Posting Language

Authorize negotiation and execution of a cooperative contract with Kudelski Security Inc. for A10 Networks Load Balancer maintenance, training, and support services, for a term of three years in an amount not to exceed \$496,000.

Additional Backup Information:

The contract is for A10 Networks products and services, including maintenance, upgrades, training, and support, which are used by Austin Energy to balance server loads. A10 Networks hardware is utilized 24/7 in all Austin Energy data centers, providing load balancing for domain name services, web services, and data power in support of virtually all Austin Energy hosted applications. Load balancing is necessary to manage the traffic of an organization's business applications, increasing their reliability and avoiding costly downtime.
