#### Recommendation for Action

#### Posting Language

Authorize an amendment to a contract with Enterprise Professional Services, Inc. d/b/a EPSI for continued cleanup services for lands, creeks, electric utility distribution and transmission sites, and related infrastructures, to increase the amount by \$1,800,000 and to reduce the term by two years, for a revised total contract amount not to exceed \$3,406,000.

(Note: This contract was reviewed for subcontracting opportunities in accordance with City Code Chapter 2-9C Minority Owned and Women Owned Business Enterprise Procurement Program. For the services required for this contract, there were no subcontracting opportunities; therefore, no subcontracting goals were established. However, the recommended contractor identified subcontracting opportunities).

#### Fiscal Note

#### Additional Backup Information:

The contract is used by the City to safely mitigate debris from encampments. Additional authority will allow for cleanups, on-going maintenance, and related services of encampments stemming from an increase in the number and size of camps throughout the city. Safely mitigating debris from encampments is part of the City's six strategic outcomes and indicators adopted by Council in Spring 2018.
