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Living Wage Procurement Program: Overview



- **History** City's Living Wage Program started 2002, initially limited to City employees, expanded to apply to certain City contracts, and modified multiple times since
- Policy Objective The minimum hourly rate Contractors pay their employees working under certain City contracts should be consistent with the minimum hourly rate the City pays its employees
- Living Wage Procurement Program
 - Applies to certain Contract types (Competitive, Services, on City property, etc.)
 - Living Wage for Contractor employees tracks with Living Wage for City employees
 - Living Wage rate at beginning of Contract is locked throughout Contract's term

Living Wage Procurement Program: Overview



- Changes The Living Wage (LW) rate has changed multiple times since the program's inception
 - 2005, \$10/hr. 2016, \$13.03/hr.
 - 2006, \$10.90/hr. 2017, \$13.50/hr.
 - 2008, \$11.00/hr. 2018, \$14.00/hr.
 - 2015, \$11.39/hr. 2019, \$15.00/hr.
- 2022 With the Fiscal Year 2022-2023 (FY23) Budget, City Council raised the Living Wage to \$20/hr.
- This Update
 - New LW Contracts: After October 1, 2022
 - Old LW Contracts: \$20/hr. Transition Plan
 - Adjustable Living Wage: Pilot

New LW Contracts: After Oct. 1, 2022



- Current Solicitations with LW requirements
 - Closed \$20/hr. LW added to these before they closed where possible; Most will proceed with \$15/hr., and be addressed in the \$20/hr. Transition Plan
 - Open All are being amended to \$20/hr. LW
- Project and One-time Transaction Living Wage Contracts
 - LW rate is locked for term of contract
- Multi-term Living Wage Contracts
 - LW Rate is locked for term of Contract (to allow for Pilot)
 - Contract terms not more than 36 months (LW stays more current)
 - Synch Contract terms with City's FY (Contract transitions as LW changes)

Old Contracts: \$20/hr. Transition Plan

Adjustable Living Wage: Pilot



- Adjustable Living Wage Contracts
 - Requested by Council, Resolution No. 20190822-067
 - Dissimilar from historical procedures, City's and elsewhere
 - Adjusting Living Wage rates will increase Price change requests; need for cost data will increase; changing Contract pricing (may become dissimilar from market rates)
- Pilot In Development, Implementing in FY23
 - Developing new Solicitation and Contract Admin. approach(es)
 - Limited to multi-term, indefinite quantity contracts
 - Targeting hourly rates
 - One-year terms, synched to FY
 - Multiple compliance paths
