Authorize negotiation and execution of a cooperative contract with Atlantic Diving Supply, Inc. d/b/a ADS, Inc. for tactical carrier vests in the amount of \$71,846.

#### Additional Backup Information:

The contract is for the purchase of 144 tactical carrier vests for the Austin Police Department's Counter Assault Strike Team (CAST) to replace existing vests. These vests have a multi-platform modular design, which allows officers to change and adapt their vest with minimal effort and maximum efficiency. The officer will be able to configure their vest depending on their environment, threat, and operational requirement.

The United States General Services Administration cooperative program establishes competitively bid contracts that can be utilized by the State and other government agencies through a cooperative agreement. Cooperative agreements save taxpayer dollars by leveraging the State's volume-buying power to drive down costs on hundreds of contracts through a streamlined cooperative purchasing program.

If the City is unable to secure a contract, it may result in CAST not having the appropriate equipment for operational efficiency and officer safety.
