Posting Language

Authorize negotiation and execution of a cooperative contract with Precision Task Group Inc. for cloud platform system software subscription, training, and associated services, for a term of five years in an amount not to exceed \$19,000,000.

The contract will provide Human Capital Management (HCM) cloud platform system software subscription, training, and associated services for the City. The City currently has a disparate system framework that poses critical challenges. A single HCM system will provide an end-to-end cohesive system to support core human resources functions and significantly improve human resources operations: Personnel Administration, Benefits and Compensation, Recruitment, Performance Management and Development, Case Management, Payroll Management, Time and Attendance, Labor Scheduling and Leave Management.

Cooperative agreements save taxpayer dollars by leveraging the State's volume-buying power to drive down costs on hundreds of contracts through a streamlined cooperative purchasing program.
