Fiscal Note

Prior Council Action:

August 30, 2007 - Council granted Acadian Ambulance Service, Inc. an initial franchise for a five-year term.

August 2, 2012 - Council granted Acadian Ambulance Service, Inc. a second franchise renewal for a five-year term.

December 7, 2017 - Council approved Ordinance No. 20171207-063 granting Acadian Ambulance Service, Inc. a third franchise renewal for a five-year term.

February 9, 2023 - Council approved a license agreement with Acadian Ambulance Service, Inc. for a limited term and waiving City Code Chapter 14-11 (Use of Right of Way) and Section 10-2-60 of Chapter 10-2 (Medical Transfer Services) to allow time to negotiate and execute the agreement.

Additional Backup Information:

The purpose of this RCA is to request that Council hold a public hearing regarding the renewal of the franchise held by Acadian Ambulance Service, Inc. and approve the franchise agreement on first reading.

Acadian Ambulance Service has held a franchise with the City of Austin since

October, 2007. On June 1, 2022, Austin-Travis County EMS (ATCEMS) received an application from Acadian Ambulance Service of Texas LLC, requesting a renewal of the franchise for another five-year term. All the required application elements have been submitted and the application fee has been paid in full.

In order for a private ambulance company to provide non-emergency transfer services within the limits of the City of Austin, the provider must hold a franchise from the City. Non-emergency transfers typically occur between skilled nursing facilities, hospitals, and private residences and are usually prescheduled by medical personnel. Currently, four companies hold such franchises, Acadian Ambulance Service, Inc. (Acadian), American Medical Response of Texas Inc. (AMR), Allegiance Ambulance and City Ambulance

On February 15, 2023, Council approved a six month license agreement to Acadian Ambulance Service, Inc. to continue service.
