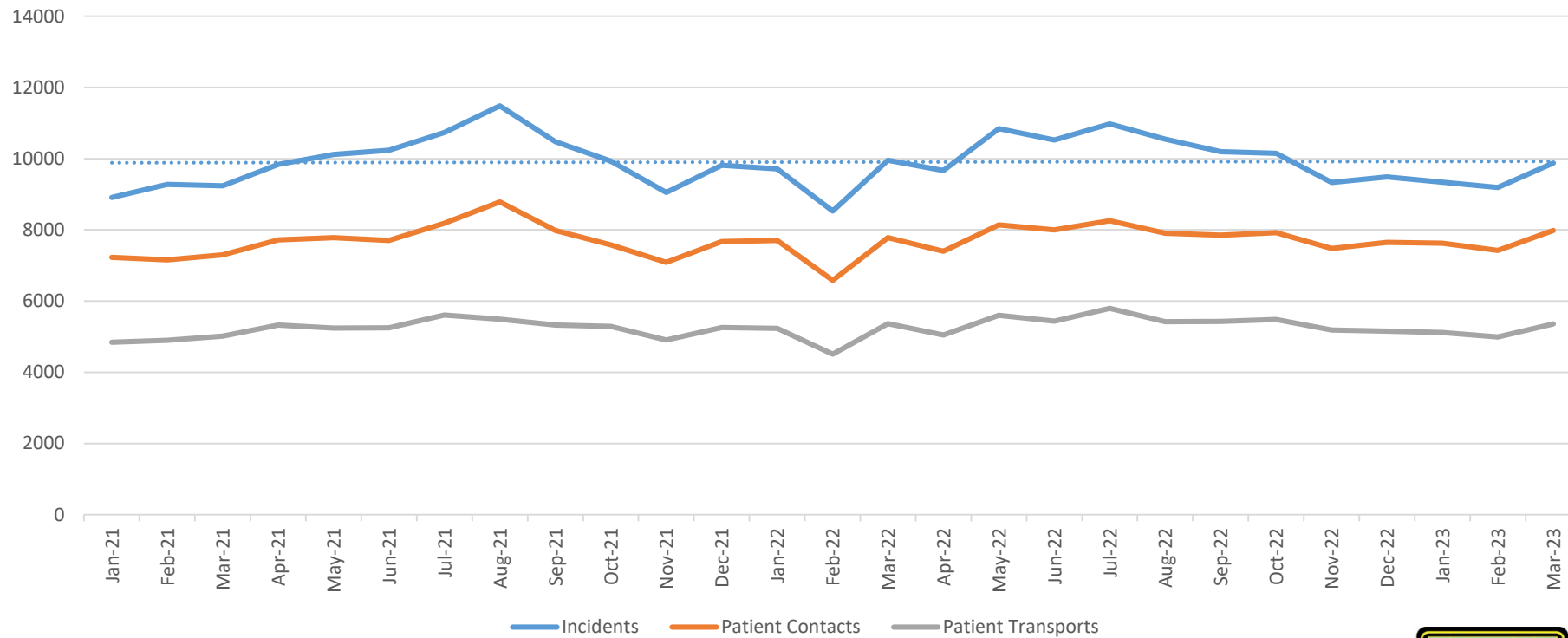

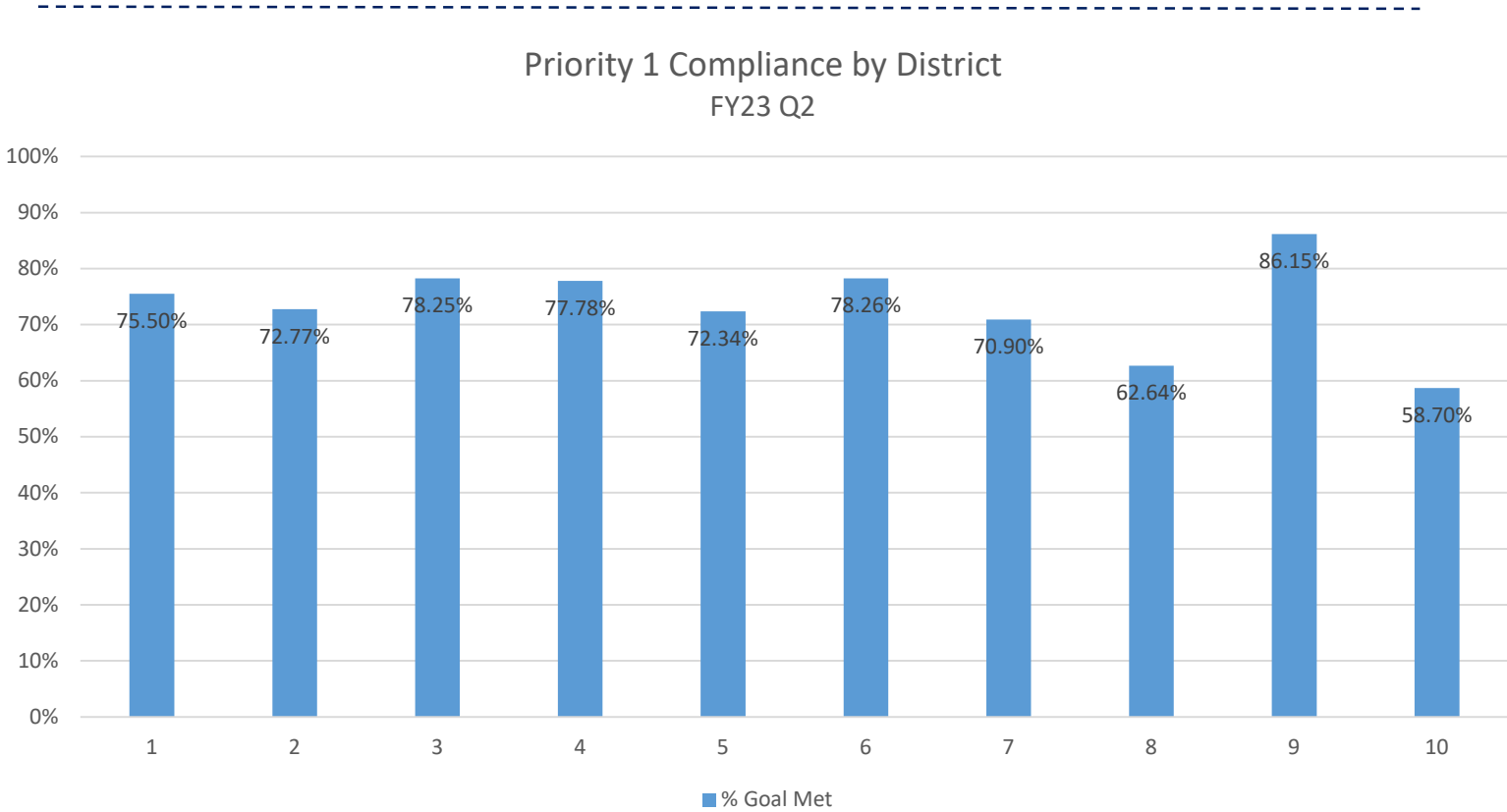


Incidents, Patient Contacts, Transports Jan. 2022– March 2023

January 2021 - March 2023

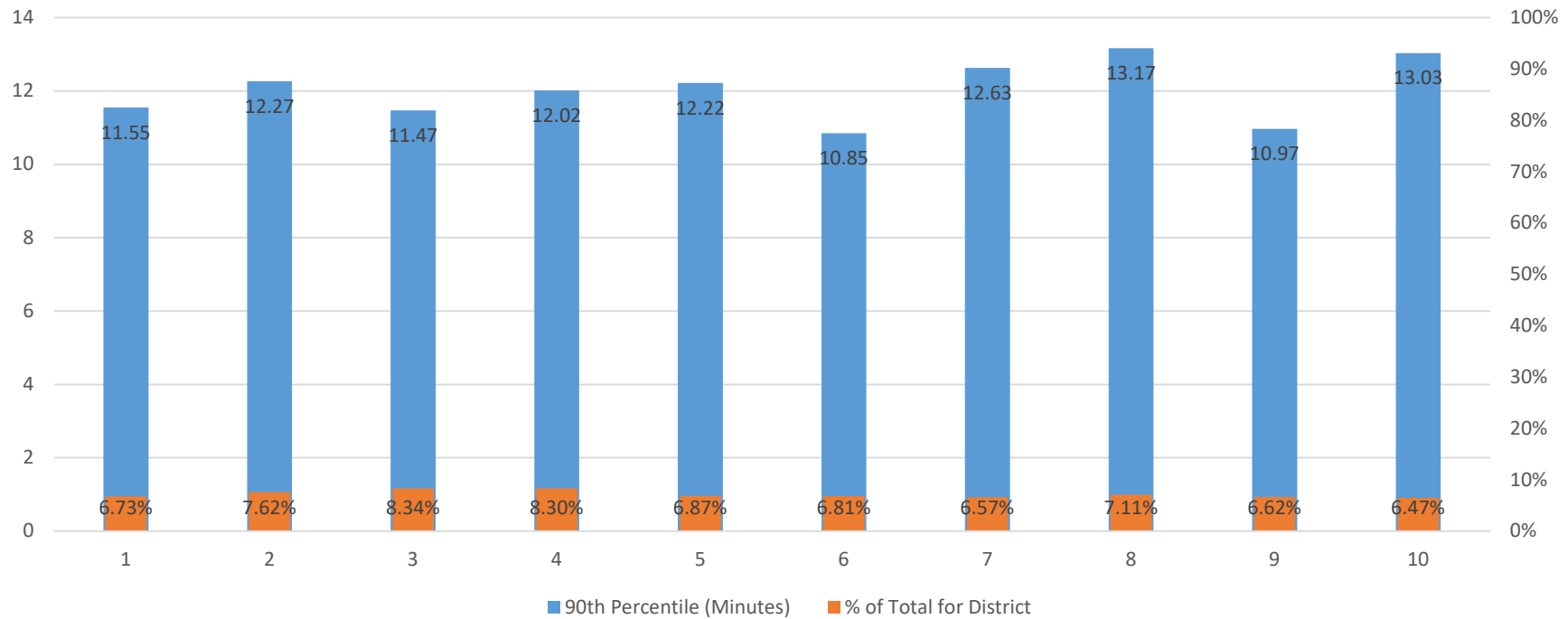


P1 Compliance by District FY23 Q2



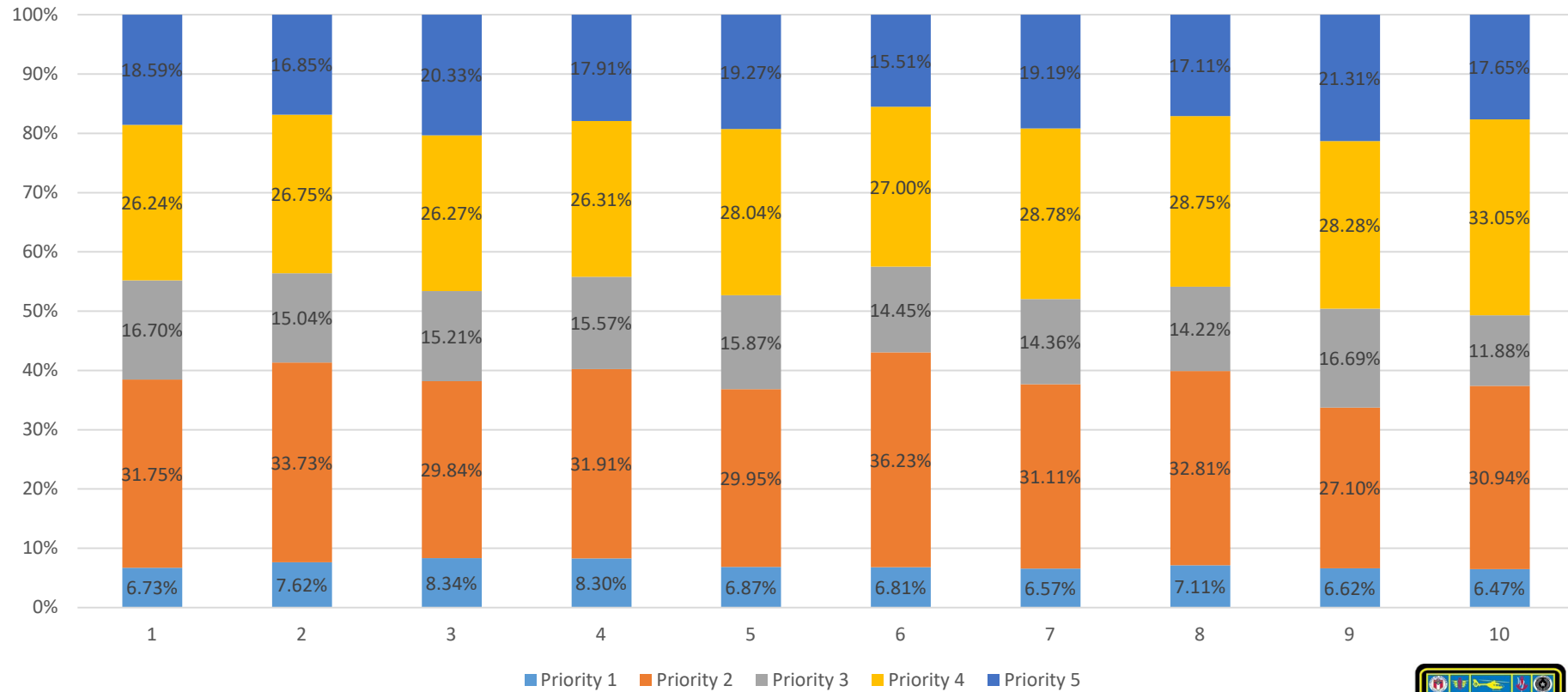
P1 Response Interval by District FY23 Q2

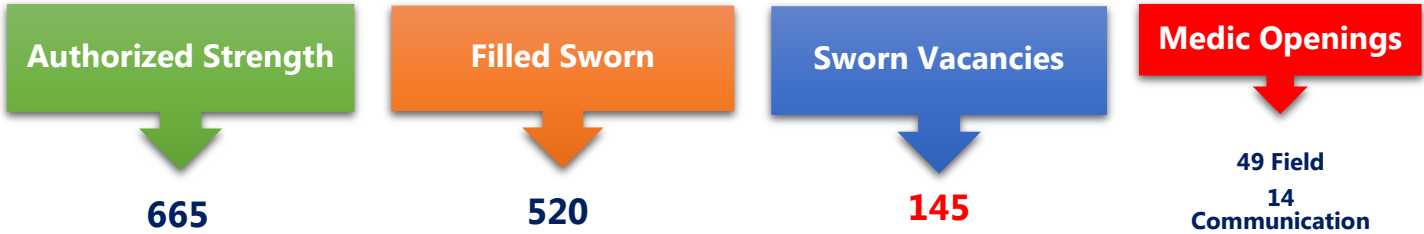


Priority Percentage By District FY23 Q2

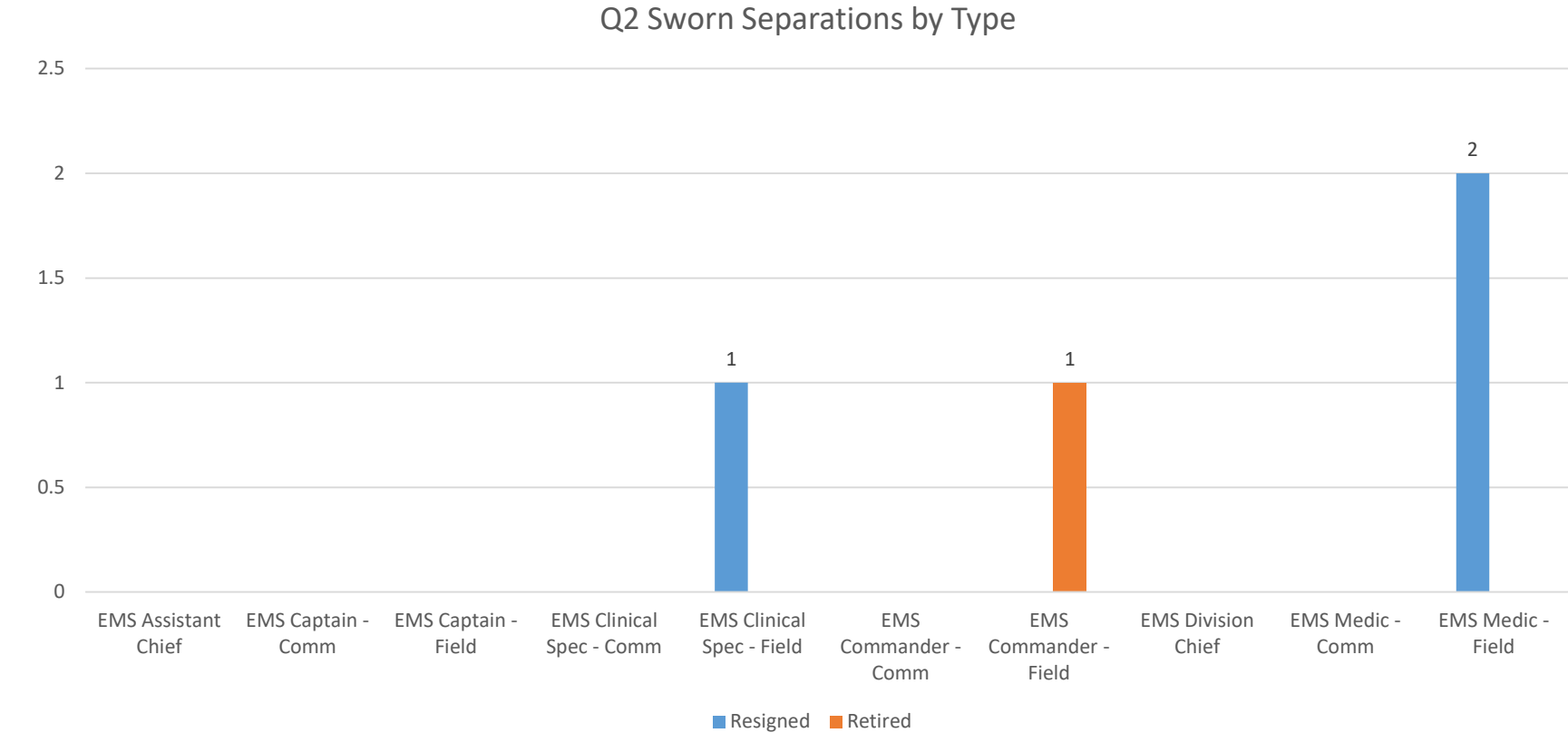

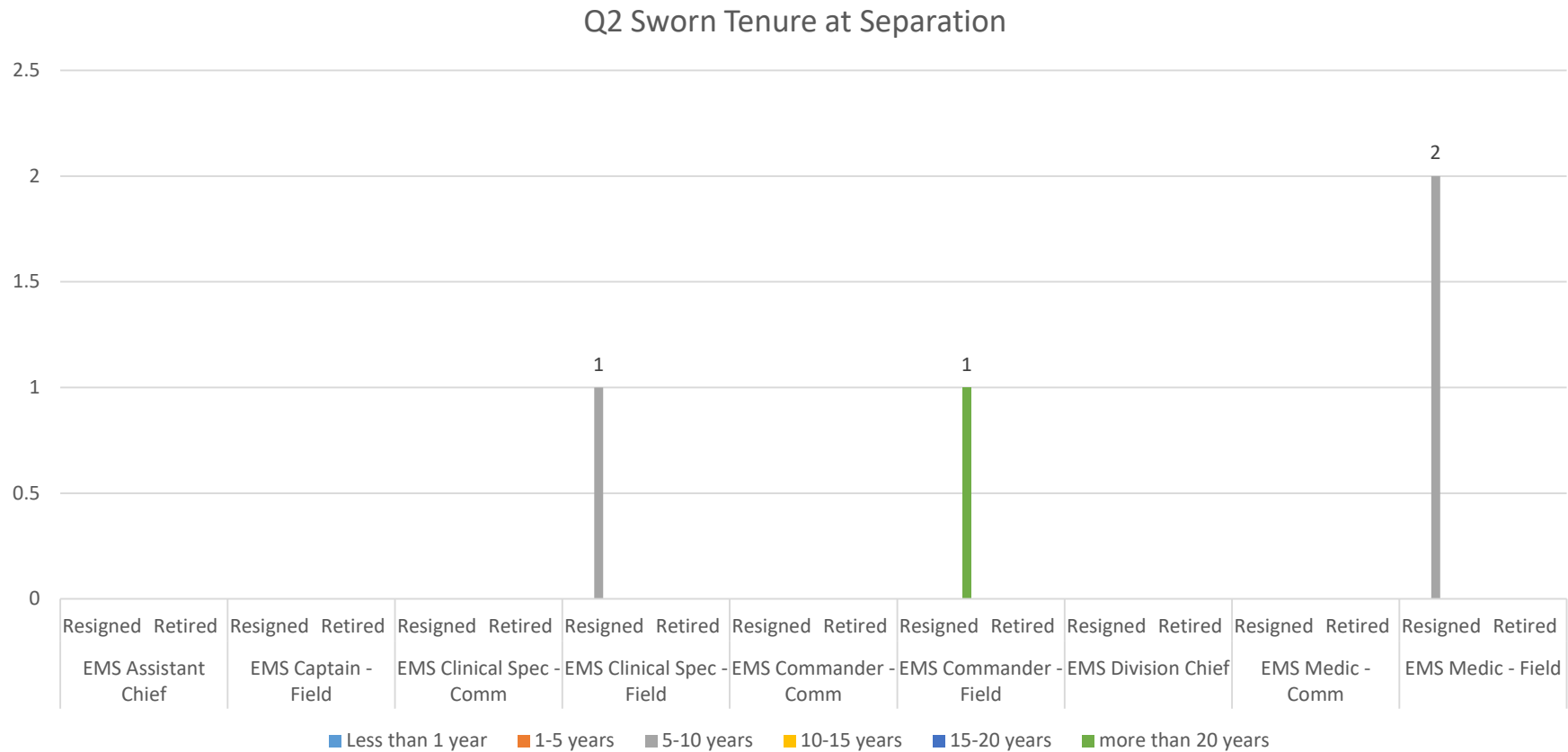

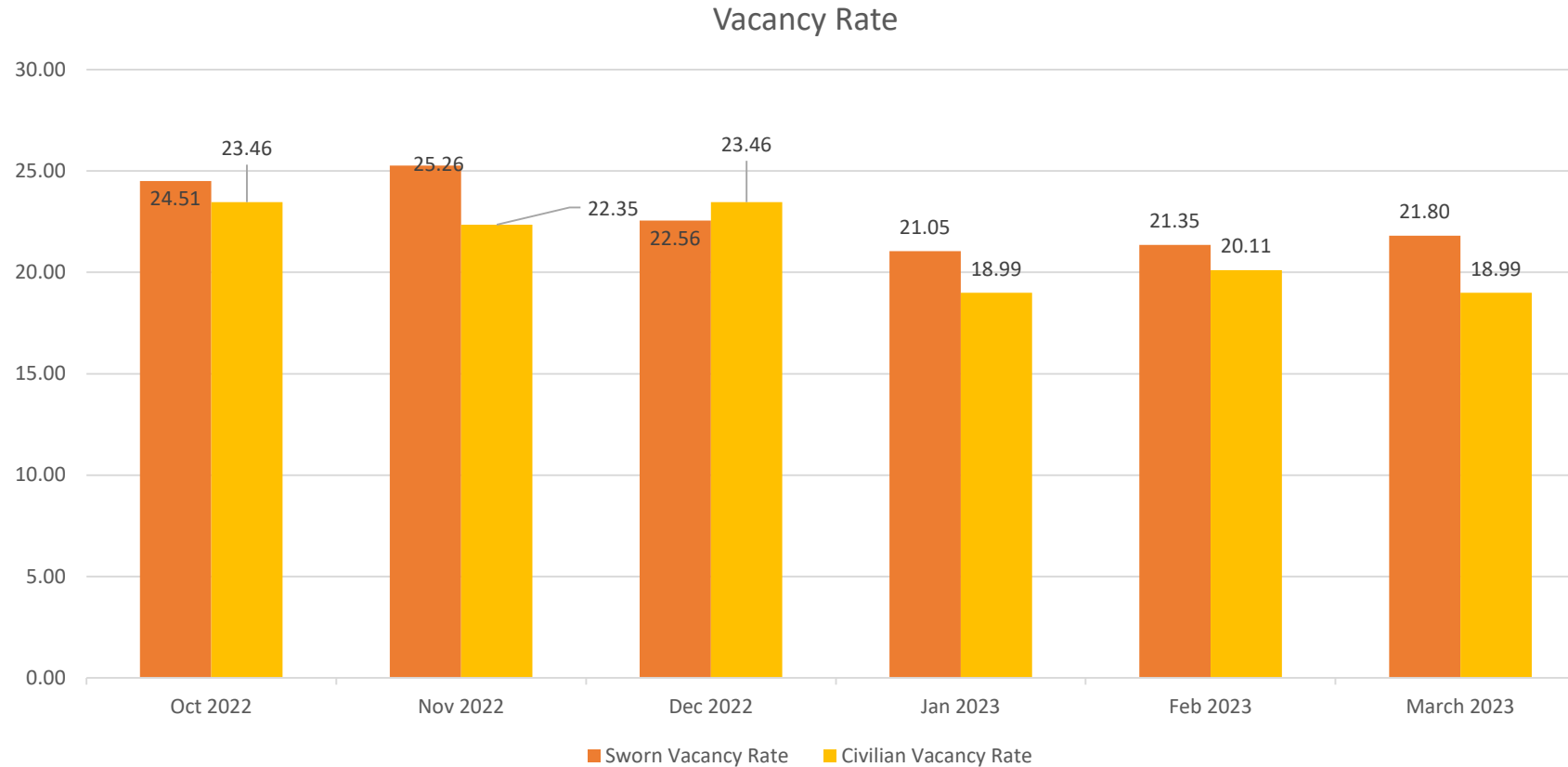
Sworn Separations



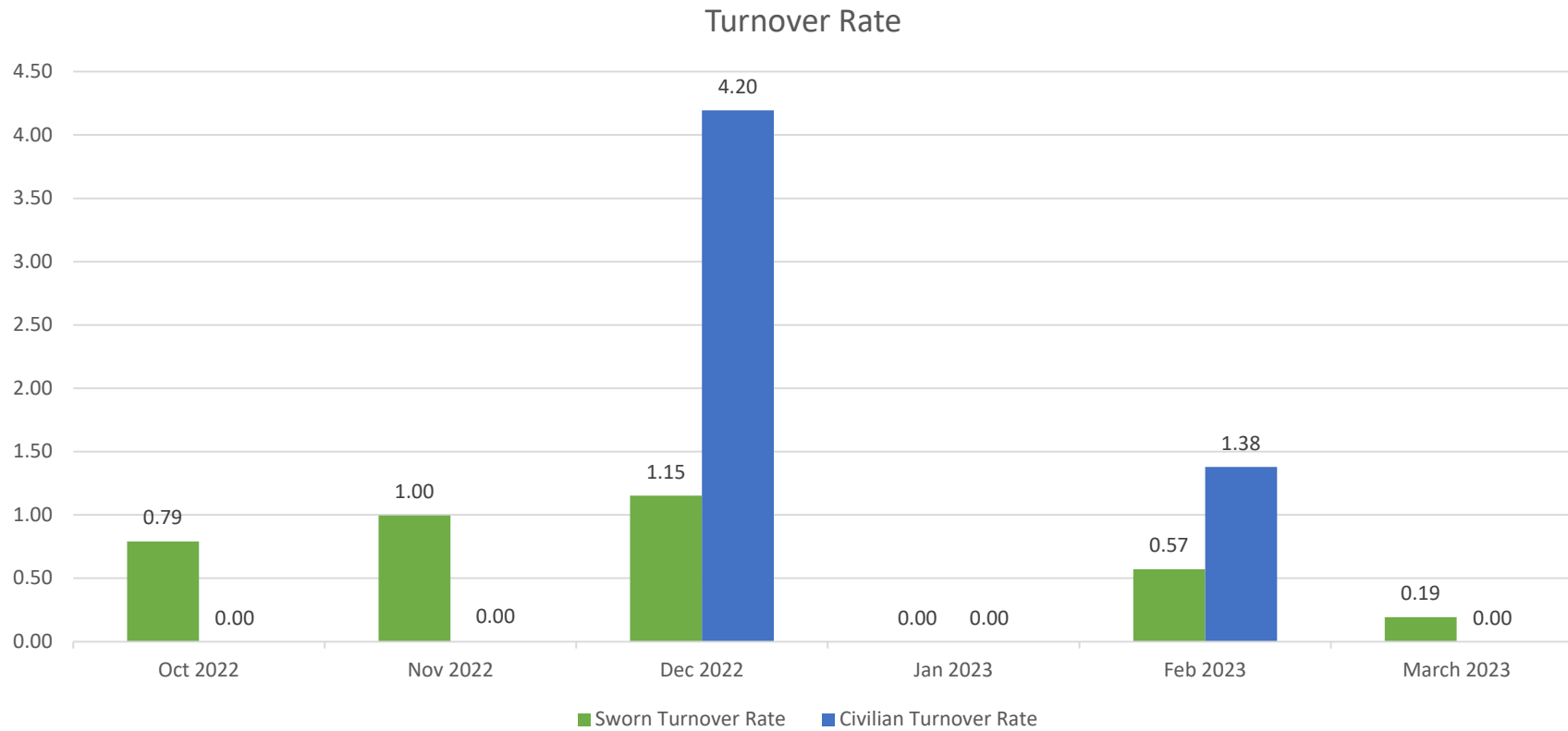
Sworn Tenure at Separation



Vacancy Rates Sworn & Civilian

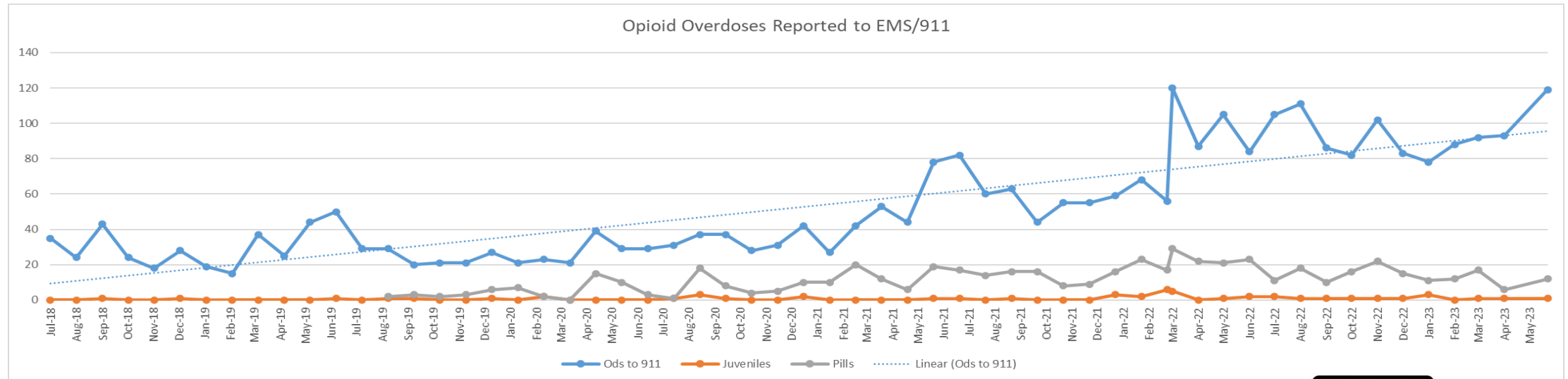


EMS Turnover Rate



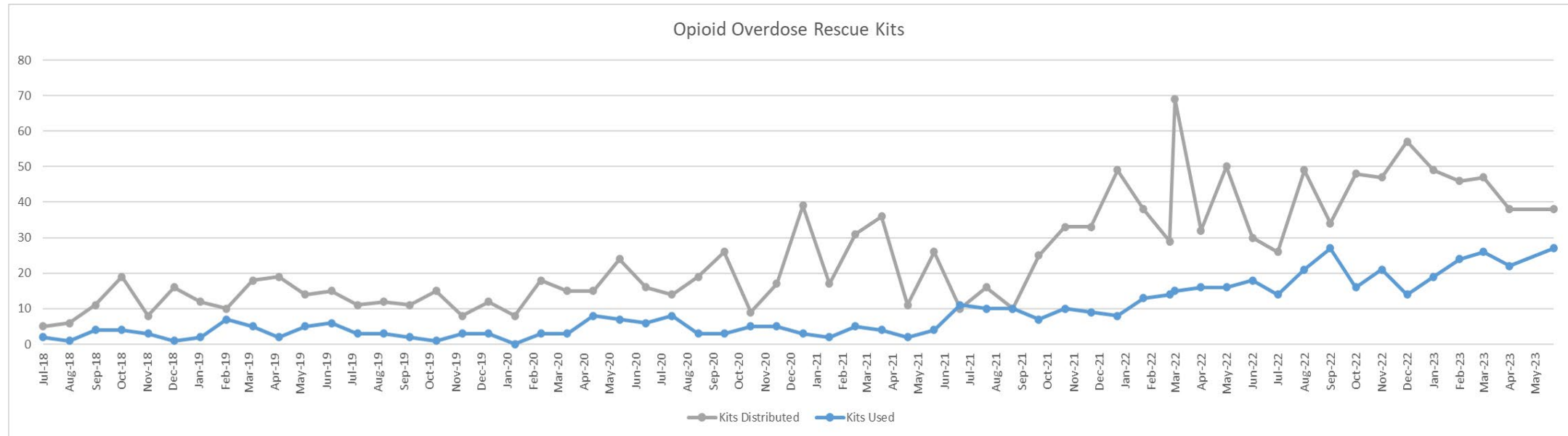
Opioid Overdoses – EMS Data

- Each spring/summer has seen an upward bump in opioid ODs
- Each spring raised the baseline for the rest of the year
 - 2020 – at the beginning of the pandemic
 - 2021 – Spring at more than twice 2019 average
 - 2022 – the largest increase. Associated with a significant increase in the amount of Fentanyl being reported
 - 2023 enters the year at > 300% increase since 2019 average – Spring spike has begun



Opioid Rescue Kits

- Kits distributed are by EMS CHP
- Kits used are patients resuscitated with a kit prior to arrival of first responders continues to rise
