Recommend approval to execute a contract for vegetation shredding services with Unity Contractor Services, Inc., for a term of five years for a total contract amount not to exceed \$875,000.

Fiscal Note

Funding in the amount of \$116,667 is available in the Fiscal Year 2022-2023 Operating Budget of Austin Water. Funding for the remaining contract term is contingent upon available funding in future budgets.

Purchasing Language:

The Financial Services Department issued an Invitation for Bids (IFB) 2200 SLW1074 for these services. The solicitation was issued on September 12, 2022 and closed on September 29, 2022. Of the six offers received, the recommended contractor submitted the lowest responsive offer. Additional Backup Information:

The contract will provide vegetation shredding for Austin Water's Quality Protection Lands (WQPL). The shredding is needed to help meet the goals of restoring these selected lands to a grass land and savannah ecosystem. This type of vegetation shredding helps yield optimal water quantity and quality to recharge the Edwards Aquifer, through Barton Springs, which is the primary goal of the WQPL program. The land management plan directing these practices and goals was approved by Council on December 13, 2012, Resolution No. 20121213-003.

The current contract expires on March 1, 2023. The requested authorization amount was determined using spend from previous years along with estimated projections.
