In this section: (B) (1) an ornamental fence is a fence with an open design that has a ratio of solid material to open space of not more than one to four; and (2) a solid fence is a fence other than an ornamental fence. (C) The height restrictions of this section do not apply to an ornamental fence. (D) Except as otherwise provided in this section, a solid fence constructed along a property line may not exceed a [an average] height of six feet measured from the natural grade up [or a maximum height of seven feet]. If there is a change in grade of at least one foot measured along any run of a (E) solid fence along a property line, then the portion of the fence where the

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grade change occurs may be constructed to a maximum height of seven feet.
