 - Heard Development Service staff outlined the Historical overview of the registration program, data of expired permits and future stakeholder plans to address contractor registration.
 - Heard the recent stakeholder engagements results which included all building and demolition contractors to register prior to permits being issued, violators are reported to the licensing agency and may not allow other individuals to work under the permit that was issued to them. Also contractors may not have more than 5 expired licenses in a current year.
 - Heard discussion on the Flat Top Fence resolution approved by Council where internal and external stakeholders are beginning to conduct

- engagements for input on code amendments to City technical codes to address more safe fence design
- Heard discussion on Exterior Deck replacement in the Wildland Urban Interface area and AFD resolution.

This board does comply with the mission statement and reviews appeals and determinations related to the Building Code, the Fire Code, and other technical codes, which is what helps make Austin one of the most livable cities.
