## Additional Backup Information:

This agenda item seeks City Council approval of the Fiscal Year 2022-23 Thrive grant agreements and allocations in the amount of \$3,935,000 from the Cultural Arts Fund.

The Cultural Arts Division of the Economic Development Department (EDD) manages programs to provide funding for arts and culture practitioners through a competitive application and review process. Funds for Thrive grant agreements are derived from a portion of the revenues from the City's Hotel Occupancy Tax (HOT). Texas Code, Chapter 351.101(a)(4) authorizes HOT to be used for the encouragement, promotion, improvement, and application of the arts. HOT funded programs, facilities, and/or events must be advertised and open to the general public and must be expended in a matter directly enhancing and promoting tourism.

Thrive will provide focused investment to sustain and grow arts organizations that are deeply rooted in and reflective of Austin's diverse cultures. This program seeks to directly correct the historical under-funding, displacement, and cultural erasure of vulnerable communities within Austin by offering substantial funding for these organizations to self-determine and invest in their own sustainability and growth. Awards range from \$85,000 to \$150,000.

Following a competitive process, staff evaluated Thrive Grant applications to ensure proposals meet state mandates, grant eligibility, and program requirements. Applications from arts and culture non-profits that met the criteria were evaluated and scored by an external review panel. The two-stage review panel scored eligible applicants based on mission and key constituencies, history of service, cultural leadership, cultural activities relevance and responsiveness, intersectionality and inclusion, community relationships, opportunity creation and community benefit, accessibility, and cultural institution status.
