As you know, we had our 1st IRAC Collaboration meeting with city staff from APH and PARD hosted by ACM Hayden-Howard on May 25th. A decision was made to form 2 working groups with IRAC members and city staff: one to update the two previous feasibility studies (APH in 2020 and PARD in 2022) and another on community engagement. It was suggested that because some of the APH staff assigned to the working group will also be working with the IRAC Working Group under the Commission on Aging, and to save time and not duplicate efforts, it would be most efficient if the Commission on Aging would consider expanding the scope of the IRAC Working Group to include updating the 2 feasibility studies.
