

1 **ORDINANCE NO. _____**

2 **AN ORDINANCE AMENDING CITY CODE CHAPTER 4-20 (*SPECIAL***
3 ***EVENTS*) TO MODIFY THE DEFINITION OF A SPECIAL EVENT AND THE**
4 **DESCRIPTION OF A TIER 2 SPECIAL EVENT; AND DECLARING AN**
5 **EMERGENCY.**

6 **BE IT ORDAINED BY THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF AUSTIN:**

7 **PART 1.** City Code Section 4-20-1 (*Definitions*) is amended to read as follows:

8 (14) SPECIAL EVENT means an event that

- 9 (a) Has 50[400] or more attendees at any time [~~per day~~] at a
10 city facility, other than the Austin Convention Center,
11 Long Center, City Hall, or Palmer Events Center;
- 12 (b) Impacts a city street, sidewalk, alley, walkway, or other
13 city public right-of-way other than as permitted under
14 Chapter 14-6 (*Temporary Street Closures*); or
- 15 (c) Is temporary, involves 50[400] or more attendees at any
16 time [~~per day~~]; and
- 17 (i) is inconsistent with the permanent use to which the
18 property may legally be used, or the occupancy
19 levels permitted on the property; and
- 20 (ii) includes one of the following: set up of temporary
21 structures, including, but not limited to, tents,
22 stages, or fences; use of sound equipment in an
23 area described in Section 4-20-43(A); or provision
24 of food or beverages, including alcohol.

25 **PART 2.** Subsection (B) of City Code Section 4-20-21 (*Categories of Special*
26 *Events*) is amended to read as follows:

27 (B) A Tier 2 event is a special event that:

- 28 (1) is an assembly at a city facility that estimates attendance at less
29 than 2,500 attendees at one time [~~per day~~]; or
- 30 (2) is an assembly [~~lasting four days or less,~~] that is held primarily
31 on private property, and that estimates attendance at less than
32 2,500 attendees at one time [~~per day~~]; or

(3) is stationary and impacts up to two blocks of a street, sidewalk,
or city right-of-way.

PART 3. The City's requirements for special events protect public health and safety. Many special events occur during Spring Festival Season, which happens in March. As a result, City staff must review numerous applications and permit requests. To protect public health and safety, City staff need sufficient time to review and approve those applications and permit requests. Because of this emergency, this ordinance takes effect the day following publication for the preservation of the public peace, health, and safety.
