To whom it may concern,

I am writing in support of Austin Rowing Club's plan to increase the accessibility of their docks to people experiencing mobility challenges. As I am sure you know, access to water is an indicator of quality of life, and Austin Rowing Club does a wonderful job of providing access to a variety of water-related activities, including rowing, kayaking, paddle-boarding, and boating.

As a physical therapist, I treat individuals with all types of disabilities, some long-term, and some short-term due to injury. Providing access to water activities can improve their quality of life, as it allows them to be mobile on water during a time their mobility is limited on land. Austin is a city with a reputation for being inclusive of all individuals, so it is critical to provide access to our beautiful waterways, especially Lady Bird Lake at the heart of our city.

I have been a member of Austin Rowing Club since 2010 and am familiar with the club's operations. During periods of warm weather, the kayak docks see heavy guest traffic. A single ramp to use for people with mobility challenges is concerning due to guests carrying bulky items including life jackets and paddles, and children running around. Adding a second ramp would be a responsible idea to ensure the safety of those requiring more time and assistance to get to the dock. When I am advising my patients on water sports, safe access to the watercraft is a primary concern. I ask questions about access to the dock, and if there is a plan for entering and exiting the watercraft. A lack of clear accessibility options could be a deterrent to those who wish to enjoy a beautiful day on the lake.

I hope you will consider ARC's addition of a second ramp and added accessibility options, so that they can provide boating experiences that are welcoming of all Austin's residents and visitors.
