Project Overview


This project is a result of the feedback and recommendations received during the evaluation of the COVID-19 and Winter Storm Uri responses.

 Goal: develop clear processes for responding to various types of disasters with food and water resources that will be needed by our community, including roles and responsibilities for plan implementation.

This project is just one part of increasing Austin's disaster preparedness and resilience.

 Additional near-term next step: HSEM to hire full-time staff to fulfill the roles of Mass Care Director and Food Access Manager.

City of Austin **Emergency Operations Plan**




Basic Plan Updated March 2020








Homeland Security and Emergency Management Proposed Organizational Chart



Review: Draft Disaster Food/Water Processes

Concept of Operations: Overview of Disaster Food/Water Response (Draft)



Immediate

- Develop and implement feeding plan in alignment with the Incident Action Plan
- Mobilize City-led, life-sustaining feeding activities
- Coordinate disaster response organization-led and community-led feeding activities
- Public information
- Event monitoring, prevention, mitigation and resilience; planning; training and exercising

Immediate

- Update Situation/Damage Assessment
- Implement feeding plan in alignment with the Incident Action Plan
- Mobilize City-led, life-sustaining feeding activities
- Coordinate disaster response organization-led and community-led feeding activities

Sustained

- Continue City-led feeding activities, including implementation of feeding contracts, County, State, or Federal support
- Coordinate disaster response organization-led and community-led feeding activities
- **Public Information**


Transition to and Short-term

- Demobilization of sustained feeding activities
- Disaster feeding
- **Public Information**

Intermediate and Long-Term

- Implementation of recovery projects
- Continued food insecurity mitigation and resilience program

Response Activation Process Review (Draft)



Situation Assessment Team includes: HSEM, Office of Sustainability, Austin Public Health, Equity Office, Resilience Office, and/or others as needed per the situation.

Actions for External Partners

- Monitor community emergency food/water needs through their network
- Communicate concerns to "blue skies" City contact(s)
- Contribute feedback/data to City Situation Assessment Team, as requested
- Implement internal continuity and readiness processes
- Remain alert and responsive to City communications regarding the activation decision
