Administrative Code to be approved by the receiving entity's governing body (1) authorizing execution of the contract for Homeless Housing and Services Program funds; (2) identifying the title of the person authorized to represent the entity and possesses the signature authority to execute the contract; and (3) dated not more than twelve months from the date of contract execution.

On July 13, 2022, the City received notification of the 2023 allocation of funding for the following grants: 1) Homeless Housing and Services Program in the amount of \$540,935 and 2) Homeless Housing and Services Program Youth Set-Aside in the amount of \$165,044, for a total allocation of \$705,979 for the term of September 1, 2022 to August 31, 2023.

The Homeless Housing and Services Program was authorized by the Texas Legislature during the 81st Legislative Session. It was the first program authorizing state funding for homeless services and homelessness prevention.

The Austin Public Health Department will allocate Homeless Housing and Services Program funding to continue emergency shelter services, case management, and housing assistance for single adults and families at the Salvation Army Social Service Center Emergency Shelter downtown. Performance measures will be negotiated during contract development with the agency.

The General Fund will not be required to contribute to this grant. All department grant application requests are reviewed by the Budget Office prior to submission to ensure that the grant minimizes the financial impact to the City.
