### **Posting Language**

Approve an ordinance amending the Fiscal Year 2021-2022 Austin Public Health Department Operating Budget Special Revenue Fund (Ordinance No. 20210811-001) to accept and appropriate \$20,000 in additional grant funds from the Texas Commission on Environmental Quality for whole air monitoring efforts.

### **Fiscal Note**

Funding in the amount of \$20,000 is available from the Texas Commission on Environmental Quality. A City funding match is not required. A fiscal note is attached.

### **Prior Council Action:**

April 8, 2021 - Council approved Ordinance No. 20210408-016, which approved acceptance of grant funds for \$169,941 in grant funds from the Texas Commission on Environmental Quality for the support of whole air monitoring efforts, on a 10-0 vote with Member Renteria off the dais.

### **Additional Backup Information:**

The Department of Homeland Security through the Texas Commission on Environmental Quality is providing grant funding to select local health departments for whole air monitoring efforts. Details of this award are "For Official Use Only" and are homeland security sensitive. This funding provides core critical capacity for field operations and public health emergency response activities. Funds will support 3.0 existing full-time equivalent grant employees for field operations and to develop sampling plans and procedures. Additionally, funding will be used to provide administrative oversight and support for existing staff. This grant award will bring the total amount of Whole Air Monitoring Grant funds to \$448,692.92.

The General Fund will not be required to contribute additional funds beyond those currently budgeted to this grant. When the grant funds expire, the Austin Public Health Department's need for continuing funding will be evaluated and may be denied.
