

26 **WHEREAS**, the Austin Police Department has provided a revised ALPR
27 policy with safeguards that are consistent with the Public Safety Commission
28 recommendation, OPO feedback, and prior Council direction as documented in
29 Resolution No. 20220915-056; **NOW, THEREFORE,**

30 **BE IT RESOLVED BY THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF AUSTIN:**

31 The Council amends its prior direction and directs the City Manager to
32 update proposed draft General Order 344 regarding the Automated License Plate
33 Reader program to reflect that data collected by the program will be kept for a
34 maximum of seven days and destroyed thereafter except for the following
35 circumstances, as currently written in the draft General Order, Subsections
36 344.4(e) and (f) (Safeguards):

37 (e) For ALPR data related to ongoing criminal investigations or criminal
38 investigations that contain ALPR as evidence, investigators must
39 download and record the relevant ALPR data into the case file.

40 (f) The Department shall retain all ALPR data related to an endangered,
41 missing person, or criminal investigation for a period consistent with the
42 City of Austin's Records Management Ordinance, Chapter 2-11, and any
43 applicable City Records Control Schedules or the State and Local
44 Government Retention Schedules.

45 **BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED:**

46 The pilot program will extend to the end of Fiscal Year 2023-2024 and cease
47 unless further extended by Council.

50 **BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED:**

51 Prior to the termination of the pilot period, the City Manager shall present to
52 Council a recommendation on the continuation of the program, including any
53 proposed adjustments to data retention or other elements of the associated policy.
