The contract will provide a log data observability platform delivered in a hybrid software as a service model. The Cribl Log Observability platform allows users to collect the logs and other metrics from many applications into one place for a better analysis. As Communications and Technology Management continues to strive for excellence in both information technology (IT) hygiene and log management and compliance, additional tools are needed to be able to optimize the large amount of IT logging data that is generated each day. The platform enables the users to archive data using lower cost cloud storage instead of storing the data on more expensive local storage.
