# Additional Backup Information:

On March 6, 2020, a Declaration of Local Disaster was issued by Mayor Adler to have the City take measures to avoid the spread of COVID-19 across the City and County. On March 13, 2020, Governor Abbott issued a Declaration of State of Disaster to take additional steps to prepare for, respond to, and mitigate the spread of COVID-19. The COVID-19 response is ongoing.

Between March 18, 2020 and September 30, 2020, the City provided medically necessary testing for COVID-19 to the 1,300,000 citizens of the Austin Metropolitan Statistical Area at six static community-based testing sites (CBTS) and via the mobile testing program to reach vulnerable and/or high-risk populations without the ability to travel to a CBTS. Acceptance of these federal public assistance grant funds will reimburse the City for operating expenditures related to the provision of COVID-19 testing in the community.
