The contract is for ADVA hardware and software maintenance for FSP 3000 fiber optic equipment. The City utilizes the ADVA fiber optic equipment as the information technology (IT) transport infrastructure for the enterprise data network. This network is used by City staff to access all IT services to include standard desktop office services such as email, collaboration, and access to applications used to conduct City business. The contract is being established to ensure advanced manufacturer support is in place for this critical IT infrastructure.
