UH, TO RESPOND TO MANY TIMES, OUR CITIZENS ARE WAITING HOURS, UH, FOR AN OFFICER TO RESPOND AND THAT'S NOT GOOD EITHER.

AND WE WANTED TO GIVE THEM A BETTER OPTION.

THANK YOU, CHIEF.

AND THANK YOU, MAYOR PRO TEM AND COUNCIL FOR GIVING ME THE TIME TO ASK THOSE QUESTIONS, BECAUSE THIS IS A VERY IMPORTANT DECISION WE MAKE TODAY.

THANKS.

SO BEFORE WE MOVE ON, I JUST WANT TO MAKE SURE TO REITERATE, IF YOU CAN KEEP IT TO ONE, MAYBE TWO QUESTIONS, AND THEN WE'LL KEEP GOING.

AND IF WE HAVE MORE TIME, THEN WE'LL GO AROUND AGAIN.

BUT I WANT EVERYBODY TO GET THE OPPORTUNITY TO, WHILE WE'RE ON THE DIOCESE TO GET TO ASK THEIR QUESTIONS.

COUNCILMAN, UM, COUNCIL MEMBER WAS NEXT, AND THEN, UH, COUNCIL MEMBER KITCHEN, AND THEN MAYOR ADLER.

THANK YOU.

AND THANK YOU, COUNSELOR KELLY FOR ASKING THE QUESTION ABOUT THE CALLS AND CHIEF COHEN.

THANK YOU FOR YOUR RESPONSE.

I THINK IT'S SUPER IMPORTANT THAT WE, UH, AS COUNCIL MEMBERS, SINCE WE HAVE INFORMATION FROM OUR CHIEF, THAT WE'RE SHARING BACK THAT INFORMATION WITH THE COMMUNITY IN ANY INTERVIEWS THAT WE PARTICIPATED, THAT'S REALLY GOOD INFORMATION TO SHARE OUT AND WE'LL HELP ADDRESS SOME OF THE MISINFORMATION THAT IS OUT THERE.

AND THE QUESTION I HAVE IS AROUND THE HANDLING OF SEXUAL ASSAULT CASES, AS YOU KNOW, THAT IS A TOP ISSUE.

ONE OF THE TOP ISSUES FOR OUR COMMUNITY.

WE HEARD TODAY FROM SEVERAL SURVIVORS OF SEXUAL ASSAULT.

UM, THE DEPARTMENT HAS HISTORY OF MS HANDLING SEXUAL ASSAULT CASES.

AND SO WHAT I, UH, MY QUESTION IS CENTERED AROUND, UH, WHAT MEASURABLE AND MEANINGFUL IMPROVEMENTS ARE YOU WILLING TO MAKE AND COMMIT TO AROUND SEXUAL ASSAULT CASES.

AND IF YOU COULD ALSO TALK ABOUT WHAT MEASURABLE IMPROVEMENTS, AND THEN ALSO IF YOU COULD TOUCH ON, UM, THE TRAINING THAT IS GOING ON RIGHT NOW WITH THE ACADEMY, UH, AND ANY IN-SERVICE TRAINING AS WELL, UH, JUST TO CLARIFY THE TRAINING AT THE ACADEMY RELATED TO SEX CRIMES.

YES.

OKAY.

SO, UH, WITH REGARD TO THE, TO THE MEASURABLE IMPROVEMENTS THAT WE'VE MADE IN THE TIME, UM, THAT, THAT WE'VE REALLY BEEN LOOKING AT THIS FROM A STAFFING PERSPECTIVE, UM, WE HAVE INCREASED OUR SEX CRIMES UNIT, UM, YEAR OVER YEAR, UH, GOING BACK TO 2018, WE ADDED FOUR DETECTIVES.

UH, WE'VE ADDED MORE DETECTIVES SINCE THEN TO TODAY.

OUR SEX CRIMES UNIT HAS 20 DETECTIVES IN IT, ALONG WITH THREE SUPERVISORS AND OUR VICTIM SERVICE COUNSELORS.

WE ALSO INCREASED THE NUMBER OF VICTIM SERVICE COUNSELORS ASSIGNED TO SEX CRIMES AS A SINGLE STANDALONE UNIT IN OUR DEPARTMENT.

IT IS, IT HAS MORE DETECTIVES THAN ANY OTHER UNIT DOES.

UM, WE HIGHLY PRIORITIZE THE, UM, THE INVESTIGATION OF, OF THE, OF THESE CRIMES.

IT'S BEEN IMPORTANT TO MAKE SURE THAT OUR DETECTIVES ARE RECEIVING THE TRAINING THAT IS VICTIM CENTERED AND TRAUMA INFORMED.

UH, WE HAVE MOVED STRONGLY IN THAT AREA, UH, AND HAVE HAD, UM, OUR BRAND NEW DETECTIVES THAT ARE COMING IN.

THEY HAVE TO COMPLETE THAT TRAINING, UH, INCLUDING TRAUMA-INFORMED VICTIM INTERVIEWING, UH, MAKING SURE THAT WE GET THEM, UH, TO THE PROPER, UH, CONFERENCES SUCH AS THE TEXAS ASSOCIATION AGAINST SEXUAL ASSAULT CONFERENCE, UH, THAT PROVIDES MANY GOOD COURSES IN THE SAME AREA.

YOU KNOW, WE HAVE, UH, REALLY PLACED THAT, UM, YOU KNOW, THAT VALUE ON THESE TYPE OF CASES, UM, YOU KNOW, WE'VE

REJOINED, UH, THE SART, UH, THAT WAS, UH, SOMETHING THAT I DID WHEN I TOOK OVER AS THE INTERIM CHIEF.

AND I JUST ISSUED A RECOMMENDATION TO THE TRAVIS COUNTY COMMISSIONER'S COURT TODAY TO ADOPT THE AUSTIN TRAVIS COUNTY START AS THE MULTI MULTIDISCIPLINARY TEAM THAT WILL FULFILL OUR NEEDS, UH, RELATED TO STATE LAW.

UH, SO I HOPE THAT PEOPLE CAN SEE THAT I'M PLACING ON PLACING THAT VALUE, UH, IN THAT, UM, AS FAR AS THE, UM, THE TRAINING THAT'S GOING ON IN THE ACADEMY WITH REGARD TO, UM, OUR, OUR BRAND NEW CADETS, YOU KNOW, HAVING, UH, COMING IN AND TEACHING A BLOCK RELATED TO SEX CRIMES IS ONE SMALL PART OF OUR ACADEMY.

THE BIGGER ISSUE REALLY IS LOOKING AT HOW WE INTERACT WITH VICTIMS OF CRIME AND ARE SURVIVORS OF SEXUAL ASSAULT AND, AND TEACHING OUR OFFICERS HOW TO, UH, BE ABLE TO INTERVIEW WITH A TRAUMA INFORMED AND VICTIM CENTERED, UM, STANCE AND HOW THEY, HOW THEY HAVE THOSE INTERACTIONS.

UM, THERE WAS A VERY GOOD COURSE THAT IS PUT ON, UH, THROUGH ICP THAT WE WERE TRAINING OUR, OUR DETECTIVES IN, UH, THERE ARE ELEMENTS OF THAT THAT ARE GOING IN, AND WE ARE LOOKING TO WEAVE THAT THROUGH REALLY ALL OF THE DIFFERENT COURSES, UH, THAT WE HAVE, UH, AS WE'RE GOING THROUGH THE CURRICULUM REVIEW RIGHT NOW AT THE ACADEMY.

I BELIEVE IT WAS COUNCIL MEMBER KITCHEN AND THE MAYOR ADLER, AND THEN COUNCIL MEMBER ELLIS UH, GEEZ.

UM, I HAVE ONE QUESTION AND ONE FOLLOW-UP AND THEN I'LL, UH, TURN IT OVER TO OTHERS. SO THANK YOU, CHIEF.

I THINK YOU SPOKE TO THIS, UH, PARTIALLY EARLIER, UH, RELATED TO THE RE-IMAGINED TASK FORCE AND THE RECOMMENDATIONS FROM THAT.

SO I JUST WANT TO ASK YOU, UM, DIRECTLY, UH, WILL YOU AGREE TO WORK WITH COMMUNITY GROUPS AND MEMBERS OF THE RE-IMAGINED TASK FORCE ON A LONG-TERM COMPREHENSIVE PUBLIC SAFETY MODEL FOR AUSTIN? THAT INCLUDES THE IMPORTANT WORK OF CIVILIANS WITHIN APD AND NON-POLICE SOLUTIONS TO SOCIAL PROBLEMS? YES.

AND A FOLLOWUP RELATED TO THAT IS THE AUSTIN CARES PROGRAM.

UM, AS YOU KNOW, AUSTIN CARES IS OUR, UM, INNOVATIVE, A NATIONALLY RECOGNIZED PROGRAM WHERE WE HAVE ADDED MENTAL HEALTH, UH, AND ASKING FOR A COUNSELOR AS AN OPTION WHEN PEOPLE CALL 9 1 1, AND WE ARE PUTTING IN PLACE OR HAVE PUT IN PLACE PROTOCOLS WHERE, UM, SOMEONE WHO IS IN THE MIDST OF A MENTAL HEALTH EMERGENCY CAN HAVE THE SERVICES OF A COUNSELOR, UH, TO WORK WITH THEM.

UM, AND SO I WANT TO ASK FOR YOUR COMMITMENT TO CONTINUE TO CHAMPION, UH, THAT EFFORT, AND ALSO GIVE YOU AN OPPORTUNITY TO SPEAK TO THE WORK THAT YOU'VE DONE, UH, AROUND MENTAL HEALTH ISSUES IN THE PAST.

UH, THANK YOU, COUNCIL MEMBER, FIRST OF ALL, YOU HAVE MY STRONG COMMITMENT TO CONTINUE IN THIS AREA.

IT'S AN AREA THAT I FEEL, UH, PROFESSIONALLY AND PERSONALLY, VERY STRONGLY ABOUT HELPING TO FIND BETTER OUTCOMES THAT ARE FOR THOSE PEOPLE THAT ARE LIVING EITHER WITH A MENTAL ILLNESS OR, UM, YOU KNOW, DISABILITIES.

I THINK THAT THE, THE, THE MEASURE THAT YOU TALKED ABOUT, THE, THE CRISIS CALL COUNSELING PROGRAM THAT WE HAVE ON OUR NINE 11 CALL CENTER FLOOR IS, UH, AS YOU SAID, A NATIONAL MODEL, IT'S SOMETHING THAT WE'VE BEEN WORKING TOWARDS FOR A VERY LONG TIME.

UM, I HAVE AS BOTH AN ASSISTANT CHIEF, AND AS THE INTERIM CHIEF WORKED IN THIS AREA WITH OUR BEHAVIORAL, BEHAVIORAL HEALTH AND CRIMINAL JUSTICE ADVISORY COMMITTEE HERE IN AUSTIN, TRAVIS COUNTY, WORKING ON, UH, TRYING TO INTERCEPT, UH, PEOPLE THAT ARE LIVING WITH MENTAL, MENTAL HEALTH ISSUES AT THE EARLIEST POSSIBLE POINT BEFORE WE HAVE TO GET LAW ENFORCEMENT INVOLVED.

SO REALLY GETTING THOSE PEOPLE THAT HAVE THE EXPERTISE TO HELP THEM, UH, AND, AND KEEP THEM FROM THAT CRISIS MOMENT, UH, WHEN THEY, WHEN PEOPLE HAVE TO CALL NINE 11, BECAUSE SOMEBODY IS, YOU KNOW, SOME SITUATION IS OUT OF CONTROL.

SO, UM, I, YOU HAVE MY STRONG COMMITMENT TO, TO CONTINUE TO DO THAT.

UM, THANK YOU.

AND I WANT TO THANK, UM, THE OTHER QUESTIONS PRIOR TO MINE AND, AND, UM, PARTICULARLY THE QUESTIONS RELATED TO SEXUAL ASSAULT.

I'M NOT GOING TO ASK ANY MORE, CAUSE I KNOW OTHER COUNCIL MEMBERS WILL BE.

SO, UM, IF THERE'S TIME AT THE END, I'LL ASK MORE QUESTIONS, BUT I'LL, I'LL PASS THE BATON AT THE MOMENT.

THANK YOU, CHIEF.

I APPRECIATE THE PROCESS THAT YOU'VE GONE THROUGH.

UH, I DO HAVE A COUPLE OF QUESTIONS AND THEN I'M INTERESTED IN THE QUESTIONS THAT I KNOW SOME OF MY COLLEAGUES WILL ASK AS WELL.

UH, YOU HAVE SAID THAT, UH, YOU, YOU SUPPORT A DATA DRIVEN APPROACH TO STAFFING LEVELS, UH, IN THE POLICE DEPARTMENT, YOU'VE SAID PUBLICLY THAT YOU DON'T SUPPORT SETTINGS STATIC, UH, PLEASE STAFFING LEVELS LIKE TWO PER THOUSAND OR EVEN 2.3 OR 2.5 PER THOUSAND.

THAT'S BEING DISCUSSED IN THE COMMUNITY.

NOW, WHY IS THAT? AND, AND IF YOU DON'T SUPPORT SETTING A STATIC LEVEL, WHAT IS IT YOU SUPPORT? AND CAN YOU EXPLAIN WHAT THAT CERTAINLY THANK YOU, MAYOR.

I THINK IT'S IMPORTANT.

YOU KNOW, WHEN WE START TALKING ABOUT THINGS LIKE SETTING A, JUST A STATIC LEVEL, UH, MANY TIMES THEY'RE BASED UPON OLDER, UH, METHODOLOGIES, UH, THAT AT THE TIME WERE MADE SENSE FOR POLICE DEPARTMENTS, BUT I, WHAT I CAN TELL YOU IS THAT WE'VE GOTTEN MUCH BETTER, UH, IN THE AREA OF AN ANALYZING DATA, ANALYZING CALL LOADS, ANALYZING, UM, YOU KNOW, PERSONNEL DISTRIBUTION, UH, AND HAVE THE ABILITY REALLY TO, YOU KNOW, WE TOUT OURSELVES AS AN EVIDENCE-BASED AND DATA DRIVEN POLICE DEPARTMENT.

AND JUST TO BE CLEAR, YOU DON'T SUPPORT SETTING STATIC LEVELS FOR DETERMINING STAFFING LEVELS FOR POLICING.

I THINK THAT IT'S IMPORTANT TO DETERMINE WHAT THE LEVEL THAT'S APPROPRIATE AS OPPOSED TO, UH, AN ARBITRARY NUMBER THAT MIGHT BE THROWN OUT THERE, IF THAT MAKES SENSE.

IT DOES.

UH, AND THEN ALSO, UH, WITH RESPECT TO, TO STAFFING, I HAVE A QUESTION, YOU, UH, YOU, YOU RECENTLY INSTITUTED THAT NEW POLICY WHERE WE WOULD NO LONGER EXPECT, UH, POLICE OFFICERS TO HANDLE ANIMAL SERVICES CALLS, UH, OR NONVIOLENT SITUATIONS, UH, UH, WHERE THERE'S REALLY ONLY A NEED FOR REPORT TAKING OR BEGINNING IN INVESTIGATIONS, ALL WORK THAT COULD BE HANDLED BY, UH, BY A CRIMINAL, UH, ON A TECHNOLOGIST FROM A POLICY STANDPOINT.

AND I THINK THAT'S GREAT.

SOME CITIES ARE UP OVER 50%.

SO I, SO I HOPE WE KEEP UP THAT WORK, NOT ONLY BECAUSE IT'S THE RIGHT RESPONSE TO THAT SITUATION, BUT AGAIN, UH, BECAUSE IT, IT MEANS THAT WE'RE NOT USING OUR POLICE OFFICERS IS THE WAY WE INTERSECT WITH MENTAL HEALTH OR WITH POVERTY IN OUR COMMUNITY.

UM, I WANTED TO ACT, I WANTED TO ASK ABOUT VICTIM SERVICES.

THERE'S BEEN REQUESTS ABOUT YOUR COMMUNICATION WITH VICTIM SERVICES.

UM, ARE YOU COMMITTED TO STRENGTHENING YOUR RELATIONSHIP AND COMMUNICATION, UM, WITH THE, WITH THE REPRESENTATIVE FROM VICTIM SERVICES, OR IS THAT NOT POSSIBLE AND WHY HASN'T THAT HAPPENED YET? YOU KNOW, I APPRECIATE THAT QUESTION AND A COUNCIL MEMBER IN, AND, YOU KNOW, WE'VE, UH, YOU KNOW, MYSELF PERSONALLY, AS WELL AS MY STAFF, WE'VE BEEN, UH, TRYING TO FIGURE OUT THE BEST WAY TO SUPPORT A VICTIM SERVICES.

UH, I AM AWARE OF THE, THE PREVIOUS, UH, UH, COUNCIL RESOLUTION THAT WAS RELATED TO IT.

UH, AND, AND, UM, AND SO WHAT I STAND READY TO DO TODAY IS, IS TO COMMIT ON, ON SEVERAL LEVELS TO INCREASING, UM, YOU KNOW, THE VISIBILITY OF VICTIM SERVICES WITHIN OUR DEPARTMENT, UH, THEIR ACCESS TO EXECUTIVE STAFF AND TO OVERALL POLICY DECISIONS.

UH, I'VE BEEN TALKING QUITE A BIT ABOUT IT OVER THE LAST SIX MONTHS AND REALLY WHAT I'VE BEEN OBSERVING, UH, EVEN LONGER THAN THAT IS A SURGE IN GUN VIOLENCE.

AND THAT, YOU KNOW, EVEN THOUGH AS A CITY, WE'VE MENTIONED THAT I'VE MENTIONED IT, UH, OVERALL, OUR CITY IS VERY SAFE WHEN YOU COMPARE TO SIMILAR CITIES IN THE, IN THE U S UH, WE ARE, ARE VIOLENT AND PROPERTY CRIME RATES ARE BOTH DOWN OVERALL.

UH, WHAT WE ARE SEEING A SURGEON AS OTHER CITIES ARE, IS GUN VIOLENCE.

IT'S DRIVING OUR HOMICIDE RATE, IT'S DRIVING OUR AGGRAVATED ASSAULT RATES.

UH, AND IT IS CONCERNING EARLY ON IN MY, UH, TERM AS THE INTERIM CHIEF OF POLICE.

I STARTED THE VIOLENCE INTERVENTION PROGRAM, UH, WITH THE, UH, PURPOSE OF GETTING, UM, ILLEGALLY OWNED GUNS OFF THE STREET OF TARGETING OFFENDERS THAT WERE SERIAL OR

CHRONIC OFFENDERS, UH, FOR GUN VIOLENCE, UH, AND BEING VERY INTENTIONAL ABOUT THE PROSECUTIONS, UH, WHETHER THAT WAS AT THE STATE LEVEL WITH THE DISTRICT ATTORNEY OR AT THE FEDERAL LEVEL WITH OUR US ATTORNEY, WE PARTNERED ALL OF THAT TOGETHER TO COME UP WITH A PROGRAM THE PROGRAM'S BEEN RUNNING FOR ABOUT FIVE MONTHS NOW, UH, WE ARE GETTING TO THE EVALUATION STAGE TO DETERMINE HOW DO WE NEED TO CHANGE IT? AND IS IT GOING TO CONTINUE? I CAN TELL YOU RIGHT NOW, IT'S CONTINUING, UH, BUT YOU KNOW HOW WE ARE GOING TO CONTINUE TO ADAPT BASED ON THE RESULTS THAT WE'VE SEEN.

I'VE ALSO SAID SEVERAL TIMES THAT WE ARE OVERLAPPING WITH THE OFFICE OF VIOLENCE PREVENTION.

I THINK IT'S INCREDIBLY IMPORTANT NOT JUST TO BE REACTIVE, UH, BUT TO ACTUALLY BE PROACTIVE AND TO LOOK AT THE SYSTEMIC ISSUES THAT WE MIGHT HAVE IN SOCIETY THAT ARE DRIVING, UH, SOME OF OUR YOUTH, UH, AND SOME OF OUR OTHER, UH, RESIDENTS, UH, TOWARDS GUN VIOLENCE.

AND HOW CAN WE STEM THAT? HOW CAN WE FIND SOME MEASURES TO DRIVE DOWN THINGS, [05:15:01]

UH, SUCH AS FAMILY VIOLENCE, UH, AND OTHER SERIOUS OFFENSES, UH, THROUGH PREVENTIVE MEASURES? SO, YES, WE ARE.

WE ARE WORKING KIND OF ON BOTH FRONTS.

THANK YOU.

I VERY MUCH APPRECIATE THAT.

AND I KNOW THAT SOME OF THE BURGLARY AND THEFT CONVERSATION OVERLAPS THIS, UM, I THINK MANY OF US HAVE HEARD STORIES OF VEHICLES BEING STOLEN.

UM, YEAH, THERE'S BEEN AN UPTICK THROUGH THE PANDEMIC, I WOULD SAY.

UM, BUT I KNOW THAT FIREARMS ARE LIKELY TO GET STOLEN OUT OF VEHICLES TOO.

SO I KNOW A LOT OF US ON THIS DIOCESE HAVE DONE WORK ABOUT SAFE STORAGE AND EDUCATIONAL CAMPAIGNS.

AND I LOOK FORWARD.

UM, IF YOU AREN'T CONFIRMED TONIGHT TO BEING ABLE TO PARTNER WITH YOU IN SOME OF THOSE EDUCATIONAL CAMPAIGNS, THANK YOU, COUNCIL MEMBER ALTAR, GOOD EVENING, CHIEF TO CONE, UM, THIS MORNING, UM, DURING THE PUBLIC COMMENT FOR THIS ITEM, WHICH SEEMS LIKE A LIFETIME AGO, UM, WE HEARD FROM SEVERAL SEC SEXUAL ASSAULT SURVIVORS REMINDING US THAT WE DON'T HAVE A REALLY GOOD TRACK RECORD, AND THAT APD DOES NOT HAVE A GOOD TRACK RECORD OF HELPING OUR SEXUAL ASSAULT VICTIMS. UM, OUR SURVIVORS, UM, WE HEARD ABOUT PROBLEMS AT THE START.

WE HEARD ABOUT PROBLEMS WITH, UM, OFFICERS NOT ANSWERING OR SAYING THAT THEY COULDN'T INVESTIGATE CASES.

UM, WE'VE HEARD ABOUT INSTANCES WHERE, UM, DETECTIVES IN OUR SEX CRIMES UNIT ARE NOT TRAINED PROPERLY OR THOROUGHLY.

UM, WE HAVE BEEN IN THE NATIONAL NEWS BECAUSE WE'VE HAD CASES THAT HAVE BEEN EXCEPTIONALLY CLEARED.

WE HAVE HAD TO, UM, WE'VE BEEN SUED, UH, BY MULTIPLE SURVIVORS.

WHAT IS YOUR ASSESSMENT OF HOW APD HAS HANDLED SEXUAL ASSAULT TO DATE AND TELL ME WHAT YOU ARE GOING TO DO DIFFERENTLY MOVING FORWARD.

AND, YOU KNOW, DON'T TELL ME YOU ADDED FOUR DETECTIVES, ET CETERA.

YOU ADDED TO VICTIM SERVICES BECAUSE THAT WAS PUSHED BY OUR BUDGET.

AND THEY WERE NOT ASKED FOR IN THE BUDGET BY APD.

I KNOW YOU WERE NOT CHIEF AT THAT TIME.

UM, BUT THIS DIOCESE IS ASKING FOR MEANINGFUL CHANGE IN SEXUAL ASSAULT RESPONSE.

FOR ME, IT IS ONE OF THE NUMBER ONE THINGS THAT I'M LOOKING FOR IN A CHIEF.

AND I STILL NEED TO HEAR FROM YOU YOUR COMMITMENT AND ACTION ON THIS ISSUE.

AH, THANK YOU, COUNCIL MEMBER.

I'M GOING TO START WITH PART OF YOUR QUESTION WHERE YOU ASKED WHAT MY THOUGHTS ARE ABOUT HOW WE'VE HANDLED CASES IN THE PAST.

AND I THINK THAT WE HAVE FALLEN SHORT.

UM, WE HAVE NOT ALWAYS DONE OUR BEST WORK IN THIS AREA.

WE LET, UH, VICTIMS AND SURVIVORS DOWN, UH, BY ALLOWING A SEXUAL ASSAULT KIT, BACKLOG TO BE CREATED AND TO GROW OVER TIME.

AND, UH, AND WE'VE HAD OTHER ISSUES, UH, WHICH WE HAVE RESOLVED SUCH AS, AS THE DNA ISSUES, WHICH DIRECTLY AFFECT OUR, OUR SURVIVORS AND OTHER THINGS, WHAT WE HAVE DONE TO, TO COME ALONG IN THOSE AREAS.

WE, WE JOINED THE SEXUAL ASSAULT KIT INITIATIVE PROGRAM, UH, AND, UH, WE HAVE BEEN ALMOST THREE YEARS NOW, BACKLOG FREE.

UH, THE STATE LAW ACTUALLY SAYS THAT WE HAVE TO SUBMIT A SEXUAL ASSAULT KIT.

WITHIN 90 DAYS.

WE'VE BEEN MEETING A 60 DAY TIMELINE ON AVERAGE.

UH, WE ARE ALSO MEETING THE TIMELINES FOR CODIS UPLOAD.

WE'VE CREATED A COLD CASE UNIT, UH, AND A VICTIM NOTIFICATION PROTOCOL, UH, FOR NOTIFYING VICTIMS OF OLD SEXUAL ASSAULTS THAT MIGHT'VE HAPPENED, UM, MANY, MANY YEARS AGO.

AND HAVE NOW COME TO LIGHT.

WHAT I WANT TO TELL YOU HERE ON THE DIAS IS THAT YOU HAVE, UH, MY STRONG COMMITMENT TO, UM, CONTINUING TO HAVE QUALITY, UH, SEX CRIME CRIMES INVESTIGATIONS, TO MAKE SURE THAT WE ARE PUTTING THE RIGHT, NOT JUST TRAINING, BUT THE RIGHT TRAINING THAT IS TRAUMA INFORMED AND VICTIM CENTERED INTO PLACE.

UH, I COMMUNICATED WITH THE SART THAT ASKED ME TO COME AND, UH, TOLD THEM THAT I WOULD, UH, PENDING THE, UH, PENDING THE, THE OUTCOME OF, OF, UH, THIS CONFIRMATION.

AND I, AND I STAND BY THAT COMMITMENT.

AND I ALSO, UH, WILL COMMIT TO MEETING WITH THE START ON A REGULAR BASIS SO THAT WE HAVE IMPROVED RELATIONS BETWEEN, UH, APD AND THE SART.

SO, UM, I'M HOPING THAT, UH, THAT YOU CAN FEEL HOW STRONGLY THAT I FEEL ABOUT THIS AS WELL.

AND I'M NOT PROUD THAT WE HAVE FALLEN SHORT, BUT I CAN TELL YOU THAT MOVING FORWARD. WE ARE GOING TO DO BETTER.

SO THANK YOU.

I APPRECIATE YOUR, YOUR, UM, COMMITMENT THAT YOU'VE EXPRESSED.

UM, IT IS MY EXPECTATION THAT WE WILL SEE IMPROVED TRAINING IN THE SEX CRIME UNIT THAT YOU WILL, AS YOU HAVE PROMISED TONIGHT AND THIS SETTING AND IN OTHERS THAT YOU WILL MEET WITH THE SART AND YOU WILL SIT DOWN WITH THEM AND YOU WILL TALK ABOUT HOW WE CAN IMPROVE APDS RESPONSE, HOW YOU CAN IMPROVE THE RELATIONSHIPS.

WE ARE ALL ON THE SAME TEAM AND IT SHOULD BE APDS DESIRE TO TREAT OUR SURVIVORS, UM, WITH RESPECT AND TO HELP THEM ACHIEVE JUSTICE.

UM, AND YOU KNOW, IT'S NOT LOST ON ME THAT, YOU KNOW, SEXUAL ASSAULT, YOU KNOW, 97% IS WOMEN AS THE VICTIMS. AND, YOU KNOW, THERE, THERE NEEDS TO BE A SEA CHANGE IN, IN HOW WE RESPOND AND HOW WE THINK ABOUT WHAT OUR OBLIGATIONS ARE TO OUR SURVIVORS

TACAN AMONG THE INITIATIVES BEGAN UNDER YOUR TENURE AS YOUR INTERIM TENURE ARE.

AND YOU MENTIONED THIS, I THINK IN ONE OF THE PREVIOUS QUESTIONS, VIOLENCE INTERVENTION PROGRAM, UH, TO CURB GUN VIOLENCE, AND ALSO SETTING PERFORMANCE METRICS FOR THE CIVILIAN UNIT AND THE POLICE DEPARTMENT THAT IS POISED TO HANDLE CERTAIN NON-EMERGENCY, UH, CASES.

I AM, I HAVE THREE QUESTIONS AND I KNOW COUNCIL MEMBER, UM, KELLY HAS A COUPLE MORE QUESTIONS, COUNCIL MEMBER ALTERNATIVES.

SO MAYBE JUST START WITH TWO, DOESN'T HAVE TO BE FOUR AND FOUR.

COULD YOU DO, THAT'S WHY I ASKED THE QUESTION.

LET'S DO TWO.

I'LL DO TWO FOR NOW, PLEASE.

THANK YOU, CHIEF.

UH, YOU'VE SPOKEN SOME TO THE, TO THE ISSUE OF, OF SWORN VACANCIES AND THE WORK THAT YOU'RE DOING THERE.

WE ALSO HAVE, UH, CIVILIAN VACANCIES AT THE NINE 11 CALL CENTER THAT I KNOW YOU'RE AWARE OF, UH, SEVERAL DOZEN THAT ARE FUNDED, BUT NOT FAILED.

AND SOME FOLKS HAVE POINTED TO, UH, TO PAY ISSUES, FOLKS MAKING AS LITTLE AS \$37,000 BEING PART OF WHAT IS DRIVING THAT, UH, JUST TO KEEP IT QUICK BECAUSE OF THE TIME WE HAVE HERE, I DON'T THINK YOU NEED TO LAY OUT THE WHOLE PLAN, BUT CAN YOU COMMIT TO US THAT YOU'RE GOING TO PUT ALL THE ENERGY THAT YOU CAN IN TO MAKING SURE THAT WE'RE NOT ONLY FILLING THOSE SWORN VACANCIES, BUT THAT WE ARE FILLING THOSE OPENINGS, THAT THE NINE 11 CALL CENTER THAT WE HAVE FUNDED.

YEAH.

THANK YOU, COUNCIL MEMBER VERY QUICKLY.

WHAT I'LL TELL YOU IS THAT I'M AWARE OF THE ISSUE.

UM, WE HAD, UH, AN INITIAL MARKET STUDY THAT WAS DONE, UH, REGARDING PAY.

AND I THINK PAY IS THE BIG DRIVER.

THAT IS, THAT IS, UM, KEEPING US FROM, UH, FILLING ALL OF THE POSITIONS AT THE CALL CENTER.

UH, AND, UH, THERE IS A, ANOTHER MARKET STUDY THAT IS CURRENTLY UNDERWAY.

I'VE SPOKEN WITH DIRECTOR HAYES ABOUT IT, AND, UH, SHE INFORMED ME THAT THEY EXPECT IT TO BE DONE IN NOVEMBER.

AND, UH, AND I'M HOPING I AM HOPEFUL THAT WE'RE GOING TO BE ABLE TO, TO SEE HOW WE CAN CONTINUE TO RAISE PAY, AND ALSO GET INNOVATIVE AS A DEPARTMENT IN, IN FINDING WAYS TO, TO PROPERLY COMPENSATE THE PEOPLE THAT ARE WORKING OUT.

THEY'RE DOING A GREAT JOB, UH, AND WORKING HARD FOR US.

THANK YOU.

UM, ON THE QUESTION OF INTERNAL AFFAIRS THAT COUNCIL PREVIOUSLY DIRECTED THAT INTERNAL AFFAIRS INVESTIGATIONS THAT IS INVESTIGATIONS THAT ARE NOT CRIMINAL, BUT ARE WITHIN DEPARTMENT BE CONDUCTED BY EITHER CIVILIANS OR COMBINATION OF POLICE AND CIVILIANS.

AND THIS SHIFT WOULD ALLOW FOR MORE OBJECTIVITY AND INVESTIGATIONS, OR AT LEAST THE PERCEPTION OF MORE OBJECTIVITY, BUT IT WOULD ALSO FREE UP OFFICERS AT APD.

WE, THE QUESTION WAS EARLIER, HOW COULD WE ADDRESS SOME OF THE STAFFING ISSUES? IT TAKES TIME TO TRAIN CADETS, BUT IN FACT, IF WE FREE UP SOME OF OUR EXISTING OFFICERS, YOU DON'T HAVE TO TRAIN SOMEONE NEW.

WE KNOW THAT OFFICERS WITHIN IAA ARE NOT USUALLY PATROL OFFICERS, BUT SERGEANTS THAT MIGHT NOT BE DOING THAT KIND OF WORK COULD DO OTHER CRITICAL, COULD DO OTHER CRITICAL WORK WITHIN THE DEPARTMENT.

SO IF I, MY QUESTION TO YOU IS IF IT'S FUNDED AND DIRECTED BY COUNCIL, WOULD YOU MOVE QUALIFIED CIVILIANS TO ASSIST WITH INTERNAL AFFAIRS? AND HOW COULD YOU IMPLEMENT THIS APPROACH IN A WAY THAT ADDRESSES STAFFING ISSUES AT APD SUPPORTS OFFICERS SUPPORTS REFORM? UH, THANK YOU, COUNCIL MEMBER, I'LL TELL YOU THAT I'M OPEN TO THE IDEA.

UH, I CERTAINLY THINK THAT THERE WOULD BE A LOT OF VALUE TO BRINGING IN, UM, YOU KNOW, PEOPLE WITH SUBJECT MATTER EXPERTISE THAT ARE CIVILIANS, UH, THAT HAVE GOOD BACKGROUND INVESTIGATIONS.

I DO THINK IT'S IMPORTANT TO KEEP LAW ENFORCEMENT INVOLVED IN THE PROCESS.

THEY HAVE A LOT OF EXPERIENCE IN THE PERSPECTIVE OF HAVING DONE THE JOB AND UNDERSTAND WHEN OFFICERS TAKE CERTAIN ACTIONS AND, UH, THAT THAT CIVILIANS MAY OR MAY NOT UNDERSTAND.

AND SO I THINK THAT THAT IS STILL A PART OF THE COMPONENT, UH, BUT I CERTAINLY WOULD BE OPEN TO HAVING THE DISCUSSION, UH, ABOUT, ABOUT MOVING THAT FORWARD AND, AND POTENTIALLY MOVING IT FORWARD.

AND OF COURSE, WE'VE TALKED ABOUT HOW ULTIMATELY DISCIPLINARY DECISIONS STILL HAVE TO BE LEFT WITH THE CHIEF.

WE WOULD HAVE TO DO SOMETHING THAT IS LEGAL UNDER STATE LAW AND UNDER THE POLICE CONTRACT.

AND WE WOULD WANT TO MAKE SURE THAT IT IS QUALIFIED PEOPLE IN A SYSTEM THAT WORKS, BUT IF WE FIND A WAY THAT MEETS THOSE METRICS AND COUNCIL FUNDS AND DIRECT SIDE, IS THAT SOMETHING THAT WE CAN DO? YEAH.

UH, I, IT IS IMPORTANT TO ME THAT A DISCIPLINED DECISIONS REMAIN WITH THE CHIEF, UH, AS WELL AS WE WOULD HAVE TO WORK THROUGH ANY CHAPTER 1 43 ISSUES, UM, RELATED TO THE TEXAS GOVERNMENT CODE AND THE RESTRICTIONS AROUND CIVIL SERVICE.

UM, BUT I THINK THAT, UH, THOSE ARE NOT INSURMOUNTABLE AND WE MIGHT BE ABLE TO FIND A WAY FORWARD ON IT.

THANK YOU, COUNCIL MEMBER TOVA.

THANK YOU.

THANK YOU, CHIEF.

THANK YOU FOR THE ANSWERS THAT YOU PROVIDED TO US IN THIS FORUM, AS WELL AS IN THE EXECUTIVE SESSION AND IN THE, IN THE WEEKS, OR AT LEAST THE LAST WEEK LEADING UNTIL NOW.

UM, THIS MORNING WE HEARD FROM MR. LINDER OF THE NAACP, AND HE ALSO HAS BEEN COMMUNICATING WITH OUR OFFICE THROUGH EMAIL, AND I WANT TO JUST HIGHLIGHT, UM, SOMETHING THAT HE COMMUNICATED IN ONE OF THE EMAILS HE

SENT AND I'M I'M READING, BUT I'M ALSO EXCERPTING A LITTLE BIT, A LITTLE BIT.

THE POLICE CHALLENGES IN THE CITY AND NATION ARE CLEARLY RELATED TO CULTURE AND ADDRESSING THE TRAUMA THAT AFRICAN-AMERICAN AND LATINO COMMUNITIES ARE FACING.

AND HE GOES ON TO HIGHLIGHT THE IMPORTANCE OF RESTORING CONFIDENCE, UM, ESPECIALLY AMONG COMMUNITIES THAT DO NOT HAVE TRUST AND POLICING.

AND SO I WONDER IF YOU COULD PLEASE STATE, WHAT IS YOUR COMMITMENT, DESCRIBE WHAT YOUR COMMITMENT IS AND WHAT POSSIBLE STRATEGIES YOU MIGHT DEPLOY TO RESTORE CONFIDENCE AND POLICING IN OUR COMMUNITY AND ESPECIALLY AMONG COMMUNITIES OF COLOR.

UH, THANK YOU, COUNCIL MEMBER, YOU KNOW, I THINK THAT I'VE BEEN EXECUTING A CULTURE CHANGE AT THE AUSTIN POLICE DEPARTMENT.

WE BROUGHT IN SOME GROUND BREAKING TYPES OF TRAININGS, UH, BOTH WITHIN OUR CADET CLASS AND WITHIN WITH OUR COM INCUMBENTS, THE, THE MEN AND WOMEN THAT ARE OUT THERE SERVING NOW.

AND, UH, AND, AND THAT IS ONLY GOING TO CONTINUE.

I THINK THE ENGAGEMENT WITH OUR AFRICAN-AMERICAN AND OUR LATINO COMMUNITIES IS EXTREMELY IMPORTANT.

THEY'RE THE ONES THAT, THAT HAVE BEEN AFFECTED, UM, AT TIMES, UH, BY ACTIONS OF THE POLICE DEPARTMENT.

UM, I THINK THAT I WANT TO BE CLEAR.

I THINK THAT WE HAVE AMAZING MEN AND WOMEN WHO WORK HERE THAT HAVE A HEART FOR SERVICE, AND THAT CERTAINLY HIT THE STREETS EVERY DAY, UM, WITH AN INTENT TO DO THE RIGHT THING.

UM, WE HAVE GOT TO, TO BE, UH, SMARTER AS A, AS A COMMUNITY OVERALL, UH, AND, AND BRINGING ALL OF OUR CITY RESOURCES TO BEAR, UH, TO FIND WAYS TO, TO KIND OF, UH, GET UPSTREAM OF SOME OF THESE, OF THE, OF THESE BAD INCIDENTS TO SEE IF WE CAN INTERSECT THEM AT BAY, YOU KNOW, AT EARLIER IN THE PROCESS, UM, YOU KNOW, I CAN MAKE A, CERTAINLY MAKE A COMMITMENT AS A POLICE CHIEF, UH, TO HAVING THOSE DIALOGUES, UM, WITH, UH, YOU KNOW, WITH MR. LINDER, AS WELL AS OTHER, UH, COMMUNITY STAKEHOLDERS ON HOW, HOW WE CAN BRING THAT TO BEAR.

AND I'VE, I'VE HAD CONVERSATIONS WITH HIM BEFORE, UH, REGARDING, YOU KNOW, HOW CAN, HOW CAN THE POLICE PLAY A BETTER ROLE IN THE AFRICAN-AMERICAN COMMUNITY? HOW CAN WE BUILD THE TRUST? UH, AND HE CERTAINLY HAS IDEAS THAT WE HAVE TALKED ABOUT, AND THEN I PLAN ON COLLABORATING WITH HIM WITH SO, UM, YOU KNOW, YES, TO YOUR QUESTION, I WILL, I WILL MAKE A STRONG COMMITMENT TO THAT.

THANK YOU VERY MUCH.

UM, SO RECENTLY THE OFFICE OF, OF THE POLICE MONITOR ALONG WITH, I'M SORRY, THE OFFICE OF POLICE OVERSIGHT ALONG WITH THE EQUITY OFFICE AND THE MAYOR'S COMMITTEE FOR PEOPLE WITH DISABILITIES, TALKED ABOUT POLICE HAD A TOWN HALL REGARDING PUBLIC SAFETY, AND THEY CAME BACK, WE JUST RECEIVED A MEMO FROM OPO WITH SOME FINDINGS ABOUT THAT.

CAN YOU TALK ABOUT HOW YOU MIGHT ADDRESS SOME OF, SOME OF THE ISSUES, WHAT YOUR COMMITMENT IS TO ADDRESSING SOME OF THE CONCERNS THAT WERE RAISED IN THAT PUBLIC MEETING, UM, AND WHAT STRATEGIES, IF ANY, THAT YOU WOULD TAKE TO, TO ADDRESS THOSE AND TO MOVE THE DEPARTMENT FORWARD? UH, CERTAINLY THANK YOU.

UM, YOU KNOW, THE, THE, UH, POINTS THAT I SAW THAT THEY WERE COMING OUT OF THAT MEETING IS REALLY AROUND COMMUNICATION AND UNDERSTANDING OF, UM, YOU KNOW, REALLY ON BOTH SIDES FOR THE OFFICERS TO UNDERSTAND, UH, THOSE THAT ARE LIVING WITH DISABILITIES, UH, AND, AND THE CHALLENGES THAT THEY FACE.

AND THEN ALSO HAVING, UH, YOU KNOW, THOSE WHO ARE LIVING WITH DISABILITIES, UH, TO BE ABLE TO UNDERSTAND, UM, YOU KNOW, POLICE INTERACTIONS AND, AND SO THAT WE CAN CONTINUE TO MAKE THOSE BETTER.

WE HAVE SEEN TRAGIC OUTCOMES FOR, UH, YOU KNOW, UM, LOCALLY IN THE STATE NATIONALLY WHEN IT COMES TO PEOPLE THAT ARE, YOU KNOW, THAT, THAT HAVE DISABILITIES OR LIVING WITH MENTAL ILLNESS AND OTHER, OTHER ISSUES IN THEIR LIFE.

AND, UM, I REALLY THINK THAT IT'S ABOUT EDUCATION.

IT'S ABOUT OUTREACH.

IT'S ABOUT CREATING, UH, OPPORTUNITIES FOR PEOPLE TO HAVE, UM, MORE RESOURCES, UH, SO THAT, UM, YOU KNOW, THAT WE CAN HOPEFULLY HEAD OFF THAT MOMENT OF CRISIS, UH, WHERE THEY HAVE TO CALL THE POLICE.

UH, AND THEN, AND THEN, YOU KNOW, WE, AGAIN, WE HAVE PEOPLE THAT ARE NOT OUR SUBJECT MATTER EXPERTS SHOWING UP, UH, YOU KNOW, AT A REALLY CRITICAL POINT IN SOMEBODY'S LIFE.

THANK YOU VERY MUCH FOR THAT RESPONSE.

SO I WILL ASK MY QUESTION AND THEN JUST TO GIVE YOU GUYS A HEADS UP, I'M GOING TO, UM, PASS THE CHAIR TO COUNCIL MEMBER ALTAR MOMENTARILY, UM, TO GO FOR THE SECOND ROUND.

AND SO MY QUESTION, EXCUSE ME.

FOR ANSWERING OUR QUESTIONS THIS EVENING, THE FBI HAS IDENTIFIED RIGHT-WING EXTREMISM AS ONE OF THE GREATEST DOMESTIC TERROR THREATS.

OUR COUNTRY FACES YET LAST SUMMER APDS RESPONSE TO REOPEN TEXAS PROTESTS.

COULDN'T HAVE CONTRAST MORE WITH ITS RESPONSE TO BLACK LIVES MATTER DEMONSTRATIONS.

THE LADDER WAS CERTAINLY DEALT WITH MORE HARSHLY THAN THE FORMER.

YOU HAVE A BACKGROUND WITH THE AUSTIN REGIONAL INTELLIGENCE CENTER, WHICH EXCUSE ME, WHICH WE KNOW HAS SPENT AN INORDINATE AMOUNT OF TIME FOCUSING ON PERCEIVED LEFT-WING ACTIVITY, INCLUDING A JUNETEENTH EVENT THAT I SPOKE AT LAST YEAR GIVENS OR SOMETHING, SORRY, GIVEN THE EVENTS OF JANUARY 6TH, I WONDER IF YOU HAVE ANY NEW PERSPECTIVE YOU CAN SHARE WITH US ON HOW OUR POLICE DEPARTMENT SHOULD APPROACH THE THREAT OF POLITICAL EXTREMISM.

UH, THANK YOU, COUNCIL MEMBER.

UH, YOU'RE CORRECT.

I HAVE, UH, UH, QUITE A BIT OF A HISTORY WITH THE AUSTRIAN REGIONAL INTELLIGENCE CENTER SERVING AS ITS DIRECTOR FOR A FEW YEARS.

UM, YOU KNOW, ONE OF THE THINGS THAT I'M VERY PROUD OF WHEN WE STOOD THE CENTER UP WAS ITS PRIVACY POLICY AND THE WAY THAT WE WERE LOOKING AT DATA, UH, THE WAY THAT WE WERE SHARING THAT INFORMATION BACK WITH OUR COMMUNITY, UH, SPECIFICALLY WHAT WE COULD DO WITH THE DATA AND WHAT WE COULDN'T DO WITH THE DATA, UH, AND THAT WE, UH, VERY MUCH, WE PUT THE, THE RESPECT FOR FIRST AMENDMENT RIGHTS, UH, AT THE FOREFRONT.

SO, UM, YOU KNOW, UH, FIRST AMENDMENT PROTECTED ACTIVITY, UH, WAS NOT TO BE, TO BE STORED.

AND, UH, AND CERTAINLY WASN'T TO BE USED AGAINST PEOPLE.

UM, YOU KNOW, THAT IT CONTINUES TO BE THE, THE, THE WAY THAT THE AUSTRIAN REGIONAL INTELLIGENCE OPERATES.

UH, AND WE NEED TO, UH, TO MAKE SURE THAT WE PUT THE RIGHT LEADERSHIP, UH, IN CHARGE THERE TO MAKE SURE THAT WE, THAT WE'RE MAINTAINING OUR OWN POLICIES.

I FEEL THAT WE HAVE DONE THAT.

UM, THE, UH, THE, THE CENTER PROVIDES, UH, VALUABLE INFORMATION, NOT JUST IN THE AREA OF DOMESTIC TERRORISM, BUT MORE IMPORTANTLY IN THE, IN THE AREA OF CRIMINAL, UH, INVESTIGATION SUPPORT FOR, UH, NOT JUST THE AUSTIN POLICE DEPARTMENT, BUT MANY POLICE AGENCIES IN THIS AREA THAT DON'T HAVE THE SAME RESOURCES THAT WE DO.

UH, THEY WROTE, THEY RELY PRETTY HEAVILY ON THE CENTER.

SO, UM, UH, THAT, THAT'S PROBABLY MY LONG WAY OF SAYING THAT TO MAKE SURE THAT WE ARE GOING TO, UH, PROTECT FIRST AMENDMENT PROTECTED ACTIVITIES, UH, AND REALLY CONCENTRATE ON CRIMINAL ACTIVITY.

AND I APPRECIATE THAT.

CERTAINLY YOU COULD TELL THAT I WAS ALLUDING TO THE FACT THAT SOME GROUPS ARE PERMITTED TO DO THINGS THAT OTHER GROUPS ARE NOT PERMITTED TO DO.

I'M TALKING ABOUT AN INORDINATE AMOUNT OF FOCUS ON A CERTAIN TYPE OF GROUP.

UM, AND TYPICALLY THAT CERTAIN TYPE OF GROUP LOOKS LIKE ME.

UH, AND SO MY QUESTION IS HOW WELL, IF, IF WE ARE RECOGNIZING AS A COUNTRY THAT EXTREMISM ON EITHER SIDE OF ANY EXTREME IS A PROBLEM, HOW DO WE MAKE CERTAIN THAT THERE IS AN INORDINATE AMOUNT OF ACTIVITY, POLICE ACTIVITY, ESPECIALLY VIOLENT POLICE ACTIVITY TOWARDS AFRICAN AMERICANS AND LATINOS THAT DOESN'T GET APPLIED TO RIGHT WING, RIGHT WING EXTREMISTS THAT ARE ANGLO.

SO, YOU KNOW, I THINK THAT GOES IN LINE WITH OUR OVERALL MISSION TO TREAT ALL PEOPLE, UH, REGARDLESS OF RACE, REGARDLESS OF GENDER, REGARDLESS OF ALL OF THE DIFFERENT PROTECTED CLASSES WITH DIGNITY AND RESPECT.

UM, THAT IS WHAT I'M GOING TO, YOU KNOW, MY, WHEN, WHEN WE TALK ABOUT MY VISION FOR THE AUSTIN POLICE DEPARTMENT, IT'S BUILDING A FOUNDATION OF PROCEDURAL JUSTICE, THAT

WE ARE TREATING PEOPLE WITH DIGNITY AND RESPECT THAT WE ARE COMMUNICATING WELL WITH PEOPLE AND GIVING THEM VOICE AND ENCOUNTERS THAT WE ARE, UM, YOU KNOW, WHEREVER POSSIBLE HAVING THAT LIGHTEST TOUCH, UH, WHEN IT COMES TO EXECUTING PUBLIC SAFETY SO THAT WE ARE ABLE TO, UM, TO, TO NOT NEGATIVELY IMPACT PEOPLE'S LIVES, UM, AND, UH, AND THEN BEING TRANSPARENT THROUGH THE WHOLE PROCESS.

SO THE ISSUES THAT I'VE MOVED TOWARDS ON THE, ON THE, ON THE, UH, ISSUES OF TRANSPARENCY THAT IS GOING TO CONTINUE, UH, I WILL, UH, IF I SEE DISPARATE TREATMENT THAT IS BEING DONE BY OFFICERS, UH, AT ANY POINT, UH, THAT WILL BE DEALT WITH, UH, AS FAR AS WHETHER, YOU KNOW, UH, INTERNAL AFFAIRS CASE, UH, IS, IS APPROPRIATE AND POTENTIAL DISCIPLINE.

UM, AND IMPORTANTLY THAT WE LEAD THE RIGHT WAY THAT WE MAKE OUR EXPECTATIONS AS LEADERSHIP CLEAR THAT THAT IS UNACCEPTABLE.

UM, THAT IS THE WAY THAT, THAT I PLAN TO LEAD THE DEPARTMENT AND TO SURROUND MYSELF WITH LEADERS THAT ARE GOING TO DO THE SAME, UH, THAT ACCOUNTABILITY IS A P IS A PART OF IT, BUT THERE'S ALSO, THERE'S, THERE'S TRAINING, THERE'S MODELING, UH, AND THERE IS A STRONG MESSAGE TO ALL OF OUR OFFICERS

THAT'S, UH, IF CONFIRMED, UH, THAT I WAS, I WAS GOING TO BE OUT OF THE OFFICE A LOT.

UM, I THINK IT'S INCREDIBLY IMPORTANT TO ME, THE LEADER OF THE ORGANIZATION NEEDS TO BE OUT IN FRONT NEEDS TO BE HIGHLY VISIBLE IN THE COMMUNITY, WHETHER I'M DOING, UH, MEDIA AVAILABILITIES OR I'M AT COMMUNITY FORUMS, OR I'M RIDING ON PATROL WITH THE OFFICERS.

I AM GOING TO BE MEETING WITH MY OFFICERS, WHETHER THEY'RE OUT IN PATROL, WHETHER THEY'RE IN THE INVESTIGATIVE UNITS, WHEREVER THEY ARE, UM, THEY CAN COUNT ON ME TO SHOW UP AND BE THERE EVERY SINGLE DAY.

I HAVE AN AMAZING STAFF THAT CAN HELP ME RUN THE DAY-TO-DAY OPERATIONS OF THE DEPARTMENT.

I THINK MY JOB IS TO MAKE SURE THAT I BECOME THE FACE OF THE DEPARTMENT FOR BOTH THE MEN AND WOMEN OF THE DEPARTMENT, AS WELL AS FOR THE COMMUNITY.

I'LL LEAVE IT BY SAYING, I APPRECIATE THAT YOU RECOGNIZE THAT THAT'S A CRITICAL COMPONENT OF YOUR POSITION.

THANK YOU, COUNCIL MEMBER ALTERMAN TO STEP AWAY FOR JUST A FEW MINUTES.

SURE.

UM, I THINK COUNCIL MEMBER KELLY HAS MENTIONED SHE HAS MORE QUESTIONS.

I KNOW KHAN MAYOR, ADLER AND CASAR, AND ANYONE ELSE I HAVE QUESTIONS DO, UM, THIS IMPORTANT DECISION.

SO I THINK WE'LL BE HERE AS LONG AS WE NEED, UM, COUNCIL MEMBER.

KAREN, THANK YOU, CHIEF.

CAN YOU HELP ME REMEMBER EARLIER IN TONIGHT'S LINE OF QUESTIONING, YOU TOLD THE COUNCIL THAT ALL OF THE DETECTIVES IN YOUR SEX CRIMES UNIT HAD FORMAL TRAINING.

IS THAT ACCURATE? UM, NO, MA'AM WHAT I SAID WAS THAT ALL OF THE TRAINING WOULD BE COMPLETED WITHIN ABOUT THE NEXT MONTH TO SIX WEEKS.

UM, AND, AND WE'RE ACTIVELY WORKING ON THAT.

OKAY.

OKAY.

SO WHILE SITTING HERE THIS EVENING, IT IS IMPORTANT FOR ME TO BRING THIS UP, LISTENING TO YOU, SPEAK HERE.

IT WAS BROUGHT TO MY ATTENTION THAT ONE OF YOUR DETECTIVES ON THE SEX CRIME UNIT HAS LESS THAN A YEAR'S EXPERIENCE IN NO FORMAL TRAINING.

UM, WHAT THEY HAD MENTIONED, THE TRAINING THAT THEY DID HAVE WAS ENDING VIOLENCE AGAINST WOMEN, BUT IT WAS JUST A WEBSITE.

THEY'VE NOT ATTENDED ANY CONFERENCES.

THEY'VE NOT DONE ANY DNA TRAINING OR NO INTERROGATION TRAINING, UM, WHICH I WANT TO BE REALLY CLEAR HERE.

THIS IS VERY CONCERNING TO ME BECAUSE I THINK WE SHOULD ALL BE DEEPLY CONCERNED ABOUT THE TRAINING THAT THESE DETECTIVES HAVE.

WERE YOU AWARE THAT THAT WAS THE CASE? SO I KNOW THAT I HAVE SOME REALLY NEW DETECTIVES IN THAT UNIT.

I WANT TO EXPLAIN WHAT'S GOING ON, UH, WITH REGARD, HOW, HOW ATTRITION IS PLAYING A ROLE IN THAT COURSE, UH, TO, TO PROMOTE TO THE NEXT RANK, UH, UH, TO SERGEANT THAT OUR DETECTIVE AND CORPORALS ARE THE ONES THAT PROMOTE FROM, TO THAT RANK.

UH, NORMALLY EVERY ONE OF OUR PROMOTIONAL LISTS LAST TWO YEARS, I'M ABOUT TO EXIST, UH, EXHAUST MY SERGEANT'S LIST, UM, AT A YEAR, UH, ALL OF MY SERGEANTS WILL HAVE PROMOTED, WHICH MEANS THAT I'VE HAD A LOT OF DETECTIVES AND CORPORALS THAT HAVE BEEN PROMOTING.

SOME OF THOSE HAVE COME OUT OF THAT UNIT.

AND SO I, AS I HAVE REPLACED THEM, THEY'VE BEEN WITH NEWER, UH, DETECTIVES AND CORPORALS WHO HAVE ALSO PROMOTED AND ARE BRAND NEW IN THE UNIT AND DON'T HAVE THE TRAINING YET.

UM, I'VE BEEN TALKING WITH OUR, UH, GRANT COORDINATOR TO MAKE SURE THAT WE ARE APPLYING THE RIGHT RESOURCES IN GRANTS TOWARDS THAT TRAINING.

AND EARLIER I WAS TALKING ABOUT, UM, THAT WE ARE SEEKING, UH, BESIDES THE ONES THAT I TALKED ABOUT, WHICH IS THE INTERVIEWING COURSE AND, AND THE, UH, AND THE OTHER CONFERENCE, UH, BRINGING TRAINERS, QUALIFIED TRAINERS FROM A VALLEY AND OTHERS TO, UH, TO GO AHEAD AND TRAIN OUR FOLKS, UH, PROPERLY.

UH, SO, UH, THAT IS SUPPOSED TO HAPPEN, UH, WITH VIRTUAL TRAININGS, UH, BEGINNING AS EARLY AS DECEMBER AND IN-PERSON TRAININGS IN THE FIRST QUARTER OF NEXT YEAR.

THANK YOU FOR EXPLAINING THAT TO US.

I, I'M GLAD TO HEAR THAT THERE IS A PLAN TO ADDRESS THAT CRITICAL NEED IF YOU ARE CONFIRMED, BUT I AM CONCERNED ABOUT THE INCONSISTENCIES WITH WHAT THE OFFICERS ARE SAYING VERSUS WHAT YOU ARE TELLING US.

AND I FULLY EXPECT A COMMITMENT FROM YOU THAT YOU WILL WORK ON THAT WITH YOUR OFFICERS TO PREVENT IT FROM HAPPENING IN THE FUTURE.

YES, MA'AM.

THANK YOU.

I THINK I SAID MAYOR ADLER AND THEN COUNCIL MEMBER, BECAUSE

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THANK YOU, COUNCIL MEMBER, CHIEF, UH, YOU KNOW, POLICING AND PUBLIC SAFETY IS A, IS A HUGE ISSUE IN AUSTIN.

IN FACT, IT'S A HUGE ISSUE RIGHT NOW, UH, IN THE ENTIRE COUNTRY.

IT MAKES THIS MOMENT WHEN WE'RE CONFIRMING A POLICE CHIEF, JUST SO INCREDIBLY, UH, SUPERCHARGED, AND IN MANY WAYS IT NEEDS TO BE BECAUSE ONE OF THE PRINCIPLE FUNCTIONS OF CITY GOVERNMENT IS TO MAKE SURE THAT THE COMMUNITY IS SAFE.

PROBABLY THE MOST IMPORTANT THING THAT CITY GOVERNMENT, UH, IS RESPONSIBLE FOR DOING, BUT IT BECOMES REALLY DIFFICULT TO HAVE A CONVERSATIONS ABOUT PUBLIC SAFETY WHEN THERE'S SO MUCH MISINFORMATION THAT, UH, EXISTS, UH, OUT IN THE COMMUNITY.

I STILL HEAR PEOPLE SAY THAT AUSTIN IS NOT A SAFE PLACE.

I'VE HEARD YOU ON MANY PUBLIC MEETINGS CONFIRMED THAT AUSTIN IS A SAFE COMMUNITY.

AS YOU HAVE SAID TONIGHT, THE AUSTIN CHRONICLE REPORTS THAT THE NEW FBI FIGURES HAVE JUST COME OUT.

AND IT SHOWS AGAIN, UH, THAT EVEN IN THE MOST RECENT NUMBERS, LOOKING AT VIOLENT CRIME, THAT AUSTIN IS IN THE TOP FOUR SAFEST, BIG CITIES IN THE COUNTRY.

THERE'S A LOT OF DISCUSSION IN THE COMMUNITY THAT, THAT AND SUGGESTIONS THAT AUSTIN DEFUNDED POLICE OR TOOK \$150 MILLION OUT OF POLICE FUNCTIONS OR TOOK A THIRD OF THE BUDGET OUT OF POLICING.

NONE OF THOSE THINGS ARE TRUE, BUT THEY KEEP GETTING REPEATED.

UH, I THINK THAT ONE OF THE MOST IMPORTANT FUNCTIONS THAT YOU HAVE AS THE POLICE CHIEF IS AS SOMEONE WHO IS RESPECTED AND AN AUTHORITY IS TO BE ABLE TO RISE ABOVE, UH, AND TO MAKE SURE THAT THE COMMUNITY HAS THE ACCURATE INFORMATION, THE GOOD AND THE BAD, BECAUSE IN THIS COMMUNITY, IN AUSTIN, ONE OF THE SAFEST IN THE COUNTRY THAT, THAT INFORMATION WILL BE OVERWHELMINGLY GOOD.

WE HAVE CHALLENGES WITH, UH, INCREASED, UH, HOMICIDES, BUT YET THE HOMICIDE RATE AND AUSTIN IS ONE OF THE LOWEST IN THE COUNTRY.

WE HAVE TO DO SOMETHING ABOUT INCREASES.

WE'RE WATCHING THE SAME INCREASES HAPPEN IN VIRTUALLY EVERY CITY ACROSS THE COUNTRY WE HAVE WORK TO DO, BUT THERE'S SO MUCH GOING RIGHT.

AND I JUST WANT TO COMMEND YOU FOR HAVING THE INTEGRITY WHEN YOU WENT BEFORE THE STATE LEGISLATURE TO SPEAK THAT TRUTH TO POWER.

UH, BUT I THINK IT'S REAL IMPORTANT THAT YOU GET OUT EVEN MORE IN OUR LOCAL COMMUNITY AND MAKE SURE THAT OUR COMMUNITY AND OUR CITIZENS GET THE, GET THE REAL FACTS AND THE REAL INFORMATION.

I THINK YOU'RE DOING THAT.

I THINK YOU DID THAT TODAY.

I THINK YOU DID THAT IN THE, UH, DISCUSSIONS THAT YOU HAD DURING THE INTERVIEWS THAT YOU'VE DONE WITH THE LEGISLATURE.

UH, WE'RE TRYING TO GO THROUGH A RE-IMAGINING OF PUBLIC SAFETY TO MAKE A SAFE CITY, EVEN SAFER.

UH, AND, AND WE NEED A CHAMPION.

WE NEED SOMEONE AS A CHIEF, UH, THAT WILL DO THINGS LIKE RECOGNIZING THAT WE DON'T NEED OUR POLICE OFFICERS, SWORN OFFICERS WITH A BADGE AND A GUN TO DO ANIMAL CONTROL SERVICES, UH, OR TO BE TAKING REPORTS ALL THE TIME.

THERE ARE MORE IMPORTANT THINGS FOR OUR OFFICERS TO DO, AND WE NEED THEM TO DO IT IN MY SEVEN YEARS IN THIS OFFICE, I WOULD SAY ALMOST TO A MAN AND A WOMAN, THE POLICE OFFICERS THAT I HAVE GOTTEN TO KNOW ARE, ARE EXEMPLARY EMPLOYEES AND, AND EXEMPLARY OFFICERS, EXACTLY THE KIND OF PEOPLE THAT WE WOULD WANT TO HAVE.

AND THIS IS A COUNCIL THAT SUPPORTS THEM.

AND I THINK IT'S REAL IMPORTANT IN THAT, THAT YOU TAKE OUT ONLY MESSAGES TO THE COMMUNITY, BUT YOU TAKE THIS MESSAGE BACK TO THE FORCE AND I'M GOING TO SUPPORT YOUR CONFIRMATION TONIGHT.

THANK YOU, MAYOR.

SO CHIEF, UH, COMMUNITY MEMBERS, UH, IN THE LEAD UP TO THE, TO THE SELECTION OF A PERMANENT CHIEF, UH, TODAY AS WELL RAISED CONCERNS WITH INTERNAL CANDIDATE HIRING BECAUSE STATE LAW PROVIDES THAT POLICE CHIEFS HIRED INTERNALLY CANNOT BE TERMINATED IN THE SAME WAY AS EXTERNAL CANDIDATES.

AND SO, UH, YOU KNOW, YOU'VE MENTIONED THIS IN AND, AND MEETINGS BEFORE.

IT'S NOT NEWS TO FOLKS THAT MAY HAVE HEARD YOU SAY THAT YOU'VE MENTIONED THIS TO ME AND MY COLLEAGUES, BUT I THINK IMPORTANT FOR THE PUBLIC TO HEAR THAT IF THE CITY MANAGER WERE TO ASK YOU TO RETIRE RESIGN, WOULD YOU EVOKE THIS PROVISION OF STATE LAW, OR WOULD YOU RETIRE OR RESIGN? I APPRECIATE YOU ANSWERING THE QUESTION.

OF COURSE, WE ALL EXPECT SUCCESS FOR YOU, BUT IT IS AN IMPORTANT QUESTION THAT HAS BEEN RAISED ABOUT THE DIFFERENCE BETWEEN AN INTERNAL AND EXTERNAL CANDIDATE.

SO WOULD

YOU INVOKE THAT STATE LAW PROVISION OR RETIREMENT? YEAH.

THANK YOU, COUNCIL MEMBER.

UH, I REALLY WANT TO SUCCEED.

YEAH, JUST TO BE CLEAR.

UH, HOWEVER, UH, IF THE CITY MANAGER INDICATED THAT, UH, THAT, THAT MY EMPLOYMENT WERE NO LONGER NEEDED OR WANT IT, UH, I WOULD NOT, UH, TRY TO FALL BACK TO A PRIOR RANK, UH, IN THE DEPARTMENT.

I WOULD, UM, I WOULD GO AHEAD AND, AND RESIGN RETIRE.

THANKS, JEFF.

AND JUST TO BE CLEAR ALSO, AS IT RELATES TO, UM, UH, WHAT HAS HAPPENED HERE ON THE DAYAS JUST EVEN RECENTLY, UH, MY VIEW IS THAT IF WE ALREADY PLACE WHERE THERE'S A VOTE OF NO CONFIDENCE, MY VIEW JEFF COURT HAD YOU NOT EXPECT, AND I EXPECT FOR YOU TO SUCCEED IN, AND THAT IS WHY, UH, THAT IS WHY YOU ARE HERE.

UM, BUT IN MY VIEW, IF THERE WERE THAT KIND OF A VOTE, MY VIEW IS THAT THE RIGHT THING FOR A POLICE CHIEF TO DO AT THAT POINT IS, IS TO RESIGN OR RETIRE OR FOR THE MANAGER TO ASK FOR THEM TO DO, OR THE COUNCIL COULD CHANGE THE MANAGER AT THAT POINT.

MY, MY SECOND QUESTION HERE IS THAT I UNDERSTAND THAT THE, WELL, NOT JUST, I UNDERSTAND WE ALL READ IT AND SAW IT.

AND IT WAS IN THE NEWS, THE DISTRICT AND ATTORNEY, ATTORNEY, AND COUNTY ATTORNEY SENDS AN OPEN LETTER TO ALL OF US TALKING ABOUT OFFICERS DECLINING TO INVESTIGATE CRIMINAL ACTIVITY AND BLAMED PROSECUTORS IN THAT PROCESS.

ALTHOUGH THOSE PROSECUTORS SAID THAT THEY WOULD TAKE UP THOSE CASES WHERE THERE WAS A DANGER TO PUBLIC SAFETY.

WE HEARD TODAY FROM COMMUNITY MEMBERS WHO TESTIFIED, INCLUDING EMPLOYEES THAT SAFE, THAT THERE HAVE BEEN INSTANCES WHERE TRUE INFORMATION WAS NOT CONVEYED BY THOSE OFFICERS WHERE IT WAS POINTED TO BUDGETS OR TO POLICY CHANGES, WHICH WEREN'T TRUE.

AND THAT IN FACT, THAT IN FACT, THE POLICE OFFICERS COULD AND SHOULD INVESTIGATE THOSE THINGS AND THE PROSECUTORS ARE READY TO, TO MAKE SURE THAT WE HOLD PEOPLE ACCOUNTABLE FOR THAT.

SO CAN YOU TALK TO US ABOUT HOW, WHAT STEPS YOU TOOK TO RESPOND TO THE COUNTY ATTORNEY AND DISTRICT ATTORNEY'S LETTERS AND WHAT YOUR NEXT STEPS ARE TO ADDRESS THAT? YEAH.

THANK YOU, COUNCIL MEMBER.

UM, I AM AWARE OF THE, THE LETTERS THAT YOU'RE TALKING ABOUT, AND OBVIOUSLY DISAPPOINTED IF I HAVE OFFICERS THAT ARE EXPRESSING PERSONAL OPINIONS, UH, ANY TYPE OF BIAS IN THEIR INTERACTIONS, UH, WITH OUR COMMUNITY.

UM, I HAVE BEEN VERY VOCAL, UH, PRIOR TO RECEIVING THOSE LETTERS AS I WAS STARTING TO GET THOSE TYPES OF REPORTS COMING IN, UH, WITH OUR OFFICERS TO LET THEM KNOW THAT THAT WAS UNACCEPTABLE AND WOULD BE, UH, YOU KNOW, WE WERE GOING TO HAVE TO DEAL WITH IT.

UM, AND SO AS THE, YOU KNOW, WHEN THOSE LETTERS CAME IN AND PROVIDED A COUPLE OF EXAMPLES OF WHAT, OF WHEN THAT HAPPENED, AND MORE SPECIFICALLY, EVERY TIME THAT I RECEIVE A REPORT, WHETHER IT IS FROM IT'S COME TO A COUNCIL OFFICE, OR IT COMES, UH, INTO THE OFFICE OF POLICE OVERSIGHT AS A COMPLAINT, OR HOWEVER IT IS, WE INVESTIGATE EVERY SINGLE ONE.

UM, YOU KNOW, THE, OUR OFFICERS HAVE THE BODY-WORN CAMERAS AND IN-CAR CAMERAS, AND WE CAN REVIEW EXACTLY WHAT WAS SAID AND TAKE APPROPRIATE ACTION TO MAKE SURE THAT THAT DOESN'T HAPPEN ANY FURTHER.

UM, YOU KNOW, I'M NOT GOING TO MAKE EXCUSE FOR OUR OFFICERS.

IT'S UNACCEPTABLE.

UH, I THINK THAT THAT, UM, PART OF WHAT IS DRIVING IT IS, YOU KNOW, THE, THE ISSUES THAT WE'VE BEEN TALKING ABOUT TONIGHT AROUND THE NATIONAL NARRATIVE AROUND POLICING.

AND IT'S REALLY TOUGH TO BE A POLICE OFFICER RIGHT NOW AROUND STAFFING ISSUES, UH, JUST AROUND, UH, THE GENERAL, UH, THINGS THAT ARE GOING ON WITH THE PROFESSION RIGHT NOW, UH, THAT ARE LEADING TO FRUSTRATION.

UH, AND, AND WE SEE THAT FRUSTRATION MANIFEST ITSELF WITH THESE TYPE OF THINGS HAPPENING, BUT IT DOESN'T MATTER BECAUSE LIKE I SAID, IT IS UNACCEPTABLE.

AND SO I WILL CONTINUE, UH, TO, TO ADDRESS THOSE.

I, UH, TO DIRECTLY ANSWER YOUR QUESTION.

UM, I HAVE COMMUNICATED WITH THE COUNTY AND DISTRICT ATTORNEYS, UH, ABOUT THE, UH, YOU KNOW, ANY INSTANCES AS THEY ARE.

AND, AND QUITE HONESTLY, THEY, THEY, THEY ARE STILL SENDING THEM TO ME AS THEY FIND THEM.

AND I AM RESPONDING DIRECTLY BACK TO THEM IN A TIMELY MANNER TO LET THEM KNOW THIS IS WHAT WE FOUND, AND THIS IS HOW IT WAS HANDLED.

THANK YOU.

AND SO WE DO HAVE, WE HAVE, THERE IS NO POLICY OR OTHER ISSUE KEEPING US FROM INVESTIGATING, HOLDING FOLKS ACCOUNTABLE FOR THOSE PUBLIC SAFETY ISSUES THAT HAVE BEEN RAISED TO YOU THERE, JUST TO BE CLEAR FOR THE COMMUNITY.

THERE IS NO POLICY OR OBSTACLE TO OUR OFFICERS HANDLING THOSE PUBLIC SAFETY.

THAT'S ABSOLUTELY CORRECT.

UH, ONE LAST QUESTION, AND THEN I'LL PASS ALONG THE MICROPHONE.

IT IS TO THIS ISSUE OF STAFFING THAT YOU JUST RAISED.

IT'S PARTLY A COMMITMENT ON MY PART AS WELL.

I BELIEVE AS YOU'VE LAID OUT, IF WE'RE NOT GOING TO HAVE AN ARBITRARY,

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OR IF YOU DON'T SUPPORT AN ARBITRARY METRIC TO WHAT THE RIGHT NUMBER OF POLICE OFFICERS IS, IT STILL LEAVES OPEN THE QUESTION OF WHERE SHOULD WE LAND.

AND I WANT TO COMMIT TO HAVING A CONVERSATION WITH OUR COMMUNITY, WITH YOU LEADING THAT CONVERSATION, BUT I BELIEVE IT SHOULD ALSO BE A CROSS ACROSS DEPARTMENTAL CONVERSATION BECAUSE FUNDING AND ONE DEPARTMENT, THAT MEANS WE HAVE TO MAKE SURE WE HAVE ENOUGH FUNDING FOR EVERYTHING ELSE, BUT HAVING THAT BROAD COMMUNITY CONVERSATION TO FIGURE OUT, AS YOU STATED, HOW DO WE GET THE RIGHT SERVICES INTO OUR COMMUNITY AND THE RIGHT STAFFING LEVELS? AND SO I WANT TO PROVIDE THIS OPPORTUNITY TO YOU BECAUSE I WOULD LIKE TO HEAR YOUR COMMITMENT TO, FOR, UP, FOR ME NOT TO PICK A NUMBER YOU'RE NOT TO PICK FOR NOBODY TO GO OUT AND PICK THEIR WAY OF DOING IT UNTIL WE MAYBE HAVE THAT MORE OPEN CONVERSATION WHERE I WANT TO HEAR FROM PEOPLE THAT I DISAGREE WITH OR PEOPLE I HAVEN'T HEARD FROM BEFORE, AND REALLY HOST THAT CONVERSATION SO THAT WE CAN COME TOGETHER AROUND HOW IT IS WITHIN A RE-IMAGINED POLICE DEPARTMENT.

WE DO THIS RIGHT.

SO I WANT TO HEAR, HEAR FROM YOU BECAUSE YOU AND I HAVE HAD THIS CONVERSATION ABOUT HOW YOU SEE THAT MOVING FORWARD.

AND IF WE CAN HAVE THAT COMMITMENT FROM YOU, THAT WE CAN HAVE THAT BROAD CONVERSATION BRING FOLKS IN HERE FROM OTHER DEPARTMENTS AND FIND THE RIGHT PATH.

YEAH.

THANK YOU.

UM, TO ANSWER YOUR QUESTION, YES, YOU HAVE MY COMMITMENT TO DO THAT.

I THINK IT'S IMPORTANT FOR US AS A CITY, UH, OF WHICH, YOU KNOW, AND AS A CITY GOVERNMENT OF WHICH THE POLICE DEPARTMENT IS ONE DEPARTMENT, UH, TO, TO HAVE MEANINGFUL CONVERSATION ABOUT, YOU KNOW, HOW DO WE DELIVER EFFECTIVE POLICE SERVICES, UM, YOU KNOW, OVERALL, HOW DO WE AFFECT OVERALL PUBLIC SAFETY AND KEEP THAT, THAT DISCUSSION MOVING FORWARD.

AND I THINK IT'S IMPORTANT TO ENGAGE WITH OTHER DEPARTMENTS AND WITH COUNCIL ON THOSE ISSUES AS WE, UH, AT THE DEPARTMENT KIND OF, YOU KNOW, MOVE FORWARD, WHAT WE THINK IS THE APPROPRIATE STAFFING LEVELS.

SO YES, I WILL DO THAT.

SO I HAD THAT, I HAD A QUESTION COUNCIL MEMBERS, KITCHEN COUNCIL MEMBER POOL, UM, AFTER I SPEAK TO YOU WANT TO TAKE IT BACK.

OKAY, GREAT.

THANK YOU.

UM, SO, UM, SHE, I WANT TO JUST COMMENT GOING BACK TO COUNCIL MEMBER, KELLY'S COMMENT ABOUT THE UNTRAINED DETECTIVE WORKING IN SEXUAL ASSAULT.

UM, I UNDERSTAND THE ISSUES OF ATTRITION, BUT, UH, BUDGETS, AS WE SAY, ARE REFLECTIONS OF VALUE AND THE APD HAS A BUDGET OF 400, SOME MILLION AND TRAINING DOESN'T REALLY COST THAT MUCH MONEY IF IT'S A PRIORITY.

UM, AND, AND SO, UM, UM, I'M SURPRISED BY THAT, AND I'M VERY CONCERNED BY THAT, AND I HOPE THAT ONE OF YOUR NEXT STEPS, AS YOU HAVE PROMISED US TO ADDRESS THE AREA OF SEXUAL ASSAULT WILL BE TO MAKE SURE THAT, UM, OUR DETECTIVES WHO ARE BRAVE AND STRONG ENOUGH TO, TO WORK IN THE SEX CRIME UNIT, BECAUSE IT IS AN EMOTIONAL POSITION.

UM, YOU COMING IN CONTACT WITH A LOT, UM, THERE THAT, THAT THEY RECEIVED THE TRAINING, THEY NEED TO SUCCEED, UM, BOTH FOR THEMSELVES AND FOR THE VICTIMS. UM, SO I, SO I HOPE THAT YOU WILL COMMIT TO DOING THAT ASAP.

I WILL, YOU KNOW, WE HAVE SOME, UM, SOME, SOME VERY NEW DETECTIVES ACTUALLY IN THAT UNIT, LIKE THE, THE TENURE IN THAT UNIT, UH, IS PRETTY VARIED BECAUSE WE HAVE 20 DETECTIVES.

UH, BUT I DO HAVE SOME NEW DETECTIVES IN THERE THAT HAVE NOT YET RECEIVED ALL OF THE TRAINING THAT IS REQUIRED.

UH, WE HAVE MADE SURE THAT WE'RE, THAT WE ARE PUTTING THEM THROUGH SOME OF WHAT WE FEEL ARE THE MOST IMPORTANT TRAININGS VERY QUICKLY.

AND WE'LL HAVE ALL OF THE DETECTIVES TRAINED, LIKE I SAID, WITHIN THE NEXT FOUR TO SIX WEEKS.

UH, BUT THAT IS THE TRAINING.

DOESN'T STOP WITH ONE TRAINING.

WE HAVE TO CONTINUE TO, YOU KNOW, I'VE TALKED ABOUT INNOVATION AND CONTINUED, UM, YOU KNOW, WAYS TO, TO CONDUCT THE INVESTIGATIONS AND HAVE GOOD OUTCOMES FOR SURVIVORS.

AND THAT REALLY MEANS THAT OUR DETECTIVES HAVE TO BE WELL-TRAINED.

AND SO, UM, YOU KNOW, WE HAVE, WE'VE BEEN WORKING IN DIFFERENT AREAS, UH, VERY DILIGENTLY.

UH, I MENTIONED OUR, OUR SAKI GRANT, WHICH DOES PROVIDE FOR TRAINING AND LOCATING, PROCURING THAT TRAINING AND BRING IT IN WITHIN THE NEXT FEW MONTHS, LIKE I WAS TALKING ABOUT.

THANK YOU.

AND, AND I JUST WANT TO BE CLEAR THAT NEW DETECTIVES IN THIS DEPARTMENT CAN BE GREAT IF THEY'RE WELL-TRAINED, BUT WE NEED TO SET THEM UP FOR SUCCESS.

IT'S NOT FAIR TO THEM.

UM, SO ONE OF THE THINGS THAT I GET A LOT OF QUESTIONS ABOUT, UM, YOU KNOW, OBVIOUSLY YOU WOULD BE AN INTERNAL HIRE IF CONFIRMED AS CHIEF.

UM, SO HELP ME UNDERSTAND HOW I WOULD ARTICULATE AN ANSWER TO THIS QUESTION.

HOW CAN SOMEONE WHO SPENT HIS ENTIRE CAREER IN APD BRING A FRESH AND NEW PERSPECTIVE

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AND REFORM IT, POSSIBLY HAVING TO PUSH AND MAYBE LOSE SOME RELATIONSHIPS ALONG THE WAY AS YOU DO.

SO, UH, THANKS FOR THAT QUESTION.

YOU KNOW, UM, I CAN CERTAINLY POINT TO THE THINGS THAT I'VE DONE OVER THE LAST SIX MONTHS THAT HAVE BEEN IN STARK CONTRAST TO THE WAY THAT CHIEF MANLEY, UH, OPERATED, I CHA HAVE CHANGED MANY OF HIS POLICIES AND SOME OF HIS, UH, BIGGER POLICIES, UH, THAT I FELT THAT NEEDED TO BE CHANGED IN THAT WAY.

I THINK, UH, JUST BECAUSE I'VE COME UP IN THE ORGANIZATION DOESN'T MEAN THAT I DON'T HA I DON'T BRING FRESH IDEAS TO THE TABLE.

I, I TRULY, UH, YOU KNOW, I HAVE, UH, BEEN WORKING VERY DILIGENTLY IN THE AREA OF REIMAGINATION, UH, AND INCLUDING THE WORK THAT WE'RE DOING RIGHT NOW AT THE ACADEMY AND SOME OF THE OTHER THINGS THAT WE'RE DOING, BUT, YOU KNOW, WHAT I CAN ASSURE YOU IS THAT, UH, YOU KNOW, I'M GOING TO BE RESPONSIVE, CONTINUE TO BE RESPONSIVE.

UH, AND I HOPE THAT THE COUNCIL MEMBERS REALLY FEEL THIS WAY IS THAT, YOU KNOW, WHEN THE COMMUNICATION HAS COME, UH, TO ME, THAT I HAVE BEEN RESPONSIVE AND THAT, THAT WILL CONTINUE, UM, COMING UP IN THE DEPARTMENT DOES NOT MEAN, UH, THAT YOU CANNOT DO THINGS DIFFERENTLY, UH, AND THAT YOU CAN'T FIND BETTER WAYS TO DO THINGS.

UM, I THINK THAT IT'S VERY IMPORTANT THAT I HAVE, UH, GOOD RELATIONSHIPS WITH THE OFFICERS, UH, BUT I WON'T SACRIFICE PUBLIC SAFETY FOR IT.

UH, SO I MEAN, I CAN JUST PROVIDE YOU MY STRONGEST ASSURANCES FOR THAT.

THANK YOU.

UM, ONE OTHER QUESTION THAT I WANTED TO ASK IS, CAN YOU HELP US UNDERSTAND YOUR VIEWS ON BLACK LIVES MATTER? I BEG YOUR PARDON, AND WHAT CAN YOU HELP US UNDERSTAND YOUR VIEWS ON BLACK LIVES MATTER BLACK LIVES MATTER MOVEMENT? SO, UH, YOU KNOW, CERTAINLY HAVE I THINK AN UNDERSTANDING OF THE MOVEMENT.

UM, I THINK THAT MY EYES WERE OPENED A LITTLE BIT MORE WHEN I ACTUALLY WENT THROUGH OUR GROUNDWATER ANALYSIS COURSE THAT WE PUTTING OUR OFFICERS THROUGH AROUND A SYSTEMIC AND INSTITUTIONAL RACISM.

UM, WHEN YOU, WHEN, WHEN I THOUGHT GOING INTO THAT CLASS, THAT I HAD A GOOD UNDERSTANDING OF, UH, YOU KNOW, UH, THE BLACK LIFE EXPERIENCE AND THEN, AND THEN FIGURED OUT THAT I DIDN'T.

AND SO, UM, YOU KNOW, I, THAT HAS CERTAINLY OPENED MY EYES TO THE MOVEMENT AND TO THE IMPORTANCE OF TREATING PEOPLE WITH DIGNITY AND RESPECT, REGARDLESS OF RACE, REGARDLESS OF THE THINGS THAT I'VE BEEN TALKING ABOUT REGARDING, UH, PROTECTED CLASSES AND JUST MAKING SURE THAT WE TREAT EVERYONE WITH, YOU KNOW, THE, WITH THAT SAME

DIGNITY AND RESPECT THAT WE WOULD WANT OUR FAMILY MEMBERS THAT WE WANT OURSELVES, UH, TREATED WITH.

UH, AND I DON'T THINK THAT THAT HAS ALWAYS HAPPENED.

I THINK THAT THERE HAS BEEN A PROBLEM WITH OUR PROFESSION, UH, AND THERE HAVE EVEN BEEN PROBLEMS OVER THE YEARS IN OUR OWN DEPARTMENT, AND WE CAN'T SHY AWAY FROM THAT.

WE NEED TO SHINE A LIGHT ON IT.

UH, AND SO THAT IS THE COMMITMENT THAT I CONTINUE TO MAKE, UH, IN THE TRAININGS THAT WOULD, THAT WE CONTINUE TO PUSH FORWARD, UH, SO THAT OTHERS CAN HAVE, YOU KNOW, THEIR OWN, UH, KIND OF AHA MOMENTS LIKE I'VE DESCRIBED AT THE BEGINNING OF THAT COURSE ABOUT WHAT SYSTEMIC AND INSTITUTIONAL RACISM REALLY MEANS.

COUNCIL MEMBER KITCHEN.

UM, THANK YOU.

THANK YOU, CHIEF.

UM, I APPRECIATE, UM, ALL THE ANSWERS YOU'VE GIVEN AND I APPRECIATE THE, UM, QUESTIONS FROM MY COLLEAGUES.

MANY OF THEM WERE THE SAME QUESTIONS THAT I HAD.

SO I HAVE ONE LAST QUESTION FOR YOU, AND WE'VE TALKED ABOUT THIS, UM, YOU KNOW, AND IT, YOU YOU'VE ANSWERED IT TO SOME EXTENT SO FAR, BUT I'M JUST GOING TO ASK IN A LITTLE DIFFERENT WAY, AND THAT IS, YOU KNOW, THAT POLICING IS CHANGING.

AND I'D LIKE TO, UM, ASK YOU TO GIVE YOU THE OPPORTUNITY TO JUST TALK FOR A MINUTE ABOUT THE ROLE OF A CHIEF.

AND IN THIS, IN THIS ENVIRONMENT, AS POLICE IS CHANGING, POLICING IS CHANGE.

YEAH.

THANK YOU, COUNCIL MEMBER.

I AGREE.

POLICING HAS CHANGED AND, YOU KNOW, I'M, I'M A CAREER LAW ENFORCEMENT OFFICER.

UH, I'VE DONE ALMOST 30 YEARS TOTAL.

UM, AND I CAN TELL YOU THAT FROM THE TIME THAT I STARTED TO WHERE WE ARE TODAY, THE WAY THAT THE COMMUNITY VIEWS THE POLICE, UH, AND THE WAY REALLY THAT WE OPERATE HAS CHANGED SIGNIFICANTLY.

AND I THINK THAT IT'S ONLY REALLY JUST STARTED TO CHANGE.

I THINK THAT WE NEED CHANGE AGENTS.

YOU NEED PEOPLE THAT ARE GOING TO LEAD FROM THE FRONT AND THEN ARE GOING TO BE COURAGEOUS TO STEP OUT, UH, AND B BE READY TO MOVE IN DIFFERENT

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DIRECTIONS.

UH, EVEN IF THERE IS RESISTANCE.

UM, I THINK THAT I HAVE ALREADY STARTED DOING THAT WITH THE AUSTIN POLICE DEPARTMENT, UH, AND THAT, UH, YOU KNOW, I MAKE A COMMITMENT TO CONTINUE, UH, TO, TO LOOK AT WAYS THAT WE CAN INCREASE TRUST AND LEGITIMACY WITH THE AUSTIN POLICE DEPARTMENT IN THE COMMUNITY THAT IT SERVES, UH, THAT THAT FACTOR IS NOT WHERE IT NEEDS TO BE RIGHT NOW THAT THAT PIECE NEEDS WORK.

AND SO I MAKE A COMMITMENT TO ME, THAT'S MY, THAT IS MY JOB.

THAT IS MY NUMBER ONE PRIORITY, UH, WITH ALL THE OTHER PRIORITIES THAT WE HAVE RIGHT NOW TO MAKE SURE THAT WE'RE GETTING IT RIGHT.

UM, WE NEED TO HAVE THE COMMUNITY UNDERSTAND WHAT WE'RE TRYING TO DO AS A POLICE DEPARTMENT, THAT WE'RE HERE TO HELP NOT TO HURT, UM, AND THAT, UH, WE'RE GOING TO CONTINUE, UH, TO ENGAGE AND HAVE GOOD DIALOGUE.

I MAKE A COMMITMENT TO BE OUT FRONT DOING THAT EVERY DAY.

UH, THANK YOU.

AND I WANT TO THANK YOU FOR JUST ONE EXAMPLE OF THAT.

AND THAT'S THE, THE POLICY CHANGE YOU MADE AROUND RELEASING, UH, BODY CAMERA FOOTAGE RECENTLY.

I WANT TO THANK YOU FOR THAT.

SO I JUST WANT TO THANK YOU FOR ALL YOUR, ALL YOUR QUESTIONS, ALL YOUR ANSWERS, TO THE MANY QUESTIONS THAT WE'VE, UM, THAT WE'VE BEEN ASKING YOU TODAY, THIS IS VERY IMPORTANT FOR OUR COMMUNITY.

UM, AND AS YOU RECOGNIZE, AND, UM, AND I WANT TO LET YOU KNOW THAT I AM SUPPORTING YOU.

I AM VERY PLEASED WITH THE ANSWERS YOU'VE GIVEN.

I CONSIDER YOU TO BE GENUINE, GENUINE, AND REAL, UH, IN YOUR APPROACH, AND, UM, APPRECIATE THE CANDOR WITH WHICH YOU'RE SPEAKING TO US.

AND I WANT TO SAY, THANK YOU FOR THAT.

SO I WILL BE SUPPORTING THANK YOU, COUNCIL MEMBER, COUNCIL MEMBER POOL.

THANKS SO MUCH.

UM, SO MY LAST QUESTION FOR YOU TONIGHT, UM, I'D LIKE TO ASK YOU TO PROVIDE A REGULAR REPORT TO THE COUNCIL ABOUT THE PROGRESS ON ALL OF THE, UM, PUBLIC COMMITMENTS THAT, THAT WE'RE TALKING ABOUT TONIGHT, THAT YOU'RE OFFERING, I'M THINKING QUARTERLY WOULD BE A GOOD START, BUT WE CAN DETERMINE THAT TIMING WITH INPUT FROM YOU AND THE CITY MANAGER, SO THAT WE CAN HAVE KIND OF A CONTINUED DIALOGUE ON THESE TOPICS THAT ARE OF REAL INTEREST AND CONCERN TO OUR COMMUNITY.

DOES THAT SOUND LIKE A GOOD PLAN? OKAY, THANKS.

WELL, THANK YOU, CHIEF, FOR YOUR THOUGHTFUL AND FULL ANSWERS TO QUESTIONS BEING ASKED TONIGHT AND THROUGHOUT THIS ENTIRE SELECTION PROCESS, I TOO WOULD LIKE TO STATE MY SUPPORT FOR, UH, FOR YOUR APPOINTMENT AND THAT I DO INTEND TO VOTE YES.

TO APPROVE YOUR APPOINTMENT.

THANK YOU, COUNCIL MEMBER.

THANK YOU, COUNCIL MEMBER.

UH, YES.

UH, SO YOU PROBABLY WHEN, UH, THE SEARCH STARTED AND, UH, AND, UH, AND WHEN THE MANAGER REDUCED IT DOWN TO THREE PEOPLE, THREE, THREE PERSONS, I RECEIVED A LOT OF PHONE CALLS FROM PEOPLE THAT YOU, THAT HAVE WORKED WITH YOU IN THE COMMUNITY, BUT SHE HAD A LOT OF HISPANIC COMMUNITY MEMBERS THAT ARE LEADERS IN MY NEIGHBOR, IN MY AREA.

AND, UH, THEY SPOKE JUST, NO, THEY, THEY SAID THAT YOU'RE THE TYPE OF OFFICER THAT WENT TO THE MEETINGS.

YOU RESPONDED TO ALL THEIR REQUESTS AND THAT YOU DID AN OUTSTANDING JOB.

I EVEN HAD ONE OF YOUR COLLEAGUES, I GUESS WOULDN'T THROUGH YOUR OLD CADET CLASS.

IT SAID THAT YOU, WEREN'T ONE OF THE GOOD OLD BOYS THAT YOU, YOU DID NOT HANG OUT WITH.

UH, THE ONES THAT, UH, COST A LOT OF PROBLEMS IN MY NEIGHBORHOOD.

SO I, I, UH, I TOOK ALL OF THAT IN, YOU KNOW, AND I, I, YOU KNOW, I'M, I BELIEVE IN COMMUNITY POLICING, I, I THINK THAT THE MORE YOU GO OUT INTO THE COMMUNITY, THE MORE THAT WE'RE GONNA HAVE A REAL STRONG, SAFE COMMUNITY, AND JUST WANT TO LET YOU KNOW THAT I AM ALSO GOING TO SUPPORT YOU.

THANK YOU, COUNCIL MEMBER, ANY OTHER QUESTIONS, COUNCIL MEMBER CASA.

OH, I'M SORRY.

ANYBODY WHO HASN'T GONE YET? UM, MY NOTES SHOW THAT COUNCIL MEMBER TOVO ELLIS WENT, THIS AND MYSELF HAVE NOT GOTTEN YET COUNCILOR BARELLA'S.

I DON'T MIND ASKING ANOTHER QUESTION.

UM, AS FAR AS THE CRIME TECHNICIAN RESPONSE WE WERE DISCUSSING EARLIER, UM, I HAVE HEARD SOME CONCERNS THAT PEOPLE JUST WANTING TO MAKE SURE THAT INVESTIGATIONS ARE HANDLED

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IN A TIMELY FASHION AND VERY THOROUGHLY.

ARE YOU FULLY COMMITTED TO DOING THAT? KNOWING IT MAY NOT BE AN ARMED OFFICER SHOWING UP IF THE PERPETRATOR IS NO LONGER ON SITE, BUT THAT PEOPLE STILL DESERVE, UM, AN AUTHENTIC INVESTIGATION AND TO, YOU KNOW, FEEL LIKE THEIR CASE IS BEING TAKEN VERY SERIOUSLY WHEN SOMETHING BAD HAPPENS TO THEM.

ABSOLUTELY.

UH, THOSE THOSE CASES, UH, REGARDLESS OF WHETHER AN OFFICER'S ON SCENE WRITING IT OR IT'S TAKEN IN ANOTHER FASHION ARE STILL ROUTED TO OUR INVESTIGATIVE UNITS FOR FOLLOW-UP.

I REALLY APPRECIATE THAT.

I DO APPRECIATE YOU TAKING SO MUCH TIME TO ANSWER OUR QUESTIONS.

OBVIOUSLY, YOU KNOW, THIS IS A VERY IMPORTANT MOMENT FOR US, UM, AND ALL THE CONVERSATIONS THAT I'VE HAD WITH YOU OVER THE PAST FEW MONTHS, UM, YOU'VE BEEN VERY TRANSPARENT WITH ME AND VERY RESPONSIVE.

SO I APPRECIATE THAT YOU'VE EVEN HELPED ME WITH SOME CONSTITUENTS WHEN I JUST HAD QUESTIONS, YOU AT LEAST CALLED ME BACK.

I THINK THE SAME DAY TO TELL ME WHAT YOU COULD TELL ME, EVEN THOUGH YOU COULDN'T TELL ME EVERYTHING ABOUT THE SITUATION.

UM, BUT I AM GOING TO BE SUPPORTING YOU TONIGHT, AND I WISH YOU LUCK IN THIS POSITION.

THANK YOU, COUNCIL MEMBER, COUNCIL MEMBER FOR THIS.

THANK YOU.

UM, YES, I HAVE ONE MORE QUESTION.

UM, THE CHEECH, A CALL, COULD YOU TELL US WHAT DOES ACCOUNTABILITY AND TRANSPARENCY MEAN AND LOOK LIKE TO YOU IN REGARDS TO SEX CRIMES AT APD WITH REGARDS TO WHAT I'M SORRY, SEX CRIMES.

SO, UM, YOU KNOW, I THINK PART OF THE TRANSPARENCY PIECE IS GOING TO BE A QUARTERLY REPORT THAT I'M GOING TO RE GIVING TO, UH, TO THE CITY COUNCIL ABOUT HOW WE'RE MAKING PROGRESS ON ALL THE THINGS THAT I'VE TALKED ABOUT TONIGHT.

I THINK THAT, UH, THE ACCOUNTABILITY PIECE IS GOING TO BE, UH, ME FULFILLING THE OBLIGATIONS THAT I HAVE SAID THAT I AM GOING TO DO, INCLUDING AROUND OUR VICTIM SERVICES PIECE, INCLUDING THE TRAINING THAT I WANT ALL OF OUR DETECTIVES TO GO THROUGH TO MAKE SURE THAT WE HAVE THE RIGHT LEADERSHIP IN PLACE.

UM, AND THAT WE ARE REALLY, UM, VALUING THOSE INVESTIGATIONS.

UH, AND THAT IS WHAT I PLAN TO SHOW.

THANK YOU.

AND I WOULD ADD, I'M ALSO SHARING THE DATA OF THE REPORTING OF SEX CRIMES.

THAT WOULD GO A LONG WAY.

I KNOW THAT THAT WAS A CONCERN THAT WAS RAISED FROM THE COMMUNITY OF HAVING CONSISTENT REPORTING ON THE LEVEL OF SEX CRIMES THAT WERE BEING COMMITTED IN OUR COMMUNITY.

UM, IN ADVANCE OF TODAY'S VOTE.

I MET WITH INTERIM CHIEF CHUCK ON, UM, I SHARED WITH HIM AS I HAVE IN THE PAST ABOUT THE REFORM THAT I WANT TO SEE.

ONE THAT IS CENTERED ON HOLISTIC DEESCALATION TRAINING AND PRACTICES FOR BOTH CADETS AND IN-SERVICE OFFICERS, AS IT RELATES TO THE HIGH NUMBER OF OFFICER INVOLVED INCIDENTS, SPECIFICALLY IN DISTRICT TWO, WE HAVE ONE OF THE HIGHEST RATES OF OFFICER INVOLVED SHOOTINGS.

UM, IN ADDITION TO COMMUNITY POLICING WITH, AND FOR OUR BLACK AND BROWN COMMUNITIES, IT REMAINS A PRIORITY NOW MORE THAN EVER THAT OUR LOCAL LAW ENFORCEMENT DEPARTMENT NOT ONLY EMBRACES THE RE-IMAGINED CULTURE OF POLICING, BUT THEY ALSO USE THE REFORMED APPROACH TO PROTECT AND SERVE THE MOST VULNERABLE COMMUNITIES.

I ALSO SHARED MY CONCERNS WITH YOU, CHUCK, ON ABOUT SEEKING A BETTER VICTIM CENTERED APPROACH TO HOW OUR SEXUAL ASSAULT CASES ARE PRIORITIZED, INCLUDING APDS RESPONSE TO SEXUAL ASSAULT SURVIVORS AND THEIR CASES, UH, ACADEMY, CURRICULUM REFORM, AND ACCOUNTABILITY AND TRANSPARENCY AROUND THE WAY SEXUAL CRIMES ARE REPORTED AND HANDLED.

I SUPPORT CHIEF CHICANO'S APPOINTMENT TODAY, AND I PLAN TO HOLD HIM ACCOUNTABLE FOR THE FOLLOW THROUGH OUR COMMUNITY, EXPECTS AND DESERVES.

UH. I ESPECIALLY APPRECIATE CHIEF SHAQUAN.

YOU SHARING YOUR VISION FOR SETTING A FOUNDATION OF PROCEDURAL JUSTICE.

I THINK THAT WILL GO A LONG WAY.

UH, RE-IMAGINING PUBLIC SAFETY DOES NOT FALL ON ANY SINGLE INDIVIDUAL, BUT RATHER AN ENTIRE SYSTEM.

YOU MUST DO ALL.

WE MUST ALL DO OUR PART TO ENSURE EVERY AUSTINITE FEEL SAFE IN OUR CITY.

I BELIEVE TEACHER CON IS WILLING AND ABLE TO DO HIS PART IN THIS EFFORT.

THANK YOU, COUNCIL MEMBER, COUNCIL MEMBER TOBO.

DID YOU HAVE ANY ADDITIONAL QUESTIONS? I DO NOT.

THANK YOU.

IN WHICH CASE, I'M THE LAST ONE WHO HASN'T GONE YET, AND I HAVE TWO QUESTIONS.

UM, ONE ACTUALLY COUNCILMEMBER POINT, THIS TEED THIS UP FOR ME, VISIBILITY IS GREAT, BUT SO IS TRANSPARENCY.

I'D LIKE TO KNOW WHAT YOU'RE GOING TO DO TO MAKE YOUR PUBLIC INFORMATION MORE ACCESSIBLE TO THE MEDIA AND TO THE PUBLIC AT LARGE, YOU KNOW, WE ARE REALLY LOOKING AT HOW WE'RE RETOOLING OUR PUBLIC INFORMATION OFFICE RIGHT NOW TO MAKE SURE THAT WE'RE DOING JUST, YOU KNOW, WE TRY TO, UH, BE VERY RESPONSIVE, UH, TO OUR, OUR MEDIA PARTNERS.

UM, I THINK THAT, UH, YOU KNOW, WE, YOU KNOW, THERE PROBABLY DEPARTMENTS AROUND THE COUNTRY THAT, THAT IF YOU REALLY JUST WE'LL TALK

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AROUND THE STATE BECAUSE THEY OPERATE UNDER, UNDER THE STATE RULES AROUND, UM, PUBLIC INFORMATION REQUESTS AND, AND, UH, THE STATE ACTUALLY GIVES MOST DEPARTMENTS WIDE LATITUDE ON, UH, HOW MUCH TIME THEY NEED.

AND YOU CAN TAKE UP TO 10 DAYS OR LONGER TO PROVIDE RESPONSES.

WE TRY TO GET RESPONSES THAT SAME DAY WITHIN, UH, WITHIN A DAY BECAUSE WE KNOW HOW IMPORTANT IT IS FOR OUR COMMUNITY TO HAVE THAT INFORMATION.

SO THAT'S GOING TO CONTINUE.

UM, I THINK ALSO THAT, UH, YOU KNOW, IT'S IMPORTANT, UH, FOR ME TO, TO LEAD FROM THE FRONT WHEN, WITH A LOT OF THE MESSAGING TO MAKE SURE THAT PEOPLE UNDERSTAND, UH, WHAT THE DEPARTMENT IS DOING AND, UM, AND CERTAINLY ENGAGE WITH THOSE, UH, COMMUNITY PARTNERS AND OUR MEDIA PARTNERS ON GETTING THE INFORMATION OUT IN A TIMELY WAY.

THANK YOU.

I APPRECIATE THAT.

I THINK IT'S OF THE UTMOST IMPORTANCE TO YOU WOULD TALKING ABOUT THAT TRUST PIECE EARLIER AND, YOU KNOW, THE RELEVANCE OF IT.

UM, AND THAT'S A GOOD SEGUE INTO, UM, A LOT OF PEOPLE DON'T REALIZE THIS, BUT THERE IS MORE THAN ONE POLICE UNION.

AND SOME OF THE MEMBERS OF THE LESSER KNOWN UNIONS THAT I'VE TALKED TO TOLD ME ABOUT MISOGYNY AND DISCRIMINATION AND RETALIATION INSIDE THE DEPARTMENT, JUST LIKE THIS COUNCIL.

WE WANT A POLICE DEPARTMENT THAT MIRRORS THE DIVERSITY OF OUR COMMUNITY.

HOW DO YOU PLAN TO NOT ONLY RECRUIT A DIVERSE DEPARTMENT, BUT TO ENSURE THAT MINORITY OFFICERS FEEL EMPOWERED TO SERVE THEIR COMMUNITY? YEAH.

THANK YOU.

UM, A COUPLE OF THINGS THAT I CAN SAY ON THAT, FIRST OF ALL, WITH REGARDS TO OUR RECRUITING DIVISION, WE HAVE BUILT THE MOST DIVERSE UNIT IN OUR DEPARTMENT IS IN OUR RECRUITING DIVISION.

WE HAVE MORE, UH, OFFICERS OF COLOR.

WE HAVE MANY WOMEN, UH, WE HAVE, UM, YOU KNOW, OFFICERS REPRESENTING LGBTQ, UH, THAT ARE IN THAT UNIT SO THAT AS THEY GO OUT INTO OUR COMMUNITY, UH, BOTH LOCALLY AND FURTHER TO DO THE RECRUITING THAT PEOPLE SEE OFFICERS THAT LOOK LIKE THEM, AND THAT MAKES A LOT OF SENSE TO THEM.

AND SO THEY'RE ABLE, UH, TO BE VERY EFFECTIVE IN THOSE RECRUITING, THOSE RECRUITING EFFORTS.

UM, YOU KNOW, I HAVE NO TOLERANCE FOR, UH, FOR ANY OF THE THINGS THAT YOU STARTED TO, TO MENTION WHETHER IT'S MISOGYNY OR, UH, OR ANY TYPE OF RACIST BEHAVIOR.

I WILL HOLD OFFICERS ACCOUNTABLE.

THERE HAS TO BE, UM, YOU KNOW, THE DISCUSSION THAT HAPPENS WHEN I OPEN UP, UH, EITHER A CADET CLASS OR WE HAVE NEW EMPLOYEE ORIENTATIONS ONCE A MONTH WITH OUR BRAND NEW A CIVILIAN EMPLOYEES.

UH, ONE OF THE FIRST STATEMENTS THAT I MAKE OUT OF THE BOX IS THAT, UM, YOU KNOW, RACISM, DISCRIMINATION AND RETALIATION ARE NOT TOLERATED AT THE AUSTIN POLICE DEPARTMENT.

I SAY THAT EVERY SINGLE TIME.

AND SO I, I, I TELL THEM THAT IF THEY ARE A VICTIM OF IT, THEY'RE TO REPORT IT.

IF THEY SEE IT, THEY SHOULD CALL IT OUT WHEN THEY SEE IT.

UH, AND OF COURSE THEY SHOULD NEVER, THEY SHOULD NEVER PARTICIPATED IN IT, IN IT THEMSELVES.

SO WE'RE BUILDING A CULTURE OF, OF, OF RESPECT AND DIGNITY.

I APPRECIATE THAT AS YOU WERE SAYING THAT I WAS THINKING, BUT I KNOW FOR A FACT THAT THERE ARE PEOPLE WHO ARE SUFFERING FROM IT.

AND I KNOW FOR A FACT THAT THERE ARE PEOPLE WHO WILL NEVER TELL A SOUL.

I ALSO KNOW FOR A FACT THAT JUST GENERALLY SPEAKING, I THINK, AS YOU WERE TALKING ABOUT POLICING EARLIER AND HOW DIFFICULT IT IS TO BE A PART OF THE PROFESSION CURRENTLY, I THINK IT'S DIFFICULT FOR SOME PEOPLE.

UM, AND WHILE I CAN APPRECIATE THAT, YOU KNOW, HAVING FOLKS LOOK AT YOUR, YOUR ROLE AND NOT UNDERSTAND THE DEGREE OF, OF SACRIFICE AND DANGER, FRANKLY, AND IT'S A DIFFICULT JOB.

SOMEBODY TOLD ME ONE TIME, YOU PRACTICALLY HAVE TO BE SUPERHUMAN TO BE A GOOD COP.

CAUSE YOU GET ABUSED AND TATTERED AND BATTERED AND YOU STILL HAVE TO SHOW UP AND BE A PROFESSIONAL CONSUMMATE, MATURE, EMOTIONALLY MATURE PROFESSIONAL.

AND THAT SAID, THERE ARE A LOT OF FOLKS WHO JUST DON'T CUT THE MUSTARD AND THEY SHOULD BE COPS ANYWAY, AS FAR AS I'M CONCERNED.

BUT I ALSO WANT TO SAY, I THINK THERE'S A FUNDAMENTAL PARADIGM SHIFT IN WHAT LAW ENFORCEMENT LOOKS LIKE, AND THERE'S GOING TO BE SOME DISCOMFORT.

AND SO I JUST WANT TO MAKE CERTAIN THAT AS WE'RE GOING THROUGH THIS, THIS GROWTH PERIOD, THIS SHIFT PERIOD, YOU KNOW, LIKE THE, THE SHIFT FROM THE ROTARY PHONE TO THE, TO THE CELLULAR PHONE, YOU KNOW, THERE WAS SOME DISCOMFORT IN THAT SPACE IN BETWEEN, BUT I REALLY WANT TO MAKE CERTAIN THAT YOU SEE THE COUNCIL AS AN ALLY, AS COLLEAGUES, AS PEOPLE THAT YOU WANT TO MAKE SURE THAT YOU'RE HAVING THESE REGULAR CHECK-INS AND COLLABORATIVE COMMUNICATIONS WITH, UM, TO MAKE CERTAIN THAT AS WE GO THROUGH THAT TRICKY PART, THAT GROWING PAINS PART THAT WE'RE NOT, WE'RE NOT THAT THERE AREN'T ANY GAPS.

THOSE, THOSE ARE SOME OF MY BIGGEST CONCERNS IS, IS THE GAPS, YOU KNOW, AND I'LL LEAVE YOU WITH THIS.

UM, I WAS TALKING TO SOMEBODY RECENTLY

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AND WE WERE TALKING ABOUT ATTRITION AND, UH, IT WAS, UH, IT WAS A GROUP OF FIRST RESPONDERS

AND DURING THE COURSE OF THE CONVERSATION, ONE COMPLAINED ABOUT ALL THE EXTRA WORK.

WHAT HE WAS TALKING ABOUT WAS HAVING TO DO, UM, TRAINING ON BIAS, IMPLICIT BIAS, UM, AND HAVING TO LEARN THINGS THAT DIDN'T HAVE ANYTHING TO DO WITH POLICE WORK.

WHEN IN FACT THEY ACTUALLY DO HAVE EVERYTHING TO DO WITH POLICE WORK, INCLUDING YOU KNOW, HOW TO DEAL WITH TRANS MEMBERS OF OUR COMMUNITY AND TREAT THEM WITH DIGNITY AND RESPECT AND NOT MIS-GENDER THEM.

UM, AND THOSE ARE, IT SEEMS SMALL, BUT IT'S CRITICAL TO SOME PEOPLE'S LIVES.

AND THAT RESPECT AND DIGNITY THAT YOU MADE REFERENCE TO THAT SAID, THIS PARTICULAR INDIVIDUAL SAID THAT THEY'D PROBABLY JUST LEAVE THE PROFESSION.

AND I LIKE IT THINK WAS GOOD.

WE DON'T WANT COPS LIKE YOU ANYWAY.

AND SO I JUST, I HOPE THAT I'M NOT ASKING YOU TO SAY THAT, BUT I HOPE THAT YOU RECOGNIZE THAT SOME PEOPLE DON'T DESERVE THE HONOR TO WEAR THE BADGE ANYWAY.

AND SO WE CAN'T KEEP THEM ALL.

AND I'M JUST FINE WITH THAT.

I'LL LEAVE YOU WITH THIS.

I DIDN'T KNOW WHETHER OR NOT I WOULD SUPPORT YOU THIS EVENING.

I WAS ASKING QUESTIONS BECAUSE I JUST DIDN'T THINK WE WERE READY YET.

I THOUGHT WE NEEDED MORE TIME RECOGNIZING JUST HOW MANY QUESTIONS MY COLLEAGUES STILL HAD RECOGNIZING HOW MANY QUESTIONS WERE STILL COMING FROM THE COMMUNITY.

I FELT LIKE IT WAS MY INHERENT DUTY AND RESPONSIBILITY TO REALLY MAKE SURE THAT WE WERE THERE BEFORE WE MADE A DECISION, BUT I'M GAUGING FROM MY COLLEAGUES' RESPONSES.

AND I'VE APPRECIATED YOUR RESPONSES.

I THINK IN LARGE PART, THE POLICE CHIEF IS A PERSON WHO'S GOING TO NEED TO BE UNFLAPPABLE AND BE COOL UNDER PRESSURE AND HAVE CAMERAS IN YOUR FACE AND BE ABLE TO ANSWER QUESTIONS AND RESPOND TO COMMUNITIES.

AND YOU PERSONALLY SAT IN THAT ROOM AND HOOVERS AND THAT ROOM WAS HOT, YOU KNOW, AND I DON'T MEAN THE HEAT AND I DON'T MEAN THE FOOD EITHER.

AND SO THAT SAID, I, UH, I THINK YOU KEEP YOUR COOL WHEN YOU NEED TO.

AND THAT'S CRITICAL.

I THINK IT'S SO VERY IMPORTANT.

AND SO I THINK AS WE WALK AWAY FROM THIS EVENING, YOU WILL PROBABLY HAVE MY SUPPORT.

THANK YOU, COUNCIL MEMBER, MAYOR, PRETEND I BELIEVE.

COUNCIL MEMBER COSTAR AND THEN COUNCIL MEMBER ALTAR.

YEAH.

THANK YOU.

UH, AND TO THAT LAST POINT, REMEMBER A TIME I THINK, UM, YOU KNOW, I THINK THAT HAVING THAT LEVEL OF LEADERSHIP AND ACCOUNTABILITY AND TRANSPARENCY HELPS US KEEP THE FOLKS THAT WE REALLY DO WANT TO KEEP.

UM, UH, THERE WAS A STORY IN THE CHRONICLE TODAY ABOUT AN OFFICER WHO SPOKE UP ABOUT AND FILED A COMPLAINT ABOUT DISCOMFORT ASSOCIATED WITH WHAT HE SAW, HEARD AS ANTISEMITIC TROPES.

PEOPLE SAYING THAT COVID WAS, UH, UH, WAS AN INVENTION OF POLITICIANS.

UH, THE SORTS OF THINGS THAT, THAT, THAT DON'T MAKE FOR A GOOD POLICING, UH, OR, OR GOOD CRITICAL THINKING.

AND, UH, OF COURSE, BECAUSE THERE WAS, THERE'S ULTIMATELY NO DISCIPLINE IN THAT CASE, WE CAN SEE THE PUBLIC IS NEVER FULLY KNOW WHAT IT IS BEHIND.

ALL OF THAT.

IT'S NOT JUST ABOUT THAT ONE CASE, BUT REALLY ABOUT MAKING SURE THAT THOSE OFFICERS THAT, THAT WANT, UH, THE RIGHT THING TO BE DONE AND WANT A GOOD ACCOUNTABILITY AND TRANSPARENCY THAT WE ARE ABLE TO KEEP, UH, THAT WE'RE ABLE TO KEEP THEM.

SO, UH, MY LAST, UH, COUPLE OF QUESTIONS IS ONE, YOU KNOW, WE'VE TALKED QUITE A BIT ABOUT, UH, THE FACT THAT WE HAVE, UH, NOW LOWER, UH, CRIME RATES, UH, THAT THE CRIME RATES ARE STARTING TO GO DOWN, BUT WE DO STILL HAVE THAT CONCERNING RISE IN GUN CRIME.

AND IN HOMICIDES, IN PARTICULAR, IN YOUR, UH, VIEW ILLEGAL GUNS SEEMS TO BE KIND OF THE PRIMARY DRIVER, UM, ALONG WITH THE NATIONAL TRENDS ON GUN CRIME.

IS THAT RIGHT? I THINK THAT IS, I THINK THAT IS A DRIVING ONE OF THE DRIVING FACTORS RIGHT NOW FOR OUR HOMICIDE AND AGGRAVATED ASSAULTS YESTERDAY.

SOME FOLKS HAVE POINTED TO THE, TO THE, TO THE QUESTION OF PR BONDS WITH THE DATA THAT YOU HAVE NOW.

I THINK YOU'VE MENTIONED TO ME THAT ABOUT ONE OF THE 60 PLUS CASES RIGHT NOW, YOU CAN TAKE A LOOK AT SOMEBODY CURRENTLY BEING AN INFORMATION MORE THAN THAT ONE AT THIS POINT, I DON'T HAVE ANY INFORMATION TO PRESENT ON THAT RIGHT NOW, COUNCIL MEMBER, I HAVE HAD CONVERSATIONS WITH OUR, UH, VIOLENT CRIME INVESTIGATORS THAT HAVE EXPRESSED CONCERNS WITH PR BONDS.

UH, I THINK IT'S AN AREA THAT WE DEFINITELY NEED TO LOOK AT, UH, AND WOULD BE ABLE TO PROVIDE YOU, YOU KNOW, UH, BETTER FIGURES IN THE FUTURE.

THAT'D BE GREAT.

BUT AT CURRENT, AT THE CURRENT MOMENT, YOU'VE GOT ABOUT ONE HOMICIDE THAT YOU THINK MIGHT BE LINKED TO THAT.

AND YOU'LL TAKE A LOOK TO SEE IF THERE'S ANY MORE THAN THAT.

I'VE BEEN TOLD ABOUT ONE, UH, I'D HAVE TO CHECK TO SEE IF WE HAVE MORE.

UM, MY LAST QUESTION HERE IS, UM, SORT OF ABOUT WHERE REIMAGINING GOES FROM HERE AND REAL SOLUTIONS TO 9 1, 1 CALLS.

NOW THERE ARE THESE PERSISTENT PUBLIC SAFETY AND QUALITY OF LIFE ISSUES IN OUR COMMUNITY THAT NEEDS SOLUTIONS.

AND SO OFTEN AS WE'VE TALKED ABOUT, POLICE

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ARE SENT TO BE THE FIRST RESPONDERS TO THOSE PROBLEMS, EVEN IF THEY'RE NOT THE BEST EQUIPPED TO HANDLE THOSE ISSUES.

AND I WANT TO BE REALLY CLEAR HERE TONIGHT BECAUSE I KNOW THAT THERE ARE FOLKS, UH, LOTS OF FOLKS IN THE DEPARTMENT WATCHING THAT I DON'T SEE THAT AS THE FAULT OF THE DEPARTMENT OR OF OFFICERS, BUT A FAULT IN OUR OVERALL SYSTEM OF LOCAL GOVERNMENT AND HOW WE HAVE TO EVOLVE.

AND I THINK THAT OUR COMMUNITY COULD REALLY USE YOU AS OUR POLICE CHIEF TO ACKNOWLEDGE THAT CHALLENGE, BECAUSE YOU'VE SPENT SO MUCH TIME ON THE FORCE HERE IN AUSTIN, AND THEN GENUINELY WORK WITH US ON HOW TO, HOW TO FIX IT IN A WAY THAT'S GOING TO ACTUALLY PROVIDE SOLUTIONS FOR COMMUNITY MEMBERS AND TAKE WORK OFF OF OFFICER'S PLATES THAT THEY'RE NOT BEST SET UP TO DO SOME REALLY CLEAR EXAMPLES FOR ME IN MY TIME IN OFFICE HAVE BEEN AROUND ADDICTION AND MENTAL HEALTH AND CERTAIN ADDRESSES AND HOUSES THAT ARE JUST GETTING THE CALL AFTER CALL AFTER CALL JUST SO MANY, NINE 11 CALLS AND POLICE RESPONSES.

AND USUALLY I FIND THAT NEIGHBORS DON'T ACTUALLY GET THE SOLUTION THAT THEY WANT BECAUSE POLICE OFFICERS, AREN'T GOING TO MAGICALLY BE ABLE TO FIX ADDICTION OR A MENTAL HEALTH ISSUE BECAUSE THAT'S JUST NOT WHAT THEY ARE MEANT TO DO.

UM, SO NEIGHBORS WANT THE SOLUTION.

IT'S SUCH A DRAIN ON OUR, ON OUR POLICING RESOURCES AND WE STILL HAVEN'T QUITE GOTTEN TO THE PLACE WHERE WE HAVE, UM, A REAL CONVERSATION AMONGST MEMBERS OF THE DIOCESE, AMONGST THE POLICE DEPARTMENT, OTHER AGENCIES TO SAY, HEY, I MIGHT ACTUALLY NEED A FEW BE ABLE TO SEND MY GUYS TO GO DO THIS OTHER WORK GUYS AND GIRLS, MEN, AND WOMEN, MEN, AND WOMEN AT THE POLICE DEPARTMENT TO DO THIS OTHER WORK.

UM, BUT WE NEED, UH, WE NEED SOMEBODY ELSE TO DO, TO DO, TO COVER THIS.

AND IF I COULD ONLY HAVE THIS EXTRA SUBSTANCE USE PROGRAM OR THESE EXTRA MENTAL HEALTH FOLKS, THIS IS HOW MANY FEWER NINE 11 CALLS POLICE OFFICERS WOULD HAVE TO GO TO.

AND SO WHAT WOULD BE REALLY WHAT I WOULD REALLY WANT IS TO BE ABLE TO LEAN ON YOUR DECADES OF EXPERIENCE IN THE DEPARTMENT TO HELP US FIND THOSE SOLUTIONS THAT WORK.

AND CAN WE FIND A WAY TO MAKE THIS PROCESS LESS CONTENTIOUS IN A WAY THAT BUILDS A PATH FORWARD WITH OUR COMMUNITY THAT IS DATA-DRIVEN AND SAYS, THERE ARE SOME OF THESE CALLS THAT WE CAN ACTUALLY TAKE OFF OF POLICE OFFICERS AND THAT YOU COULD COME FORWARD TO US BRINGING THOSE SOLUTIONS FORWARD YOURSELF.

SO TELL ME YOUR THOUGHTS THERE, BECAUSE IT JUST SEEMS LIKE THERE ARE SOME REALLY, IT SEEMS TO ME THAT THERE IS LOW-HANGING FRUIT OF PLACES WHERE WE ARE JUST SPENDING A LOT OF POLICE RESOURCES, WHERE WE COULD BE DOING SOMETHING BETTER.

I HAVE TO REMEMBER CASSADA AND TEACH AT GONE.

IF YOU GUYS WILL OFFER ME JUST A MOMENT, WE NEED TO VOTE TO GO PAST 10 O'CLOCK.

IT'S ONLY A FEW MINUTES PAST, BUT IT'S 10 0 4 COUNCIL MEMBER POOL MADE THE MOTION IS SECONDED BY COUNCIL MEMBER.

TOVO ALL IN FAVOR.

MAYOR PRO TEM.

I, I CAN'T, I WAS SECONDING THE MOTION, BUT I DO HAVE A COMMENT.

OKAY.

I'M NOT SURE HOW MANY MORE ROUNDS OF QUESTIONS WE HAVE, BUT WE HAVE A LOT, I THINK IF ANYTHING, WE'RE CLOSING UP, I WAS JUST GOING TO SUGGEST THAT IF, IF THERE ARE MORE QUESTIONS TO COME, THAT WE JUST AFFORD A FIVE MINUTE RECESS, IF THE CHIEF OR ANYONE ELSE WOULD LIKE TO TAKE ONE, I THINK WE VERY RARELY HAVE SORT OF ONE, ONE PERSON, UM, GOING FOR SO LONG.

AND IT'S JUST, IT'S JUST, I UNDERSTAND FOR WHAT IT'S WORTH.

I DON'T HAVE TO GAMBLE OR ANYTHING, BUT MY THOUGHT WAS THIS WAS OUR LAST PASS.

OKAY.

VERY GOOD.

THANK YOU.

UM, SO ALL IN FAVOR OF, OF US GOING PAST 10 O'CLOCK THIS EVENING, I SEE 1, 2, 3, 4, 5, 6, 7, 8, 9 HANDS.

AM I MISSING 10? SO I'M UH, NO, I DON'T HAVE THAT.

SO 10 TO ONE TO GO PAST 10:00 PM.

OKAY.

COUNCIL MEMBER, OR, UM, SORRY, CHIEF JACK ON IT.

THE MIC IS BACK ON YOU, CHIEF CHACAN, WOULD YOU LIKE SOME MORE WATER? UH, THAT WOULD BE AWESOME.

OKAY.

IT WOULD BE GLAD THAT YOU SAID, I THINK WE HAVE SOME DONE.

DO YOU NEED A BREAK BECAUSE WE CAN CERTAINLY TAKE A FIVE MINUTE BREAK.

WOULD YOU LIKE A FIVE MINUTE BREAK CHIEF TACOMA? I'M FINE.

YEAH.

IF I CAN JUST GET SOME WATER, I'LL BE ALL RIGHT.

THANK YOU.

UM, I WANT, I WANT TO ANSWER THE COUNCIL MEMBERS QUESTION WITH REGARD TO HOW WE CAN BE INNOVATIVE, UH, AROUND CERTAIN TYPES OF CALLS, IF THERE IS AN ABILITY, UH, TO FIND AND THANK YOU FOR THAT COUNCIL MEMBER.

UM, IF WE HAVE THE ABILITY, UH, TO FIND A WAY, AND THE EXAMPLE THAT YOU GAVE IS IT'S THE FIRST ONE THAT COMES TO MY MIND, WHICH IS AROUND MENTAL HEALTH.

UM, YOU KNOW, HAVE BEEN WORKING IN THAT AREA FOR A REALLY LONG TIME AND TRYING TO FIND GOOD, EFFECTIVE WAYS TO ACTUALLY MOVE THE NEEDLE ON, ON RESPONSE TO MENTAL HEALTH CRISIS.

UM, WE'VE, I THINK WE'VE MADE SOME SIGNIFICANT PROGRESS AND WE'VE TALKED ABOUT IT A LITTLE BIT TONIGHT AND OUR NINE 11 CALL CENTER AND TRYING TO DIVERT AT THAT EARLIEST INTERCEPT.

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HOWEVER, UM, YOU KNOW, WE ARE, WE ARE NOT STOPPING THERE AND WE CONTINUE, UH, WE'RE WORKING, UH, UH, THROUGH THE, THE PROGRAMS THAT WE HAVE WITH MEADOWS, UH, ON OTHER, UH, MULTI-DISCIPLINARY TEAMS, UH, THAT ARE, THAT ARE SIMILAR, UH, ESSENTIALLY TO WHAT HOST DOES OUR HOMELESSNESS TEAM.

UM, BUT THEY, UH, ARE, ARE DIRECTLY GEARED TO MENTAL HEALTH.

SO IT'S A, IT'S A SIMILAR TYPE OF MAKE-UP.

THAT IS SOMETHING THAT IS IN THE WORKS THAT WE WERE TRYING TO, WE WERE WORKING WITH EMS AND, UM, EMS SPECIFICALLY, UH, BECAUSE THEY PROVIDE THE COMMUNITY HEALTH PARAMEDIC, UH, AND WITH INTEGRAL CARE BECAUSE THEY PROVIDE, UH, THAT CLINICIAN THAT WE NEED.

SO TRYING TO FIND SOME ALTERNATE, UH, WAYS TO, UH, INSTEAD OF AN EMERGENCY POLICE RESPONSE, UH, THAT, THAT JUST MAKES SENSE FOR PEOPLE.

SO, UM, WE'RE GOING TO CONTINUE TO INNOVATE.

WE'RE GOING TO CONTINUE TO FIND ALTERNATIVE MEASURES.

THANK YOU FOR THAT.

AND, UH, W WE'LL CONTINUE TO FOLLOW UP ON THE ISSUES THAT WE'VE RAISED, UH, TONIGHT AND THAT WE RAISED WHEN YOU WERE APPOINTED INTERIM CHIEF.

I KNOW THAT THERE'S STILL WORK TO BE DONE, TO GET TO CONSENSUS ON USE OF FORCE POLICIES, AS WE TALKED ABOUT DURING THE LAST APPOINTMENTS, UH, RACIAL DISPARITIES, THAT ARRESTS IN TRAFFIC STOPS.

UM, I THINK THAT, UH, YOU'VE HEARD FROM THE DIOCESE, ALL OF THE QUESTIONS AROUND SEXUAL ASSAULT, AND I THINK THAT THE POLICY CHANGES THAT WE CAN MAKE, UH, TOGETHER, UM, UH, CAN HELP US SETTLE THAT THE LAWSUIT BROUGHT FORWARD BY SURVIVORS.

UH, AND ALSO, YOU KNOW, YOU'VE HEARD A LOT FROM US ABOUT ADDRESSING, ADDRESSING GUN CRIME AND REIMAGINING PUBLIC SAFETY.

SO AS WE CONTINUE TO DO THAT WORK, I WANT YOU AND THE DEPARTMENT TO SUCCEED THAT WILL HELP US ALL SUCCEED.

AND I PLAN ON VOTING YESTERDAY, COLLEAGUES, WE HAVE COUNCIL MEMBER ALTER AND KELLY NEXT, BUT IT, IT SOUNDS AS THOUGH THERE MIGHT BE SOME WELL TO TAKE A FIVE MINUTE BREAK.

I SEE A VERY HARD HEAD SHAKE.

THAT'S NOT THE CASE.

RAISE YOUR HAND IF YOU NEED A BREAK, PLEASE, SO I CAN GET SOME INDICATION.

OKAY.

THANK YOU, COUNCIL MEMBER ALTAR, AND THEN COUNCIL MEMBER KELLY, THANK YOU, UM, TO FIGHT APPRECIATE ALL YOUR TIME AND YOUR ANSWERS TONIGHT.

UM, IT'S CLEAR THAT YOU BRING MANY NEEDED QUALITIES FOR THIS POSITION AND YOU CARE DEEPLY ABOUT THE CITY, THE DEPARTMENT AND YOUR OFFICERS.

UM, AND YOU HAVE BEEN VERY RESPONSIVE AND RESPECTFUL OF THE COUNCIL, UM, AND WORKING TO UNDERSTAND, UM, WHERE WE ARE AT.

I AM HOPEFUL THAT YOU WILL BRING THE NEEDED CULTURAL CHANGE TO THE DEPARTMENT.

WE'VE HAD A CHANCE TO WORK TOGETHER THOUGH OVER THE LAST FEW WEEKS AND MONTHS.

AND I THINK, YOU KNOW, THAT I LIKE TO DO MY HOMEWORK.

WE ARE BEING ASKED TO MAKE IT THE MOST IMPORTANT DECISION THAT WE MAKE WITH JUST A LITTLE BIT OVER A WEEK'S TIME.

AND I'VE HAD AN OPPORTUNITY TO TALK TO YOU AND TALK TO SEVERAL PEOPLE, DOVE, PARTICULARLY INTO THE SEXUAL ASSAULT ISSUE AND INTO THE ACADEMY, UM, WITH MIXED RESULTS.

SO, UM, THE ACADEMY, UM, I BELIEVE THAT YOUR HEART IS IN IT.

I BELIEVE THAT YOU ARE TRYING, I BELIEVE YOU HAVE A VERY, VERY STEEP TASK THAT HAS BEEN PUT BEFORE YOU, UM, AND THAT YOU ARE TAKING STEPS TO MEET THOSE GOALS.

UM, THERE'S A LOT OF POSITIVE.

THERE, THERE ARE STILL BUMPS AND THERE ARE STILL A LOOMING DEADLINE OF FEBRUARY THAT I AM NOT CONVINCED YET THAT WE HAVE MARSHALED OUR RESOURCES TO MAKE, BUT I HOPE THAT YOU AND THE CITY MANAGER WILL GET THERE.

UM, I STILL HAVE REALLY SERIOUS CONCERNS ABOUT SEXUAL ASSAULT AND HOW THAT HAS BEEN HANDLED ON YOUR WATCH AS AN ASSISTANT CHIEF BEFORE THAT, AND AS INTERIM, UM, I KNOW, YOU KNOW, THIS IS FOR ME, THIS IS AN ISSUE THAT PRIMARILY AFFECTS WOMEN AND THE LACK OF PRIORITIZATION THAT PREDATES YOU, BUT OF WHAT I'M SEEING GIVES ME A LOT OF PAUSE.

UM, FROM WHAT I HEARD, YOU HAVE DECLINED TO ELEVATE THE VICTIM SERVICES MANAGER TO YOUR EXECUTIVE TEAM.

I APPRECIATE THE MOVEMENTS THAT YOU HAVE, UM, INDICATED.

UM, TO ME, THIS IS AN EASY ASK AND DECLINING IT, UM, TO MAKE THIS CHANGE REALLY INDICATES HOW YOU, HOW YOU THINK ABOUT VICTIM SERVICES AND SEXUAL ASSAULT AND, AND, AND CHALLENGING FOR ME.

UM, THERE WAS A FIRST INTERIM REPORT FROM THE PERF THAT CAME OUT, UM, AND IT APPEARS THAT YOU HAVEN'T READ IT.

AND, UM, THAT IS DEEPLY DISTURBING GIVEN THE STORIES THAT WE'VE HEARD FROM OUR SURVIVORS, GIVEN WHAT WE'VE HEARD FROM THIS DYESS ABOUT OUR INTENTION, TO BE MORE VICTIM-CENTERED AND

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TO ADDRESS THE CHALLENGES OF SEXUAL ASSAULT RESPONSE WITHIN OUR SYSTEM.

AND THAT DOESN'T ONLY FALL ON, ON APD.

APD IS NOT THE ONES PERPETRATING THE CRIME IN THE FIRST PLACE.

UM, THIS IS ONE OF MY TOP PRIORITIES.

I'M GOING TO TAKE YOU AT YOUR WORD THAT YOU ARE GOING TO WORK AT IT.

AND I THINK MY COLLEAGUES ARE WORKING HARD TO ALSO HOLD YOU ACCOUNTABLE.

UM, I WANT TO WORK TOGETHER WITH YOU TO TRANSFORM THIS AREA AND TO REIMAGINE PUBLIC SAFETY.

UM, BUT AS WE TALKED ABOUT THE OTHER DAY, EACH OF US IN OUR JOBS HAS TO MAKE TOUGH DECISIONS AND WE DON'T ALWAYS GET TO MAKE THOSE DECISIONS WITH THE INFORMATION THAT WE WOULD LIKE GIVEN THAT I DON'T HAVE THE TIME.

THAT'S NOT THE WILL OF THE DIOCESE TO TAKE MORE TIME.

UM, I'M NOT GOING TO BE ABLE TO SUPPORT, UM, YOUR CONFIRMATION TODAY, BUT THAT BEING SAID, ONCE YOU ARE CONFIRMED AS CHIEF, I WILL WORK WITH YOU AS IS OUR ROLES TO KEEP THE CITY SAFE, UM, AND, UM, YOU KNOW, WISH YOU ALL THE BEST AND WANT YOU TO SUCCEED.

UM, BUT I, AT THE END OF THE DAY, HAVE TO BE COMFORTABLE WITH MY VOTE, WITH THE INFORMATION THAT I HAVE AVAILABLE TO ME TODAY.

AND I HOPE THAT YOU WILL PROVE ME WRONG.

UM, BUT THAT'S WHERE I'M GOING TO END UP TONIGHT.

AND I LOOK FORWARD TO WORKING WITH YOU SINCE IT SEEMS TO BE THE WILL OF THE DYES, KATHERINE RIVER KELLY, AND THEN COUNCIL MEMBER KITCHEN.

THANK YOU.

AND THANK YOU, CHIEF CHICONE FOR THE LINE OF QUESTIONING THAT YOU'VE ANSWERED THUS FAR.

I WOULD BE REMISS IF I DIDN'T BRING THIS LAST ITEM UP.

UM, MANY OF US HAVE HEARD THAT THERE IS, UM, CLAIMS OF RETALIATION AGAINST A DETECTIVE IN YOUR DEPARTMENT RECENTLY.

WELL, I KNOW THAT'S UNDER INVESTIGATION.

I'D LIKE TO KNOW HOW YOU WILL CULTIVATE A CULTURE OF THE DEPARTMENT WHERE RETALIATION DOESN'T OCCUR.

COULD YOU SPEAK TO THAT PLEASE? I THINK THAT THE, UM, RESULTS OF THAT INVESTIGATION ARE GOING TO BE PUBLIC SOON.

UH, THE INVESTIGATION HAS BEEN COMPLETED, UH, AND SO I'M GOING TO LET THE INVESTIGATION CERTAINLY SPEAK FOR ITSELF.

UH, I'VE, I'VE VOICED VERY STRONGLY TONIGHT, MY, UH, FEELINGS REGARDING, UH, RETALIATION AND DISCRIMINATION AND, UH, ANY TYPE OF, UH, BEHAVIOR LIKE THAT IS NOT TOLERATED AT THE AUSTIN POLICE DEPARTMENT.

SO, UH, TO BE CLEAR, YOU KNOW, IT WAS AT MY REQUEST THAT THE INVESTIGATION INITIATE AND, UH, AND, AND I'M SURE THAT THE RESULTS WILL BE MADE PUBLIC.

THANK YOU FOR ANSWERING THAT.

UM, I APPRECIATE HOW COUNCIL MEMBER ALTAR SO ELOQUENTLY PUT HOW SHE WOULD VOTE THIS EVENING.

AND I JUST WANT TO REITERATE AS WELL THAT WHILE MY VOTE IS, NO, I WILL STILL HAVE A STRONG COMMITMENT TO BE WORKING WITH YOU TO ENSURE THAT THE AUSTIN POLICE DEPARTMENT GETS TO BE BACK TO BEING THE SHINING LIGHT OF AN EXAMPLE OF WHAT A DEPARTMENT, THE BEST DEPARTMENT IN THE UNITED STATES CAN BE.

THANK YOU VERY MUCH, COUNCIL MEMBER.

IT IS, I CAN'T REMEMBER KITCHEN.

UM, YES.

AND, AND CHIEF, I, I THINK IT'S IMPORTANT TO HAVE A MORE COMPLETE, UM, ANSWER WITH REGARD TO THE, UM, THE, UH, THE ROLE OF THE VICTIM SERVICES MANAGER.

UM, UM, I, I WOULD LIKE TO GIVE YOU THE OPPORTUNITY TO SPEAK TO THE LEVEL OF DECISION-MAKING THAT YOU INTEND TO, UM, PROVIDE THAT PERSON.

UH, THANK YOU, COUNCIL MEMBER.

SO, UH, AS I COMMITTED EARLIER, I WILL BRING THAT PERSON, UM, NUMBER ONE, THEY'RE GOING TO HAVE DIRECT ACCESS TO ME AND TO EXECUTIVE STAFF.

UM, SO, UH, YOU KNOW, UH, I THINK THAT, THAT, UH, THE, THE VICTIM SERVICES MANAGER, KATRINA CLARK HAS LARGELY ENJOYED THAT.

UH, AND DURING MY TIME AS BOTH AN ASSISTANT AND AS AN INTERIM CHIEF, UH, BUT SHE CAN CERTAINLY, UH, DIRECTLY REACH OUT TO ME WITH ANY ISSUES THAT SHE IS SEEING WITH HOW HER COUNSELORS ARE NOT ONLY INTERACTING WITH VICTIMS WITH SEX CRIMES, BUT REALLY WITH ANY OF THE INVESTIGATIVE UNITS THAT THEY SUPPORT.

UM, I'M GOING TO FORMALIZE A PROCESS SO THAT SHE HAS, UH, EYES, HER AND HER STAFF HAVE EYES ON ANY POLICY DECISIONS THAT WE'RE MAKING TO MAKE SURE THAT THEY'RE IN LINE WITH WHAT WE'RE TRYING TO ACCOMPLISH IN, IN PROTECTING VICTIMS. I AM.

AND MOST IMPORTANTLY, I'M GOING TO BRING HER INTO THE STAFF MEETINGS.

THAT DOESN'T MEAN THAT SHE HAS TO SIT THERE AND NOT SAY ANYTHING.

THAT MEANS THAT SHE HAS THE SAME VOICE, UH, THAT THE OTHERS THAT PARTICIPATE IN THAT STAFF MEETING, WHETHER IT IS AN ASSISTANT CHIEF, UH, WHETHER IT IS, UH, ONE OF OUR APPOINTED, UH, YOU KNOW, HIGH

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LEVEL, UH, EXECUTIVES, UH, IN THE DEPARTMENT, UH, CITY LEGAL IS IN THOSE.

SO, YOU KNOW, BRINGING THEM IN AND, AND LETTING HER HAVE THAT SAME VOICE, UH, WILL HAVE A VERY STRONG EFFECT ON, UM, ON THE ISSUES THAT I THINK WERE IMPORTANT TO WHAT WE'VE SPOKEN TO TONIGHT.

AND IF I'M UNDERSTANDING CORRECTLY, OR THE ROLE IN REVIEWING POLICIES, THE SAME LEVEL, UH, AND SAME ROLE, UM, AS OTHERS ON YOUR EXECUTIVE TEAM, UH, WITH REGARD TO HER INFLUENCE ON POLICY, THAT'S CORRECT, UH, THE WAY THAT POLICY WORKS RIGHT NOW, IT GOES THROUGH EACH ONE OF OUR ASSISTANT CHIEFS TO LAY EYES ON FOR THEM TO PROVIDE ANY FEEDBACK.

AND WE'RE SIMPLY ADDING, UH, THAT, THAT DIVISION MANAGER ON THERE TO PROVIDE THAT SAME FEEDBACK.

MAYOR ADLER YOU'RE MUTED, YOU'RE ON MUTE.

OKAY.

MAYOR PRO TEM.

I MOVED CONFIRMATION OF THE CITY MANAGER'S APPOINTMENT OF, UH, UH, JOSEPH TRICHOMONAS, A POLICE CHIEF.

SO IT MAY, OR OTHER HAS MOVED THAT WE MOVE FORWARD WITH THE APPOINTMENT OF CHIEF JUDGE COHN.

IS THERE A SECOND SECONDED BY COUNCIL MEMBER? TOVO GIVE ME JUST A MOMENT.

I'M SORRY.

I GOTTA BUY MY STUFF READY, ANY DISCUSSION.

ALL RIGHT.

COUNCIL MEMBER, TOVA JUST BRIEFLY, I REALLY WANT TO, UM, ECHO MY COLLEAGUES, THANKS FOR REALLY, FOR YOUR CANDID AND SINCERE ENGAGEMENT WITH THESE QUESTIONS AND, UH, AND ALL OF THE, ALL OF THE CONVERSATIONS THAT WE'VE HAD.

AND I'M, I'M VERY HAPPY TO SUPPORT YOU AS OUR NEXT POLICE CHIEF, AND LOOK FORWARD TO CONTINUING, CONTINUING TO SUPPORT YOU AS YOU DO THE IMPORTANT WORK THAT YOU'VE COMMITTED TO AND HAVE BEEN DOING.

OKAY.

AND ACTUALLY HAVE A FEW REMARKS OF MY OWN.

UM, SO PUBLIC SAFETY IS PARAMOUNT IMPORTANCE TO ALL OF US ON THE DICE.

OUR POLICE DEPARTMENT IS JUST ONE PART OF THE LARGER PUBLIC SAFETY PICTURE, BUT IT'S OBVIOUSLY A VERY BIG PART, AND IT HASN'T ALWAYS BEEN A FULLY SUCCESSFUL PART.

I THINK YOU'VE ACKNOWLEDGED THAT THIS EVENING, I DON'T HAVE TO GO OVER ALL THE VIVID REASONS THAT WE EMBARKED ON OUR EFFORT LAST YEAR TO RE-IMAGINE PUBLIC SAFETY AND THE ROLES AND STRUCTURES OF OUR POLICE DEPARTMENT.

THE STATE IS CLOSED OFF A LOT OF PATHS THAT WE COULD HAVE TAKEN ON THAT JOURNEY, BUT I THINK WE OWE IT TO OUR COMMUNITY TO KEEP MOVING FORWARD.

AND WE NEED A CHIEF WHO WILL BE A COLLABORATIVE PARTNER IN THAT JOURNEY DURING HIS TENURE, CHIEF CHUCK COHN, UM, DURING YOUR TENURE HAS DEMONSTRATED HIS WILLINGNESS TO BE THAT COLLABORATIVE PARTNER.

I APPRECIATE THE NEW BODY CAM REVIEW POLICY THAT YOU'VE INSTITUTED.

I APPRECIATE YOUR FORTHRIGHTNESS WHEN IT COMES TO YOUR OPINION ABOUT POLICE STAFFING.

UM, I APPRECIATE THAT YOU STOOD THERE AND HAD THE HARDEST JOB INTERVIEW I'VE EVER WATCHED IN MY LIFE AND YOU DIDN'T FLAP ONCE.

AND I REALLY APPRECIATE THAT.

I CAN'T EMPHASIZE ENOUGH HOW IMPORTANT I BELIEVE THAT IS.

UM, I ALSO APPRECIATE YOUR ABILITY TO TAKE CRITICISM IT'S, IT'S IMPORTANT AND YOU'RE GOING TO GET A LOT OF IT.

UM, AND SO I REALLY APPRECIATE THAT YOU CAN TAKE IT, AND MY HOPE IS THAT YOU DON'T JUST TAKE IT, BUT THAT YOU DO SOMETHING WITH IT.

UM, SO I'M LOOKING FORWARD TO WORKING TOGETHER.

I BELIEVE THAT YOU CAN SUCCESSFULLY DO THE JOB.

I THINK THAT WE, AS A COUNCIL, WE GET TO VOTE YES.

OR VOTE NO DURING THIS PROCESS, BUT WE DON'T HAVE DIRECT CONTROL OVER WHO OUR POLICE CHIEF IS.

UM, WE DO, HOWEVER, HAVE A BIT MORE SAY WHEN IT COMES TO THE PERSON WHO CHOOSES THE CHIEF, UM, THAT'S THE ACCOUNTABILITY BACKSTOP, UM, AND IT'S ONE OF OUR CONSTITUENTS.

UM, IT SHOULD RIGHTFULLY HOLD US TO, SO, UM, I'M HAPPY TO, TO MOVE FORWARD WITH YOUR PROMOTION.

I LOOK FORWARD TO WORKING WITH YOU IN THE FUTURE.

SO I SUPPOSE IT'S TIME TO TAKE THAT VOTE OR COUNCIL MEMBER POOL.

I JUST WANTED TO ADD A FEW THINGS TO, I SUPPORT THE CITY MANAGER'S CHOICE OF JOE CHACAN FOR CHIEF OF PLACE FOR THE AUSTIN POLICE DEPARTMENT.

CHIEF TACONY IS WELL-POSITIONED AS A LONG TIME LEADER AT APD, AND I'M CONFIDENT HE IS THE BEST CHOICE TO LEAD OUR POLICE FORCE TO BE A CHANGE AGENT HERE, AND TO KEEP AUSTIN A SAFE CITY.

I LOOK TO OUR SWORN OFFICERS AND IN PARTICULAR, THE AUSTIN POLICE ASSOCIATION AND ITS LEADERSHIP TO PROVIDE ADDITIONAL LEADERSHIP AND SUPPORT FOR THIS CHOICE IN A WAY THAT WILL UNIFY OUR COMMUNITY AND MOVE US ALL FORWARD.
