






#### Austin MSA COVID-19 Patients Under 18 Years of Age








#### Rates of COVID-19-Associated Hospitalizations by Vaccination and Additional or Booster Dose Status

In January, compared to fully vaccinated persons with additional or booster doses in each age group shown below, the monthly rates of COVID-19-associated hospitalizations were:





Figure 4. TxS2 ILI Percentage Syndromic Surveillance Data, Travis County: 2018-2022<sup>14,15</sup>









COVID-19 confirmed case deaths by sex and year, Travis Coun 2020-current, n=1,350 (updated 2/25/2022)








## Race/Ethnicity Demographics of Pediatric Vaccine Distribution

Pediatric Doses Administered by APH by Race/Ethnicity




Race and Ethnicity of Travis County Residents Ages 5-11






### Pediatric Vaccination by county




#### Pediatric Vaccine Rates by Race and Ethnicity in Texas




### Race/Ethnicity Demographics of Travis County Vaccine Distribution

Travis County 5+ Census Population Estimate





Primary Series Completion in Travis County by Race and Ethnicity






#### Travis County by Vaccination Status for Week of February 27, 2022


