Additional Backup Information:

The Austin Transportation Department (ATD) has extensively studied the South Congress area to understand the parking and mobility issues facing the district, as well as to develop a plan of action to address those challenges in the near-term. In 2019, ATD along with consultant Nelson Nygaard, conducted a parking study in the South Congress area. The South Congress (SoCo) Parking Strategy also included a series of meetings, workshops, and surveys to gather input from the community and share findings from the study.

The first strategy proposed from the South Congress Parking Strategy is to create and implement a Parking and Transportation Management District (PTMD), which sets aside parking fees to be used within the South Congress area, for the further enhancement of transportation and mobility services in the district.

ATD is recommending the establishment of a Parking and Transportation Management District (PTMD) to be managed by ATD in accordance with the requirements established by City code 12-7 Parking and Transportation Management District.

The South Congress Public Improvement District, the neighborhood Associations of Bouldin Creek and the South River City Citizens in conjunction with the Austin Transportation Department have had meetings to

discuss implementing a host of parking and mobility tools, including paid parking. The hours of operation would be Monday through Sunday from 8:00 a.m. to Midnight. Additionally, the residential permit parking (RPP) zones adjacent to South Congress Avenue would be modified to be consistent with restriction times, and a new hybrid parking zone would be implemented, allowing for efficient use of unused curb space, yet dynamically managed.

The proposed South Congress PTMD boundaries are:

North: Riverside Drive

South: West Oltorf Street

East: Travis Heights Boulevard

West: Union Pacific Railroad, east of Lamar Boulevard

A series of stakeholder outreach meetings and workshops were held during the South Congress Parking Study and throughout this process, including regularly schedule meetings with the PTMD Advisory Team to review application details, district boundaries, parking regulation, develop employee parking solutions.
