ANALYSIS / ADDITIONAL INFORMATION: On March 6, 2020, a Declaration of Local Disaster was issued by Mayor Adler putting into motion measures to prevent the spread of COVID-19. On March 13, 2020, Governor Abbott issued a Declaration of State of Disaster to take additional steps to prepare for, respond to, and mitigate the spread of COVID-19. COVID-19 created an immediate threat to the health and safety of the general public requiring emergency response and protective measures. City of Austin provided "force account labor" jursidication-wide to help assist and aid the response to the threat of COVID-19. This grant is a FEMA Public Assistance grant award which reimburses City departments for expenses incurred for carrying out COVID-19 public health responses from March 1, 2020 to November 21, 2020. The General Fund will not be required to contribute additional funds beyond those currently budgeted to this grant. When the grant funds expire, the departments' need for continuing funding will be evaluated and may be denied.
