Mission/Purpose

- Formalize partnership with Austin Independent School District
- Teach high school students swimming skills throughout a year-long swim lesson program
- Provide opportunity for students to earn lifeguard certification (StarGuard Elite) through 36-hour lifeguard certification course
- Students possessing a StarGuard Elite Lifeguard Certification will then be eligible to apply for lifeguard positions to guard City pools that are currently experiencing a lifeguard shortage
- Students earn PE credit for their participation

Goals & Objectives

- To enhance the physical abilities of the students to a level where they can successfully complete the lifeguard training course and become eligible for employment with the City of Austin
- To train and recruit a diverse workforce that is reflective of the Austin community
- To promote healthy activities that can be enjoyed at any age
- To promote water safety awareness

History

- Pilot program begins Spring 2015 with John H. Reagan Early College High School and Lyndon Baines Johnson (LBJ) Early College High School
- Spring of 2017 LBJ withdrew from the program and Eastside Memorial Early College High School joined the program
- End of Spring 2018 Eastside Memorial Early College High School withdrew from the program
- Fall 2019 John H. Reagan renamed Northeast Early College High School
- Spring 2020 Akins joins SwimATX, but contact with students is lost due to COVID
- Fall 2020 SwimATX goes virtual
- End of Spring 2021 Northeast Early College High School withdraws from the program
- Fall of 2022 SwimATX returns to in-person

Deliverables: City of Austin, Aquatic Division

- Facility usage no charge
- Provide staff to teach and lifeguard
- Provide scholarships valued at \$425 in the form of the StarGuard Elite Lifeguard Certification course that will be provided to each of the 50 AISD students in the lifeguard certification program.
- Recruit students to participate
- Provide a single point of contact
 - Austin Independent School District

Deliverables: Austin Independent School District

- Provide student participants
 - Total of 50 students per year
 - Allow students to earn PE credit for class
- Establish mutually agreeable class times
- Provide final student roster
- Provide a physical education instructor to monitor and assist students
- Provide transportation to and from swimming facilities
- Provide lunch for students participating in the lifeguard certification course
- Provide completed written permission waivers

Current Status

- Swim ATX remains active at Akins High School
- As the completion of the Spring 2022 semester :
 - 366 students have participated
 - 66 students have worked as a lifeguard
 - 7 are currently employed by the City of Austin
 - Approximately, 20 students from Akins are prepared to take the class in May 23

Requested Committee Action

Recommend to the Parks and Recreation Board the negotiation and execution of an interlocal agreement between the City of Austin and the Austin Independent School District for SwimATX, a year-long swim lesson program that includes the 36-hour lifeguard certification course, which will be provided to the students of select AISD high schools.
