Posting Language

Authorize negotiation and execution of Amendment No. 13 to the interlocal agreement with Austin Travis County Mental Health & Mental Retardation Center, d/b/a Integral Care, to provide community forums for creative and collaborative problem solving, inclusive community participation, and community consensus-building, to add one 12-month extension option in an amount not to exceed \$100,797, for a total agreement amount not to exceed \$889,936.

Fiscal Note

Funding in the amount of \$100,797 is available in the Fiscal Year 2022-2023 Austin Public Health Department Operating Budget.

Prior Council Action:

September 17, 2020 - Council authorized the negotiation and execution of Amendment No. 11 to the agreement with Austin Travis County Mental Health & Mental Retardation Center, doing business as Integral Care, on an 11-0 vote.

February 15, 2018 - Council authorized the execution of Amendment No. 7 adding \$2,458 for the Fiscal Year 2017-2018 program period ending September 30, 2018, for a total agreement amount not to exceed \$587,545, on a 10-0 vote with Council Member Casar off the dais.

April 13, 2017 - Council authorized the execution of Amendment No. 5 adding \$2,211 for the Fiscal Year 2016-2017 program period ending September 30, 2017 and each of the remaining three 12-month extension options, for a total agreement amount not to exceed \$580,171, on a vote of 9-0 with Council Member Pool absent and Council Member Troxclair abstaining.

December 11, 2014 - Council authorized the execution of Amendment No. 1 adding \$22,500 for a half-time research assistant, for a total agreement amount not to exceed \$544,122, on a 7-0 vote.

August 7, 2014 - Council authorized a 12-month interlocal agreement with Integral Care beginning on October 1, 2014 with five 12-month extension options, for a total agreement amount not to exceed \$409,122, on a 7-0 vote.

This action would authorize Austin Travis County Mental Health & Mental Retardation Center, doing business

as Integral Care, to provide a community forum for creative and collaborative problem-solving, inclusive community participation, and community consensus-building. Community Advancement Network staff provide management, coordination, communication, and follow-through for all phases of this community-wide collaborative process. Amendment No. 11 exercised the sixth 12-month extension option beginning October 1, 2020.

Amendment No. 10 modified program exhibits.

Amendment No. 9 exercised the fifth 12-month extension option beginning October 1, 2019.

Amendment No. 8 exercised the fourth 12-month extension option beginning October 1, 2018.

Amendment No. 7 added \$2,458 to the agreement as a part of the 2.5% cost of living increase authorized by Council in Fiscal Year 2017-2018.

Amendment No. 6 exercised the third 12-month extension option beginning October 1, 2017.

Amendment No. 5 added \$2,211 to the agreement as a part of the 2.3% cost of living increase for each of the three remaining 12-month extension options, for a total agreement amount not to exceed \$580,171.

Amendment No. 4 exercised the second 12-month extension option beginning October 1, 2016.

Amendment No. 3 added \$5,441 to the agreement for the first 12-month extension option and each of the four remaining 12-month extension options as a result of a 6% cost of living increase to all Austin Public Health Department's social service agreements.

Amendment No. 2 exercised the first 12-month extension option beginning October 1, 2015.

Amendment No. 1 added \$22,500 to the base agreement and each of the five remaining 12-month extension options, for a total agreement amount not to exceed \$544,122.

On August 7, 2014, Council approved a 12-month interlocal agreement with Integral Care for Community Advancement Network administration services beginning October 1, 2014, with five 12-month extension options.

Integral Care provides administration support for the Community Advancement Network. The Community Advancement Network is a partnership of governmental, non-profit, private, and faith-based organizations that leverages mutual resources to collectively improve social, health, educational and economic opportunities in Central Texas. As a neutral convener, connector, and informer in the community, the Community Advancement Network's partnership works to promote a community of equity and opportunity for all.
