2	WHEREAS, license plate readers gather objective and unbiased facts about
3	vehicles; and,
4	WHEREAS, license plate reader technology focuses solely on extracting
5	empirical data, primarily the license plate numbers which Texas state law requires
6	to be affixed to every vehicle; and
7	WHEREAS, license plate readers only record the vehicle make, model, and
8	license plate number of a vehicle; and
9	WHEREAS, license plate readers are not a "live camera" and cannot be
10	used for surveillance, traffic enforcement, or any other purpose; and
11	WHEREAS, these cameras do not capture images of vehicle drivers; and
12	WHEREAS, maintaining the privacy of the data collected through license
13	plate readers is paramount; and
14	WHEREAS, the systems historically used by the Austin Police Department
15	are categorically objective and cannot collect information in ways that discriminate
16	against any resident in the City; and
17	WHEREAS, the use of license plate readers assists police departments all
18	across the country by increasing their investigative efficacy while reducing
19	unnecessary delays in pursuing leads; and
20	WHEREAS, camera data helps solve crimes when crimes occur; and
21	WHEREAS, license plate readers previously helped the Austin Police
22	Department locate stolen or wanted vehicles, vehicles connected to AMBER

- Alerts, Silver Alerts, missing person reports, abductions reports, and vehicles connected to other crimes; and
- WHEREAS, the use of license plate readers bolsters the capability of local law enforcement to act and apprehend criminals swiftly, leading to the deterrence of crimes; and
- WHEREAS, re-introducing license plate readers to the Austin Police
 Department will help reduce crime and prevent residents and visitors to the City
 from being victimized, particularly from car and property thefts and lead to
 deterrence of crime; and

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- WHEREAS, license plate readers can notify Austin Police Department officers within seconds that a license plate has passed within the device's range, allowing APD officers to take immediate action in furtherance of public safety;
- WHEREAS, the Texas Penal Code potentially provides criminal penalties if an officer or other public servant intentionally or knowingly misuses information from the license plate reader with the intent of obtaining a benefit, harming, defrauding, oppressing another person, or disclosing the information for a nongovernmental purpose that has not otherwise been made public; and
- WHEREAS, the Austin Police Department's General Orders includes rules on the Security and Release of Records and Information, General Conduct and Responsibilities, Racial or Biased Profiling, Responsibility to the Community, and other policies that ensure an officer keeps private or confidential information secure, knows and complies with laws, does not engage in racial or biased profiling, performs their services in an impartial and equitable manner, and

- provides equal and fair protection of all rights under local, state, and federal law 46
- 47 for all members of the community; and
- **WHEREAS**, a violation of such a rule provides cause to discipline a police 48
- officer under Section 143.052 of the Texas Local Government Code and Rule 10 49
- of the Rules of Procedure for the Firefighters', Police Officers' and Emergency 50
- 51 Medical Service Personnel's Civil Service Commission; **NOW**, **THEREFORE**,

BE IT RESOLVED BY THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF AUSTIN:

- The City Council directs the City Manager to identify funding in the amount of \$114,775.00 that can be used for the license reader program in this Fiscal Year's budget and return with any actions that are necessary for Council to authorize this
- expenditure. 56

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BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED:

Council directs the City Manager to include authorization for continuation of the license reader program for Council consideration during the upcoming budget adoption for Fiscal Year 2022-2023.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED:

- The City Council directs the City Manager to re-evaluate the Austin Police 62 Department's former policy on license plate readers and take necessary and 63 appropriate steps to ensure policy and/or procedure includes, but is not limited to, 64 the following:
- 1. Data used for the license plate reader program will be kept and 66
- destroyed after one year. 67

- 2. Data sharing will only occur for investigating and/or prosecuting criminal activity, unless a circumstance arises where the City is required by state or federal law to share the information at the request of a state or federal agency for another lawful purpose.
- 3. Annual training of all Austin Police Department personnel will be conducted on the policies and restrictions concerning license plate reader camera use and data.
- 4. An annual audit and review on license plate reader data and program will be conducted by the Austin Police Department, and to the extent allowed by the law, information obtained by the audit and review will be shared with the Office of Police Oversight and the Public Safety Committee. Except for law enforcement sensitive information and information considered to be confidential by law, either constitutional, statutory, or by judicial decision, the audit and review will be posted on the City's website for the public to view.
- 5. The City Manager will post the Austin Police Department's usage and privacy policy regarding license plate readers on the City's website.
- 6. No person will be the subject of police action because of actual or perceived race, color, religion, creed, sex, gender, gender identity, sexual orientation, age, national origin, ethnicity, disability, veteran status, marital status, partnership status, political affiliation or beliefs, and, to the extent permitted by law, alienage or citizenship status, when license plate reader data is used.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED:

The City Manager will implement necessary and appropriate changes to former policy and/or procedure and restore the Austin Police Department's license plate reader program by October 1, 2022 if funding is appropriated by Council for this purpose.
