ANALYSIS / ADDITIONAL INFORMATION:

Approval of this ordinance will authorize the addition of 17.0 full-time grant-funded positions.

This grant from the Centers for Disease Control and Prevention will provide funding to improve critical public health infrastructure needs. COVID-19 has amplified the historical resource gap and underfunding of public health necessary to meet the public's evolving at complex needs. The Austin Public Health Department partnered with Williamson County and Cities Health District to submit the application for this grant, which will enable the Austin Public Health Department to address some critical shortages, including those related to epidemiology, public health preparedness, workforce development, community health worker certification and training, and data modernization.

The General Fund will not be required to contribute additional funds beyond those currently budgeted to this grant or to the funding of these positions. When the grant funds expire, the Austin Public Health Department's need for these position will be evaluated and the positions may be eliminated.
